Acrobatics & Tumbling

- No. 1 A&T is on a two-meet road trip in New York, facing two programs in their inaugural seasons.
- BU posted a 19.42-point win over No. 15 Iona in New Rochelle with the high score of the meet coming in the synchronized pyramid heat with a 9.95.
- The Bears increased their meet winning streak to 31. BU faces LIU Tuesday at 5 p.m. CT in Brookville for the Sharks' home opener.

Baseball

- Baseball concludes its nine-game homestand hosting No. 17 DBU on Tuesday before opening Big 12 play at Houston this weekend.
- The Bears are coming off their second sweep of the Mitch Thompson era, taking all three from Oral Roberts this past weekend.
- BU racked up 31 runs on 42 hits, its most in a three-game weekend series since scoring 43 runs on 45 hits on May 7-9, 2021, against KSU.
- BU has struck out double-digit batters in six of their 11 games, and 26 times under Thompson.
- Of the 24 times that redshirt junior OF Enzo Apodaca has reached base this season, he has either scored or driven in a run 15 times (63%).

Equestrian

- Baylor dropped its last regular season meet 12-7 to No. 1 TCU last Friday: five Bears were honored on Senior Day, including Gianna Brocchini, Rachel Brody, Tatum Mitchell, Bella Rosa and Samantha Stubblefield.
- BU returns to action March 29-30 at the Big 12 Equestrian Championship, as it hosts the event for the first time in three years.
- Four Bears boast a winning conference record ahead of the championship, including Madison Mitchell (Flat, 4-2), Sadie Peters (Reining, 3-2), Lauren Reid (Fences, 3-2 | Flat, 5-1) and Dominika Silvestri (Fences, 3-2).

Men's Basketball

- No. 11/11 BU moved up four spots in the AP poll and has now won three-straight Big 12 games.
- The Bears captured the final regular-season meeting with Texas on Monday night with a 93-85 win over the Horns.
- For a second-straight season in Waco, BU erased a 14-point first-half lead by UT.
- The Bears overcame a 10+ point second-half deficit for the first time since 1/31/22 vs. WVU.
- BU shot .692 from three-point range, which ranks as the highest three-point shooting percentage in a Big 12 game for Baylor, and the third highest in program history.
- The Bears' 34 made free throws were its most in a game since making 38 against Nebraska in the 2021 NCAA Tournament.
- Jalen Bridges scored a career-high 32 points on senior night, on a season-high 6 made threes
- RayJ Dennis eclipsed the 200-assist mark for the season with 8 more dimes on Monday. He has the fifth-most assists in a single-season, 19 behind Lester Medford's 222 in 2015-16.

Women's Basketball

- Baylor jumped four spots in the latest AP Top 25 poll and enter this week's Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship as the No. 17-ranked team in the country and No. 5 seed in the tournament.
- The Bears will face the winner of Texas Tech/Houston at 11 a.m. on Friday at the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City. Winners of their last five games, Dre'Una Edwards (11.8) and Jana Van Gytenbeek (10.2) have led the Bears in scoring during those contests.
- Baylor is an impressive 19-1 this season when outrebounding its opponent and 20-2 when leading at halftime.

Men's Golf

- Baylor concludes the Cabo Collegiate Tuesday.
- The Bears are facing off against the best field they will see until the NCAA postseason, playing against six of the top-10 and 10 of the top-25 teams in the nation.
- Johnny Keefer entered Tuesday with a career-best nine-straight rounds at par or better, and enters the final round in the top-10.

Women's Golf

- Baylor is competing at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate against three of the top five, six of the top 10, and 10 of the top 25 teams.
- The Darius Rucker features live coverage on the Golf Channel on Tuesday and Wednesday from 1:30-4:30 p.m. CT and it is the only nationally televised, all-female regular-season event in college golf.

Softball

- No. 14 Baylor completed a three-game sweep over Morgan State last weekend, holding MSU to just two runs scored over three games.
- The Bears will face Sam Houston on Tuesday and Penn State on Wednesday, before welcoming No. 4 Oklahoma State to Getteman Stadium for the first Big 12 weekend of the year.
- Baylor sports a 2.31 team ERA through the first 14 games and has hit .290 as a team. Rylee Crandall is 5-0 with a 1.44 ERA in the circle. Shaylan Govan is hitting .436 with a homer.

Men's Tennis

- The Bears dropped two matches last week against No. 1 Ohio State and at No. 19 Illinois to move to 12-3 on the season. Playing the top-ranked Buckeyes, the Bears clinched their ninth-straight doubles point before Zsombor Velcz and Marko Miladinovic posted singles wins against the Fighting Illini.
- BU begins a slate of four games in four days on Thursday against VCU before also hosting Omaha on Friday and Cleveland State on Sunday. On Sunday at noon, Baylor travels to TCU for the 71st all-time matchup for the first half of the day's 90-mile doubleheader.
- Thursday's match against VCU is the third of the season that will be streamed by Big 12 Now on ESPN+ with Cracked Racquet's CrossCourt Cast.

Women's Tennis

- Baylor returns to action today at the Hurd Tennis Center against future Big 12 opponent and nationally ranked Arizona State at noon.
- The Bears will remain home this weekend and return to Big 12 action against UCF (March 8) and Houston (March 10). Friday's 6 PM match has been tabbed Go Gold.
- Miska Kadleckova boasts a team-leading 7-1 record in singles play while Isabella Harvison follows closely behind with six singles wins. The tandem of Kadleckova and Danielle Tuhten have a team-best record of 7-2 in doubles play.

Track & Field

- BU heads to the TRACK at new balance in Boston, Mass., for the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships that run Friday-Saturday with the most entries qualified in the Michael Ford era.
- Demario Prince was named Big 12 Outstanding Freshman of the Year last week by the conference office. The Jamaica native won All-Big 12 honors, has all four of his 60-meter hurdle races within the team's top-10 marks and is the lone freshman competing in the 60H across both the men's and women's entry fields this weekend.
