**Acrobatics & Tumbling**

- A&T is on a 22-meet winning streak after going 2-0 for the week against Frostburg State and Quinnipiac.
- They had back-to-back meets with two perfect 10 scores. Against FSU it was Compulsory Toss and Inversion Pyramid, then against QU it was Inversion Pyramid and Kamryn Kitchens' Aerial Tumbling Pass. Bears haven't earned a 10 in that pass since 2017.
- BU is the only team to hit an overall score of 280 or more this season and has done it four times - at Trine, at Oregon, vs Frostburg and vs Quinnipiac

**Baseball**

- Went 1-3 on the week and fell to 9-15 on the season, including a 2-4 mark in conference.
- Bears raised their team batting average from .246 to .252 with three performances of at least nine hits on the week.

**Equestrian**

- Went 1-1 at the Big 12 Championship to take third place. Finished at 6-9, awaiting final seeding for potential trip to nationals April 13-15. Selections will be announced on Tuesday at 12 p.m.
- Dominika Silvestri named Big 12 Flat Rider of the Year. Also earned Most Outstanding Performer honors in Fences at the Big 12 Championship. Bears landed six on the All-Big 12 Teams.

**Softball**

- No. 20 Softball posted a mid-week win over UT Arlington on Wednesday, which marked the 1,000th career win for 26th year head coach Glenn Moore. Moore is the winningest coach in Baylor athletics history.
- The Bears then fell in three games at No. 2 Oklahoma State, including a 6-5 loss in 11 innings in the series lid-lifter.

**Women's Basketball**

- Baylor finished the season with 20 wins for the 23rd-straight year, which is the second-longest active streak behind UConn.
- NaLyssa Smith was crowned champion of Athletes Unlimited on Saturday.
- Caitlin Bickle will be participating in the College Team Skills & 3X3U Championships in Houston on Wednesday. The event will air on ESPN2 at 9 p.m. on Sunday.

**Women's Golf**

- No. 14 Baylor finished third at the PING/ASU Intercollegiate this weekend.
- Sera Hasegawa won a share of the individual title at the PING/ASU Intercollegiate.
- BU has now had multiple individual winners in two of the last three years.

**Men's Tennis**

- No. 49 BU swept No. 47 SMU in Dallas on Thursday night, 4-0.
- The Bears took the doubles point and got singles wins from Ethan Muza and Juan Pablo Grassi Mazzuchi before Luc Koenig closed out the match on Court Five.
- League play begins at 6 p.m. on Friday night against Texas Tech at the Hurd Tennis Center. MTEN Alumni will have a pre-match tailgate as part of Alumni Weekend with the team.

**Women's Tennis**

- The Bears split with WVU and ISU this weekend.
- Sophomore Alina Shcherbinina has won five-straight and picked up her third-ranked win against Iowa State.

**Track & Field**

- The Bears won eight events at the Clyde Hart Classic this weekend in Waco.
- Freshman Gary Moore Jr. set a new program record of 199-1 in the hammer throw on Friday evening.
- Demar Francis' 20.54 mark in the 200 meters ranks No. 3 nationally so far in outdoor competition this spring, while the women's 4x400-meter relay squad sits fourth.
- The men are ranked No. 20 and the women check in at No. 41.
