STORY LINES

- No. 11 Baylor returns home for a nationally televised tussle with Texas Tech on CBS.
- BU is aiming to sweep the season series from the Red Raiders for the eighth time in the **Scott Drew** era.
- Saturday marks BU's first regular-season game on CBS since 2021 and its first home game on CBS since Feb. 10, 2018.
- This is the 146th series meeting between the two, with Baylor holding a 24-15 edge in the Drew era.
- The Bears have won nine of the last 11 meetings in Waco (39-28 overall).
- In the last meeting, BU led by as many as 16 in the second half, before holding off a hard-charge from the Red Raiders to win 81-74, for a third-straight conference win.
- Last time out, Baylor had its six-game winning streak snapped at Texas (76-71), just its second loss in its last 14 games against AP top-10 teams.
- BU is 78-22 against in-state opponents since the start of the 2011-12 season, and the Bears have advanced deeper into postseason play than any of Texas' 23 Division I teams in five of the last nine seasons.
- In its last home game, BU beat Arkansas 67-64 in the final SEC/Big 12 Challenge game in front of the second-largest crowd in program history.
- The Bears defeated eight different teams in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge and won all five meetings at the Ferrell Center.
- The Bears are 25-9 vs. AP top-25 teams over the last four years, with 15 of those wins coming away from home.
- Baylor's seven quad-one wins are tied for the second-most in the nation.
- Baylor's starting guard trio of **George**, **Adam Flagler** and **LJ Cryer** ranks as the sixth-highest scoring back court trio in college basketball (47.2 ppg, second-best in the power six – NC State).
- **Keyonte George's** 17.2 points per game rank third among freshman in Division I.
- **George** Has nine 20-point games this season are tied for the most by a BU freshman since Aaron Bruce had nine in 2004-2005.
- At 24-7, BU has the best Big 12 road record over the last four seasons, and is one of just three teams with a .500+ road record in the conference during that span.
- The Bears had a season-high 30 second-chance points against the Sooners (1/21), the most since they had 32 against Washington State on 12/23/2010.
- Baylor's 47-12 Big 12 record over the last four seasons is the best of any Power-5 team.
- BU is 161-93 in Big 12 play in 13 seasons since 2010 after going 59-149 in the league's first 13 seasons.
- After a one-week absence from the AP Top 25 in January, the Bears are back in the top 25 and have now been ranked in 68 of the last 69 AP Polls.
- All six of BU's losses have come against teams currently ranked in the top 15 of the AP poll, and in the top 19 of the latest NCAA Net rankings.
- The Bears are the fourth-best offense in the nation (best in the conference) according to Ken Pom (120.0 Adj. Efficiency rating), averaging 78.5 points per game.

