STORY LINES

- No. 2/1 Baylor takes on No. 5/10 Illinois in the Jimmy V Classic Wednesday night in Indianapolis.
- This is the 6th top-5 matchup in Baylor program history, the first in non-conference play or at a neutral site.
- Baylor is No. 1 in the preseason coaches' poll and No. 2 in the AP Top 25 – both highest preseason rankings in program history. This is the 7th time Baylor has been ranked No. 1 nationally.
- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in 3 of the last 5 seasons.
- Baylor is facing Illinois for the 4th time and is 0-3 in the all-time series (1986, 1987, 2014).
- Baylor returned four All-Big 12 players from a 2019-20 team which went 26-4 and spent five weeks ranked No. 1 nationally. The Bears finished last season ranked No. 4 in the coaches poll (No. 5 in AP).
- 2020 Big 12 Coach of the Year **Scott Drew** will coach his first game of the season after missing two games due to COVID-19. Associate head coach **Jerome Tang** served as BU's acting head coach.
- Baylor opened with a 112-82 win over ULL on Saturday. BU's 112 points were its most since 2017.
- BU then beat Washington 86-52 on Sunday in Las Vegas, out-rebounding the Huskies 50-19.
- Baylor is on a school-record streak of 13 straight weeks top-5 ranked (previously 6 straight in 2017).
- BU's streak of 22 consecutive AP polls ranked ties the 2nd-longest in program history (25 in 2016-17).
- Baylor's defense forced 15+ turnovers in 19 of 32 games since the start of the 2019-20 season.
- BU has led by at least 5 points in 32 consecutive games and built a double-digit lead in 26 of 32 games.
- Among BU returners is **Jared Butler**, who is the first preseason AP All-American in program history.
- BU also welcomes back **MaCio Teague**, an all-conference pick in all 3 of his collegiate seasons.
- BU returns two players who were semifinalists for the 2020 Naismith Defensive Player of the Year. **Mark Vital** was 1 of 4 finalists, while **Davion Mitchell** joined Vital among the 10 semifinalists.
- Baylor is playing its 244th game as a ranked team under Drew – BU was ranked in 2 of 2197 games over the program's 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 241 of 423 games.
- BU has been top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage a nation's-best 7 straight years.
- Baylor is 1 of 5 Power-5 programs to win 18+ games in each of the last 12 seasons since 2008, joining Duke, Kansas, Kentucky and Michigan State.
- Baylor has won 20+ games in 11 of the last 13 years. The Bears reached the 20-win mark only 3 times in 101 seasons prior to 2008. BU is averaging 24 wins per season since 2008.
- Head coach **Scott Drew** is in his 18th season in Waco and is BU's all-time wins leader (344-213).
- BU has advanced to 8 consecutive postseasons, tied as the nation's 10th-longest active streak.
- BU was picked to win the Big 12 in the league's preseason coaches' poll for the first time.
- Baylor signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history (No. 4) earlier this month. BU inked 5-star Kendall Brown, 4-star Langston Love and 4-star Jeremy Sochon for the 2021-22 season.
- Baylor has defeated 8 top-10 teams in the last 4+ seasons, including a 6-4 mark vs. top-10 teams in Waco.
- The Bears have now been ranked in every AP Top 25 spot except No. 8 during the 17-year Drew era.
- BU is 12-2 all-time as a No. 1-ranked team, including 10-1 over the last two seasons.

