## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

« Houston opens the 2020 campaign, the 74th season in program history, on Saturday as the Cougars travel to Waco to face Baylor. Kickoff is set for 11 a.m. CT. The game will be televised on FOX with **Gus Johnson** (pxp), **Joel Klatt** (analyst) and **Jenny Taft** (sideline) on the call. Radio coverage on KPRC 950-AM begins at 10 a.m. CT.

« Houston and Baylor are meeting for the first time since the final season (1995) of the Southwest Conference. The Bears defeated the Cougars, 47-7, on Oct. 14, 1995, at the Houston Astrodome, to go ahead 14-13-1 in the all-time series.

« Since 1996, Houston is 27-24 against former Southwest Conference schools. Arkansas, Baylor and Texas A&M are the only current FBS former league members the Cougars have not faced since the conference disbanded.

« Houston has won four out of its last five season openers since 2015. Saturday marks the 12th time in the last 13 seasons the Cougars will have opened their season in the state of Texas.

« Houston is 39-33-2 all-time in season openers and 23-47-3 in road openers. Since the start of the 2015 season, Houston holds a record of 14-5 in September.

« During his tenure as a head coach, **Dana Holgorsen** is 6-3 in season openers (0-1 at Houston; 6-2 at West Virginia). As a head coach, Holgorsen is 5-2 against Baylor -- with all seven matchups coming at the helm of West Virginia.

« Saturday's game marks the 10th career start for junior quarterback **Clayton Tune**, but his first in a season opener. Tune threw for 1,533 yards and 11 touchdowns in seven starts a year ago.



Senior wide receiver **Marquez Stevenson** ranks second among all returning American Athletic Conference receivers with 1,962 career receiving yards enter the 2020 season. The Shreveport, La., native already ranks in the top-15 in receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns in UH history. He was named to the Biletnikoff and Maxwell Award Watch Lists during the offseason.

## FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

« For the second straight season, Houston will begin the season against a Big 12 opponent. UH opened the 2019 season at No. 4/4 Oklahoma last season, falling 49-31 to the Sooners. Houston is 62-70-5 against current members of the Big 12 Conference and has faced at least one Big 12 foe in four consecutive seasons.

« Houston returns its 2019 statistical leaders in passing yards and touchdowns (**Clayton Tune**), rushing yards (**Kyle Porter**), rushing touchdowns (**Mulbah Car**), receiving yards and touchdowns (**Marquez Stevenson**), tackles (**Grant Stuard**), interceptions (**Damarion Williams**) and field goals made (**Dalton Witherspoon**).

« The 2020 roster features players from four countries and 11 states with 91 hailing from Texas and 47 from Houston.

« Special teams were a major factor for the Cougars a year ago. Houston led the FBS with five blocked punts and six blocked kicks in 2019. The Cougars also recorded a pair of kickoff touchdowns and two punt return touchdowns. Kicker **Dalton Witherspoon** also made 20 field goals and set the UH single-season record with 15 consecutive field goals made.

« Since 2018, senior wide receiver **Marquez Stevenson** leads active FBS players with nine receptions of 50 yards or more. The senior has also been explosive on kickoff returns during his career. In 2019, Stevenson was tied for second nationally with two kickoff returns for touchdowns.

EXPERIENCE IS BACK

« The Cougars return a plethora of experience for the 2020 season, returning 15 starters (not including specialists) who started at least seven games last year (seven on offense, eight on defense). Twelve of those 15 started at least 10 games (four on offense and eight on defense). UH also welcomes back senior kicker **Dalton Witherspoon**, who has made 27 career field goals.

« The seven returning offensive starters (at least seven starts) are sophomore offensive lineman **Jack Freeman** (seven starts), senior offensive lineman **Gio Pancotti** (11 starts), senior running back **Kyle Porter** (nine starts), junior wide receiver **Jeremy Singleton** (11 starts), senior wide receiver **Marquez Stevenson** (11 starts), junior tight end **Christian Trahan** (11 starts) and junior quarterback **Clayton Tune** (seven starts).

« The eight returning defensive starters (at least seven starts) are senior safety **Deontay Anderson** (11 starts), senior defensive lineman **David Anenih** (eight starts), senior linebacker **Donavan Mutin** (12 starts), junior safety **Gervarius Owens** (11 starts), senior linebacker **Grant Stuard** (12 starts), senior defensive lineman **Payton Turner** (12 starts) and senior defensive lineman **Damarion Williams** (12 starts).

