STORY LINES

- Baylor faces No. 17 Villanova in the Myrtle Beach Invitational championship game at 4 pm CT Sunday.
- The game will be shown on ESPN with Rich Hollenberg and Fran Fraschilla calling the action.
- BU is appearing in a regular-season tournament title game for the 8th time in 13 seasons since 2007.
- The Bears are looking to win their 3rd tournament title in the last 4 years (2016 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2017 Hall of Fame Classic) and their 5th tournament title under Drew (2007, 2011, 2016, 2017).
- Baylor is 9-1 against Big East members during the Drew era, but BU is facing Villanova for the first time.
- Drew is 6-0 against Big East teams in neutral-site games, 3-0 at home and 0-1 on the road.
- Baylor is 35-12 in regular-season tournaments during the Drew era, including 22-4 since 2013-14.
- Baylor leads the Big 12 in offensive rebounding (13.8) and ranks 2nd in steals (9.6) and 3FG% (.378).
- **Davion Mitchell** leads a Baylor defense that has forced 15+ turnovers in all 5 games this season after doing so only 7 times last season. BU ranks 16th nationally in defensive turnover percentage (26.7).
- **Jared Butler** has led BU in scoring in 4 of 5 games this season (30-UCA, 18-UW, 15-TXST, 19-OU).
- **Butler** leads the Big 12 in scoring (18.8) and FT% (15-15), ranks 2nd in 3FGs made (3.4), 3rd in 3FG% (.531), 5th in steals (2.0), 5th in FG% (.554) and 13th in assists (3.6).
- **Freddie Gillespie** has 3 double-doubles, tied for the Big 12 lead. He ranks 6th in the Big 12 in rebounding (8.0), 5th in steals (2.0), 5th in blocks (1.6) and 3rd in offensive rebounding (4.2).
- **MaCio Teague** is 11th in the Big 12 in scoring (15.2), 3rd in 3FGs made (2.6) and 5th in 3FG% (.394).
- Baylor is 40-11 in games against non-Big 12 teams over the last 4 seasons since 2016-17.
- BU is the only school with FB, MBB, WBB & VB all ranked. Those teams are a combined 42-3 this year.
- Drew is coaching his 531st game at Baylor (320-210). His .604 winning percentage is best in BU history among coaches with 40+ games, and his teams have a .670 winning percentage since 2007-08 (286-141).
- Baylor is 59-31 against non-conference teams in neutral-road games during the Drew era, including a 31-16 record in away games against non-Big 12 teams since 2011-12.
- Baylor is coming off its 10th 20-win season in the last 12 years. The Bears were a No. 9 seed in the 2019 NCAA Tournament, where they knocked off Syracuse before falling to No. 1 seed Gonzaga.
- BU is No. 24 in the most recent AP Top 25 and No. 23 in the preseason coaches' poll.
- Baylor has been in the Preseason AP Top 25 in 7 of 10 seasons since its first preseason ranking in 2010-11.
- Head coach **Scott Drew** is in his 17th season in Waco and is BU's all-time wins leader (320-210).
- Baylor returned 9 players with at least 26 games of Division I experience, including a pair of transfers who started in their BU debuts after sitting out last season – **Davion Mitchell** and **MaCio Teague**.
- BU returned 8 letterwinners from last season, including 5 players who made at least 7 starts – **Mark Vital** (34), **Jared Butler** (21), **Tristan Clark** (14), **Freddie Gillespie** (11) and **Devonte Bando** (7).
- BU was picked 2nd in the Big 12 Preseason Coaches Poll, tying the highest in program history (2012-13). The Bears were picked 9th in last year's poll, but overcame a multitude of injuries to finish in 4th place.
- BU has advanced to the postseason in 8 straight seasons, tied as the nation's 10th-longest active streak.

