STORY LINES

- No. 4/4 Baylor returns from winning the Battle 4 Atlantis title by hosting UAPB at 4 pm CT Saturday.
- BU has the nation's longest winning streak (13), with 9 at neutral sites and all wins by 8+ points.
- Baylor has won 31 straight non-conference games (+22.2 average margin) dating back to Nov. 2020.
- BU has won 17-straight home games, setting a new Ferrell Center record for longest winning streak.
- Baylor is 29-1 at home over the last 2+ seasons, with the lone loss by 3 to Kansas on Feb. 22, 2020.
- Baylor is now 26-4 in regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, including 5 regular-season tournament titles. BU (2016, 2021) joined Villanova (2013, 2017) as the only 2-time Battle 4 Atlantis Champions.
- Baylor has won 4 of its last 5 regular-season tournaments – 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis (Louisville), 2017 Hall of Fame Classic (Creighton), 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational (Villanova), 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis (Michigan State).
- BU is allowing only 4.7 second-chance points per game, while scoring 13.9 second-chance points.
- Baylor is averaging 15 more field goal attempts per game than its opponents (BU 67.1, OPP 52.1).
- Baylor ranks top-10 nationally in steals (4th, 11.7/game), turnovers forced (4th, 20.4/game), turnover margin (4th, +8.0/game), scoring margin (6th, +25.1/game), assists (9th, 19.3/game),
- BU defeated now-No. 22-ranked Michigan State, 75-58, in the Nov. 26 Battle 4 Atlantis title game.
- Baylor was No. 8 in the preseason AP Top-25, snapping a school-record streak of 29-straight weeks top-5 ranked. The Bears are currently on a school-record streak of 33-straight weeks top-10 ranked.
- Baylor has been ranked in all 25 spots in the AP Top 25 at some point in the last 7 years.
- BU's 41-straight weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 is the nation's 3rd-longest behind Gonzaga and Villanova.
- Head coach **Scott Drew** is in his 19th season at Baylor with a school-record 377 career victories, including a 17-8 mark in NCAA Tournaments, which is the 7th-best mark among active coaches.
- **Drew** has swept AP and coaches' Big 12 Coach of the Year honors each of the last two seasons.
- BU has led by at least 4 points in all 67 games since the start of the 2019-20 season and built a double-digit lead in 58 of 67 games, including 34 of 37 games since the start of last season.
- Baylor went 11-2 vs. AP Top 25 teams last season, including 7-0 against AP Top 10 teams.
- Baylor returned seven letterwinners from the 2021 national championship team, with **Flo Thamba** as the lone returning starter. The four departed starters are all playing in the NBA, G-League or NFL.
- Among BU returners is **Matthew Mayer**, who made his career-first start in the opener after coming off the bench in 93 games over his first 3 seasons. He is on 6-player the Preseason All-Big 12 team.
- The Bears also welcomed back **Adam Flagler**, who came off the bench in 28 games last season and is now starting. He joins Mayer on the Naismith Trophy and Wooden Award preseason watch lists.
- BU also returned **LJ Cryer**, **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua**, **Jordan Turner** and **Zach Loveday**.
- Baylor welcomed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history (No. 4). Trio of freshmen includes 5-star **Kendall Brown** and 4-stars **Jeremy Sochan** and **Langston Love** (out for year with injury).
- BU added Arizona transfer **James Akinjo**, who is also on the Naismith Trophy watch list and is a preseason All-America honorable mention (The Athletic). He was first-team All-Pac 12 last season.