QUICK HITS

- Last year, Baylor claimed its 7th conference title in program history (1932, 1946, 1948, 1949, 1950, 2021, 2022).
- Baylor is the first team other than Kansas to win back-to-back Big 12 Titles since Iowa State in 2000 and 2001.
- No Big 12 team other than Kansas has won three-straight titles in conference history.
- Selected ninth overall by the San Antonio Spurs in June's NBA Draft, **Jeremy Sochan** gave BU back-to-back lottery picks for the first time in program history (**Davion Mitchell** 9th overall to Sacramento in 2021).
- The Bears have had 10 picks in the last 10 drafts, which is the most in the state of Texas and second-most in the Big 12 since 2012.
- With **Kendall Brown's** selection at No. 48 overall in the 2022 Draft, Baylor became one of five schools with multiple picks in back-to-back NBA Drafts.
- BU's four draft selections in the last two drafts trail only Duke (6) and Kentucky (5).
- BU is 50-5 in home games over the last four seasons.
- Baylor has sold over 6,000 season tickets this season, a record-high for the program.
- Baylor has reached the 25-win milestone in each of the last 3 seasons and in 7 of the last 13 years. Prior to that, BU reached 25 wins just once in the program's first 103 years (25-5 in 1945-46).
- Baylor is 25-9 against ranked teams over the last four seasons, including a 15-5 mark away from home.
- Baylor's 47-12 Big 12 record over the last four seasons is the best record of any Power-5 team.
- Head coach **Scott Drew** is in his 20th season at Baylor with a school-record 412 career victories.
- Over the last 4 seasons, Baylor is 78-7 when leading at the half and 96-10 when taking a 2nd-half lead.
- Baylor spent a school-record 54-straight weeks ranked in the top-10 of the AP Poll, from Dec. 16, 2019-Dec 5, 2022.
- BU set a school-record streak of 65-straight weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 (previous record was 25). The streak lasted from Nov. 5, 2019 to Jan 9, 2023 (1,161 Days).
- Baylor has been ranked in all 25 spots in the AP Top 25 at some point in the last 8 years.
- Baylor has been No. 1 ranked in 4 of the last 7 seasons (Gonzaga, Duke and Kansas are only others).
- Baylor and Kansas are the only Power-5 schools to win 18+ games every year since 2008.
- Baylor has built leads of 10+ points in 45 of 58 games since the start of the 2021 NCAA Tournament (46-12 record).
- BU has built double-digit leads in 92 of 114 games over the last 4 seasons.
- BU went 305 days between losses last year, the longest in program history (March 12, 2021 – Jan. 11, 2022).
- BU had a 36-game non-conference winning streak with 813 days between losses (Nov. 8, 2019 – Jan. 29, 2022).
- Last year, Baylor became the first program to start consecutive seasons 15-0 since Syracuse in 2010-11 and 2011-12.
- Baylor's streak of 10 consecutive postseasons is tied as the nation's 6th-longest active streak.
- Baylor is 1 of 9 teams nationally to appear in every postseason since 2012 (8 NCAAAs, 2 NITs).
- Baylor is 108-10 when leading at halftime over the last 6 seasons (77-7 over last four seasons).
- Baylor has won 90% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (226-26).
- Entering 2022-23 Baylor is 272-106 over the last 11 seasons, averaging 24.5 wins per season since 2011-12.
- Baylor's 287 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (337).
- Baylor is 378-159 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- Six of Baylor's players have used or are currently using a redshirt year. Three after transferring to BU (Flagler, Grimes, Tchamwa Tchatchoua), one before transferring (Bonner) and two as freshmen — Turner and Langston Love.
- Eleven of Baylor's 12 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (17 of last 18 seasons).
- Baylor has the nation's 9th-longest active streak with at least one 3-point FG made in 1,017 straight games — the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was nearly 33 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- **Scott Drew** became Baylor's head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew is one of 10 active men's Division I coaches with at least 400 wins at their current school.
- Drew is one of 2 active coaches to have won an NCAA Title and an NIT Title. He is the only active coach to have won both at the same school (John Calipari NCAA: Kentucky, NIT: Memphis).
- Drew was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 20th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (413).
- Baylor has a .704 winning percentage (377-157) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .721 winning percentage (287-109) over the last 11 seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (52) is the youngest active collegiate head coach to win a National Championship.
- In Drew's first 19 seasons at Baylor, 51 players have gone on to professional careers.
- Was announced as a member of the Texas Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2023.
- He is the 23rd BU player or coach to be inducted into the Texas Sports Hall of Fame
- Will be inducted April 15, 2023, alongside Texas legends like Michael Strahan (Texas Southern), Adrian Peterson (Palestine High School) and Priest Holmes (Marshall High School & the University of Texas)

UP NEXT

- BU will look to sweep the regular-season series against Oklahoma for a fifth-straight season when they host the Sooners on Feb. 8th.
- The Bears return to the road to face No. 15 TCU in Fort Worth after the Frogs topped BU 88-87 in Waco early last month.
- BU aims to win a fourth-straight in a Waco and a fifth-straight overall when they welcome in WVU.

NATION'S-BEST 25-9 VS. RANKED TEAMS OVER LAST FOUR SEASONS

- Baylor is a nation's-best 25-9 against AP Top-25 ranked teams since 2019-2020.
- BU is 10-3 at home vs. ranked teams in the last 3 seasons – wins vs. #12 Arizona (Dec. 2019), #18 Butler (Dec. 2019), #14 West Virginia (Feb. 2020), #9 Kansas (Jan. 2021), #17 Oklahoma State (March 2021), #18 Texas Tech (March 2021), #6 Villanova (Dec. 2021), #20 Texas (Feb. 2022), #5 Kansas (Feb. 2022) and #9 Kansas (Feb. 2023) and losses by 3 points to #3 Kansas (Feb. 2020) and #19 Texas Tech (Jan. 2022).
- The record includes 15-5 away from home, with neutral wins vs. #17 Villanova (Nov. 2019), vs. #5 Illinois (Nov. 2020), vs. #18 Villanova (March 2021), vs. #10 Arkansas (March 2021), vs. #6 Houston (April 2021), #1 Gonzaga (April 2021), #8 UCLA and #14 Gonzaga, with road wins at #22 Texas Tech (Jan. 2020), at #4 Kansas (Jan. 2020), at #15 Texas Tech (Jan. 2021), at #6 Texas (Feb. 2021), at #6 West Virginia (March 2021), at #8 Iowa State (January 2022) and at #21 Texas (Feb. 2022).

