Acrobatics & Tumbling

- No. 1 BU hosts No. 2 Oregon on Sunday at 3 p.m. for their Go Gold meet and the Cub Club event of the month. Meet will be a rematch of the 2023 national title meet.
- Baylor took the Athlete of the Week (Riley Chimwala) and Freshman of the Week (Emily Bott) awards last week.

Baseball

- Baseball begins a nine-game homestand with Lamar on Tuesday at 4 p.m. at Baylor Ballpark.
- The Bears went 0-3 at the 2024 Shriners Children's College Showdown, but held their own against very tough competition.
- Junior RHP Mason Marriott struck out a career-high 10 vs. Nebraska on Friday, becoming the first Bear to eclipse double digits in punchouts since Shawn Tolleson fanned 11 vs. Duke on Feb. 19, 2010.
- 14 Bears made their Baylor debut on the weekend, including 10 players making their Division I debut and six freshmen making their collegiate debuts.

Equestrian

- Equestrian heads into a bye week before their last meet of the season against No. 1 TCU on Friday, March 1 at the Willis Family Equestrian Center.
- Reining claimed its first win of the season at UC Davis on Saturday, Feb. 17
- Lauren Reid (Flat) and Bella Rosa (Horsemanship) garnered their Most Outstanding Performer (MOP) honors of the season. Reid has picked up four consecutive Flat points.

Men's Basketball

- No. 12/13 BU makes the cross-conference trip to complete the regular-season series with BYU in prime time on ESPN.
- The Bears enter on the heels of a 94-81 road win in Morgantown, BU's most points in a regulation Big 12 game since they rolled up 107 against Kansas State Jan. 27, 2021.
- 94 points are Baylor's most in a regulation Big 12-road game since rolling up 100 at K-State on Dec. 19, 2020.
- BU has won 8+ Big 12 games in 13-straight seasons after winning 8+ just 3 times in the league's first 15 years.
- In a matchup of the top two offensive teams in the conference, the Bears enter fourth in the nation in 3-point FG% (40.1) and offensive efficiency (123.2), while ranking second in the Big 12 in points per game (83.0).
- In the last meeting in Provo, Perry Jones III had 28 points and Brady Heslip added 18 as the No. 6 Bears knocked off BYU 86-83 on Dec. 17, 2011.

Women's Basketball

- No. 24/21 picked up win No. 19 on Sunday, downing Texas Tech, 61-32. The 32 points scored by TTU were the fourth-fewest points scored by a Big 12 team in league play. The Bears out rebounded the Lady Raiders, 42-26, moving to 15-1 this season when out rebounding their opponents and 54-9 under the direction of Nicki Collen. With a win over Kansas on Wednesday, Baylor would clinch its 24th-straight 20-win

season which would be the second-longest active streak in the country behind UConn.

Men's Golf

- Men's golf is playing its first tournament of the spring at the Prestige Mon.-Wed.
- Johnny Keefer was one of 40 players named to the Hogan Award Watch List.

Softball

- Baylor took the series win over No. 23 Louisiana-Lafayette last week. After falling in the Friday matchup, the Bears completed the Sunday doubleheader sweep to improve to 3-3 on the season.
- BU also picked up a midweek win over McNeese.
- The Bears will head to Palm Springs, Calif., this week to face five different opponents at the Mary Nutter Classic Feb. 22-24. All the games will be featured on FloSoftball.

Men's Tennis

- Men's tennis defeated McMurry and Abilene Christian in its Sunday doubleheader in Abilene.
- In the Bears' 7-0 sweep of McMurry, BU allowed the fewest cumulative games (five) from its opponent since May 8, 2015, when Baylor beat Bryant in Waco.
- Freshman No. 107 Devin Badenhorst has tallied eight singles wins this spring in as many tries, the most on the squad. Two doubles pairs (Paroulek/Velcz and Badenhorst/Koenig) have won a team-leading six matches.
- Baylor hosts SMU and UTRGV on Sunday for a doubleheader at the Hurd Tennis Center. The SMU match is the annual white out, where fans receive free white Baylor Tennis T-shirts. UTRGV's match has free Tiff's Treats cookies, while supplies last. Sunday's DH is half of the Hurd Tennis Center's quadruple-header with the women's tennis team.

Women's Tennis

- Women's tennis bounced back from a loss at Ole Miss on Friday to power past Mississippi State, 4-1, on Sunday wrapping up a seven-match road swing to start the season.
- Miska Kadleckova secured her fifth singles win of the season to remain undefeated. With the win over the Bulldogs on Sunday, the Bears snapped Mississippi State's 11-match home winning streak vs. non-conference opponents.
- The Bears kick off a four-match home stand on Friday when they host Denver and Incarnate Word in a doubleheader beginning at 12 p.m.

Track & Field

- Track & field had the weekend off to gear up for the Big 12 Indoor Track and Field Championships, held Friday-Saturday at Texas Tech's Sports Performance Center in Lubbock.
- The Bears have 16 entries sitting within the top-8 in the Big 12 Conference and it will be the first conference championship that features BYU, Cincinnati and Houston, with UCF's women's-only squad.
- BU begins the meet at 3 p.m. on Friday and 1 p.m. on Saturday. The meet will be streamed live by Big 12 Now on ESPN+.