QUICK HITS

- Baylor's 61-6 record since the start of the 2019-20 season is the nation's best among Power-5 conference teams.
- BU is playing its 286th game as a ranked team under Drew – BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program's 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since January 2010, BU has been ranked in 270 of 407 games.
- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in 3 of 5 seasons since 2017.
- Baylor and Kansas are the only Power-5 schools to win 18+ games every year since 2008.
- BU finished last season ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding pct (No. 8) for a 7th consecutive year.
- BU led the nation in 3-point pct. last season (.413) and ranked 3rd nationally in turnover margin (+5.5) and scoring margin (+17.4). The Bears were also top-10 in scoring (6th, 82.9), steals (9th, 8.9/gm) and assists (10th, 16.9/gm).
- Baylor's streak of 9 consecutive postseasons is tied as the nation's 7th-longest active streak.
- Baylor's 2 losses last seasons were its fewest losses since going 13-0 in 1911-12.
- Baylor is 40-21 in postseason tournaments (conference, national) over the last 13 seasons.
- Baylor has won 20+ games in 12 of the last 14 seasons after recording only three 20-win seasons in the previous 100 years of Baylor Basketball (1946, 1948, 1988).
- Baylor is 14-3 in Big 12 road games over the last 2 seasons (rest of league is 59-99 in B12 road games).
- Baylor is 82-5 when leading at halftime over the last 4+ seasons (52-2 over last 2+ seasons, 24-0 last season).
- In the last two seasons, Baylor has recorded the longest winning streak in the Big 12 Conference's 26-year history (23 wins in 2019-20) and 4th-longest winning streak in Big 12 history (18 wins in 2020-21).
- Baylor has won 90% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (200-21).
- BU is 61-4 when leading at any point in the 2nd half of a game over the last 2+ seasons.
- Baylor is 252-99 over the last 10+ seasons, averaging 24.5 wins per season since 2011-12.
- Baylor's 252 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (290).
- Baylor is 343-146 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- Six of Baylor's players have used or are currently using a redshirt year. Two after transferring to BU (Flagler, Tchamwa Tchatchoua), one before transferring (Bonner) and three as freshmen – Turner, Dainja and Love.
- Ten of Baylor's 11 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (16 of last 17 seasons).
- Baylor is 1 of 10 teams nationally to appear in every postseason since 2012 (7 NCAAs, 2 NITs).
- Baylor has the nation's 10th-longest active streak with at least one 3-point FG made in 969 straight games — the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was more than 30 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).
- BU is 7-1 all-time in Big 12/SEC Challenges, the best record of any team in either league. Combined with a 3-1 mark in the Big 12/Pac-10 Series and 1-0 in the Big 12/Big East Battle, Baylor is 11-2 in conference challenges.
- Baylor has won 8 tournament titles under Drew – 2007 Paradise Jam, 2011 Las Vegas Classic, 2013 NIT, 2016 & 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2017 Hall of Fame Classic, 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational and 2021 NCAA Championship.

ANOTHER BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS TITLE

- Baylor won its second Battle 4 Atlantis title (2016, 2021) with wins over Arizona State, VCU and Michigan State. The Bears joined Villanova (2013, 2017) as the only 2-time Battle 4 Atlantis Champions.
- Baylor is now 39-12 in regular-season tournaments during the Drew era, including 26-4 since 2013-14.
- James Akinjo was named 2021 B4A MVP, while Kendall Brown joined him on the All-Tournament Team.
- Baylor defeated VCU, Michigan State and Louisville, respectively, to win the 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis.

NOTEABLE STREAKS

- Baylor has won 31-consecutive games when leading at halftime (last loss Feb. 29, 2020 at TCU).
- Baylor has won a school-record 17-consecutive home games (last loss Feb. 22, 2020 vs. Kansas).
- Baylor has won 17-consecutive non-conference home games (last loss Dec. 18, 2018 vs. SFA).
- Baylor has won 17-consecutive non-conference road/neutral games (last loss Nov. 8, 2019 vs. Washington).
- Baylor has won 27-straight games when shooting 50% or higher (last loss March 18, 2018 vs. Mississippi State).
- BU has won 49-straight when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent (last loss March 2, 2019 at K-State).
- Baylor has won 30-straight when scoring 80+ points (last loss Jan. 5, 2019 vs. TCU).
- BU has won 28-consecutive games when holding an opponent below 70 points (last loss Feb. 22, 2020 vs. KU).
- BU has won 28-consecutive games when its bench outscores the opposing bench (last loss Feb. 29, 2020 at TCU)
- Baylor has won 17-consecutive games when **Adam Flagler** scores 10+ points (never lost).
- Baylor has won 8-straight games following a loss (last consecutive losses were March 9-14, 2019)

LONGEST WINNING STREAK IN FERRELL CENTER HISTORY

- Baylor's current 17-game home winning streak is the longest in Ferrell Center history (est. 1988).
- The Bears broke the previous record of 15-straight wins with their victory over Central Arkansas on Nov. 17.
- Baylor has twice before won 15-straight at the Ferrell Center – Feb. 21, 2015-Jan. 20, 2016 and Feb. 3, 2020-Jan. 11, 2011. This marks the 12th double-digit winning streak in Ferrell Center history (top 8 all in Drew era).