QUICK HITS

- Five of Baylor’s 11 active players have used a redshirt year at Baylor, and the Bears have three players currently sitting out as redshirts – **Jordan Turner, Adam Flagler** and **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua**.
- **Davion Mitchell** took over as Baylor’s starting point guard replacing Makai Mason. Eight of Baylor’s nine starting point guards during the Drew era have earned All-Big recognition (14 of last 15 seasons).
- BU is 41-72 against AP-ranked teams since 2007-08 after going 0-27 in Drew’s first 4 rebuilding seasons.
- Baylor is 12-23 against AP Top 10 teams since March 2012. BU started the Drew era 1-26 vs. top-10.
- Baylor has defeated 7 top-10 teams in the last 3 seasons, including a 6-3 mark vs. top-10 teams in Waco.
- Baylor is 32-4 when leading at halftime over the last 3 seasons since 2017-18.
- Baylor has won 88% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (150-20).
- Baylor has won 20+ games in 10 of the last 12 seasons after recording only three 20-win seasons in the previous 100 years of Baylor Basketball (1946, 1948, 1988).
- The Bears are one of 11 programs to win 18+ games in every year since 2008.
- Baylor is 1 of 14 teams nationally to appear in every postseason since 2012 (6 NCAAs, 2 NITs).
- BU is 92-21 since 2015-16 when leading at any point in the 2nd half of a game (4-1 this season).
- Baylor is 195-94 over the last 9 seasons, averaging 24 wins per season since 2012.
- Baylor’s 195 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (239).
- Baylor is 286-141 since 2007-08, the first year Drew’s staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- Baylor is 5-1 all-time in Big 12/SEC Challenges, the best record of any team in either league.
- Baylor has the nation’s 11th-longest active streak with at least one 3-point FG made in 908 straight games – the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was more than 29 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).
- BU has recorded double-digit non-conference wins in 11 of the last 12 seasons (all except 2012-13).
- Baylor has won 5 tournament titles under **Drew** (2007 Paradise Jam, 2011 Las Vegas Classic, 2013 NIT, 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis and 2017 Hall of Fame Classic).

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- **Scott Drew** became Baylor head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew is now in his 17th season at Baylor and is the school’s all-time wins leader (320).
- Drew is coaching his 531st game at Baylor (320-210). His .604 winning percentage is best in BU history among coaches with 40+ games, and he’s the program’s all-time wins leader.
- Baylor has a .670 winning percentage (286-141) since Drew’s first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .675 winning percentage (195-94) over the last 9 seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (49) is the youngest of 12 coaches nationally to take his current program to four Sweet 16s since 2010.
- Baylor is playing its 217th game as a ranked team in Drew’s 17 seasons. BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program’s first 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 214 of 396 games.
- In Drew’s first 16 seasons at Baylor, 42 players have gone on to professional careers.

PICKED 2ND IN BIG 12 PRESEASON COACHES POLL

- Baylor was picked second in the 2020 Big 12 Preseason Coaches Poll, tying 2013 for the best in program history.
- Baylor (71 points) was projected behind only Kansas (80). Texas Tech (62) was third, followed by Texas (57), West Virginia (45), Oklahoma State (42), Iowa State (30), Oklahoma (29), Kansas State (23) and TCU (11).
- BU was projected to finish 9th last season, but the Bears overcame injuries to four projected starters to finish 4th.

DREW'S BEARS 9-1 AGAINST BIG EAST

- Sunday is Baylor's first time facing Villanova and the Bears' 11th game against Big East members under Drew.
- Baylor is 9-1 against Big East teams during the Drew era, with the lone loss at Xavier in 2017. Drew has faced five Big East teams – Xavier (3-1), Creighton (2-0), Providence (2-0), St. John's (1-0) and Georgetown (1-0).
- The only Big East teams the Bears haven't faced in program history are Villanova, Butler and Seton Hall. The Bears host Butler on Dec. 10 as part of the inaugural Big East/Big 12 Battle.
- Drew vs. Big East – 2008 win vs. Providence (n), 2009 win vs. Georgetown (h), 2009 win vs. Xavier (n), 2012 win vs. Xavier (n), 2012 win vs. St. John's (n), 2013 win vs. Providence (h), 2014 win vs. Creighton (n), 2016 win vs. Xavier (h), 2017 win vs. Creighton (n), 2017 loss at Xavier.

SUCCESS IN TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor is 35-12 in regular-season tournaments during the Scott Drew era.
- BU is 22-4 in its seven regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, going 3-1, 3-1, 3-1, 4-0, 4-0, 3-1 and 2-0.
- BU advanced to championship games in the 2007 Paradise Jam (won), 2008 76 Classic (lost), 2011 Las Vegas Classic (won), 2013 Maui Invitational (lost), 2014 Las Vegas Invitational (lost), 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis (won), 2017 Hall of Fame Classic (won) and 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational (TBD).
- Baylor has won four regular-season tournament titles under Drew – the 2017 Hall of Fame Classic, the 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis, the 2011 Las Vegas Classic and the 2007 Paradise Jam.

