Cross Country

- The Bears compete on Saturday morning at the Big 12 Championships in Ames, Iowa.
- The first race is set to start at 10 a.m. on ESPN+.

Equestrian

- Baylor is ranked No. 8 and opened up Big 12 play with a loss vs. Oklahoma State on Oct. 13.
- Seven Bears opened conference play with a win and Jumping Seat claimed its first event wins of the season against OSU.
- The Bears will return to action Thursday, Nov. 2, at the Willis Family Equestrian Center against Fresno State.

Football

- Baylor used a strong passing game and a historic outing from kicker Isaiah Hankins to post a 32-29 win at Cincinnati on Saturday.
- The Bears improved to 2-0 on the road in 2023, getting 313 yards passing from QB Blake Shapen and 130 yards receiving from Ketrion Jackson Jr.
- Hankins connected for four field goals from 40+ yards, including a career-long 54 yarder that marked the sixth-longest field goal in program history. He was named the Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week and the Lou Groza Award Star of the Week.

Men's Golf

- No. 23 men's golf will close down the fall slate next week at the Kapolei Invitational Oct. 31-Nov. 2.

Women's Golf

- After the first of three rounds on Monday, the No. 69 Bears are leading the Rainbow Wahine Invite in Hawaii.
- The tournament will run through Wednesday.

Men's Tennis

- Men's tennis wrapped up its time at the ITA Texas Regionals in Fort Worth on Monday.
- Tadeas Paroulek went 4-1 in singles on the weekend to advance to the semifinal round.

Women's Tennis

- The Bears are traveling to the TCU Invitational this weekend for their third tournament of the fall.
- Baylor will be represented by Isabella Harvison, Zuzanna Frankowska, Daniella Dimitrov and Lauren Littell.
- Littell and Frankowska will be making their first appearances of the fall slate

Soccer

- The Bears defeated Houston 3-2 on Monday night to secure a spot in the Big 12 Tournament.
- As the No. 8 seed in the tournament, the Bears will face No. 9 seed Cincinnati, on Saturday at 1 p.m. in Round Rock.
- Ashley Merrill now has 11 goals on the season, the most by a BU player in a single season since 2012.

Volleyball

- The red-hot Bears swept season series with No. 24 UCF, which entered the series unbeaten in league play, booting them from the AVCA poll.
- Baylor stretched its win streak to five games with the sweep of UCF.
- The Bears moved up to No. 20 and face No. 5 Texas on Thursday and Friday in Austin.