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- **Scott Drew** became Baylor head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 19th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (377).
- Drew is coaching his 593rd game at Baylor (377-215). His .637 winning pct. is best in BU history among coaches with 40+ games, and he's the program's all-time wins leader with 176 more victories than any other coach.
- Baylor has a .701 winning percentage (343-146) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .718 winning percentage (252-99) over the last 10+ seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (51) is the youngest active collegiate head coach to win a National Championship.
- Baylor is playing its 286th game as a ranked team in Drew's 19 seasons. BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program's first 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since January 2010, BU has been ranked in 270 of 407 games.
- In Drew's first 18 seasons at Baylor, 48 players have gone on to professional careers.

WIN OVER MICHIGAN STATE

- Baylor won the Battle 4 Atlantis title with a 75-58 win over Michigan State on Nov. 26. The 17-point margin of victory was the largest for a non-conference team against Michigan State since Nov. 15, 2016 (Kentucky, 69-48).
- BU faced its largest deficit at 36-31 with 2:20 left in the first half, then went on a 24-6 run and led by double-digits for the final 14 minutes. BU forced 19 turnovers and had 15 more field goal attempts than the Spartans.
- **James Akinjo** (game-highs 15 pts, 5 assists) was named MVP, and **Kendall Brown** was named All-Tournament.

HARD-FOUGHT B4A SEMIFINAL WIN OVER VCU

- Baylor overcame 13 first-half turnovers in a hard-fought 69-61 win over VCU in the Battle 4 Atlantis semifinals.
- The Bears led 29-27 at the break, then started the second half on a 9-0 run. VCU cut the deficit to 3 points with 11 minutes left, but BU responded with a 6-0 run and led by at least 4 points the rest of the game.
- BU was out-shot (42%-40%), but forced 19 turnovers and out-rebounded VCU 42-33. **Matthew Mayer** led BU with 15 points, while **Kendall Brown** added 14, and **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** tied his career-high 13 points.

BEARS PULL AWAY EARLY IN BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS WIN OVER ARIZONA STATE

- Baylor broke a 23-23 tie with a 19-4 run and led by double-digits for the final 22 minutes in a 75-63 win over Arizona State on Nov. 24 in the Battle 4 Atlantis first round. BU won despite shooting a season-low 42% from the field.
- **Flo Thamba** posted career-highs with 11 points in 23 minutes, while **LJ Cryer** (15 points) led the Bears in scoring for a 4th-straight game. **Matthew Mayer** (14), **Adam Flagler** (13) and **Kendall Brown** (10) also scored 10+ points.
- The Bears improved to 24-4 in regular-season tournaments over the last 9 seasons since 2013-14.

SECOND-HALF SURGE LEADS TO BLOWOUT OF STANFORD

- Baylor led 34-28 at the break, then rushed out to a 24-3 run to start the second half and pulled away for a dominating 86-48 win over Stanford on Nov. 20. BU snapped Stanford's streak of 89-straight games with 50+ points.
- **LJ Cryer** (21 points) made his career-first start and had his 3rd-consecutive 20-point game, while **James Akinjo** (11 points, 11 assists) had his second-straight double-double after recording his career-first three days prior.

RECORDS FALL IN WIN OVER CENTRAL ARKANSAS

- Baylor set a new Ferrell Center record with its 16th-straight home win, beating Central Arkansas 92-47 on Nov. 17.
- **LJ Cryer** had his second-straight 20-point game off the bench, while **James Akinjo** recorded his career-first double-double with 18 points and 10 assists. **Kendall Brown** chipped in 19 points, and **Matthew Mayer** added 12.
- The Bears also tied a school record with 21 steals – **Matthew Mayer** (5), **James Akinjo** (4), **Flo Thamba** (3), **Jeremy Sochan** (2), **LJ Cryer** (2), **Kendall Brown** (2), **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** (2), **Adam Flagler** (1).