WINNING AWAY FROM HOME VS. NON-BIG 12 TEAMS

- Baylor is 59-32 against non-conference teams in neutral/road games in the Scott Drew era, including a 36-17 record in away games against non-Big 12 teams since 2011-12.
- Baylor is 56-26 in road/neutral non-conference games since the 2007-08 season (2-1 in 2019-20, 3-3 in 2018-19; 2-2 in 2017-18; 6-1 in 2016-17; 1-3 in 2015-16; 3-2 in 2014-15; 6-2 in 2013-14; 5-2 in 2012-13; 8-1 in 2011-12; 1-3 in 2010-11; 8-2 in 2009-10; 6-2 in 2008-09; 5-2 in 2007-08).

RANKED 24TH IN LATEST AP TOP 25

- Baylor remained No. 24 in the latest AP Top 25 released on Monday. It's the Bears' 3rd straight week ranked.
- Baylor was ranked No. 16 in the preseason AP Top 25 poll, which tied the 2nd-highest preseason ranking in BU history.
- BU has been in the preseason AP Top 25 in 7 of 10 seasons since the program's first preseason ranking in 2010-11.
- Friday is Baylor's 216th games as a ranked team, with 213 of those coming in the last 12 seasons.
- Baylor's highest preseason ranking was No. 12 in 2011-12. The Bears were No. 16 in 2010-11 and 2019-20, No. 19 in 2012-13, No. 22 in 2015-16, No. 24 in 2017-18 and No. 25 in 2013-14.

SUCCESS ACROSS BAYLOR ATHLETICS DEPARTMENT

- Baylor is the nation's only school with top-25 ranked teams in football, men's and women's basketball and volleyball.
- The BU Volleyball team is No. 3, and the Bears knocked off No. 1 Texas on Wednesday, avenging their lone loss, and they are now 23-1 on the season. Baylor Volleyball has lost only 10 sets all season (69 sets won, 10 lost).
- Baylor Football is No. 13 nationally after starting 10-1, with its lone loss by 3 points to No. 8 Oklahoma.
- Baylor Men's Basketball is ranked No. 24 nationally at 4-1 with its lone loss by 3 points to current No. 25 Washington.
- Baylor Women's Basketball is ranked No. 2 nationally and has won 33 straight games dating back to Dec. 15, 2018.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Drew is in his 17th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (320).
- Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren't ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school – Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson and Taurean Prince.
- Drew has graduated 49 players during his Baylor tenure, averaging more than 3 graduates per season.
- The Bears have advanced to postseason play in a school-record eight straight seasons (6 NCAA, 2 NIT).
- Baylor is 22-4 in regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, including 3 regular-season tournament titles.
- Drew has won 20+ games in 10 of the last 12 years – the Bears had 3 seasons of 20+ wins prior to his arrival.

NON-CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- BU went 10-5 in non-conference last season, with marquee wins at Arizona, vs. Oregon, vs. Alabama and vs. Syracuse.
- BU held Oregon to 47 points on Dec. 15, the Ducks' fewest in a game since scoring 46 vs. Cal on Feb. 21, 2013.
- BU won 58-49 at Arizona on Dec. 1, becoming the first team to hold UA below 50 points since Feb. 26, 2011.
- The win at Arizona snapped the Wildcats 52-game non-conference home winning streak.
- Baylor is now 11-5 vs. the Pac-12 in the Drew era, 9-1 against the Big East during the Drew era and 10-5 against SEC teams since 2012-13.
- Baylor is 39-11 in games against non-Big 12 teams over the last 4 seasons, including home victories against No. 4 Oregon, No. 7 Xavier, Oregon and Alabama, neutral site wins vs. No. 10 Louisville, vs. No. 24 Michigan State, vs. VCU, vs. USC, vs. Wisconsin, vs. Creighton and vs. Syracuse and road wins at Arizona and Ole Miss.

TWENTY-THREE WINS VS. RANKED TEAMS IN LAST FIVE SEASONS

- Baylor has gone 23-32 against ranked teams since the start of the 2014-15 season (3-5 last season).
- BU is 41-72 against AP-ranked teams since 2007-08 after going 0-27 in Drew's first four rebuilding seasons.
- Baylor has won multiple games vs. AP Top 25 teams in each of the last 12 seasons. The Bears have defeated at least five ranked teams in four of the last six seasons dating back to 2013-14.