BEARING DOWN AGAINST THE RED RAIDERS

- This is the 146th meeting between BU and TTU. While the Red Raiders hold the 82-63 all-time series advantage, BU has a 22-9 edge over Tech since 2007-2008, Baylor's first year under Scott Drew with no scholarship restrictions.
- BU's longest win streak in the series is four games. Of the four instances that has occurred, three have come under the direction of Scott Drew.
- Baylor is 9-2 in its last 11 games against Tech in Waco, and BU is 24-11 overall against Texas Tech since 2006.

THE LAST MEETING

- Leading by as much as 16 in the second half, BU held off a hard-charge from the home-standing Red Raiders 81-74 to move to 3-3 in conference play.
- Baylor improved to 78-21 against in-state opponents since the start of the 2011-2012 season.
- Texas Tech allowed a season-high 48 points against the Bears.
- George recorded his eighth 20-point game of the season the most by a freshman since Aaron Bruce had nine in 2004-2005.

MILESTONE WATCH

- With a win over Tarleton (12/6), fifth-year senior **Flo Thamba** became the program's all-time winningest player in both career games (117) and wins in games participated in (109).
- Thamba has 138 career games played, the fourth-most in program history. With one more game played, he will tie Quincy Acy for the third-most in program history.
- The senior enters with 50 career Big 12 wins, two behind the all-time program leader Matthew Mayer (52).
- With 3 more games played, Thamba would join A.J. Walton and Rico Gathers for the most games played in program history.
- With one more block, Thamba will reach 100 career blocks.

THE BIG 12'S MOST WINS ON CONFERENCE CHALLENGES

- Baylor is 13-4 in conference challenges – 782 in Big 12/SEC Challenge, 3-1 in Big 12/Pac-10, 2-1 in Big 12/Big East.
- Baylor's 13-4 record in conference challenges (Big 12-Big East, Big 12/SEC, Big 12/Pac-12) is best in the Big 12, followed by Kansas at 12-7, OSU at 12-8, Texas Tech at 10-8, Iowa State at 9-8, Texas at 9-8, OU at 9-10, TCU at 7-7, K-State at 8-12 and WVU at 5-10.

NOTABLE STREAKS

- Baylor has taken a lead in 141-consecutive games (last wire-to-wire loss Dec. 1, 2018 at Wichita State).
- BU has won 73-straight when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent (last loss March 2, 2019 at K-State).
- Baylor has won 40-straight games when shooting 50% or higher (last loss March 18, 2018 vs. Mississippi State).
- Baylor has made 2 or more 3-pointers in 169-consecutive games (last on Jan. 2, 2018 vs. TCU).

ANOTHER TALENTED CROP HEADED TO WACO

- BU signed Miro Little and Ja'Kobe Walker on signing day, the 21st-ranked class according to ESPN.com.
- Walter is rated as a five-star prospect (No. 17 overall) by ESPN. BU has signed a five-star prospect in each of the last three classes.
- A native of McKinney, Texas, Walter led McKinney High School to its first-ever state championship game in 2021-22, before transferring to Link Academy in Branson, Mo., for the 2022-23 season.
- Walter is the sixth McDonald All-American in program history.
- Miro Little is rated as a four-star prospect from Helsinki, Finland, by way of Sunrise Christian Academy in Bel Aire, Kan. He is BU's 3rd player to sign out of Sunrise Christian in the last five years. (Turner 2019 & Kendall Brown 2021)
- Little averaged 15.6 points, 4.0 assists and 9.4 rebounds to help Finland to the third-place game in Division B U18 European Championships.
- This past summer, he became the youngest Finnish player to ever play for the senior team when he helped them to the quarterfinals of the FIBA EuroBasket Championships.

SHOOTING STRUGGLES CONTINUE IN LOSS AT NO. 10 TEXAS

- BU shot .368 its fourth-straight game shooting below 38% in a 76-71 loss at No. 10 Texas.
- After the Bears tied the game to start the second-half, Texas went on an 8-0 run to wrestle back the league they would never give back.
- **LJ Cryer** scored a team-high 19 points, leading the team in scoring for a second time in three games, his 11th 15+ point game of the season.
- **Keyonte George** tallied 17 points, his 14th game of 15+ points this season.

CHALLENGE ACCEPTED

- Baylor held off Arkansas 67-64 to win its sixth-straight game and finish the SEC/Big 12 challenge at 8-2 the best record in either conference.
- **Keyonte George** scored nine of Bu's last 11 points to secure the win in front of the second-largest crowd in Ferrell Center History.
- **LJ Cryer** poured in 20 points, his fourth 20-point output of the season.
- It marked the third time BU had multiple players score 20-plus points this season.