BEARS TEACH LESSON IN SHARING TO ELEMENTARY SCHOOL KIDS VS. NICHOLLS STATE

- With 3,500 local elementary school children in attendance, Baylor shared the sugar to the tune of 33 assists on 37 made field goals in an 89-60 win over Nicholls State on Nov. 15. The 33 assists were 3rd-most in BU history.
- Freshman **Kendall Brown** (13p/8r/10a) was two rebounds shy of a triple double, while **LJ Cryer** added a career-high 20 points, **Jeremy Sochan** had 14 points and **Matthew Mayer** and **Adam Flagler** added 12 points apiece.

BANNER OPENER WITH 87-60 WIN OVER INCARNATE WORD

- Baylor had a memorable season-opening 87-60 win over Incarnate Word on Nov. 12, as the 2021 National Championship banner was unveiled and the team was presented with its 2021 rings and in a pregame ceremony.
- Five Bears scored in double-figures, led by **Matthew Mayer**, who posted a team-high 14 points in his career-first start (94th game played). Freshmen **Kendall Brown** (13 points) and **Jeremy Sochan** (10 points) were joined by **LJ Cryer** (13 points) and **James Akinjo** (10 points) to account for five Bears in double-figures.

NON-CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- Baylor is 15-5 vs. the Pac-12 during the Drew era, 11-1 against the Big East during the Drew era and 17-10 against the SEC during the Drew era, including 12-5 since 2012-13 and 7-1 in the Big 12/SEC Challenge.
- The Bears are 5-0 against Big Ten teams since 2015, with wins against Michigan State (2016 B4A), Wisconsin (2017 HOF Classic), Illinois (2020 Jimmy V Classic), Wisconsin (2021 NCAAT) and Michigan State (2021 B4A).

IMPRESSIVE NON-CONFERENCE NUMBERS AT HOME

- Baylor is 70-4 in its last 74 non-conference home games dating back to Dec. 12, 2012.
- Baylor is 135-16 in non-conference home games in the **Drew era**, including 107-8 since 2007-08.
- Baylor is 46-7 in home games against unranked opponents (including Big 12 play) since 2016-17.

PROTECTING HALFTIME LEADS

- Baylor is 82-5 when leading at halftime over the last five seasons since the start of 2017-18.
- Baylor has won 90% of its games (200-21) when leading at the half in the last 10+ seasons ... **7-0** in 2021-22, **24-0** in 2020-21, **21-2** in 2019-20, **15-3** in 2018-19, **15-0** in 2017-18, **18-3** in 2016-17, **18-2** in 2015-16, **21-7** in 2014-15, **18-2** in 2013-14, **17-1** in 2012-13 and **26-1** in 2011-12.
- BU has won 40% of games in which its been tied or trailing at the half since 2011-12, going 52-78 in those.

BEARS RETURN SEVEN LETTERWINNERS FROM NATIONAL TITLE TEAM

- Baylor lost four starters from last season's National Championship team, but the Bears returned seven lettermen.
- BU's seven returning lettermen entered this year with a combined 344 games (77 starts) of collegiate experience.
- **Matthew Mayer** (93 career games), **Flo Thamba** (82 career games, 30 starts), **Adam Flagler** (64 career games, 36 starts), **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** (60 career games, 11 starts), **LJ Cryer** (20 career games), **Zach Loveday** (13 career games) and **Jordan Turner** (12 career games) all returned from last year's National Championship team.

THIRTY-THREE STRAIGHT WEEKS AP TOP-10 RANKED

- BU is ranked No. 4 in the Nov. 29 AP Top 25, extending a school-record streak to 33-straight weeks top-10 ranked.
- With its No. 8 AP preseason ranking, Baylor's school-record streak of 28-straight weeks top-5 ranked was snapped. BU was top-5 ranked in 12 total weeks in program history prior to the 28-week streak.
- Baylor has been in the AP Top 25 a school-record 41-straight weeks, which is the nation's 3rd-longest active streak behind only Gonzaga (99) and Villanova (44).

ALL FOUR DEPARTED STARTERS NOW PLAYING PROFESSIONALLY

- All four departed starters from last season's National Championship team are now playing professionally.
- **Davion Mitchell** was drafted No. 9 overall by the Sacramento Kings.
- **Jared Butler** was drafted No. 40 by the New Orleans Pelicans (traded to Utah Jazz).
- **MaCio Teague** is playing on the Utah Jazz G-League team.
- **Mark Vital** is suiting up for the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs.