SERIES WITH BAYLOR

« Baylor leads the all-time series with Houston, 14-13-1 overall and 8-6-1 in Waco. The two teams have not met since Oct. 14, 1995, at the Astrodome.

« After dropping four of the first six games in the series (1950-57), Houston ran off six wins in the next eight matchups (1962-81).

« Houston and Baylor combined to capture the Southwest Conference title in five of seven seasons from 1974-80. The Bears won the 1974 and '80 titles while the Cougars were champions in 1976, '78 and '79.

SCOUTING THE BEARS

« Saturday marks the season opener for Baylor. The Bears' originally scheduled opener against Louisiana Tech, set for Sept. 12, was postponed due to an outbreak of positive COVID-19 results and contact tracing.

« First-year head coach **Dave Aranda** ushers in a new era. The 24-year coaching veteran was named the 28th head coach in Baylor Football history on Jan. 16, 2020. Aranda spent the previous four seasons as associate head coach and defensive coordinator at LSU, helping the Tigers to the 2020 College Football Playoff championship.

« Fourth-year Baylor starting quarterback **Charlie Brewer** enters the season with 7,742-career passing yards – the third most in BU history. The Austin native has started 30 games and is the fourth Baylor student-athlete to throw for 6,000-plus career yards.

« Saturday's game features the top-two teams in FBS in 2019 in blocked kicks. Houston led the nation with six blocked kicks in 2019, while Baylor led the Big 12 and was tied for second nationally with five.

« Baylor has been picked to finish fifth in the 2020 Big 12 Football Media Preseason Poll. The Bears return 11 student-athletes combined that have started 10 or more games in their careers and 31 student-athletes with career starts overall. Baylor's nine returning starters overall is the fewest in the Big 12.

« The Bears are 78-36-4 all-time in season openers. Baylor has won 10 of its last 11 season openers and has started nine of the last 10 years with at least two consecutive victories. First-year Baylor coaches are 13-11-3 all-time in openers.

« Last season, Baylor became the first Power 5 program to win 11 games within two seasons of losing 11 games. The Bears finished 2019 with an 11-3 record alongside appearances in the Big 12 Championship game and Sugar Bowl.

NOTABLES // BAYLOR

« Houston head coach **Dana Holgorsen** and Baylor head coach **Dave Aranda** were on staff together at Texas Tech from 2000-02. Holgorsen was inside receivers coach and Aranda was a graduate assistant.

« Baylor head coach **Dave Aranda** coached linebackers at Houston during the 2003-04 seasons. In 2003, he helped the Cougars to their first winning season since 1999 and berth in the Hawai'i Bowl.

« Baylor running back coach **Justin Johnson** played for the Cougars from 2008-11. He also served as UH's running back coach in 2019.

« The Cougars defeated Baylor, 13-10, on Oct. 6, 1979 for the 200th victory in program history.

« On Sept. 22, 1951, the Cougars and Bears played in front of 55,000 fans at Rice Stadium, the No. 7 largest crowd to attend a UH game.

« **Manny Hazard's** five touchdown receptions versus Baylor are tied for the most in a single game by a Houston receiver.

COUGARS IN SEASON OPENERS

« Houston's start to the 2020 season is beginning later than normal. The Cougars haven't opened a season on Sept. 19 or later since 1970, when UH opened the season against Syracuse (won 42-15).

« Overall, Houston is 39-33-2 in season openers and 10-5 since 2005.

« For the fourth straight season, Houston begins the season away from home. It is the first time in program history the Cougars have opened a season away from home in four consecutive years.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

« Since 2009, Houston is 30-13 in non-conference regular season contests including perfect 4-0 marks four times (2009, 2011, 2015 and 2016). The Cougars have finished .500 or better in non-conference play each of the last seven seasons (2013-present).

COACHING STAFF STABILITY

« Since taking over the Houston program in 2019, head coach **Dana Holgorsen** has consistently spoken about bringing stability to the program. Heading into year two of the Holgorsen era, eight of UH's 10 assistants return from last year's 2019 staff.

« While the majority of the staff returns in their positions from last year, **Shannon Dawson** assumes the offensive coordinator role for the 2020 season after serving as UH's tight ends coach a year ago.

MEEKINS, SCOTT ADDED TO COACHING STAFF

« During the offseason, **Dana Holgorsen** announced the additions of **Mark Scott** as UH's special teams coordinator and **Corby Meekins** as tight ends/inside receiver coach.

« Scott spent the 2019 season as the special teams analyst for the Cougars, helping implement UH's special teams strategy that led to one of the most efficient units in the nation.