BAYLOR BEATS KANSAS FOR A FOURTH-STRAIGHT SEASON

- The Bears controlled the game, leading for 38:39 en route to a 75-69 win over the Jayhawks, BU's third-straight in Waco.
- **LJ Cryer** finished with a team-leading 22 points on 8-of-16 shooting with three assists and two boards in 37 minutes.
- **Cryer** had five 3-pointers in the first half, the first player with 5 triples in the first half since Adam Flagler had 5 at Oregon last season.
- Baylor improved to 12-1 vs. top-10 ranked teams in the last three years and are 10-4 in home games against top-10 foes over the last 10 seasons.

BAYLOR STEALS A ROAD WIN AT OKLAHOMA

- Despite trailing for nearly half the game, Jalen Bridges and Adam Flagler hit clutch three-pointers in the final 1:30 to go from trailing by two, to leading by four, which put the game out of reach.
- BU had a season high 30 second-chance points, its most since they had 32 against Washington State on 12/23/2010.
- BU's .362 FG% was its lowest in a win since they shot .317% in a 74-49 win over K-State on 1/25/22.

BEARS HOLD OFF TEXAS TECH FOR THIRD-STRAIGHT BIG 12 WIN

- Leading by as much as 16 in the second half, BU held off a hard-charge from the home-standing Red Raiders 81-74 to move to 3-3 in conference play.
- Baylor improved to 78-21 against in-state opponents since the start of the 2011-2012 season.
- Texas Tech allowed a season-high 48 points against the Bears.
- George recorded his eighth 20-point game of the season the most by a freshman since Aaron Bruce had nine in 2004-2005.

BEARS PUT UP A LIGHTS-OUT PERFORMANCE AGAINST OKLAHOMA STATE

- After starting the game on a 13-0 run, Baylor led wire-to-wire to win a second-straight game over Oklahoma State.
- The Bears improved to 153-9 under Scott Drew (5-0 this season) when holding teams to below 60 points.
- A city-wide power outage caused the arena to lose power at the 11:00 minute mark of the 2nd half, causing a 20-minute delay.
- **LJ Cryer** scored a game-high 16 points his most since he scored 19 at Marquette on 11/29.
- With 11 points, **Adam Flagler** extended his streak of 10+ point games to 17.

BEARS BREAK THROUGH IN BIG 12 PLAY AGAINST WEST VIRGINIA

- Baylor held off West Virginia 83-78 in overtime for its first Big 12 win of the season
- **Keyonte George** scored 32 points, the most by a freshman since LaceDarius Dunn had 38 against Texas Tech in 2008.
- In his return to West Virginia, **Jalen Bridges** recorded his first double-double at Baylor with 10 points and 11 rebounds.
- The Bears snapped a three-game losing streak, the longest since 2018-2019.

BEARS FORCE OVERTIME BUT FALL IN RETURN OF JEROME TANG

- Ismael Massoud hit a go-ahead three pointer with 32 seconds left in overtime to Snap BU's seven-game winning streak over Kansas State.
- **Jalen Bridges'** three-pointer with 22 seconds left tied the game and sent it to overtime.
- **Keyonte George** scored 22 points, his sixth 20-point performance of the season, the most by a freshman since Perry Jones III in 2010-2011 (6).
- BU dropped to 21-7 in overtime games under **Scott Drew**.

MILES & TCU USE SECOND-HALF SURGE TO DROP BU

- TCU erased a 17-point deficit, hitting a game-winning shot with 0:04 seconds left to drop the Bears to 0-2 in Big 12 Play.
- Baylor went on a 9:11 field goal drought in the second-half that allowed TCU back into the games.
- The Frogs blitzed the Bears 23-2 in fast-break points
- Keyonte George scored 20+ points for a team-leading fifth time, the most 20-point games by a freshman since Perry Jones III (6).
- TCU's Mike Miles dropped a career-high 33 points

CYCLONES SLOW DOWN THE SHORT-HANDED BEARS TO OPEN CONFERENCE PLAY

- Playing without **L.J. Cryer** ISU snapped Baylor's four-game winning streak in Ames, the longest road winning streak by either team in the series.
- **Adam Flagler** scored a season-high 18 first-half points, his 12th-straight double-figure scoring effort, and his fourth-straight against Iowa State.
- **Keyonte George** notched a double-figure scoring effort for the 11th time this season.
- Iowa State used a 10-0 run late in the first half to take a halftime lead they would never relinquish.

