## MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Head coach Matt Rhule and the Bears are now 2-1 vs. UTSA in his career.
- Baylor is in its 118th football season and third under Matt Rhule -- the Bears are 598-574-44 all-time and Rhule is 38-40 in his career (10-17 at BU).
- Baylor has scored in a school-record 152-straight games -- the previous school record was 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 - Oct. 23, 1987.
- BU is 66-35-2 against members of Conference USA. Additionally, the Bears play Rice in Houston on Sept. 21.
- The Bears hold a 375-231-31 all-time record against current Division I schools in the state of Texas.
- Baylor won the toss and chose to defer for the second-straight game. UTSA received to start the game.
- **Sam Tecklenburg, Jordan Williams, Bravvion Roy and Jake Fruhmorgen** served as team captains vs. UTSA.
- The Bears shut out the Roadrunners in the first half, the first shutout in a half since shutting out Kansas in the first half, Sept. 22, 2018.
- The temperature at kickoff was 99 degrees, making it the hottest game at McLane Stadium history and hottest Baylor game in Waco since Aug. 31, 2013 vs. Wofford.

## TEAM NOTES

- The last time the Bears scored 60+ points was when they scored 66 on Oct. 10, 2015 when they scored 66 in a 66-7 victory at Kansas.
- The Bears allowed just 102 passing yards, the fewest since allowing just 31 to Rice, Sept. 16, 2016.
- For the second-straight game the Bears scored 35 first half points.
- The Bears held UTSA to just 79 yards of total offense in the first half (49 yards rushing, 32 yards passing).
- Five different Bears rushed for TDs on the day (Brewer, Bohanon, Hasty, Platt, Q. Jones).
- BU completed passes to seven different receivers, with three having multi-reception performances (Mims 7, Sneed 3, Hasty 2)
- The last time the Bears rushed for 350+ yards was 10/29/16 at Texas (398).
- First back-to-back-back 40-plus point performances for head coach Matt Rhule in his career.
- Matt Rhule coached teams have won 34 straight games when leading entering the fourth quarter.
- 63 points is the most points scored during the Matt Rhule era (previous high was 56 last week vs. SFA).
- The 63 points scored are the most ever by a Matt Rhule coached team. The previous record was 60 points scored in a 60-40 win for Temple at SMU on Nov. 6, 2015.
- The Bears finished with 546 yards of offense, the third-straight game they have had over 500 yards of offense (668 yards in the Texas Bowl vs. Vanderbilt, 518 yards vs. SFA). That is the first time the Bears have had back-to-back-back 500+ yard performances under Rhule. Overall, the Bears have had nine games with over 500 yards of offense in the Matt Rhule era (3 games in 2017, 4 games in 2018, 2 in 2019).

## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- LB **Clay Johnston** collected his third career sack, a loss of six yards on UTSA's first drive of the day.
- LB **Blake Lynch** collected his first sack of the year, a loss of one yard. Now has 2.5 sacks in his career.
- RB **Trestan Ebner** rushed for 55 yards, a career long on the Bears' first scoring drive of the game.
- WR **Denzel Mims** had his second-career 3 TD performance (first in 2017 vs. OU). He hauled in his first TD reception of the year, a 9-yd reception for the Bears' first score of the day. He then added a 30-yd TD reception in the second quarter and a 26-yd reception in the second quarter for his third TD of the day.
- WR **Denzel Mims** now has 19 career touchdowns, good for sole possession of ninth place on the Baylor receivers all-time TD list.
- WR **Denzel Mims** had 7 receptions on the day and now has 132 career receptions, good for 13th most on the Baylor all-time list.
- WR **Denzel Mims** finished with 101 yards receiving on the day and now has 2,052 yards receiving in his career, good for 10th best on the all-time Baylor receiving yards list.
- WR **Denzel Mims** finished with 101 receiving yards, his seventh-career 100-yd receiving performance.
- CB **Grayland Arnold** took a 73-yd punt return to the house, the first punt return TD of his career and the Rhule era. Overall, it is the first Baylor punt return TD since Nov. 16, 2013 when Levi Norwood had a 58-yd punt return vs. Texas Tech at AT&T Stadium. The 73-yd punt return TD is tied for the ninth longest in Baylor history (Don Huggins, 73 yards vs. TCU in 1970) and the longest since Shaun Rochon's 85-yd punt return TD vs. Samford in 2005.
- RB **JaMyca Hasty** with a 1-yd rushing TD in the 3rd quarter, his first of the season and ninth of his career.
- S **JT Woods** with a fumble recovery as UTSA drops the Baylor punt, the first fumble recovery of his career.
- WR **Chris Platt** with a 15-yard rushing TD, the first rushing TD of his career, 12th overall.
- WR **Chris Platt** becomes just the fourth active player nationally to score a TD in five different seasons (2015-19).

- QB **Gerry Bohanon** rushed for 93 yards on 7 carries, including his first-career rushing TD.
- QB **Gerry Bohanon** was 4-for-7 passing for 15 yards.
- QB **Charlie Brewer** rushed for his 8th career rushing TD, putting him in sole possession of seventh place on the Baylor quarterback all-time rushing TD list.
- QB **Charlie Brewer** finished with 3 TD passes on the day and has now thrown for 36 TDs in his career.
- During the Bears' four-game winning streak, QB **Charlie Brewer** has rushed for 1,054 yards on 76-for-111 passing, with 11 TDs to just 2 INTs.
- K **Noah Rauschenberg** sent 7-of-9 kickoffs for touchbacks on the day. He has now sent 15-of-18 kickoffs for touchbacks in the first two games of the season for a touchback percentage of 83.3 percent.
- C **Sam Tecklenburg** started his team-leading 27th-straight game.
- LS **Ross Maticcik**, C **Sam Tecklenburg** and LB **Jordan Williams** appeared in their 40th career games.
- DE **Cole Maxwell** made his first career appearance.