« Scott spent seven seasons at West Virginia from 2012-18 and coached a pair of All-Americans in **David Long** (2017, 2018) and **Isaiah Bruce** (2013). He began his tenure as a graduate assistant at WVU from 2012-14.

« Meekins spent the last three seasons at Texas and was a part of Houston's staff that won the 2015 American Athletic Conference Championship.

AMONG THE BEST

« Houston leads the FBS programs in Texas since 2016 with 41 wins. The Cougars are one win ahead of Texas A&M and TCU, five wins ahead of Baylor and Texas.

« Since 2013, Houston ranks second in the state of Texas with 57 wins, trailing only Baylor (58). The Cougars are seven wins ahead of Texas in that span. Houston also leads the state of Texas FBS schools with 10 seasons of at least eight wins since 2006. TCU is second in that span with nine.

« The Cougars also rank second among American Athletic Conference Teams with 35 victories in league history. UH remains the last FBS school in the state of Texas to win a league championship (2015 American Athletic Champions).

## ON THE OFFENSIVE

« Since 2006, only Oklahoma, Oregon and Texas Tech have racked up more yards than Houston, which has 87,243 in that span. Houston has scored in 247 straight games dating back to Sept. 30, 2000.

« In 2019, Houston produced a strong rushing attack with five different players rushing for at least 100 yards in a game: **D'Eriq King** (twice), **Patrick Carr**, **Mulbah Car** (twice), **Kyle Porter** (twice) and **Clayton Tune**. The Cougars were one of seven programs to have at least four different players with at least one 100-yard rushing game along with Air Force, Georgia Southern, Louisiana, South Carolina, Wake Forest and Wyoming. Georgia Southern and Houston were the only two programs with five different players with at least one 100-yard rushing game.

« Over the last two seasons, Houston has recorded 26 plays of 50 yards or more, which ranks seventh among FBS teams since 2018. The only teams with more plays of 50 yards or more are Clemson (39), Memphis (39), Oklahoma (33), Alabama (32), Appalachian State (29) and Oklahoma State (29).

« Houston ranks ninth in the FBS since 2010 in scoring offense, averaging 36.4 points per game. The Cougars have scored 4,659 points in 128 games since the 2010 season started.

« Since 2015, Houston has 22 games with 500+ yards of total offense and eight games with 600+ yards. It has scored more than 40 points in 24 of 64 games and more than 50 points on seven different occasions.

## SECOND YEAR IN THE SYSTEM

« Over his coaching career, quarterbacks under **Dana Holgorsen** have seen their biggest jump in production from year one to year two. With **Clayton Tune** returning for his second season in Holgorsen's system, the junior looks to increase his production from 2019.

« Since 2008, quarterbacks under Holgorsen's tutelage have thrown for 30+ plus touchdowns in nine out of the last 12 seasons. During that same time span, he has helped three different quarterbacks passing for over 4,000 yards and helped five different signal callers throw for over 3,000 yards. Holgorsen's development at the quarterback position has produced a pair of NFL First Round draft picks (**Brandon Weeden**, 2012 - Cleveland Browns; **Geno Smith**, 2013 - New York Jets), while helping **Will Grier** at West Virginia earn a fourth-place Heisman finish in 2018 by throwing for 3,864 yards and 37 touchdowns.

## TUNED IN

« After two seasons of being pushed into the starting lineup, **Clayton Tune** enters his first season as the full-time starter under center. In seven starts in 2019, Tune recorded 1,533 passing yards and 15 touchdowns. He completed 106 passes on 179 attempts (59.2%) and averaged 219.0 yards per game through the air.

« Tune shined in his first start last season at North Texas, throwing for 124 yards and one touchdown on 16-of-20 passing. The sophomore rushed for a career-high 100 yards on 11 carries, including a 55-yard scramble late in the fourth quarter. At North Texas, Tune showed off his dual threat ability as he became the eighth UH quarterback to pass and rush for 100 yards in a single game in school history.

« After missing the Oct. 19 game at UConn, Tune returned to action against SMU and finished with a career-high 407 yards and two touchdowns on 18-of-33 passing. The Carrollton, Texas, native became the 11th Houston signal caller to throw for over 400 yards in a single game in school history.

« In the season finale against Navy, Tune set a career-high with four passing touchdowns and finished 23-for-35 through the air with 393 yards, while adding 61 rushing yards.

« Heading into his junior year, Tune already ranks 20th all-time in school history with 2,328 career passing yards.