BEARS BEAT BACK THE COUGARS IN BIG D

- **Keyonte George** led the Bears with 19 points, leading the team in scoring for a third-straight game, to hold off Washington State.
- With BU facing its largest deficit of the second half, **George** scored or assisted on nine of Baylor's next 10 points to take the lead back for good.
- With 12 points, **Adam Flagler** scored in double figures for an 11th-straight game.
- It was **Flagler's** 80th career double-figure scoring effort (10 this season, 48 at Baylor)

SHORTHANDED BEARS HOLD OFF TARLETON

- Baylor played without its two leading scorers in **Adam Flagler** and **LJ Cryer**.
- Baylor improved to 61-17 against in-state opponents since the start of the 2011-12 season.
- With 100 career wins, Flo Thamba is now the winningest player in program history (Only includes games played).
- The senior also set a new program record with his 108th win of his career (including all games regardless of participation).
- Langston Love made his first-career start and notched his first-career 20-point game, a new career high.
- Keyonte George had a game-high 22 points, his third 20-point game this season.

STRUTTING THEIR STUFF, BU TAKES THE INAUGURAL PEACOCK CLASSIC VS. GONZAGA

- Baylor trailed by seven with 1:31 to play in the game, but back-to-back threes by **Adam Flagler** and a pair of clutch free throws from **Jalen Bridges** gave BU its second-straight win over the Zags.
- The Bears built on the nations best record against AP Top 25 teams over the last 4 years (24-7, 15 of those coming away from home).
- The Bears limited Gonzaga, the nation's best offense, to a season-low 63 points in the win.
- **Keyonte George** led all scorers with 18 points, the fourth time he led the Bears in eight games

BEARS DROP ROAD CONTEST AT MARQUETTE

- Baylor played in front of its largest crowd of the season (14,022), and its largest since last year against Oklahoma in the Big 12 Tournament (15,805).
- **LJ Cryer** had a team-high 19 points, and has averaged 20.4 points per game in his last five contests.
- With four made threes, **Adam Flagler** made 4+ three pointers in five of seven games this season.

BEARS ROPE THE COWBOYS

- The Bears finished with 30 assists, the first game with 30+ assists since BU had 33 against McNeese State on 11/15/21.
- **LJ Cryer** scored the first 10 points of the game (10-0 run), and finished with 16 points, his fifth game in double figures this season.
- Cryer is averaging 20.8 points over the last three games, and has made multiple three-pointers in 13-straight games.
- **Keyonte George** had a game-high 17 points, his fifth game of 13+ points.
- **Dale Bonner** set a new career high with 12 assists. His previous high was 11 assists at Fairmont State against Bowie State (11/30/19) and Concord (2/8/21).

BLISTERING THE BRUINS

- Baylor held off No. 8 UCLA 80-75, thanks in part to a career-high 28 points for **LJ Cryer**, while **Adam Flagler** chipped in 22 points.
- Cryer found his stroke in the second half, scoring 18 points on 5-of-8 shooting, including three of his four three-pointers and a pair of clutch free throws to seal the game.
- BU improved to 11-1 in its last 12 games against AP Top-10 teams.
- Baylor improved to 10-1 in its last 11 meetings against Pac 12 opponents, including 6-straight wins.

BEARS SUFFER FIRST LOSS OF THE SEASON AGAINST NO. 16 VIRGINIA

- Baylor dropped its first game of the season, 86-79, against No. 16 Virginia in a matchup of two of the last three national champions.
- BU held a 33-30 lead at the half, before a 14-0 second-half run by the Cavaliers put them in control of the game.
- **Keyonte George** scored 20+ points for the second time in four games.
- **LJ Cryer** hit a 3-pointer for a 16th-consecutive game
- **Caleb Lohner** set a new Baylor career high with 11 points, his most since scoring 20 with BYU against Long Beach State, in the opening round of the NIT.

BAYLOR BEATS BACK NORTHERN COLORADO

- Scott Drew won his 400th game at Baylor, becoming one of 10 active Division 1 men's coaches with 400+ wins at their current school.
- 299 points through the first three games were the most in program history.
- Dale Bonner matched a career high with 6 steals. He is the fifth player in program history with multiple games of 6+ steals (Micheal Williams, Terry Black, Wendell Greenleaf and A.J. Walton).
- Jalen Bridges scored in double figures for a third-straight game. It is the first time in his career he has reached double figures in three-straight games.
- With 13 points and 10 assists, Adam Flagler recorded the second double-double of his career.

