### STORY LINES

- No. 4 Baylor looks to bounce back from its first non-conference loss in 813 days when it hosts West Virginia for the 95th-anniversary Immortal Ten Game at 8 p.m. CT Monday on ESPN.
- Baylor is 13-8 all-time against West Virginia, including a 5-1 mark over the last 4 seasons (2-0 in Waco).
- BU is looking to sweep the home-and-home with WVU for a 4th time (2013, 2015, 2019).
- The Bears won 77-68 when facing WVU in Morgantown on Jan. 18. James Akinjo and Jeremy Sochan missed the game with injuries, but LJ Cryer (25) and Matthew Mayer (20) both scored career-highs.
- Baylor's 18-3 record is its lowest winning percentage through 21 games since 2018-19. BU was 20-1 in 2020 & 2021. The Bears are a combined 58-5 through their first 21 games over the last 3 seasons.
- BU is 33-2 vs. unranked teams over the last 2 seasons (+22.1 avg margin) with all wins by 5+ points.
- Baylor is coming off an 87-78 loss at Alabama on Saturday. BU's allowed 1.26 points-per-possession, its worst since March 14, 2019 vs. Iowa State (1.31 PPP), including 22-of-28 on 2-point field goals.
- BU looks to start 7-2 or better in Big 12 play for a 3rd-straight season (once in first 23 seasons – 2012).
- Jeremy Sochan had career-highs of 17 points and 32 minutes and added 8 rebounds at Alabama. The Bears also got a full game from James Akinjo (32 minutes) for the first time since his Jan. 11 injury.
- BU is playing its 299th game as a ranked team under Drew – BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program's 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since January 2010, BU has been ranked in 284 of 421 games.
- Baylor has been No. 1 ranked in 4 of the last 6 seasons (Gonzaga, Duke and Kansas are only others).
- Baylor's 34-6 Big 12 conference record over the last 3 seasons is the best of any Power-5 team.
- Baylor's 46-5 record over the last 2 seasons is the nation's best among Power-5 teams, and the Bears' 72-9 record over the last 3 seasons is 2nd-best nationally, trailing only Gonzaga (79-5).
- BU is 15-0 this season when winning points off turnovers and 14-0 when winning points in the paint.
- Baylor is the nation's only team ranked top-40 in scoring offense (30th) and scoring defense (20th).
- Baylor ranks top-25 nationally in scoring margin (5th, +18.0), assists (11th, 17.2), steals (12th, 9.6), rebounding margin (21st, +7.2), turnovers forced (19th, 17.2), turnover margin (23rd, +4.0), offensive rebound percentage (5th, 37.7) FG% (25th, .481) and effective FG% (18th, .552).
- Over the last 3 seasons, Baylor is 61-3 when leading at the half and 72-5 when taking a 2nd-half lead.
- BU has forced 10+ turnovers in 29-straight games, including 12+ TOs in 20 of 21 games this season.
- BU is 21-2 in home games over the last 2 seasons, with an average scoring margin of +24.8.
- Baylor is 35-3 at home over the last 3 seasons, with two losses by 3 points against ranked teams.
- Baylor is on a school-record streak of 41-straight weeks top-10 ranked (top-5 ranked in 38 of those).
- BU is on a school-record streak of 49-straight weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 (previous record was 25). It's the nation's 3rd-longest active streak behind Gonzaga (107) and Villanova (52).
- Baylor has been ranked in all 25 spots in the AP Top 25 at some point in the last 7 years.
- BU has defeated 3 currently top-25 ranked teams this season – No. 10 Michigan State (75-58 in Battle 4 Atlantis title game), No. 14 Villanova (57-36 in Waco) and No. 23 Iowa State (77-72 in Ames).