BACK SUPPORT

« With 70.3 percent of its 2019 rushing yards returning in 2020, Houston returns six of its top eight rushers from a year ago. Senior **Kyle Porter** leads the way, starting nine games at running back and leading Houston a year ago with 615 yards rushing and three touchdowns on 130 attempts.

« Porter rushed for a career-best 120 yards and one touchdown against Prairie View A&M on only 19 attempts, averaging 6.3 yards per carry. He recorded his second 100-yard rushing game of the year against Cincinnati, logging 107 yards on 16 carries.

« Senior **Mulbah Car** returns after redshirting a year ago, playing in four games in 2019. Despite limited action, Car rushed for 375 yards and three touchdowns last season, averaging 6.4 yards per carry. Car had back-to-back 100-yard rushing games in the final two games he appeared in. He finished with 136 yards on 18 carries against SMU and followed up with a 132-yard, two-touchdown performance at UCF.

« In reserve duty, senior **Chandler Smith** added 32 attempts and recorded 298 yards on the ground. Sophomore **Kelan Walker** also appeared in 11 games and finished with seven carries for 30 yards last season. Taking advantage of the NCAA's new redshirt rule, redshirt freshman **Terrell Brown** recorded 10 carries for 23 yards in three games.

RECEIVING STRENGTH

« The Cougars have a pair of career 1,000-yard receivers on their roster heading into 2020 -- seniors **Keith Corbin** and **Marquez Stevenson**. Stevenson was named to The American's First Team for the second straight season, finishing with 52 receptions for 907 yards and nine touchdowns in 2019. He also recorded three 100-yard receiving games in 2019, including a career-high 211 yards against SMU. Stevenson closed out 2019 with eight catches for 133 yards and two touchdowns versus Navy.

« Stevenson ranks ninth among active FBS receivers in receiving yards with 1,962 career yards. His 18 career receiving touchdowns are tied for 12th-most in program history. Among FBS receivers in 2019, Stevenson was tied for second with three catches of 70 yards or more.

« Corbin, who redshirted after appearing in the first four games in 2019, logged 11 catches for 192 yards. The Beaumont, Texas, native has 1,115 career receiving yards. Corbin was second in The American and 21st nationally with 10 touchdown receptions in 2018.

« **Jeremy Singleton** enjoyed a breakout season in 2019, finishing with 26 receptions for 381 yards and three touchdowns. Singleton led the Cougars with 103 receiving yards at UConn and scored one touchdown.

« The trio is joined by two others with at least nine receptions in 2019 -- senior **Tre'Von Bradley**, who logged 16 catches for 326 yards and one touchdown, while **Bryson Smith** also returns for his junior season after finishing with nine catches for 62 yards last season.

« With starting tight end **Christian Trahan**, the Cougars have a reliable option back. In his first full season as a starter, Trahan ranked third on the team with 22 catches and finished with 244 receiving yards. Against Cincinnati, Trahan caught his first career touchdown. He logged a career-high 71 receiving yards on three catches against SMU and finished the year with four receptions for 54 yards versus Navy.

THE LINE ON THE LINE

« On the offensive line, co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach **Brandon Jones** returns a load of talent up front with a unit that has 69 combined starts.

« Senior **Braylon Jones** leads the way with 36 career starts between center and right guard. Jones started four games at center in 2019 before suffering a season-ending injury. Senior **Gio Pancotti** also returns after making 11 starts in 2019. Pancotti picked up nine starts at left guard a year ago, but also has shown versatility by playing at right guard and right tackle.

« After the injury to Jones early in the season, sophomore **Jack Freeman** stepped in and made seven starts at center and returns in 2020. Senior **Keenan Murphy** is back and has logged five career starts. Senior **Dennis Bardwell** (4), redshirt freshman **Patrick Paul** (3), sophomore **Max Banes** (2) and junior **Jordan Boatman** (1) all return after seeing significant action last year.

### TURNOVER U

« Since the start of the 2013 season, no program has taken the ball away from opposing offenses more than Houston with 184 turnovers forced in that time -- 13 in 2019, 24 in 2018, 21 in 2017, 18 in 2016, 35 in 2015, 30 in 2014 and 43 in 2013.

« UH has forced multiple turnovers in 58 of its last 97 games. The Cougars forced a season-high four turnovers at Tulsa in 2019.

« Houston has been opportunistic with its turnovers, ranking third nationally since 2010 with 49 non-offensive touchdowns including 26 defensive touchdowns over the last seven seasons.

« Houston is third among all FBS teams with 109 interceptions since 2013.