STRONG SHOWING AGAINST THE SPARTANS

- BU defeated Norfolk State 87-70 in an NCAA Tournament rematch at the Ferrell Center (11/11)
- The Bears improved to 3-1 under Scott Drew when facing an NCAA Tournament foe the following season.
- 38 three-point attempts tied for the 5th most in school history (2nd most in the Drew Era), and were the most since BU shot 39 against Alcorn State (11/23/02).
- **Keyonte George** scored 23 points in the win, which was the most points by a freshman since Jared Butler scored 31 against Kansas in 2019.
- **Jalen Bridges** set a new Baylor career high with 20 points, two points shy of his career high of 22.

DEALT WITH THE DELTA DEVILS

- BU Improved to 18-2 in season openers under Scott Drew with a 117-53 win over MVSU (11/7).
- 117 points were the most by a Baylor team since the Bears scored 118 against Savannah State on 12/17/2017.
- BU's 64-point win was the third-largest margin of victory in program history and the most since beating Hardin Simmons by 69 on Jan. 19, 2013.
- **Jalen Bridges, Keyonte George and Langston Love** all scored 13 points, which are the most in a BU debut since LJ Cryer had 17 against Louisiana on 11/28/2020.
- **Adam Flagler** reached the 20-point mark for the second-straight game (21). Scoring in double figures in 23 of his last 25 games.

SUCCESS IN TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor is 40-13 in regular-season tournaments during the Drew era, including titles in 4 of the last 5 tournaments.
- BU is 27-5 in its eight regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, going 3-1, 3-1, 3-1, 4-0, 4-0, 3-1, 3-0, 3-0 and 1-1.
- BU advanced to championship games in the 2007 Paradise Jam (won), 2008 76 Classic (lost), 2011 Las Vegas Classic (won), 2013 Maui Invitational (lost), 2014 Las Vegas Invitational (lost), 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis (won), 2017 Hall of Fame Classic (won), 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational (won) and 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis (won).
- Baylor has won six regular-season tournament titles under Drew – 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational, 2017 Hall of Fame Classic, 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2011 Las Vegas Classic and 2007 Paradise Jam.

TWO-STRAIGHT NO. 1 SEEDS

- Baylor earned its second-straight No. 1 seed last year – the previous high was No. 3 in 2010, 2012, 2015 and 2017 – and if 2020 had been played, the Bears likely would’ve become just the 11th team all-time to earn 3-straight No. 1 seeds.
- Baylor has earned a top-3 seed in 6 of the last 12 NCAA Tournaments.
- BU is 15-5 in NCAAT games as the higher seed, but 2021 was the first time as a higher seed after the Sweet 16.
- BU is 3-5 in NCAAT games as the lower/same seed, though four of those five losses were to top-2 seeds.

BACK-TO-BACK BIG 12 CHAMPIONS

- Baylor has won back-to-back Big 12 Championships, claiming its first league titles since the 1950 SWC.
- BU became the first team other than Kansas to win consecutive Big 12 titles since Iowa State in 2000-01.
- Baylor has won seven league titles in program history, the first five in the Southwest Conference – SWC Championships: 1932 (10-2), 1946 (11-1), 1948 (11-1), 1949 (9-3) and 1950 (8-4); Big 12 Championships: 2021 (13-1) and 2022 (14-4). The 1949, 1950 and 2022 titles were co-championships.
- This marks 3-straight years of top-2 finishes; the best prior Big 12 finish was a tie for 2nd (2010 & 2017).
- Baylor’s 15 Big 12 wins in 2020 were the most ever by a team that didn’t claim the Big 12 title.

BAYLOR PARTNERS WITH CITY OF WACO ON \$700 MILLION RIVERFRONT PROJECT

- Baylor and the City of Waco have partnered on a \$700 million riverfront development project, headlined by the \$212 million Foster Pavilion, the future home for Baylor’s national champion basketball programs.
- Foster Pavilion (capacity 7,500) will be located along the Brazos River on the opposite side of I-35 from McLane Stadium.
- Construction is underway, with the pavilion targeted for a January 2024 opening.
- Development Centers for both basketball programs are included in the 245k square foot Foster Pavilion project.

FINAL FULL SEASON AT THE FERRELL

- BU has played in the Ferrell Center since 1988, and holds a 408-169 record all-time.
- LaceDarius Dunn holds the individual scoring record at the Ferrell Center when he scored 43 against Morgan State on 1/4/2011.
- The team record is 118 points by BU against Savannah State on 12/17/2017. The Bears got within one point of that in a 117-52 win over MVSU in the season opener (11/7/22).
- Three of the top six crowds in Ferrell Center history have come in the last four seasons (10,628 vs. KU 2/26/22, 10,627 vs. Arkansas 1/28/23 and 10,627 vs. Kansas 2/22/20)