### QUICK HITS

- Baylor has built leads of 11+ points in 25 of 27 games since the start of the 2021 NCAA Tournament.
- BU has built double-digit leads in 70 of 81 games over the last 3 seasons (46 of 51 last 2 seasons).
- Baylor is 4-0 in Big 12 road games this season, while the rest of the league is a combined 12-22.
- For a second-straight season, Baylor was one of the nation's final two undefeated teams.
- BU went 305 days between losses, the longest in program history (March 12, 2021 – Jan. 11, 2022).
- BU had a 36-game non-conference winning streak with 813 days between losses (Nov. 8, 2019 – Jan. 29, 2022).
- BU went 1,038 days without consecutive losses before dropping back-to-back games Jan. 11 and Jan. 15.
- Baylor became the first program to start consecutive seasons 15-0 since Syracuse in 2010-11 and 2011-12.
- Head coach **Scott Drew** is in his 19th season at Baylor with a school-record 388 career victories, including a 17-8 mark in NCAA Tournaments, which is the 7th-best mark among active coaches.
- BU ranks 5th nationally in KenPom's offensive rebound pct (37.7), its 8th-straight year ranked top-10.
- Baylor and Kansas are the only Power-5 schools to win 18+ games every year since 2008.
- Baylor's streak of 9 consecutive postseasons is tied as the nation's 7th-longest active streak.
- Baylor has won 20+ games in 12 of the last 14 seasons after recording only three 20-win seasons in the previous 100 years of Baylor Basketball (1946, 1948, 1988).
- Baylor is 91-6 when leading at halftime over the last 5 seasons (61-3 over last 3 seasons, 24-0 last season).
- Baylor has won 90% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (208-22).
- BU is 72-5 when leading at any point in the 2nd half of a game over the last 3 seasons.
- Baylor is 263-102 over the last 10+ seasons, averaging 24.5 wins per season since 2011-12.
- Baylor's 263 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (302).
- Baylor is 354-149 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- Five of Baylor's players have used or are currently using a redshirt year. Two after transferring to BU (Flagler, Tchamwa Tchatchoua), one before transferring (Bonner) and two as freshmen – Turner and Langston Love.
- Ten of Baylor's 11 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (16 of last 17 seasons).
- Baylor is 1 of 10 teams nationally to appear in every postseason since 2012 (7 NCAAs, 2 NITs).
- Baylor has the nation's 9th-longest active streak with at least one 3-point FG made in 983 straight games – the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was more than 30 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).
- Baylor has won 8 tournament titles under **Drew** – 2007 Paradise Jam, 2011 Las Vegas Classic, 2013 NIT, 2016 & 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2017 Hall of Fame Classic, 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational and 2021 NCAA Championship.

### NOTEABLE STREAKS

- Baylor has taken a lead in 107-consecutive games (last wire-to-wire loss Dec. 1, 2018 at Wichita State).
- BU has won 58-straight when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent (last loss March 2, 2019 at K-State).
- Baylor has won 35-straight games when shooting 50% or higher (last loss March 18, 2018 vs. Mississippi State).
- Baylor has won 34-straight games when scoring 80+ points (last loss Jan. 5, 2019 vs. TCU).
- Baylor has had at least 3 players make 3-pointers in 24-consecutive games (last on March 27, 2021 vs. Villanova).
- Baylor has made 3+ 3-pointers in 110-consecutive games (last on Nov. 23, 2018 vs. Ole Miss).
- Baylor has won 9-consecutive games against AP Top-10 ranked opponents (last loss Feb. 22, 2020 vs. Kansas).
- Baylor has won 9-consecutive neutral-site games – (last loss Nov. 8, 2019 vs. Washington in Alaska).
- Baylor has won 21-consecutive non-conference home games (last loss Dec. 18, 2018 vs. SFA).