QUICK HITS

- Baylor's 23-game winning streak last season was the longest ever by a Big 12 team (previously 22 by 1996-97 KU).
- BU's 13-game conference winning streak was the longest in school history (previously 11 in 1946 SWC).
- Baylor has won 20+ games in 11 of the last 13 seasons after recording only three 20-win seasons in the previous 100 years of Baylor Basketball (1946, 1948, 1988).
- Baylor is 53-5 when leading at halftime over the last 4 seasons since 2017-18 (21-2 last season).
- Baylor has won 89% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (171-21).
- BU is 116-23 since 2015-16 when leading at any point in the 2nd half of a game (26-3 last season).
- Baylor is 219-97 over 9+ seasons, averaging 24 wins per season since 2011-12.
- Baylor's 219 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (264).
- Baylor is 310-144 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- BU returns 8 players with at least 30 games of DI experience, including a pair of sophomore transfers who will join the rotation after sitting out last season – Adam Flagler and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua.
- Eight of Baylor's players either have used or are currently using a redshirt year. Four after transferring to BU – Flagler, Mitchell, Tchamwa Tchatchoua and Teague, and four as freshmen – Moffatt, Turner, Vital and Dainja.
- Nine of Baylor's 10 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (15 of last 16 seasons).
- Baylor is 1 of 14 teams nationally to appear in every postseason since 2012 (6 NCAAs, 2 NITs).
- Baylor has the nation's 10th-longest active streak with at least one 3-point FG made in 935 straight games – the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was more than 30 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).
- BU is 6-1 all-time in Big 12/SEC Challenges, the best record of any team in either league. Combined with a 3-1 mark in the Big 12/Pac-10 Series and 1-0 in the Big 12/Big East Battle, Baylor is 10-2 in conference challenges.
- Baylor has won 6 tournament titles under Drew (2007 Paradise Jam, 2011 Las Vegas Classic, 2013 NIT, 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2017 Hall of Fame Classic and 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational).

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- Scott Drew became Baylor head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 18th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (344).
- Drew is coaching his 558th game at Baylor (344-213). His .618 winning percentage is best in BU history among coaches with 40+ games, and he's the program's all-time wins leader.
- Baylor has a .683 winning percentage (310-144) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .693 winning percentage (219-97) over the last 9+ seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (50) is the youngest of 12 coaches nationally to take his current program to four Sweet 16s since 2010.
- Baylor is playing its 244th game as a ranked team in Drew's 18 seasons. BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program's first 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 241 of 423 games.
- In Drew's first 17 seasons at Baylor, 44 players have gone on to professional careers.

UP NEXT

- BU remains in Indianapolis for a showdown with No. 1/2 Gonzaga at noon CT Saturday on CBS.
- The Bears then return to Waco to host consecutive home games vs. Nicholls State (Dec. 8) and Texas (Dec. 13).
- Baylor's first true road game of the season follows on Dec. 19 at Kansas State.

2020-21 BAYLOR BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

ONE OF FOUR PROGRAMS RANKED NO. 1 THREE TIMES SINCE 2017

- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in three seasons since 2017.
- Baylor is ranked No. 1 in one of the national polls for the seventh time in program history. BU was No. 1 for the first time on Jan. 9, 2017, spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 2020 and was named preseason No. 1 this year.
- The Bears have been ranked in 24 of 25 AP Top 25 spots during the Drew era (all since 2008). The only spot Baylor hasn't been ranked in the AP poll is No. 8.

SIXTH AND SEVENTH TOP-5 MATCHUPS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- No. 2 Baylor will play consecutive top-5 matchups this week, taking on No. 5 Illinois and No. 1 Gonzaga.
- This will mark the 6th and 7th games in BU history matching two top-5 teams, the first in non-conference play.
- After this week, Baylor will have played 4 top-5 matchups in the 2020 calendar year, more than the 3 top-5 matchups in Baylor's Basketball's previous 114 years of competition (2012, 2017, 2017).
- Baylor's first win in a top-5 matchup came at No. 3 Kansas on Jan. 11, 2020, when No. 4 BU won 67-55.

FOUR ALL-BIG 12 PLAYERS RETURN

- All five Baylor starters were named to 2020 All-Big 12 teams, making BU the first team in the league's 24-year history with five players on All-Big 12 teams, and four of those players are back for the 2020-21 season.
- **Jared Butler** became Baylor's first underclassman named first-team All-Conference since Terry Teagle in 1980, and he was named a consensus third-team All-American. He's the Bears' first AP Preseason All-American.
- **MaCio Teague** has been all-conference in all three of his previous seasons. He was a first-team All-Big South honoree while at UNC Asheville in 2017 and 2018 and earned second-team All-Big 12 honors in 2020.
- **Mark Vital** and **Davion Mitchell** were both third-team All-Big 12 and Big 12 All-Defensive Team choices.