FIVE NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES IN LAST SIX SEASONS

- Baylor appeared in the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in the last six seasons in 2019.
- BU is 1 of 22 teams (1 of 15 in Power-5) to appear in five NCAA Tournaments since 2014, joining Arizona, Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Iowa State, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan, Michigan State, New Mexico State, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Providence, Purdue, VCU, Villanova, Virginia, Wichita State, Wisconsin and Xavier.

EIGHT CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON BERTHS

- Baylor is on a school-record streak of eight consecutive postseason berths, surpassing the total number of postseason berths in the program's 97 seasons prior to the **Scott Drew** era.
- Baylor is 1 of 14 teams to appear in every postseason since 2012, joining Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan State, New Mexico State, North Carolina, Oregon, Saint Mary's, Virginia and Wichita State.
- BU earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2019 and NIT bids in 2013 and 2018.
- Baylor has made postseason appearances in 11 of 12 seasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor's only postseason berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).
- Baylor is 21-10 in postseason national tournaments during the Drew era after going 3-9 prior to Drew's arrival.

A WIN WOULD ...

- Give Baylor its 5th regular-season tournament title of the Drew era and the 3rd in the last 4 seasons.
- Improve Baylor's record against Big East teams to 10-1 during the Drew era.
- Be Baylor's 42nd win against a ranked opponent since 2007-08 after going 0-27 in Drew's first 4 rebuilding seasons.
- Move Baylor to 41-11 in games against non-Big 12 teams since 2016-17.
- Be Drew's 321st win at Baylor and improve Baylor's record to 287-141 since 2007-08.
- Make Baylor 150-34 in November/December games under Drew, including 77-15 in November games.

GILLESPIE GROWING INTO STARTING ROLE

- **Freddie Gillespie** has started 14 of the last 17 games since entering the starting lineup on Feb. 9, 2019 vs. K-State.
- Gillespie did not play in 8 of 9 games immediately preceding Tristan Clark's injury last year, but he joined the rotation for the first game without Clark on Jan. 12, and he became a starter 8 games later (started 9 of final 12 games).
- Gillespie has posted double-doubles in 3 of 5 games this season after doing so in 1 of 26 games played last year.
- Gillespie is tied with TCU's Kevin Samuel for the Big 12 lead with 3 double-doubles this season.
- Gillespie leads the Big 12 in double-doubles (3), ranks 6th in the Big 12 in rebounding (8.0), 5th in steals (2.0), 5th in blocks (1.6) and 3rd in offensive rebounding (4.2).

BUTLER TAKING OVER

- **Jared Butler** has led Baylor in scoring in 4 of 5 games this season after doing so in 6 of 34 games last year.
- Butler posted 30 points in the season-opener vs. UCA, the most by a Big 12 player this season and the 2nd-most of his career behind a 31-point effort at Kansas on March 9, 2019.
- Butler leads the Big 12 in scoring (18.8) and free throw percentage (15-15), ranks 2nd in 3FGs made (3.4), 3rd in 3FG% (.531), 5th in steals (2.0), 5th in FG% (.554) and 13th in assists (3.6).
- Butler has scored at least 12 points in all 5 games this season, a career-long streak.

TEAGUE CONTINUING STREAKS

- **MaCio Teague** has played in 72 consecutive games and made 68 consecutive starts during 3 collegiate seasons (2016-17 & 2017-18 at UNC Asheville, 2019-20 at Baylor). He has started all but one game (Nov. 20, 2016).
- Teague has made at least one 3-pointer in 30 consecutive games, including 25 of 30 games with multiple 3FGs.
- Teague ranks 11th in the Big 12 in scoring (15.2), 3rd in 3FGs made (2.6) and 5th in 3FG% (.394).

BREAKTHROUGH IN BIG 12

- BU is 113-94 in Big 12 play in 12 seasons since 2008 after going 45-131 in the league's first 11 seasons.
- BU is 99-77 in Big 12 play in 10 seasons since 2010 after going 59-149 in the league's first 13 seasons.
- Baylor is 34-38 in Big 12 road games since 2012, second-best in the league behind only Kansas (44-24).
- BU has recorded double-digit Big 12 wins in 4 of the last 5 and 6 of the last 10 seasons.
- BU has won 8+ Big 12 games in 8 straight seasons after winning 8+ just 3 times in the league's first 15 years.