NATION'S-BEST 17-3 VS. RANKED TEAMS OVER LAST TWO SEASONS

- Baylor is 17-3 against AP Top-25 ranked teams over the last two seasons. BU became the first team since Indiana in 1974-76 to win 10 of 11 games against ranked opponents before the Feb. 27 loss at Kansas ended the run.
- The record includes 11-2 away from home, with neutral wins vs. #17 Villanova (Nov. 2019), vs. #5 Illinois (Nov. 2020), vs. #18 Villanova (March 2021), vs. #10 Arkansas (March 2021), vs. #6 Houston (April 2021) and #1 Gonzaga (April 2021) and road wins at #22 Texas Tech (Jan. 2020), at #4 Kansas (Jan. 2020), at #15 Texas Tech (Jan. 2021), at #6 Texas (Feb. 2021) and at #6 West Virginia (March 2021).
- BU is 6-1 at home vs. ranked teams in the last 2 seasons – wins vs. #12 Arizona (Dec. 2019), #18 Butler (Dec. 2019), #14 West Virginia (Feb. 2020), #9 Kansas (Jan. 2021), #17 Oklahoma State (March 2021) and #18 Texas Tech (March 2021), and the lone loss by 3 points to #3 Kansas (Feb. 2020).

FORTY WINS VS. RANKED TEAMS IN LAST SEVEN SEASONS

- Baylor has gone 40-35 against ranked teams since the start of the 2014-15 season (17-3 last 2 seasons).
- BU is 58-75 against AP-ranked teams since 2007-08 after going 17-122 in the program's first 101 seasons.
- Baylor has won multiple games vs. AP Top 25 teams in each of the last 14 seasons.
- The Bears have defeated at least five ranked teams in six of the last eight seasons.

DREW'S 17-8 NCAA TOURNAMENT RECORD

- Head coach Scott Drew has a 17-8 record over nine NCAA Tournament appearances, including five Sweet 16s, three Elite Eights, one Final Four and one National Championship.
- Drew's 17-8 record (.680) is 7th-best among active coaches, trailing only Mike Krzyzewski (.764; 97-30), John Calipari (56-19; .747), Rick Pitino (33-22; .730), Chris Beard (.713; 10-4), Tom Izzo (.703; 52-22) and Bill Self (.700; 49-21).
- Drew has guided Baylor to nine of the last 12 NCAA Tournaments. Prior to Drew's arrival, Baylor had been to only four NCAA Tournaments, including just once in the 53 seasons preceding his arrival in 2003-04.
- In 2008, Drew guided Baylor to its first NCAA Championship appearance in 20 seasons (since 1988) and just its second appearance in 58 seasons since going to the eight-team tournament in 1950.

APPEARANCES IN SIX OF LAST SEVEN NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor appeared in the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time in the last seven tournaments.
- BU is 1 of 16 teams to appear in six NCAA Tournaments since 2014, joining Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan, Michigan State, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Purdue, VCU, Villanova, Virginia, Wichita State and Wisconsin.

SECOND-MOST WINS AMONG BIG 12 TEAMS IN LAST DECADE

- Baylor's 252-99 record since 2011-12 trails only Kansas (290-73) among Big 12 teams (thru 12/2/21).
- West Virginia (217-130) is 3rd, Iowa State (204-135) is 4th, Oklahoma (203-129) is 5th, Kansas State (195-144) is 6th, Texas (194-144) is 7th, Oklahoma St. (190-146) is 8th, Texas Tech (183-150) is 9th and TCU (170-165) is 10th.
- Baylor has averaged 24.5 wins per season over the last 10 full seasons since 2011-12.

WINNING AWAY FROM HOME VS. NON-BIG 12 TEAMS

- Baylor is 51-17 in road/neutral games against non-Big 12 teams over the last 10+ seasons since 2011-12.
- Baylor is 71-26 in road/neutral non-conference games since the 2007-08 season (3-0 in 2021-22; 9-0 in 2020-21; 5-1 in 2019-20; 3-3 in 2018-19; 2-2 in 2017-18; 6-1 in 2016-17; 1-3 in 2015-16; 3-2 in 2014-15; 6-2 in 2013-14; 5-2 in 2012-13; 8-1 in 2011-12; 1-3 in 2010-11; 8-2 in 2009-10; 6-2 in 2008-09; 5-2 in 2007-08).