**REMEMBERING THE IMMORTAL TEN**

- BU will honor the 95th anniversary of the 1927 Immortal Ten team. That season was canceled after the team bus was hit by a train while traveling to Austin, killing 10 of 22 players, coaches and fans in the Baylor travel party.
- BU players will wear the last names of the Immortal Ten on the backs of their jerseys.
- **Jack Castellaw**, a senior from Ennis, was the team’s official scorekeeper. He loved traveling with the basketball team and naturally wouldn’t miss this important game. Baylor’s Castellaw Communications Center is named for him; his friend Dave Cheavens, BA ’33, a Lariat editor who was also on the bus that day, dedicated the final years of his life to raising money for the building.
- **Sam Dillow**, a junior from Fort Worth, was a Baylor Chamberman as well as a starting guard who had captained the team the year before. Sam’s parents, who had attended Baylor as well, were planning to celebrate his 22nd birthday with him a week later in Fort Worth when the team played TCU.
- **Merle Dudley**, a second-year law student from Abilene and the only yell leader who planned to attend that game. Merle lived with five of those on the bus, including three of those who perished (Castellaw, Dillow, and Hannah).
- **L.R. “Ivey” Foster, Jr.**, a freshman from Taylor who had been named sports editor for the Lariat just a week earlier. Ivey had been hitchhiking to Austin through the freezing January rain when the bus driver saw him and picked him up. The Lariat’s coverage of the crash had to include the death of their own reporter.
- **Robert “Bob” Hailey**, a sophomore from Lott and substitute guard. The first in his family to attend college, Bob was known as “Smilin’ Bob” due to his ever-present grin. He had just joined Baylor Chamber, and was to have been initiated the next week.
- **Robert “Bob” L. Hannah, Jr.**, a junior from Waco and starting guard. His parents had relocated to St. Louis for his father’s engineering job. His best friend? William Winchester.
- **James Clyde “Abe” Kelley**, a substitute forward on the basketball team and captain-elect of the football team. He was studying business administration and was working at a local fire department to pay for housing. Kelley had seen the train coming just before impact and, rather than save himself, pushed his childhood friend and roommate, Weir Washman, out the window. Abe left behind his parents, nine siblings, and longtime girlfriend Dorris Roberts.
- **Willis Murray**, a junior from Gatesville, substitute guard and team manager. Though he served as manager most of the time, he was happy to be part of the team. Much of his interest in basketball came from his friendship with teammate Jim Walker, a high school classmate. Willis had come to Baylor at age 16 and was earning both a bachelor of arts and a law degree. He left behind his parents, five siblings, a girlfriend, and his childhood pony, Snip.
- **James “Jim” Walker**, a junior from Gatesville and a forward on the team. He had come from a large, humble family, and his basketball, football and track skills gave him the opportunity to study business administration. Unlike his outgoing, prank-playing teammates, Jim was often the quiet one of the group.
- **William Winchester**, a senior from Waco and substitute center and guard. William was majoring in history and French, was in the top 10% of his class, and was a leader in the local Boy Scout order. He left behind at Baylor his twin brother, Robert, and their younger brother, Albert.
- One of 12 survivors of the tragedy was **John “Killer” Kane**, a football and basketball player who graduated in 1928 and went on to serve as a Colonel in the Army Air Corps in World War II. He was awarded the Medal of Honor after leading a daring air raid against Nazi petroleum reserves dubbed Operation Tidal Wave. Four others in the raid were awarded the Medal of Honor, making it the most highly-decorated single engagement in the nation’s history.

**SERIES HISTORY VS. WEST VIRGINIA**

- Monday is the 22nd all-time series meeting, all of which have been played since 2011.
- Baylor won seven of the first eight series meetings, but the Bears are 6-7 vs. WVU since then.
- BU leads the series 13-8, including a 5-3 mark in Waco.

**LAST TIME VS. WEST VIRGINIA**

- Baylor was without starting point guard James Akinjo (31.1 mpg) and reserve forward Jeremy Sochan (21.9 mpg), but the short-handed Bears fought off a tough West Virginia team for a 77-68 win in Morgantown on Jan. 18.
- LJ Cryer (25) and Matthew Mayer (20) both scored career-highs, while Adam Flagler added 14 points and a game-high 7 assists). That trio combined for 20 points in the final 8 minutes as BU erased WVU’s 54-53 lead.
- Dale Bonner contributed 4 assists in a season-high 26 minutes and had a game-high +18 plus-minus.

**BAYLOR PARTNERS WITH CITY OF WACO ON \$700 MILLION RIVERFRONT PROJECT**

- Baylor and the City of Waco have partnered on a \$700 million riverfront development project, headlined by the \$185 million Foster Pavilion, the future home for Baylor’s national champion basketball programs.
- Foster Pavilion (capacity 7,500) will be located along the Brazos River on the opposite side of I-35 from McLane Stadium.
- Groundbreaking is expected in June 2022, with the pavilion targeted for a January 2024 opening.
- Development Centers for both basketball programs are included in the 245k square foot Foster Pavilion project.

**RANKED NO. 1 FOR THIRD-STRAIGHT SEASON**

- Baylor reached No. 1 nationally on Dec. 13, marking a third-straight season with a No. 1 national ranking.
- BU was No. 1 for the first time on Jan. 9, 2017, spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 2019-20, was No. 1 in the preseason and week 1 coaches' polls last year and has been No. 1 for five weeks in 2021-22.
- Baylor has now been ranked No. 1 in 14 weekly polls all-time. The Bears are 19-4 when playing as a No. 1 team.
- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in four seasons since 2016-17.

**ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY**

- **Scott Drew** became Baylor head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew has swept Big 12 Coach of the Year honors from the league coaches and media each of the last two seasons. He was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 19th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (388).
- Drew is coaching his 607th game at Baylor (388-218). His .640 winning pct. is best in BU history among coaches with 40+ games, and he's the program's all-time wins leader with 187 more victories than any other coach.
- Baylor has a .704 winning percentage (354-149) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .721 winning percentage (263-102) over the last 10+ seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (51) is the youngest active collegiate head coach to win a National Championship.
- Baylor is playing its 300th game as a ranked team in Drew's 19 seasons. BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program's first 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since January 2010, BU has been ranked in 284 of 421 games.
- In Drew's first 18 seasons at Baylor, 48 players have gone on to professional careers.

- Drew is in his 19th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (388).

**BEARS WELCOME HIGHEST-RANKED RECRUITING CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY FOR 2021-22**

- Baylor signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history in November 2020, inking a trio of top-40 recruits for the 2021-22 season. BU's 2021 recruiting class was ranked No. 4 nationally by ESPN.
- The Bears signed 5-star forward Kendall Brown, 4-star guard Langston Love and 4-star forward Jeremy Sochan.
- Brown was ranked No. 12 nationally, Love was No. 23 nationally and Sochan was No. 40 nationally.
- Brown and Sochan debuted in the season-opener, but Love is out for the year with a knee injury.

**ANOTHER STRONG CLASS HEADED TO WACO IN 2022**

- Baylor's three-player 2022 signing class is ranked No. 13 nationally by ESPN.com.
- The Bears signed the highest-ranked recruit in program history with No. 3-ranked Keyonte George (IMG Academy).
- George was recently named a McDonald's All-American, making him the 5th Burger Boy in BU history, joining Tweety Carter, Perry Jones III, Isaiah Austin and Kendall Brown.
- Baylor signed another guard with No. 53-ranked Dillon Hunter (Sunrise Christian) and added 4-star big man prospect Joshua Ojjanwuna (NBA Global Academy – Australia).

**ALL FOUR DEPARTED STARTERS NOW PLAYING PROFESSIONALLY**

- All four departed starters from last season's National Championship team are now playing professionally.
- Davion Mitchell was drafted No. 9 overall by the Sacramento Kings.
- Jared Butler was drafted No. 40 by the New Orleans Pelicans (traded to Utah Jazz).
- MaCio Teague is playing on the Utah Jazz G-League team.
- Mark Vital is suiting up for the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs.

**POINT GUARDS THRIVE IN DREW'S SYSTEM**

- Ten of Baylor's 11 starting point guards during the **Scott Drew** era have earned All-Big 12 recognition.
- Baylor's starting point guard has earned All-Big 12 recognition in 16 of 17 seasons since 2004-05.
- Jared Butler (2019, 2020, 2021), Davion Mitchell (2020, 2021), Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

**SCOTT DREW COACHING TREE**

- Three current Division I head coaches took their first DI head coaching jobs after stints on Scott Drew's BU staff.
- Matthew Driscoll is in his 13th season as head coach at North Florida after six seasons as a Baylor assistant.
- Grant McCasland is in his fifth season as head coach at North Texas. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.
- Paul Mills is in his fifth season as head coach at Oral Roberts. He was a member of Drew's original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.
- All 3 former assistants have led their teams to NCAA Tournaments – Driscoll led UNF to the 2015 NCAA Tournament, while McCasland took UNT to the 2021 Second Round and Mills took ORU to the 2021 Sweet 16.

**NINE CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON BERTHS**

- Baylor is on a school-record streak of nine consecutive postseason berths and has appeared in 12 of the last 13 seasons. BU made seven postseason appearances in the program's 97 seasons prior to the **Scott Drew** era.
- Baylor is 1 of 10 teams to appear in every postseason since 2012, joining Gonzaga, Iona, Kansas, Michigan State, North Carolina, Oregon, Saint Mary's, Virginia and Wichita State.
- BU earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019 and 2021 and NIT bids in 2013 and 2018.
- Baylor has appeared in 12 of the last 13 seasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor's only postseason berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).