A TOP-25 STAPLE

- BU returned to the AP Top-25 after a one week absence, and have now been ranked in 68 of the last 69 AP Polls.
- BU set a school-record streak of 65-straight weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 (previous record was 25). The streak lasted from Nov. 5, 2019 to Jan 9, 2023 (1,161 Days).
- Baylor spent a school-record 54-straight polls ranked in the top-10 of the AP Poll (Dec. 16, 2019-Dec. 5, 2022)

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Scott Drew is in his 20th season at Baylor and is the school’s all-time wins leader (413).
- Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren’t ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school – Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson and Taurean Prince.
- The Bears have advanced to postseason play in a school-record 10 straight seasons (8 NCAA, 2 NIT).
- Baylor is 27-5 in regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, including 5 regular-season tournament titles.
- Drew has won 20+ games in 13 of the last 15 years – the Bears had 3 seasons of 20+ wins prior to his arrival.

BEARS MAKE BIG 12 HISTORY

SCOTT DREW COACHING TREE

- Four current Division I head coaches took their first DI head coaching jobs after stints on Scott Drew’s BU staff.
- Jerome Tang is in his first year as head coach at Kansas State. He was a member of Drew’s original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 19 years with Drew.
- Matthew Driscoll is in his 14th season as head coach at North Florida after six seasons as a Baylor assistant.
- Grant McCasland is in his sixth season as head coach at North Texas. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.
- Paul Mills is in his sixth season as head coach at Oral Roberts. He was a member of Drew’s original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.
- 3 of the 4 former assistants have led their teams to NCAA Tournaments – Driscoll led UNF to the 2015 NCAA Tournament, while McCasland took UNT to the 2021 Second Round and Mills took ORU to the 2021 Sweet 16.
- Drew is 0-1 all time when facing a former assistant as a head coach.

PROTECTING HALFTIME LEADS

- Baylor is 108-10 when leading at halftime since the start of 2017-18.
- Baylor has won 90% of its games (226-26) when leading at the half in the last 10+ seasons ... **14-2** in 2022-23, **20-3** in 2021-22, **24-0** in 2020-21, **21-2** in 2019-20, **15-3** in 2018-19, **15-0** in 2017-18, **18-3** in 2016-17, **18-2** in 2015-16, **21-7** in 2014-15, **18-2** in 2013-14, **17-1** in 2012-13 and **26-1** in 2011-12.
- BU has won 42% of games in which it’s been tied or trailing at the half since 2011-12, going 60-81 in those.

TEN CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON BERTHS

- Baylor is on a school-record streak of 10-consecutive postseason berths and has appeared in 13 of the last 14 seasons. BU made seven postseason appearances in the program’s 97 seasons prior to the **Scott Drew** era.
- Baylor is 1 of 9 teams to appear in every postseason since 2012, joining Gonzaga, Iona, Kansas, Michigan State, North Carolina, Oregon, Saint Mary’s and Virginia.
- BU earned NCAA bids in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019, 2021 and 2022 and NIT bids in 2013 and 2018.
- Baylor has appeared in 13 of 14 seasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor’s only postseason berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).

SECOND-MOST WINS AMONG BIG 12 TEAMS IN LAST DECADE

- Baylor’s 287-112 record since 2011-12 trails only Kansas (337-80) among Big 12 teams.
- West Virginia (240-154) is 3rd, Iowa State (234-154) is 4th, Oklahoma (227-154) is 5th, Texas (229-159) is 6th, Kansas State (225-162) is 7th, Texas Tech (216-168) is 8th, TCU (202-183) is 9th and Oklahoma St. (195-169) is 10th.
- Baylor has averaged 24.6 wins per season over the last 11 seasons since 2011-12.

NON-CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- Baylor is 13-2 against the Big East during the Drew era, 17-5 vs. the Pac-12 during the Drew era, and 18-11 against the SEC during the Drew era, including 13-7 since 2012-13 and 8-2 in the Big 12/SEC Challenge.
- The Bears are 11-1 against their last 12 Pac 12 opponents, with wins in each of their last 6 meetings against teams from out west.

POINT GUARDS THRIVE IN DREW’S SYSTEM

- Eleven of Baylor’s 12 starting point guards during the **Scott Drew** era have earned All-Big 12 recognition.
- Baylor’s starting point guard has earned All-Big 12 recognition in 17 of 18 seasons since 2004-05.
- James Akinjo (2022), Jared Butler (2019, 2020, 2021), Davion Mitchell (2020, 2021), Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

51 PRO PLAYERS IN DREW ERA

- In Scott Drew’s 19 years at Baylor, 51 of his players have gone on to professional careers.
- Six Bears are currently on NBA rosters – Kendall Brown (Pacers), Davion Mitchell (Kings), Royce O’Neale (Nets), Taurean Prince (Timberwolves), Jeremy Sochan (Spurs) and Ishmail Wainright (Suns).
- In addition to the six current NBA players, eight more of Drew’s former players have played in the NBA (most recent team) – Quincy Acy (Raptors), Jared Butler (Jazz), Freddie Gillespie (Raptors), Pierre Jackson (Mavs), Cory Jefferson (Suns), Perry Jones III (Thunder), Quincy Miller (Kings), Johnathan Motley (Clippers) and Ekpe Udoh (Jazz).