NINE CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON BERTHS

- Baylor is on a school-record streak of nine consecutive postseason berths and has appeared in 12 of the last 13 postseasons. BU made seven postseason appearances in the program's 97 seasons prior to the **Scott Drew** era.
- Baylor is 1 of 10 teams to appear in every post-season since 2012, joining Gonzaga, Iona, Kansas, Michigan State, North Carolina, Oregon, Saint Mary's, Virginia and Wichita State.
- BU earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019 and 2021 and NIT bids in 2013 and 2018.
- Baylor has appeared in 12 of the last 13 post-seasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor's only post-season berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).

BEARS WELCOME HIGHEST-RANKED RECRUITING CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY FOR 2021-22

- Baylor signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history in November 2020, inking a trio of top-40 recruits for the 2021-22 season. BU's 2021 recruiting class was ranked No. 4 nationally by ESPN.
- The Bears signed 5-star forward Kendall Brown, 4-star guard Langston Love and 4-star forward Jeremy Sochan.
- Brown was ranked No. 12 nationally, Love was No. 23 nationally and Sochan was No. 40 nationally.
- Brown and Sochan debuted in the season-opener, but Love is out for the year with a knee injury.

ANOTHER STRONG CLASS HEADED TO WACO IN 2022

- Baylor's three-player 2022 signing class is ranked No. 13 nationally by ESPN.com.
- The Bears signed the highest-ranked recruit in program history with No. 3-ranked Keyonte George (IMG Academy).
- Baylor signed another guard with No. 53-ranked Dillon Hunter (Sunrise Christian) and added 4-star big man prospect Joshua Ojjanwuna (NBA Global Academy – Australia).

ONE OF FOUR PROGRAMS RANKED NO. 1 IN THREE OF LAST FIVE SEASONS

- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in three seasons since 2017.
- BU was No. 1 for the first time on Jan. 9, 2017, spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 2020 and was No. 1 in the preseason and week 1 coaches' polls this year. All told, BU has been No. 1 for eight weeks since 2017.
- The Bears have been ranked in all 25 AP Top 25 spots during the Drew era (all since 2008).

NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER SUCCESS

- Baylor has posted a combined 170-34 record in November and December games during the Drew era, including an 88-12 mark in November and December games since 2013.
- The Bears are 86-15 in November games and 84-19 in December contests during the Drew era.
- BU is 46-7 in November games since 2013, with the only losses to No. 8 Syracuse (2013), vs. Illinois (2014) in Las Vegas, at No. 25 Oregon (2015), at No. 21 Xavier (2017), vs. Texas Southern (2018), vs. Ole Miss (2018) in Florida and vs. Washington (2019) in Alaska.
- BU is 42-5 in December games since 2013, with the only losses at No. 24 Texas A&M (2015), vs. No. 8 Wichita State (2017), at No. 22 Texas Tech (2017), at Wichita State (2018) and vs. SFA (2018).

SCOTT DREW COACHING TREE

- Three current Division I head coaches took their first DI head coaching jobs after stints on Scott Drew’s BU staff.
- Matthew Driscoll is in his 13th season as head coach at North Florida after six seasons as a Baylor assistant.
- Grant McCasland is in his fifth season as head coach at North Texas. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.
- Paul Mills is in his fifth season as head coach at Oral Roberts. He was a member of Drew’s original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.
- All 3 former assistants have led their teams to NCAA Tournaments – Driscoll led UNF to the 2015 NCAA Tournament, while McCasland took UNT to the 2021 Second Round and Mills took ORU to the 2021 Sweet 16.

- In Scott Drew’s 18 years at Baylor, 48 of his players have gone on to professional careers.
- Five Bears are currently on NBA rosters – Jared Butler (Jazz), Davion Mitchell (Kings), Royce O’Neale (Jazz), Taurean Prince (Timberwolves) and Ishmail Wainright (Suns).
- In addition to the five current NBA players, eight more of Drew’s former players have played in the NBA (most recent team) – Quincy Acy (Raptors), Freddie Gillespie (Raptors), Pierre Jackson (Mavs), Cory Jefferson (Suns), Perry Jones III (Thunder), Quincy Miller (Kings), Johnathan Motley (Clippers) and Ekpe Udoh (Jazz).