THIRTEEN STRAIGHT WEEKS AP TOP-5 RANKED

- BU is No. 2 in this week's AP Top 25, extending its school-record streak to 13 straight weeks top-5 ranked.
- Baylor's 5-week streak at No. 1 last season was the longest since Kentucky in 2015.
- Baylor's streak of 22 consecutive weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 ties the 2nd-longest streak in program history – 25 consecutive polls in 2016-17, 22 in 2011-12 and 22 in 2019-20.

SERIES HISTORY VS. ILLINOIS

- Baylor and Illinois will meet for the fourth time, and the Bears are seeking their first win in the series.
- BU last faced Illinois in the 2014 Las Vegas Invitational championship game, a 62-54 Illini win. Prior to that, the teams met in Champaign in 1986 (92-68 Illini win) and in the 1987 Maui Invitational (73-50 Illini win).
- Baylor is 4-0 against Brad Underwood-coached teams – 2-0 vs. Oklahoma State, 2-0 vs. SFA.

DREW'S CREW VS. BIG TEN

- Baylor is facing a Big Ten opponent for the first time since defeating Wisconsin in the 2017 Hall of Fame Classic.
- The Bears are 6-6 against current Big Ten teams during the Drew era, including 5-3 over the last 10 seasons. Comparatively, Baylor is 11-1 against the Big East and 13-5 vs. the Pac-12 during his Drew's tenure.
- Drew's Bears have notched wins over Michigan State (2016-17), Wisconsin (2017-18), Nebraska (2013-14), Iowa (2012-13), Northwestern (2011-12) and Purdue (2004-05) and have losses against Illinois (2014-15), Wisconsin (2013-14), Northwestern (2012-13), Penn State (2008-09) and Purdue (2007-08 & 2003-04).

A WIN WOULD ...

- Be Drew's 345th win at Baylor and improve Baylor's record to 311-144 since 2007-08.
- Give Baylor a win over an AP Top 10 team for the 15th time in the Drew era, improving to 9-9 since 2016-17.
- Improve Baylor to 13-2 all-time when playing as a No. 1-ranked team and 32-10 all-time as an AP Top 5 team.
- Be Baylor's first win over Illinois (1-3) and give the Bears a 6-3 record vs. Big Ten teams in the last 10 seasons.

WINNING AWAY FROM HOME VS. NON-BIG 12 TEAMS

- Baylor is 62-32 against non-conference teams in neutral/road games in the Scott Drew era, including a 39-17 record in away games against non-Big 12 teams since 2011-12.
- Baylor is 59-26 in road/neutral non-conference games since the 2007-08 season (2-0 in 2020-21; 3-1 in 2019-20; 3-3 in 2018-19; 2-2 in 2017-18; 6-1 in 2016-17; 1-3 in 2015-16; 3-2 in 2014-15; 6-2 in 2013-14; 5-2 in 2012-13; 8-1 in 2011-12; 1-3 in 2010-11; 8-2 in 2009-10; 6-2 in 2008-09; 5-2 in 2007-08).

TWO 30-POINT WINS IN VEGAS TO OPEN SEASON

- Baylor's season started three days later than expected, but the Bears came out strong scoring 112 points in a 30-point win over Louisiana-Lafayette and then taking down Washington 86-52 the following day.
- Baylor is averaging 14 made 3-pointers per game and 23 assists per game, while out-rebounding opponents 46-24.
- The Bears drained 15 treys and had 25 assists on their way to 112 points in the opener vs. Louisiana-Lafayette.
- BU out-rebounded Washington 50-19, with Mark Vital (15) recording as many rebounds as all Washington players combined (15 + 4 team rebounds). It was the second time Vital accomplished that feat (2018-19 at Arizona).