HISTORY OF DEVELOPMENT WITH REDSHIRTS

- Baylor has a track record of success when redshirting players. **Davion Mitchell, MaCio Teague, Freddie Gillespie, Mark Vital, Ekpe Udoh, Johnathan Motley, Cory Jefferson, Brady Heslip, Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. and Manu Lecomte** have all gone on to professional careers after redshirting.
- **Adam Flagler** and **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** redshirted in 2019-20 while sitting out to satisfy NCAA transfer rules, while **Jordan Turner** elected to redshirt in 2019-20. **Langston Love** redshirted last season and **Dantwan Grimes** has elected to redshirt for 2022-23.

BAYLOR BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

- Baylor basketball is aired live via the Baylor Sports Network from Learfield on ESPN Central Texas and flagship station 1660AM/92.3 FM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco, worldwide on Sirius/XM Radio and The Varsity Network App.
- Games are broadcast by the “Voice of the Bears” John Morris, who was named NSMA 2019 Texas co-Sportscaster of the Year on Jan. 13, 2020, and former Baylor basketball standout Pat Nunley.
- Morris is in his 39th year doing BU broadcasts (28th full-time), and Nunley is in his 42nd season as analyst.
- All of Baylor’s games can be heard live on the Internet at www.BaylorBears.com and via the Varsity Network App.

OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING A BAYLOR STAPLE

- BU leads the conference (8th in the nation) in offensive rebound % (37.2) according to KenPom
- Baylor has ranked top-13 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage in all nine seasons since 2013-14, including six times ranked in the nation’s top-5. The Bears only cracked the top-20 once in Drew’s first 10 years.
- Baylor finished ranked No. 13 nationally in 2021-22, No. 5 nationally in 2020-21, No. 8 in 2019-20, No. 2 in 2018-19, No. 9 in 2017-18, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16, No. 1 in 2014-15 and No. 3 in 2013-14. Prior to that top-10 streak, BU’s best rank was No. 16 in 2011-12.

BREAKTHROUGH IN BIG 12

- BU is 161-92 in Big 12 play in 13 seasons since 2010 after going 59-149 in the league’s first 13 seasons.
- BU is 174-109 in Big 12 play in 15 seasons since 2008 after going 45-131 in the league’s first 11 seasons.
- Baylor is 65-46 in Big 12 road games since 2012, second-best in the league behind only Kansas (70-43).
- BU has won 8+ Big 12 games in 11-straight seasons after winning 8+ just 3 times in the league’s first 15 years.
- BU has double-digit Big 12 wins in 7 of the last 8 years and 9 of the last 13 seasons. BU didn’t reach double-digit Big 12 wins in any of its first 13 years in the league before reaching 10+ for the first time in 2010.

DREW IS THIRD BIG 12 COACH TO REACH 150 CONFERENCE WINS

- **Scott Drew** joined Rick Barnes and Bill Self as the only coaches to reach 150 Big 12 wins on March 4, 2021 vs. OSU.
- Drew needed 136 games over 2,940 days for his first 50 Big 12 wins (50-86), 88 games over 1,821 days for his next 50 Big 12 wins (50-38) and only 77 games over 1,493 days for his next 50 Big 12 wins (50-27).

BEST IN TEXAS

- Baylor is 78-22 against in-state opponents since the start of the 2011-12 season, and the Bears have advanced deeper into postseason play than any of Texas' 23 Division I teams in five of the last nine seasons.

BIG 12 BOASTS SOME OF THE BEST

- The Big 12 has won the last two NCAA men's basketball national championships, played in the last three national championship games and appeared in the last four Final Fours.
- It's the only conference to have a representative in the title game in three-straight seasons.
- The Big 12 is the first conference to win back-to-back national championships since the ACC in 2009 and 2010.
- Sixty percent of Big 12 institutions have advanced to the Final Four since 2002, the highest percentage among conferences.

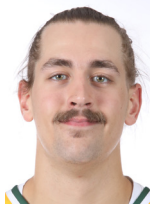

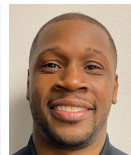