« Senior cornerback **Damarion Williams** recorded Houston's fifth interception return for a touchdown over the last three seasons last year at Tulsa.

« Heading into 2020, the Cougars return 100 percent of its interceptions, fumbles forced and fumble recoveries from last season.

### TURN IT LOOSE

« It was a common thought around the Houston football program that the Cougars' scout team defense in 2019 had elite talent that any program would welcome to their roster. Last season with **Marcus Jones** (Troy), **Kelvin Clemmons** (Minnesota), **Hasaan Hypolite** (Colorado) and **Thabo Mwaniki** (Oklahoma State) sitting out due to NCAA transfer rules, Houston's offense was tested each day by this group.

« The quartet looks to make an immediate impact on defense heading into 2020. Jones was a two-year starter at Troy at cornerback and also an All-American as a punt returner. Mwaniki made six starts for the Cowboys and was the only true freshman for Oklahoma State to start in 2017.

« In December, the Cougars also added graduate transfer **JoVanni Stewart**, who looks to slide into the nickel position. Stewart made 16 starts and appeared in 41 games for **Dana Holgorsen** at West Virginia from 2016-18.

### FOREMEN

« In 2020, the Cougars return several key pieces on the edge, while looking to replace interior starters **Aymiel Fleming** and **Blake Young**.

« Senior defensive end **Payton Turner** made 11 starts a year ago, and finished with 34 tackles, 4.0 sacks and 8.0 tackles for loss in 2019. Turner owns 23 career starts at defensive end and enters his senior season with 5.0 career sacks. The Houston, Texas, native ranked third on the team with 4.0 sacks in 2019.

« Senior **David Anenih** made eight starts in 2019 and finished with 26 tackles and 7.0 tackles for loss. Anenih's 5.0 sacks were tied for the team lead. Anenih led the way with seven tackles and had a career-high 2.5 sacks at Tulane.

« Junior defensive end **Derek Parish** logged four starts a year ago at BANDIT, finishing with 38 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. Parish made four starts in 2019.

« Junior **Logan Hall** started three games at defensive tackle, recording 14 tackles and 2.0 tackles for loss a year ago.

« Senior **Jamykal Neal** started the final two games of 2019 at defensive tackle. Neal finished last season with eight tackles.

« Senior defensive tackle **Olivier Charles-Pierre** was a key piece of Houston's rotation up front, recording 13 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. Charles-Pierre also logged one fumble recovery in 2019.

« Redshirt freshman **Nelson Ceaser** appeared in three games, taking advantage of the NCAA's redshirt rule in 2019. He logged his first career sack at UCF.

« The Cougars also added local product **Chidozie "Dot" Nwankwo**, a three-star recruit and finalist for The Touchdown Club of Houston Defensive Player of the Year.

### SMASHMOUTH FOOTBALL

« The linebacking corps returns four players with at least five starts from last year, including junior **Donavan Mutin**, who made 12 starts a year ago and senior **Grant Stuard** who makes the move to linebacker from nickel.

« Mutin ranked third on the team with 61 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and one interception.

« After a breakout season at nickel, Stuard transitions to linebacker for 2020 and led Houston with 93 tackles and 9.5 tackles for loss a year ago. Stuard had three double-digit tackles games in 2019, including a career-high 15 stops at UConn and was a second team all-conference selection.

« The Cougars also return junior **Terrance Edgeston**, who finished with 16 tackles and 3.0 tackles for loss in six starts at WILL linebacker. Houston also added another face to the linebackers room in the spring in junior college transfer **Malik Robinson**.

« Redshirt freshman **Mannie Nunnery** moves to linebacker after spending 2019 at safety. He appeared in one game a year ago, before redshirting.

« At SAM, **JoVanni Stewart** provides key experience after transferring to Houston from West Virginia in December. The Cougars have two players that are seeking playing time at the position behind Stewart. Sophomore **Jordan Moore** and junior **Amaud Willis-Dalton**.

