STORYLINES **COMING HOME**

- After a 1-1 road series to begin the 2020 season, the Bears are back in Waco to take on I-35 rival TCU.
- Under sixth-year head coach Ryan McGuyre, BU is 3-2 in home openers.
- The Bears currently own a two-match win streak in home openers, as last season Baylor topped Houston in four sets and in 2018, the Bears defeated LSU in four.

 Due to precautions taken in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Ferrell Center will be restricted to 25 percent capacity (just under 700 seats) in order to provide the safest environment for student-athletes, fans, coaches and staffs.

Two of Baylor volleyball's all-time top-four Ferrell Center crowds have come at home openers.

AGAINST THE HORNED FROGS

- Baylor leads the all-time series with TCU 17-7, including a 7-3 record under McGuyre.
- The Bears have won each of the last six meetings with the Horned Frogs, including a pair of 3-0 sweeps in 2019.
- BU is 6-2 against TCU in Waco since the Horned Frogs joined the Big 12 in 2012.

BOUNCING BACK

 After dropping the season opener in five sets at Kansas last Friday, the Bears bounced back to sweep the Jayhawks on Saturday in dominating fashion.

- The Bears had three players record double-digit kills in both matches at KU as Lauren Harrison and Kara McGhee reached double figures twice, and Yossiana Pressley and Marieke van der Mark each did so once.
- The Bears improved to 4-0 following a season-opening loss under McGuyre.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS

 Eight Bears saw their first action in a Baylor uniform last weekend: L/DS Gabby Brown, MB Laché Harper, OH Lauren Harrison, L/DS Jena Kelly, OPP AJ Koele, MB Andressa Parise, L/DS Emily Van Slate and S Callie Williams.

- Brown made her first-career start on Saturday, tallying two digs in action as a defensive specialist.
- Harrison led the Bears in kills in both matches with 15 and 14, respectively.
- Parise made her Division I debut on Friday, recording four kills and six blocks.
- Williams collected 47 assists, just eight off her career-high, in her first action as a Bear on Friday.
- Harper, Kelly, Koele and Van Slate each came off the bench for the Bears.

NEW IN 2020

 The revised 2020 schedule includes a new, 16-match format in which teams will play on back-to-back days against league opponents.

• The Bears will host four Big 12 opponents and travel for four road series, splitting the 2020 ledger evenly with eight home and eight away contests.

 The Big 12 has set the minimum number of players required to play a match this season at nine, which must include one setter. Teams falling below the benchmark, based on game week test results, could still elect to play as scheduled if so desired. Otherwise, upon approval by Big 12 Commissioner Bob Bowlsby, the match would be declared a no-contest if it cannot be moved to a later date.

Quick Hits

PRESEASON HONORS

• The Bears were picked to finish second in the Big 12 for the third consecutive season. Baylor received three first-place votes behind Texas, who was selected as the league's favorite.

• Yossiana Pressley, Hannah Sedwick and Marieke van der Mark were all selected to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING

• The Bears are coming off the most successful season in program history, going 29-2 and making a run to the NCAA National Semifinals.

• The Bears were ranked No. 1 in the nation for six weeks during the 2019 campaign. Prior to last season, BU had never been ranked higher than No. 12.

• Baylor broke its school record for single season wins with 29 and won a share of the Big 12 title for the first time in program history after posting a 15-1 conference record.

• BU's Nov. 9 win over Texas Tech gave the Bears their fourth-straight 20-win season under head coach Ryan McGuyre and four consecutive 20-win seasons for the first time in program history.

• The win over Texas Tech also gave the Bears double-digit wins in Big 12 play for the thirdstraight season, a new program best.

• The Bears were the final undefeated team in D1 college volleyball after holding a 16-0 record.

• Baylor had a program-best 31-set winning streak during the 2019 season, sweeping 10 straight matches after a fourth-set win against Houston on Sept. 12

THE QUEEN RETURNS

 Baylor returns the 2019 AVCA/ESPNW National Player of the Year in senior Yossiana Pressley after she averaged 5.41 kills per set and 5.83 points per set as a junior.

• Pressley was named the 2020 Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year and earned a spot on the preseason all-conference team.

• In 2019, Pressley posted nine 20-plus kill matches and two 30-plus kill matches.

• Pressley owns the school record for kills in a single match with 39, coming in a five-set victory at lowa State in 2018. She became the first Bear since Stevie Nicholas in 2001 to record over 35 kills in a match.

Pressley recorded eight double-doubles last season, moving her career total to 20.

Pressley has won a program-record 15 Big 12 weekly awards heading into her senior campaign.

NEW NAME, SAME GAME

• Hannah Sedwick, formerly Lockin, married Baylor football kicker Jay Sedwick on May 25, 2020.

• The preseason All-Big 12 selection enters her senior season sitting in fifth place on the Bears' all-time leaderboard with 3,288 career assists.

• Sedwick missed the opening series at Kansas due to injury. Her expected return to the court is unknown.

FLYING DUTCHWOMAN

 Redshirt junior opposite hitter Marieke van der Mark was named to the 2020 preseason All-Big 12 Team after a breakout 2019 campaign.

• The Papendrecht, Netherlands native set a career high with 16 kills against Purdue in last season's NCAA Regional Semifinals.

• The lefty attacker broke or matched her career high for kills in each of the Bears' first three postseason matches in 2019.

 van der Mark aspires to play for the Dutch National Team and has her sights set on wearing the Orange in the 2024 Olympics.

MCGHEE IN THE MIDDLE

• After a strong freshman season in which she recorded 158 kills and 139 total blocks in 2019, sophomore MB Kara McGhee is off to a hot start in 2020.