**BEARS FALL AT ALABAMA IN BIG 12/SEC CHALLENGE**

- Baylor suffered only its second loss in nine Big 12/SEC Challenge games when it fell 87-78 at Alabama on Jan. 29.
- The Bears led 32-31 with less than two minutes remaining in the first half, but Alabama closed the half on a 7-2 run and BU wouldn't get closer than 2 points the rest of the way. Alabama shot 79% (22-28) on 2-point field goals.
- BU made a run to cut a 15-point deficit to 4 with 4 minutes left, but Alabama answered with a 6-0 run.
- Leading scorer LJ Cryer missed the game (injury), but Jeremy Sochan had a career-high 17 points in 32 minutes.

**BU ROLLS PAST K-STATE IN SOCHAN'S RETURN**

- Baylor built an 18-point halftime lead and cruised to a 74-49 win over Kansas State on Jan. 25 in Waco.
- Kendall Brown (10 points, 11 rebounds) and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua (13 points, 12 rebounds) both posted double-doubles, while Dale Bonner had a season-high 5 assists.
- Jeremy Sochan returned after missing 4.5 games with an injury. He had 5 points, 2 rebounds, 2 steals in 21 minutes.

**BEARS CLOSE STRONG TO WIN AT OKLAHOMA**

- Baylor used a late 18-4 run to put the game away in a 65-51 win at Oklahoma on Jan. 22.
- The 51 points BU allowed tied the fewest scored by OU in any game since BU won 77-47 in Norman on Jan. 28, 2019.
- Baylor went on a 16-0 run the final 4 minutes of the first half and first 2 minutes of the second half.
- BU forced 25 turnovers and recorded 16 steals, led by Matthew Mayer and James Akinjo with 4 steals each.

**SHORT-HANDED BEARS BREAK THROUGH AT WEST VIRGINIA**

- Baylor was without starting point guard James Akinjo (31.1 mpg) and reserve forward Jeremy Sochan (21.9 mpg), but the short-handed Bears fought off a tough West Virginia team for a 77-68 win in Morgantown on Jan. 18.
- LJ Cryer (25) and Matthew Mayer (20) both scored career-highs, while Adam Flagler added 14 points and a game-high 7 assists. That trio combined for 20 points in the final 8 minutes as BU erased WVU's 54-53 lead.
- Dale Bonner contributed 4 assists in a season-high 26 minutes and had a game-high + 18 plus-minus.

**LATE RALLY FALLS SHORT VS. OKLAHOMA STATE**

- Baylor trailed by 17 points with 11 minutes left, then cut the deficit to 55-54 with 1:21 left before falling short in a 61-54 loss to Oklahoma State on Jan. 15. The Bears had two chances to tie or take the lead in the final minute.
- LJ Cryer led the Bears with 18 points. BU was without James Akinjo for the final 9 minutes, as he battled through a bruised tailbone, and Jeremy Sochan missed his second-straight game with a sprained ankle.
- With the loss, Baylor suffered consecutive losses for the first time since March 14, 2019.

**BEARS SUFFER FIRST LOSS TO NO. 19 TEXAS TECH**

- Baylor built an early 15-point lead and led for more than 31 minutes of game time, but No. 19 Texas Tech used a late 8-0 run to take the lead for good and hand Baylor its first loss of the season, 65-62, on Jan. 11.
- Adam Flagler and James Akinjo had 17 points apiece, but aside from Flagler's 5-of-8, the rest of the team shot 3-of-16 from 3-point range. The Bears also forced a season-low 12 turnovers and had a season-low 5 steals.
- The loss snapped Baylor's 21-game winning streak (3rd-longest by any team in Big 12 history).

**FLAGLER SPARKS COMEBACK FROM 9 DOWN TO WIN AT TCU**

- Baylor trailed TCU by 9 points early in the second half, but the Bears used a 17-0 run to take the lead for good in a 76-64 win in Fort Worth on Jan. 8. Adam Flagler had 18 second-half points (6-of-9 from 3-point range).
- James Akinjo added 20 points, 8 assists and 3 steals to lead the Bears to the comeback victory.
- LJ Cryer contributed 15 points off the bench, giving the guard trio 57 of the team's 76 points.