SECOND-MOST WINS AMONG BIG 12 TEAMS SINCE 2011-12

- Baylor's 195-94 record since 2011-12 trails only Kansas (239-61) among Big 12 teams (thru 11/22/19).
- Iowa State (186-94) is 3rd, Kansas State (176-100) is 4th, West Virginia (173-109) is 5th, Oklahoma (166-105) is 6th, Texas (156-124) is 7th, Oklahoma State (148-122) is 8th, Texas Tech (145-124) is 9th and TCU (140-135) is 10th.
- Baylor has averaged 24 wins per season over the last seven seasons since 2011-12.

PROTECTING HALFTIME LEADS

- Baylor is 35-4 in its last 39 games when leading at the half, including 15-3 last season and 15-0 in 2017-18.
- Baylor has won 88% of its games (150-20) when leading at the half since 2011-12 (2-1 in 2019-20, 15-3 in 2018-19, 15-0 in 2017-18, 18-3 in 2016-17, 18-2 in 2015-16, 21-7 in 2014-15, 18-2 in 2013-14, 17-1 in 2012-13 and 26-1 in 2011-12).
- BU has won 38% of games in which its been tied or trailing at the half since 2011-12, going 45-74 in those.

DOMINANT DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCES

- Baylor held 3 high-major teams below 50 points last season, each team's lowest scoring total in more than 5 years.
- BU held Arizona to 49 points in Tucson on Dec. 1, becoming the first team to hold UA below 50 since Feb. 26, 2011.
- Baylor limited Oregon to 47 points on Dec. 15, the Ducks' fewest points in a game since Feb. 21, 2013.
- Baylor held Oklahoma to 47 points in Norman on Jan. 28, the Sooners' fewest in a game since Nov. 23, 2012.

NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER SUCCESS

- Baylor has posted a combined 149-34 record in November and December games during the Drew era, including a 66-12 mark in November and December games since 2013.
- The Bears are 76-15 in November games and 73-19 in December contests.
- BU is 36-7 in November games since 2013, with the only losses to No. 8 Syracuse (2013), vs. Illinois (2014) in Las Vegas, at No. 25 Oregon (2015), at No. 21 Xavier (2017), vs. Texas Southern (2018), vs. Ole Miss (2018) in Florida and vs. Washington (2019) in Alaska.
- BU is 31-5 in December games since 2013, with losses at No. 24 Texas A&M (2015), vs. No. 8 Wichita State (2017), at No. 22 Texas Tech (2017), at Wichita State (2018) and vs. SFA (2018).

POINT GUARDS THRIVE IN DREW'S SYSTEM

- Eight of Baylor's nine starting point guards during the **Scott Drew** era have earned All-Big 12 recognition.
- Baylor's starting point guard has earned All-Big 12 recognition in 14 of 15 seasons since 2004-05.
- Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

DOUBLE-DIGIT NON-CONFERENCE WINS IN 11 OF LAST 13 YEARS

- Baylor has begun Big 12 play with double-digit wins in 5 of the last 6 seasons and 11 times in the last 13 years.
- All told, Baylor has gone 144-26 prior to Big 12 play over the last 14 seasons dating back to 2006-07, including a 9-9 record against AP Top 25 teams.
- BU entered Big 12 play 8-4 in 2018-19, 10-2 in 2017-18, 12-0 in 2016-17, 10-2 in 2015-16, 11-1 in 2014-15, 12-1 in 2013-14, 8-4 in 2012-13, 13-0 in 2011-12, 10-3 in 2010-11, 12-1 in 2009-10, 12-2 in 2008-09, 12-2 in 2007-08 and 10-3 in 2006-07. The Bears are 4-1 in non-conference this season.

GRADUATING 91 PERCENT OF SENIORS

- Since **Scott Drew** took over the Baylor Basketball program in 2003, 32 of 35 scholarship players who have played their fourth years of collegiate eligibility under Drew have graduated from Baylor.
- Players recruited by Drew to graduate at Baylor: Tim Bush, Patrick Fields, Aaron Bruce, Mamadou Diene, Delbert Simpson, Curtis Jerrells, Henry Dugat, Kevin Rogers, Tweety Carter, Josh Lomers, Ekpe Udoh, Fred Ellis, Quincy Acy, Anthony Jones, J'mison Morgan, A.J. Walton, Cory Jefferson, Brady Heslip, Gary Franklin, Kenny Chery, Royce O'Neale, Lester Medford, Rico Gathers, Taurean Prince, Al Freeman, Johnathan Motley, Ishmail Wainright, Manu Lecomte, Jo Lual-Acuil Jr., Nuni Omot, Jake Lindsey and King McClure.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT – FROM UNRANKED TO NBA DRAFT PICKS

- Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren't ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school.
- The only other schools with three such players were Colorado, Marquette, Missouri, New Mexico and Connecticut.
- Baylor developed **Quincy Acy**, **Ekpe Udoh**, **Pierre Jackson** and **Taurean Prince** into NBA Draft picks after joining the program as unranked recruits.