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Drew is in his 19th season at Baylor and is the school’s all-time wins leader (377).
- Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren’t ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school – Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson and Taurean Prince.
- Drew has graduated 54 players during his Baylor tenure, averaging 3 graduates per season.
- The Bears have advanced to postseason play in a school-record nine straight seasons (7 NCAA, 2 NIT).
- Baylor is 26-4 in regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, including 5 regular-season tournament titles.
- Drew has won 20+ games in 12 of the last 14 years – the Bears had 3 seasons of 20+ wins prior to his arrival.

POINT GUARDS THRIVE IN DREW’S SYSTEM

- Ten of Baylor’s 11 starting point guards during the **Scott Drew** era have earned All-Big 12 recognition.
- Baylor’s starting point guard has earned All-Big 12 recognition in 16 of 17 seasons since 2004-05.
- Jared Butler (2019, 2020, 2021), Davion Mitchell (2020, 2021), Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

HISTORY OF DEVELOPMENT WITH REDSHIRTS

- Baylor has a track record of success when redshirting players. **Davion Mitchell, MaCio Teague, Freddie Gillespie, Mark Vital, Ekpe Udoh, Johnathan Motley, Cory Jefferson, Brady Heslip, Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. and Manu Lecomte** have all gone on to professional careers after redshirting.
- **Adam Flagler** and **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** redshirted in 2019-20 while sitting out to satisfy NCAA transfer rules, while **Jordan Turner** elected to redshirt in 2019-20. **Dain Dainja** redshirted last season.

BAYLOR BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

- Baylor basketball is aired live via the Baylor Sports Network from Learfield on ESPN Central Texas and flagship station 1660AM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco and worldwide on Sirius/XM Radio.
- Games are broadcast by the “Voice of the Bears” John Morris, who was named NSMA 2019 Texas co-Sportscaster of the Year on Jan. 13, 2020, and former Baylor basketball standout Pat Nunley.
- Morris is in his 38th year doing BU broadcasts (27th full-time), and Nunley is in his 41st season as analyst.
- All of Baylor’s games can be heard live on the Internet at www.BaylorBears.com and via the TuneIn App.

OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING A BAYLOR STAPLE

- Baylor has ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage in all eight seasons since 2013-14, including six times ranked in the nation’s top-5. The Bears only cracked the top-20 once in Drew’s first 10 years.
- Baylor’s 8-year streak is the nation’s best, and West Virginia (67years) is the only other team with a 4+ year streak.
- Baylor currently ranks 6th nationally in offensive rebounding percentage, grabbing 36.9% of its missed field goals.
- Baylor finished ranked No. 5 nationally in 2020-21, No. 8 in 2019-20, No. 2 in 2018-19, No. 9 in 2017-18, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16, No. 1 in 2014-15 and No. 3 in 2013-14. Prior to that top-10 streak, BU’s best rank was No. 16 in 2011-12.

GRADUATING 91 PERCENT OF SENIORS

- Since **Scott Drew** took over the Baylor Basketball program in 2003, 37 of 40 scholarship players who have played their final years of collegiate eligibility under Drew have graduated from Baylor.

- BU advanced to championship games in the 2007 Paradise Jam (won), 2008 76 Classic (lost), 2011 Las Vegas Classic (won), 2013 Maui Invitational (lost), 2014 Las Vegas Invitational (lost), 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis (won), 2017 Hall of Fame Classic (won), 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational (won) and 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis (won).
- Baylor has won six regular-season tournament titles under Drew – 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational, 2017 Hall of Fame Classic, 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2011 Las Vegas Classic and 2007 Paradise Jam.

ENTIRE STAFF BACK FOR FIFTH-STRAIGHT SEASON

- Scott Drew's entire coaching staff returned for the 2021-22 season, a fifth-straight season of continuity.
- Jerome Tang is in his fifth season as associate head coach and has been on Drew's staff all 19 seasons at Baylor.
- Assistant coaches Alvin Brooks III (sixth season) and John Jakus (fifth season) also return to the bench.
- Special assistant & director of player development Jared Nuness is back for his 12th season, while director of basketball operations Aditya Malhotra returns for his ninth season.