## SAFE ZONE

- « The secondary looks to be a point of strength for Houston in 2020, as three full-time starters from last year's team return.
- « At cornerback, senior **Damarion Williams** made an immediate impact a year ago and made 12 starts in his first season in a Houston uniform. Williams led Houston with two interceptions and ranked second on the team with 73 tackles. He logged interceptions against Cincinnati and Tulsa. His 25-yard interception return for a touchdown was UH's first defensive score of the year.
- « Junior **Gervarius Owens** recorded 11 starts last season, including five starts at cornerback. Owens ranked fourth on the team with 54 tackles and picked up one interception in 12 games. The Moore, Okla., native also made six starts at safety.
- « Junior **Shaun Lewis** recorded three starts last year and has appeared in 24 career games. He finished with 24 tackles and one interception during his sophomore season. Junior **D.J. Small** also provides the Cougars with another option at cornerback. Small started the first two games of the year at cornerback and finished 2019 with 13 tackles.
- « At the safety positions, the Cougars return four players who made multiple starts in 2019. Senior **Deontay Anderson** returns after being a full-time starter for the past two seasons and logged 48 tackles and a team-high nine pass breakups. Against Cincinnati, Anderson led the way with nine tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss.
- « In his first season of full-time action, sophomore **Garrison Vaughn** recorded 35 tackles and added five pass breakups. Vaughn made five starts at safety and finished with a career-high eight tackles against Memphis.
- « The Cougars also add in more depth with transfers who sat out the 2019 season: **Marcus Jones** (Troy), **Kelvin Clemmons** (Minnesota), **Hasaan Hypolite** (Colorado) and **Thabo Mwaniki** (Oklahoma State) sitting out due to NCAA transfer rules.
- « Two names name that will be given an opportunity to make an impact right away will be junior college transfer **Jayce Rogers** who was a three-star prospect at Northwest Mississippi Community College. A two-year starter, Rogers finished with 30 tackles and two interceptions during the 2019 season. In May, Houston added cornerback **Art Green** from Hutchinson (Kan.) Community College. Green logged eight interceptions in two seasons at the JUCO level.

## SPOONMAN

- « Senior **Dalton Witherspoon** is back for his third and final season as Houston's kicker. Witherspoon enjoyed his most productive season at UH a year ago, recording 20 field goals on 24 attempts.
- « As a junior, Witherspoon made 15 consecutive field goals during 2019, establishing a new school record for a single season. The Moore, Okla., native was named The American's Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 9 after he hit three field goals (22 yards, 29 yards and a career-long 46 yards) against Prairie View A&M. Witherspoon has also made 112 consecutive point-after-attempts entering the 2020 season.
- « He enters the season with 27 career field goals, the third-most among active kickers in The American.

## AUSSIE RULES CONTINUE

- « The Cougars look to replace one Australian punter with another Aussie after senior **Dane Roy** became the program's first Ray Guy Finalist in 2019.
- « 26-year old freshman **Laine Wilkins** looks to take over the punting duties after joining the program in January.
- « Like Roy, Wilkins trained with ProKick Australia before signing with Houston in December.

## SPECIAL TEAMS STRENGTH

- « Houston returns two players that scored on kickoff and punt return touchdowns, while the Cougars led the FBS in blocked kick (6) and blocked punts (5) in 2019.
- « Houston ranked fifth in The American in kickoff return average (21.7) as senior **Marquez Stevenson** recorded a pair of kickoff touchdowns in 2019.
- « Stevenson became one of three players in school history to have multiple kickoff return touchdowns in the same season, joining **Tyrone Carrier** and **Brandon Wilson**.
- « Stevenson was one of 11 players to have multiple kickoff returns for touchdowns in 2019.
- « The Cougars also bring back **Bryson Smith**, who recorded one punt return touchdown in 2019.
- « Houston adds in Marcus Jones to its return game for both kickoffs and punts. Jones, the 2017 Sun Belt Freshman of the Year and All-America kickoff returner at Troy, owns four career kickoff returns for touchdowns.
- « In terms of kick coverage, few teams were better than Houston in 2019. The Cougars ranked first in FBS in net punting (43.59) and 14th in kickoff defense (17.6).

## A HOUSTON WIN WOULD ...

- « Improve Houston's program win-loss record to 446-374-15 all-time since 1946 and give Houston its 58th win since 2013, matching Baylor for the most among FBS programs in Texas during that time.
- « Even the all-time series against Baylor at 14-14-1 and move the Cougars to 7-8-1 in Waco.
- « Snap a two-game losing streak to Baylor and three-game losing streak against the Bears in Waco.
- « Move **Dana Holgorsen's** head coaching record to 6-2 against Baylor.
- « Make it 40-32-2 all-time in season openers including victories in 10 of the last 12.
- « Give Houston its 37th all-time win over a ranked opponent. The Cougars are 36-101-5 all-time against top-25 foes.

HEAD COACH DANA HOLGORSEN

SECOND SEASON AT HOUSTON (4-8) | NINTH SEASON OVERALL (65-49)

• Dana Holgorsen was named head coach at Houston on Jan. 1, 2019, after eight seasons as head coach at West Virginia. Holgorsen closed his tenure at West Virginia as the second-winningest coach in Mountaineer history with an eight-year record of 61-41. His 61 wins trailed only College Football Hall of Famer Don Nehlen for most wins in West Virginia history.