BUTLER BACK AFTER ALL-AMERICA SOPHOMORE SEASON

- **Jared Butler** was named to the Sporting News All-America Third Team and All-Big 12 First Team, becoming Baylor's first underclassman to earn All-America or All-Conference first team honors since Terry Teagle in 1980.
- Butler led Baylor in scoring in 17 of 30 games last season after doing so in 6 of 34 games as a freshman.
- Butler had 8 games with 20+ points last season, including his 2nd career 30-point game – 30 vs. UCA, 22 vs. Villanova, 20 vs. UMES, 22 at Kansas, 20 at K-State, 21 vs. WVU, 22 at Oklahoma and 21 at WVU.
- Butler ranked top-10 in the Big 12 in scoring (3rd, 16.0), 3-pointers (2nd, 2.6/gm), 3-point percentage (6th, .381), field goal percentage (7th, .421), steals (7th, 1.6) and assists (10th, 3.1).

VITAL TO BEARS' SUCCESS

- **Mark Vital** is back after being named one of 4 Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Award finalists in 2020.
- He was named to the All-Big 12 Third Team and was a unanimous All-Defensive Team selection.
- In Baylor's Nov. 29, 2020 game vs. Washington, Vital's 15 rebounds matched all Washington players combined (15).
- Vital did not attempt a field goal in the Feb. 1, 2020 win over TCU, but he had a +13 plus-minus in 22 minutes.
- Vital filled the stat sheet in the Jan. 29 win at Iowa State, posting 8 points, 9 rebounds and 7 assists in 31 minutes.

TEAGUE LOOKING FOR FOURTH ALL-CONFERENCE SEASON

- **MaCio Teague** has earned all-conference honors in all 3 collegiate seasons – All-Big South First Team in 2017 and 2018 at UNC Asheville and All-Big 12 Second Team in 2020 at Baylor.
- Teague played in 90 consecutive games and made 86 consecutive starts before sitting out two games with a broken wrist. He has started all but 3 games (Nov. 20, 2016, Feb. 18, 2020, Feb. 22, 2020) in his career.
- Teague led Baylor in scoring in 6 straight games (15+ points in each) before injuring his wrist at Texas on Feb. 10.
- Last season, Teague ranked 10th in the Big 12 in scoring (13.9), 3rd in free throw percentage (.848), 7th in 3-pointers (2.1/gm), 8th in 3-point percentage (.355) and 8th in minutes (32.7).
- Baylor is 23-1 when Teague scores 10+ points. He has averaged 9.5 ppg in BU's four losses (8, 8, 13, 9).

MITCHELL RETURNS AS STARTING POINT GUARD

- **Davion Mitchell** was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, selected to the All-Big 12 Third Team and Big 12 All-Defensive Team and was a unanimous choice on the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.
- Mitchell started all 30 games last season after coming off the bench in all 34 games during his freshman season at Auburn (2017-18). He needed only 14 games to pass his freshman season scoring total (126).
- Mitchell has made a 3-pointer in 23 of the last 28 games and is shooting 35% on 3FGs in that stretch (35-of-99). Prior to that stretch, he shot .264 (19-of-72) from downtown over his first 38 collegiate games.
- Last season, he ranked 8th in the Big 12 in steals (1.5), 4th in A:T ratio (1.70) and 7th in assists (3.8).
- Mitchell joined Mark Vital to make BU the only school with two Naismith Defensive Player of the Year semifinalists.
- When Mitchell has played 20+ minutes, his collegiate teams are 39-4 (12-0 at Auburn, 27-4 at Baylor).
- When Mitchell scores 10+ points, his collegiate teams are 17-1 (2-0 at Auburn, 15-1 at Baylor).