HISTORY OF DEVELOPMENT WITH REDSHIRTS

- Baylor has a track record of success when players redshirt under Scott Drew. **Ekpe Udoh**, **Johnathan Motley**, **Cory Jefferson**, **Brady Heslip**, **Jo Lual-Acuil Jr.** and **Manu Lecomte** have all gone on to professional careers after redshirting.
- **Mark Vital**, **Freddie Gillespie**, **MaCio Teague** and **Davion Mitchell** have all redshirted while at Baylor.
- **Adam Flagler** and **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** are both redshirting this season while sitting out to satisfy NCAA transfer rules, while freshman **Jordan Turner** has elected to redshirt.

42 PRO PLAYERS IN DREW ERA

- In Scott Drew's 16 years at Baylor, 42 of his players have gone on to professional careers.
- Five of Drew's players were in the NBA last season, and they all graduated from Baylor – Quincy Acy (Suns), Johnathan Motley (Clippers), Royce O'Neale (Jazz), Taurean Prince (Hawks) and Ekpe Udoh (Jazz).

- Baylor's offense has consistently ranked among the nation's best over the last 12 seasons under Scott Drew.
- The Bears have finished 10 of the past 12 seasons among the top 25 nationally in KenPom's adjusted offensive efficiency, joining Duke as the only programs to make that claim.
- BU finished No. 20 in 2018-19, No. 62 in 2017-18, No. 23 in 2016-17, No. 13 in 2015-16, No. 18 in 2014-15, No. 9 in 2013-14, No. 14 in 2012-13, No. 8 in 2011-12, No. 102 in 2010-11, No. 3 in 2009-10, No. 11 in 2008-09 and No. 11 in 2007-08.

OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING BECOMING A BAYLOR STAPLE

- Baylor has ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage in every season since 2013-14, including five times ranked in the nation's top-4. The Bears only cracked the top-20 once in Drew's first 10 years.
- Baylor's 6-year streak is the nation's best, and West Virginia (5 years) is the only other team with a 3+ year streak.
- Baylor ranked No. 2 nationally in 2018-19, No. 9 in 2017-18, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16, No. 1 in 2014-15 and No. 3 in 2013-14. Prior to that 6-year top-10 streak, BU's best rank was No. 16 in 2011-12.

BAYLOR BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

- Baylor basketball is aired live via the Baylor Sports Network from Learfield IMG College on ESPN Central Texas and flagship station 1660AM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco and worldwide on Sirius/XM Radio.
- Games are broadcast by the "Voice of the Bears" John Morris and former Baylor basketball standout Pat Nunley.
- Morris is in his 36th year doing Baylor broadcasts, while Nunley is in his 39th season as color analyst.
- Dave Rosselli enters his 3rd season filling in when Morris slides over to the TV broadcast.
- All of Baylor's games can be heard live on the Internet at www.BaylorBears.com and via the TuneIn App.

SCOTT DREW COACHING TREE

- Three current Division I head coaches took their first DI head coaching jobs after stints on Scott Drew's BU staff.
- Matthew Driscoll is in his 11th season as head coach at North Florida after six seasons as a Baylor assistant.
- Grant McCasland is in his third season as head coach at North Texas. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.
- Paul Mills is in his third season as head coach at Oral Roberts. He was a member of Drew's original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.

ENTIRE STAFF RETURNS

- Scott Drew's entire coaching staff returns for the 2019-20 season.
- Jerome Tang is in his third season as associate head coach and has been on Drew's staff all 17 seasons at Baylor.
- Assistant coaches Alvin Brooks III (fourth season) and John Jakus (third season) also return to the bench.
- Special assistant & director of player development Jared Nuness is back for his 10th season, while director of basketball operations Aditya Malhotra returns for his 7th season. Special assistant to the head coach Bill Peterson and director of video operations Ty Beard are both back for their third seasons.

UP NEXT

- Baylor's next game is Dec. 3 at home vs. Maryland-Eastern Shore, which will be a 6:30 p.m. CT tipoff.