• He led the Mountaineers to bowl games in seven of his eight seasons including each of the last five seasons. His first season at West Virginia ended with a 70-33 rout of Clemson in the Orange Bowl. Throughout his career, Holgorsen has had 21 players earn All-America honors, win 10 national awards and 14 national award finalist honors.

• He has displayed his ability to prepare players for the next level as West Virginia had 10 NFL draft picks in first three rounds in the past seven years, second most in Big 12 with at least one Top-15 draft pick in four of the past seven years. In all, he had four NFL Top-15 draft picks during the past seven years, the most in the Big 12, and 20 players drafted in seven years at WVU, tied for second-most in the Big 12 during that span.

• An offensive genius, his passing offenses and total offensive output have ranked in the Top 10 nationally all but four years during the 14-year span since he became offensive coordinator at Texas Tech in 2005. He's had eight quarterbacks pass for 4,000 or more yards and 10 throw for 30 or more touchdowns in a season with 20 receivers finishing with 1,000 or more yards in a season, including 11 finish with 90 or more receptions and 16 finish with double figure TD receptions in a season. He is the only coach in West Virginia history to have coached a team with at least 450 rushing yards in a game (Oklahoma, 2012) and at least 450 yards passing in a game (six times).

• West Virginia has been ranked in both major polls at least one week in seven of his eight years including the entire 2018 season with several weeks inside the top 10. He had 10 wins over Top 25 opponents in his eight-year tenure at WVU.

• Holgorsen had a successful first season at WVU in 2011, coaching the Mountaineers to a 10-3 record, the Big East championship and a 70-33 Orange Bowl rout of Clemson. The victory was WVU's third Bowl Championship Series championship in school history and earned Holgorsen the First-Year Coach of the Year award by the Football Writers Association of America.

• Before West Virginia, Holgorsen spent the 2010 season as offensive coordinator at Oklahoma State. He was a finalist for the 2010 Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant, and also named the rivals.com Offensive Coordinator of the Year. The Cowboys led the nation in total offense during the regular season and finished No. 2 in passing offense and No. 3 in total and scoring offense. OSU averaged 520.23 yards per game in total offense, including 345.9 passing yards and 44.23 points per game..

• Postseason accolades rolled in for Holgorsen's offensive players as quarterback Brandon Weeden became the first OSU passer to earn first team All-Big 12 honors. He was a finalist for the Manning Award, given to the top quarterback in the nation. Receiver Justin Blackmon won the 2010 Biletnikoff Award, given to the top receiver in the nation, and running back Kendall Hunter was a finalist for the Doak Walker Award, given to the nation's top running back. Weeden, Hunter and Blackmon became only the second trio in NCAA history to pass for at least 3,000 yards, run for more than 1,500 yards and finish with more than 1,500 yards receiving in the same season.

• During his two-year tenure with Houston, his offenses put up explosive numbers, accounting for 563 yards of total offense per game, passing for 433.7 yards per game and totaling more than 42.2 points per game. His offense ranked No. 3 in total offense in 2008 and No. 1 in 2009. His quarterback, Case Keenum, led the nation in total offense in 2008 and 2009, totaling 403.2 yards per game as a sophomore and 416.4 yards his junior season. He also ranked among the Top 10 nationally in pass efficiency both years.

• Before his two-year stint with the Cougars, Holgorsen was a member of the coaching staff at Texas Tech from 2000-07, serving as the inside receivers coach from 2000-04, before being elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2005 and offensive coordinator in 2006-07. During his time in Lubbock, his offenses increased the amount of yardage from 324.8 yards of total offense to 529.6, an increase of more than 200 yards per game.

• In his two years as offensive coordinator, his squad was nationally ranked No. 8 in 2006 and No. 3 in 2007. In 2007, Texas Tech led the nation in passing (470.31), was No. 2 in total offense (529.62) and was No. 7 in scoring offense (40.9). Quarterback Graham Harrell led the nation in total offense and Biletnikoff Award winner Michael Crabtree led the nation in receptions per game and receiving yards per game. In 2006, the Red Raiders ranked No. 3 nationally in passing offense and No. 6 in total offense. Harrell once again was outstanding, finishing No. 3 nationally in total offense with 344.38 yards per game. Texas Tech led the nation in passing in 2005, was No. 4 in scoring offense (39.4) and No. 6 in total offense (495.83)