• The 6-4 San Antonio native leads the Bears with a .525 attack percentage after tallying a careerhigh 12 kills against Kansas in the season opener.

• Last season, McGhee earned All-Big 12 second team and All-Big 12 Rookie Team honors.

ANCHORING THE DEFENSE

• Baylor has no shortage of options in the back row, as junior L/DS Shanel Bramschreiber will anchor the Bears defense in 2020, with redshirt freshman OH/DS Campbell Bowden expected to contribute.

- With Bowden unavailable at Kansas due to non-COVID related illness, redshirt sophomore Emily
- Van Slate stepped up and led the team in digs over the opening weekend with 18 (2.25 per set).

• Jena Kelly and Gabby Brown, both redshirt freshmen defensive specialists, also saw playing time in the back row at Kansas, helping to shore up the Bears passing game.

FRESH FACES

• The Bears welcome five newcomers to the roster in 2020: transfer OH Lauren Harrison (North Carolina), graduate transfer MB Laché Harper (UCF), junior college transfer MB Andressa Parise (St. Petersburg College), freshman OH Cassie Davis (Highlands Ranch, Colo.) and freshman S/DS Giselle Vogel (Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.)

• Baylor will also welcome the addition of two former transfers who redshirted in 2019 due to NCAA transfer rules: junior S Callie Williams and sophomore OPP AJ Koele.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY

• Redshirt junior setter Callie Williams is the daughter of Baylor associate head coach Jason Williams and BUVB Hall of Famer Cory (Sivertson) Williams.

• Williams transferred to Baylor after spending two seasons at Tennessee, returning to her hometown of Waco where she was a standout for Midway High School's No. 1-ranked volleyball team.

• In her first action as a Bear, Williams collected 47 assists against Kansas on Friday, Sept. 25. She added assists in the second match with the Jayhawks, giving her 9.63 assists per set so far in 2020.

LEADERSHIP FROM THE TOP

 Reigning AVCA National Coach of the Year Ryan McGuyre is in his sixth season at the helm for the Bears.

- The Bears are 113-44 (.720) under McGuyre.
- McGuyre led the Bears to their first conference title in 2019, going 29-2 (15-1 Big 12).

• McGuyre has guided the Bears to the postseason in four-consecutive years, only falling short of the NCAA Tournament in his first season as Baylor's head coach (2015).

BEARS UNDER MCGUYRE

- Baylor has never lost a match while leading 2-0 under McGuyre (75-0).
- The Bears are 101-17 under McGuyre when out-killing their opponent.
- BU is 73-10 under McGuyre when hitting above .250.

FINISHING STRONG IN BIG 12 PLAY

• Baylor has taken massive strides since the arrival of head coach Ryan McGuyre, and the Bears finished in the top-four of the conference standings for the fourth-straight season in 2019.

• The Bears have either matched or surpassed their Big 12 preseason poll prediction. If BU were to continue the trend, it would need to finish second or win the Big 12 title in 2020.

RYAN MCGUYRE 6th season at Baylor 19th season overall (w) 28th season overall (w/m)

In five seasons at the helm of Baylor volleyball, head coach Ryan McGuyre has put the program amongst the sport's biggest names and into the national spotlight. After narrowly missing the postseason in his first year, McGuyre

and the Bears marched their way to the program's first Big 12 title and the NCAA National Semifinals in 2019 while earning the school's first No. 1 AVCA national ranking and No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament.

Entering his sixth season, McGuyre has compiled five consecutive winning seasons, four-straight 20-win seasons and a program-best four consecutive NCAA appearances since his arrival in 2015.

Named the 2019 AVCA and VolleyballMag.com National Coach of the Year, 2019 AVCA Southwest Region Coach of the Year, 2017 and 2019 Big 12 Coach of the Year, McGuyre has coached nine AVCA All-America selections, 11 All-Region honorees, 18 All-Big 12 awardees and 39 Academic All-Big 12 selections at Baylor.

McGuyre's teams continue to lock down home court advantage behind recordbreaking crowds at the Ferrell Center. Baylor has broken its own attendance record in three straight seasons. Last season's win against No. 1 Texas on Nov. 20 drew 7,357 fans, almost double the old attendance record set earlier against Tennessee in September.

Baylor went an unblemished 17-0 at home in 2019, securing wins over five ranked opponents and hosting through the NCAA Regional final to book a spot in Pittsburgh, Pa.

Along with matching the most home wins in program history with 13 in 2017, BU's season opener against LSU in 2018 drew a record crowd of 3,858. The team has had 10 top-10 crowds at the Ferrell Center under McGuyre.

McGuyre has coached at the collegiate level for both men and women since 1999 including head-coaching stints at California Baptist (CBU) and Biola University, both of which are faith-based institutions.

As associate head coach for two seasons, McGuyre and the Florida State Seminoles finished a 2014 NCAA Tournament run reaching the Sweet 16 before a loss to national runner-up, BYU. Prior to his arrival at Florida State, McGuyre was an assistant at Maryland for one season following a 10-year head coaching stint at CBU. There, he was the head coach for both the men's and women's programs, and he crafted a men's program that won six NAIA national championships and three women's national titles.

Among many accolades at CBU, McGuyre was named the 2005 NAIA Men's National Coach of the Year and in 2011 the NCCAA Division I National Coach of the Year. In 2010, he made history by being named both the AVCA Men's and Women's NAIA National Coach of the Year in the same calendar year.

A 1998 graduate of Biola, McGuyre is married to former University of Hawaii volleyball standout and USA National Team member Jennifer (Roberts) McGuyre. The couple has three children: sons, Tryston and Ryder, and a daughter, Kitana.