SECOND-MOST WINS AMONG BIG 12 TEAMS SINCE 2011-12

- Baylor's 219-97 record since 2011-12 trails only Kansas (265-64) among Big 12 teams (thru 11/29/20).
- Iowa State (196-113) is 3rd, West Virginia (193-120) is 4th, Kansas State (182-124) is 5th, Oklahoma (180-117) is 6th, Texas (171-135) is 7th, Oklahoma St. (164-135) is 8th, Texas Tech (161-138) is 9th and TCU (155-150) is 10th.
- Baylor has averaged 24.1 wins per season over the last nine seasons since 2011-12.

BREAKTHROUGH IN BIG 12

- BU is 114-80 in Big 12 play in 11 seasons since 2010 after going 59-149 in the league's first 13 seasons.
- BU is 128-97 in Big 12 play in 13 seasons since 2008 after going 45-131 in the league's first 11 seasons.
- Baylor is 41-40 in Big 12 road games since 2012, second-best in the league behind only Kansas (54-27).
- BU has won 8+ Big 12 games in 9 straight seasons after winning 8+ just 3 times in the league's first 15 years.
- BU has recorded double-digit Big 12 wins in 5 of the last 6 years and 7 of the last 11 seasons.

- The Bears recorded double-digit non-conference wins for the 6th time in the last 7 years last season.
- Baylor is 13-5 vs. the Pac-12 during the Drew era, 11-1 against the Big East during the Drew era and 16-10 against the SEC during the Drew era, including 11-5 since 2012-13 and 6-1 in the Big 12/SEC Challenge.

- Baylor has posted a combined 157-34 record in November and December games during the Drew era, including a 75-12 mark in November and December games since 2013.
- The Bears are 79-15 in November games and 78-19 in December contests.
- BU is 39-7 in November games since 2013, with the only losses to No. 8 Syracuse (2013), vs. Illinois (2014) in Las Vegas, at No. 25 Oregon (2015), at No. 21 Xavier (2017), vs. Texas Southern (2018), vs. Ole Miss (2018) in Florida and vs. Washington (2019) in Alaska.
- BU is 36-5 in December games since 2013, with the only losses at No. 24 Texas A&M (2015), vs. No. 8 Wichita State (2017), at No. 22 Texas Tech (2017), at Wichita State (2018) and vs. SFA (2018).

- Baylor has gone 29-33 against ranked teams since the start of the 2014-15 season (6-1 last season).

- Baylor is on a school-record streak of eight consecutive postseason berths, surpassing the total number of postseason berths in the program's 97 seasons prior to the **Scott Drew** era.
- Baylor is 1 of 14 teams to appear in every postseason since 2012, joining Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Iona, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan State, New Mexico State, North Carolina, Oregon, Saint Mary's, Virginia and Wichita State.
- BU earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2019 and NIT bids in 2013 and 2018.
- Baylor has made postseason appearances in 11 of 12 seasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor's only postseason berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).
- Baylor is 21-10 in postseason national tournaments during the Drew era after going 3-9 prior to Drew's arrival.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Drew is in his 18th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (344).
- Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren't ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school — Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson and Taurean Prince.
- Drew has graduated 51 players during his Baylor tenure, averaging 3 graduates per season.
- The Bears have advanced to postseason play in a school-record eight straight seasons (6 NCAA, 2 NIT).
- Baylor is 23-4 in regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, including 4 regular-season tournament titles.
- Drew has won 20+ games in 11 of the last 13 years — the Bears had 3 seasons of 20+ wins prior to his arrival.

PROTECTING HALFTIME LEADS

- Baylor is 56-5 in its last 61 games when leading at the half, including 21-2 last year, 15-3 in 2019 and 15-0 in 2018.

- Baylor's starting point guard has earned All-Big 12 recognition in 15 of 16 seasons since 2004-05.
- Davion Mitchell (2020), Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

FIVE MARCH MADNESS APPEARANCES IN LAST SIX TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor has appeared in five of the last six NCAA Tournaments dating back to 2014.
- BU is 1 of 22 teams (1 of 15 in Power-5) to appear in five NCAA Tournaments since 2014, joining Arizona, Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Iowa State, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan, Michigan State, New Mexico State, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Providence, Purdue, VCU, Villanova, Virginia, Wichita State, Wisconsin and Xavier.