• Holgorsen also spent time at Valdosta State (1993-95) as the quarterbacks, receivers and special teams coach, Mississippi College (1996-98) as the quarterbacks, receivers and special teams coach and at Wingate (1999) as the quarterbacks and receivers coach. While at Valdosta State in 1994, Chris Hatcher won the Harlon Hill Trophy, the NCAA Division II Player of the Year award, by the second largest vote margin in the 17-year history of the award. Hatcher won the award after throwing for 4,076 yards and 55 touchdowns, against just 10 interceptions, while completing 367 of 508 passes. Hatcher led Division II in passing efficiency during the regular season and directed VSU to its first Division II post-season appearance.

# TDECU STADIUM

### BERT F. WINSTON BAND COMPLEX

A 39,089-square foot building on the east end of TDECU Stadium housing the Spirit of Houston Band Recital Halls and classroom spaces, Coach Bill Yeoman Hall and the UH Athletics Ticket Office.

### COACH BILL YEOMAN HALL

A 2,000-square foot tribute area to University of Houston history located on the northeast corner of TDECU Stadium. Serves as a gameday club for ticket holders in section 129 and north side loge boxes.

### DORIS NANTZ PRESS BOX

The Doris Nantz Press Box contains seats for 70 working media along with a press dining area and a wired photographer work room.

### FIELD SURFACE

The synthetic surface installed at TDECU Stadium is the SS-M manufactured by UBU. SS-M, a Speed Series product, is a slit-film turf blade with a sand/rubber combination for infill. It is the same surface installed at the Houston Football practice facility. The turf is designed to host a multitude of events, including but not limited to, high school football games, band practice, specific UH intramural events, etc.

### LEGENDS PLAZA

A plaza area recognizing the proud tradition of Houston Football at the northeast corner of TDECU Stadium.

### LOCKER ROOM (HOME)

State-of-the-art 5,000-square foot home locker room located at the southeast corner of TDECU Stadium. Views exclusive to the club area give those fans an opportunity to watch team members travel from the locker room to the field level.

### LOCKER ROOM (VISITOR)

Located at the west end of the stadium with a field entrance in the northwest corner of TDECU Stadium. Multi-functional locker room can be split and serve two separate teams simultaneously.

### ORIENTATION OF STADIUM

East-to-west giving fans and television audiences a spectacular view of the downtown Houston skyline while also keeping in line with the University's grid system and creating more efficient parking. Sun and shade studies were also conducted to improve the best level of comfort for Houston fans and not affect student-athletes.

### PARTY PATIOS

Four (4) open-air lower bowl party decks with 24 armchairs (20 inches wide). Both the east and west lower bowl end zones contain a party deck with two located on the north lower bowl sideline.

### PREMIUM SEATING

Consists of 5,000 of the 40,000 seats in the TDECU Stadium.

**Club Area** - The stylish club area is the ultimate Houston Football experience. With 12,400 square feet of multi-purpose club area overlooking the field of play, fans with access to the club area enjoy upscale food and drinks while receiving first-class hospitality on game days. The climate-controlled area also feature high-definition televisions and private restrooms. The area is also available to host special events, meetings and classes.

**Suites** - Spanning from end zone to end zone on the south side of TDECU Stadium with a view of downtown Houston, 26 premium suites each containing 12 outside padded arm chairs, four inside bar stools and entertainment area. Houston fans enjoy comfort and style in these 325-square foot suites with individual upscale service and amenities.

**Loge Boxes** - 42 loge boxes each containing four seats and high-definition monitors located throughout the stadium.

**Club Seats** - 766 armchair style padded club seats that are 22 inches wide and located in the lower bowl of TDECU Stadium.

**Additional Premium Seating** - 2,778 armchair seats that are 20 inches wide and 1,210 benches with backs with the majority located in the lower bowl of TDECU Stadium.

### SUITE DECKS

Two (2) open-air party suites located on the suite level positioned at each end (east and west end) of the suites. Each open-air suite contains 60 padded armchairs (21 inches wide).

### TICKET OFFICE

The University of Houston Athletics Ticket Office is located on the northeast corner of TDECU Stadium facing Cullen Blvd. The facility has eight exterior ticket-selling windows along with two interior windows in the ticket office lobby in close proximity to the stadium parking garage.

### VIDEO BOARD

State-of-the-art HD-video board located on the west end of TDECU Stadium. Sized at 2,584 square feet (38 feet high, 68 feet wide), the board was designed by Panasonic using Nichia technology.