**AKINJO AND FLAGLER PUSH BEARS PAST OKLAHOMA FOR 20TH-STRAIGHT WIN**

- Baylor prevailed 84-74 in a hard-fought battle against Oklahoma on Jan. 4, led by a career-high 27 points from James Akinjo and a Baylor-career high 22 points from Adam Flagler.
- Oklahoma shot 75% (24-of-32) on 2-point field goals, the highest ever by a Big 12 team in a loss, but the Bears overcame that by out-rebounding the Sooners 34-16 and recording a 19-0 edge in second-chance points.

**BEARS PREVAIL AT IOWA STATE IN HISTORIC MATCHUP OF UNDEFEATED TEAMS**

- Baylor led wire-to-wire and fought off a late comeback in a 77-72 win at No. 8 Iowa State on New Year's Day.
- James Akinjo had a team -high 16 points, and Jeremy Sochan and LJ Cryer combined for 25 points off the bench.
- The matchup was the first time two undefeated Big 12 teams met in conference play (min. 10 games), as both teams entered 12-0. It was the 4th time in the last 40 years any two 12-0 or better Division I teams matched up.

**AKINJO, FLAGLER SHINE IN WIN OVER NORTHWESTERN STATE**

- Baylor rolled to a 104-68 win over Northwestern State on Dec. 28, led by James Akinjo's career-high 27 points along with 9 assists, and Adam Flagler's 21 points, career-high 11 assists and 0 turnovers.
- Jeremy Sochan made his career-first start and recorded his first double-double with 16 points and 11 boards.

**BEARS SHARE WEATLH IN WIN OVER ALCORN STATE**

- Baylor rolled to a 94-57 win over Alcorn State on Dec. 20 in its final game before the Christmas break.
- Nine different Bears combined for 29 assists, and seven different Bears hit 3-pointers in the win.
- Flo Thamba and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua both posted career-highs of 16 points on a combined 14-14 FGs.

**COMEBACK FROM 10 DOWN IN FIRST ROAD TEST AT OREGON**

- Baylor faced a 34-24 deficit 15 minutes into its first road game, but the Bears fought back to take a 42-41 lead with 17 minutes remaining and used a 12-0 run to a break a 51-all tie in a 78-70 win at Oregon on Dec. 18.
- Head coach Scott Drew recorded his 400th career victory (380 at Baylor) in his 20th season as a head coach.
- Kendall Brown scored a team-high 17 points (15 in 2nd half), including 9 as part of the decisive 12-0 run.
- James Akinjo had 17 points and a game-high 6 assists, and Adam Flagler had 16 points with 5 first-half treys.

**DOMINANT WIN OVER NO. 6 VILLANOVA**

- Baylor put together a dominant defensive performance in a 57-36 win over No. 6 Villanova on Dec. 12.
- The Bears held Villanova to its fewest points since 1979, lowest field goal percentage (.222) of the 21-year Jay Wright era and fewest points by any AP Top 10 team in the shot clock era.
- It was BU's 8th-straight win over top-10 ranked teams and improved BU to 13-1 vs. the Big East in the Drew era.
- James Akinjo had a game-high 16 points along with 7 rebounds and 5 assists, as BU improved to 3-0 vs. Villanova.

**ANOTHER BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS TITLE**

- Baylor won its second Battle 4 Atlantis title (2016, 2021) with wins over Arizona State, VCU and Michigan State. The Bears joined Villanova (2013, 2017) as the only 2-time Battle 4 Atlantis Champions.
- Baylor is now 39-12 in regular-season tournaments during the Drew era, including 26-4 since 2013-14.
- James Akinjo was named 2021 B4A MVP, while Kendall Brown joined him on the All-Tournament Team.
- Baylor defeated VCU, Michigan State and Louisville, respectively, to win the 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis.

### BEARS NOTCH MARQUEE WIN OVER MICHIGAN STATE IN B4A TITLE GAME

- Baylor won the Battle 4 Atlantis title with a 75-58 win over Michigan State on Nov. 26. The 17-point margin of victory was the largest for a non-conference team against Michigan State since Nov. 15, 2016 (Kentucky, 69-48).
- BU faced its largest deficit at 36-31 with 2:20 left in the first half, then went on a 24-6 run and led by double-digits for the final 14 minutes. BU forced 19 turnovers and had 15 more field goal attempts than the Spartans.
- **James Akinjo** (game-highs 15 pts, 5 assists) was named MVP, and **Kendall Brown** was named All-Tournament.