- In Scott Drew's 16 years at Baylor, 43 of his players have gone on to professional careers.
- Five of Drew's players were in the NBA recently, and they all graduated from Baylor – Quincy Acy (Suns), Johnathan Motley (Suns), Royce O'Neale (Jazz), Taurean Prince (Nets) and Ekpe Udoh (Jazz).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT — FROM UNRANKED TO NBA DRAFT PICKS

- Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren't ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school.
- The only other schools with three such players were Colorado, Marquette, Missouri, New Mexico and Connecticut.
- Baylor developed Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson and Taurean Prince into NBA Draft picks after joining the program as unranked recruits.

HISTORY OF DEVELOPMENT WITH REDSHIRTS

- Baylor has a track record of success when redshirting players. Ekpe Udoh, Johnathan Motley, Cory Jefferson, Brady Heslip, Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. and Manu Lecomte have all gone on to professional careers after redshirting.
- Mark Vital, Freddie Gillespie, MaCio Teague and Davion Mitchell have earned All-Big 12 honors after redshirting.
- Adam Flagler and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua redshirted last season while sitting out to satisfy NCAA transfer rules, while freshman Jordan Turner elected to redshirt last year. Dain Dainja is redshirting in 2020-21.

OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING BECOMING A BAYLOR STAPLE

- Baylor has ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage in every season since 2013-14, including five times ranked in the nation's top-4. The Bears only cracked the top-20 once in Drew's first 10 years.
- Baylor's 7-year streak is the nation's best, and West Virginia (6 years) is the only other team with a 3+ year streak.
- The Bears ranked 8th nationally in offensive rebounding percentage (35.7) in 2019-20.
- Baylor finished ranked No. 2 nationally in 2018-19, No. 9 in 2017-18, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16, No. 1 in 2014-15 and No. 3 in 2013-14. Prior to that top-10 streak, BU's best rank was No. 16 in 2011-12.

BAYLOR BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

- Baylor basketball is aired live via the Baylor Sports Network from Learfield IMG College on ESPN Central Texas and flagship station 1660AM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco and worldwide on Sirius/XM Radio.
- Games are broadcast by the "Voice of the Bears" John Morris, who was named NSMA 2019 Texas co-Sportscaster of the Year on Jan. 13, 2020, and former Baylor basketball standout Pat Nunley.
- Morris is in his 37th year doing BU broadcasts (26th full-time), and Nunley is in his 40th season as analyst.
- All of Baylor's games can be heard live on the Internet at www.BaylorBears.com and via the TuneIn App.

SCOTT DREW COACHING TREE

- Three current Division I head coaches took their first DI head coaching jobs after stints on Scott Drew's BU staff.
- Matthew Driscoll is in his 12th season as head coach at North Florida after six seasons as a Baylor assistant.
- Grant McCasland is in his fourth season as head coach at North Texas. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.
- Paul Mills is in his fourth season as head coach at Oral Roberts. He was a member of Drew's original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.

GRADUATING 91 PERCENT OF SENIORS

- Since Scott Drew took over the Baylor Basketball program in 2003, 34 of 37 scholarship players who have played their fourth years of collegiate eligibility under Drew have graduated from Baylor.

ENTIRE STAFF RETURNS

- Scott Drew's entire coaching staff returns for the 2020-21 season, a fourth-straight season of continuity.
- Jerome Tang is in his fourth season as associate head coach and has been on Drew's staff all 18 seasons at Baylor.
- Assistant coaches Alvin Brooks III (fifth season) and John Jakus (fourth season) also return to the bench.
- Special assistant & director of player development Jared Nuness is back for his 11th season, while director of basketball operations Aditya Malhotra returns for his 8th season.