### HARD-FOUGHT B4A SEMIFINAL WIN OVER VCU

- Baylor overcame 13 first-half turnovers in a hard-fought 69-61 win over VCU in the Battle 4 Atlantis semifinals.
- The Bears led 29-27 at the break, then started the second half on a 9-0 run. VCU cut the deficit to 3 points with 11 minutes left, but BU responded with a 6-0 run and led by at least 4 points the rest of the game.
- BU was out-shot (42%-40%), but forced 19 turnovers and out-rebounded VCU 42-33. **Matthew Mayer** led BU with 15 points, while **Kendall Brown** added 14, and **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** tied his career-high 13 points.

### BEARS PULL AWAY EARLY IN BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS WIN OVER ARIZONA STATE

- Baylor broke a 23-23 tie with a 19-4 run and led by double-digits for the final 22 minutes in a 75-63 win over Arizona State on Nov. 24 in the Battle 4 Atlantis first round. BU won despite shooting a season-low 42% from the field.
- **Flo Thamba** posted career-highs with 11 points in 23 minutes, while **LJ Cryer** (15 points) led the Bears in scoring for a 4th-straight game. **Matthew Mayer** (14), **Adam Flagler** (13) and **Kendall Brown** (10) also scored 10+ points.

### BEARS RETURN SEVEN LETTERWINNERS FROM NATIONAL TITLE TEAM

- Baylor lost four starters from last season's National Championship team, but the Bears returned seven lettermen.
- BU's seven returning lettermen entered this year with a combined 344 games (77 starts) of collegiate experience.
- **Matthew Mayer** (93 career games), **Flo Thamba** (82 career games, 30 starts), **Adam Flagler** (64 career games, 36 starts), **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** (60 career games, 11 starts), **LJ Cryer** (20 career games), **Zach Loveday** (13 career games) and **Jordan Turner** (12 career games) all returned from last year's National Championship team.

### APPEARANCES IN SIX OF LAST SEVEN NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor appeared in the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time in the last seven tournaments.
- BU is 1 of 16 teams to appear in six NCAA Tournaments since 2014, joining Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan, Michigan State, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Purdue, VCU, Villanova, Virginia, Wichita State and Wisconsin.

### HISTORY OF DEVELOPMENT WITH REDSHIRTS

- Baylor has a track record of success when redshirting players. **Davion Mitchell**, **MaCio Teague**, **Freddie Gillespie**, **Mark Vital**, **Ekpe Udoh**, **Johnathan Motley**, **Cory Jefferson**, **Brady Heslip**, **Jo Lual-Acuil Jr.** and **Manu Lecomte** have all gone on to professional careers after redshirting.
- **Adam Flagler** and **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** redshirted in 2019-20 while sitting out to satisfy NCAA transfer rules, while **Jordan Turner** elected to redshirt in 2019-20.

### BAYLOR BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

- Baylor basketball is aired live via the Baylor Sports Network from Learfield on ESPN Central Texas and flagship station 1660AM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco and worldwide on Sirius/XM Radio.
- Games are broadcast by the "Voice of the Bears" **John Morris**, who was named NSMA 2019 Texas co-Sportscaster of the Year on Jan. 13, 2020, and former Baylor basketball standout **Pat Nunley**.
- **Morris** is in his 38th year doing BU broadcasts (27th full-time), and **Nunley** is in his 41st season as analyst.
- All of Baylor's games can be heard live on the Internet at [www.BaylorBears.com](http://www.BaylorBears.com) and via the **TuneIn** App.

### OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING A BAYLOR STAPLE

- Baylor has ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage in all eight seasons since 2013-14, including six times ranked in the nation's top-5. The Bears only cracked the top-20 once in **Drew's** first 10 years.
- Baylor's 8-year streak is the nation's best, and West Virginia (7 years) is the only other team with a 4+ year streak.
- Baylor currently ranks 7th nationally in offensive rebounding percentage, grabbing 38% of its missed field goals.
- BU finished No. 5 in 2020-21, No. 8 in 2019-20, No. 2 in 2018-19, No. 9 in 2017-18, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16, No. 1 in 2014-15 and No. 3 in 2013-14. Prior to that top-10 streak, BU's best rank was No. 16 in 2011-12.

### GRADUATING 91 PERCENT OF SENIORS

- Since **Scott Drew** took over the Baylor Basketball program in 2003, 38 of 41 scholarship players who have played their final years of collegiate eligibility under **Drew** have graduated from Baylor.
