### STORY LINES

- Baylor football will open its 2024 season on Saturday, hosting Tarleton with a 6 p.m. kickoff at McLane Stadium in a game broadcast live on ESPN+ and the Baylor Sports Media Network.
- The Bears enter the fifth year under Coach Dave Aranda, who in 2021 led the Bears to the best season in school history with a 12-2 record, a Big 12 Championship and the 2022 Sugar Bowl. Aranda directed the Bears to the Armed Force Bowl in 2022 and after a 3-9 season in 2023, has taken over defensive play calling duties.
- Aranda taking over defensive play calling is his first time directing a defense since he established himself as one of the top defensive minds in football as the defensive coordinator at LSU, Wisconsin and Delta State. He is also directing the inside linebackers.
- The Bears have added several key members to its coaching staff, including new offensive coordinator Jake Spavital, associate head coach/running backs coach Khenon Hall, tight ends coach Jarrett Anderson, defensive line coach Inoke Breckterfield, inside linebackers coach Jamar Chaney and offensive line coach Mason Miller.
- Baylor will turn to sixth-year senior quarterback Dequan Finn as its starting QB. Finn won a battle for the QB job in a spring and summer camp battle with Sawyer Robertson, who made four starts as a sophomore in 2023. Finn is a former MAC MVP after leading Toledo to an 11-2 record in 2023. He has thrown for over 7,000 yards with over 1,800 rushing yards in his career.
- Since 2011, combined with football, and men's and women's basketball, Baylor leads the nation in wins, owning 46 more wins than the next closest program (UConn).
- Baylor returns Caden Jenkins, who was named a second-team Freshman All-America cornerback in 2023 by The Athletic. Jenkins ranked second in the nation in freshman interceptions a year ago. He and safety Carl Williams IV both finished their 2023 seasons ranked among the nation's top freshman corners by PFF.
- Junior RB Richard Reese ranks 38th in program history in rushing yards and sits just four TDs shy of cracking the top-10 in rushing TDs in Baylor career history.
- Last year, Baylor ranked tops in the Big 12 in terms of freshmen playing offensive and defensive snaps, while also ranking third-fewest in snaps played by seniors in the league.

SCOUTING THE PROUD DEFENDERS OF THE PURPLE AND WHITE

- The Texans are under the direction of Todd Whitten, who is in his third stint as the head coach in Stephenville. Whitten was head coach of the Texans in 1996, again from 2000-04 and since 2016. He has also served as the head coach at Sam Houston, with assistant stops at Texas Tech, New Mexico State, UTEP, Wyoming and Lamar, in addition to serving as the head coach at Arlington Heights High School in 2012. A former all-conference QB for Stephen F. Austin, Whitten played a year with the New England Patriots. He has led Tarleton to Lone Star Conference Championships in 2018 and 2019 and is a four-time conference coach of the year.
- Over the DII to FCS transition, Tarleton has gone 25-16, which marks just the fourth team since 2004 to post winning records during the transition period, behind only NDSU (35-9) and Central Arkansas (29-17). Last year, Tarleton went 8-3 and 4-2 in conference play. The Texans averaged 33.3 points per game, 201.7 rushing and 228.7 passing.
- The Texans opened the college football season in 2024 with the first game played in the United States on Saturday, posting a 26-23 win over McNeese in Stephenville, Texas. Kayvon Britten rushed 25 times for 164 yards, Derrel Kelly III toted it 12 times for 41 yards and a score and Darius Cooper had six grabs for 85 yards.
- Tyrone Nix, a well-respected mind in collegiate football, serves as the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, also working with inside linebackers. He has been on the Tarleton staff since 2022 with stops at Ole Miss, South Carolina, Southern Miss, Middle Tennessee State, Virginia tech and Texas A&M, and was the defensive coordinator for Jeff Traylor’s first team at UTSA in 2020. Adam Austin and Scott Carey serve as co-offensive coordinators, with Austin working with the QBs and Scott Carey the offensive line. Michael Walton is the special teams coordinator and has been with the Texans since 2019.
- Steve Uryasz is in his first year as the Vice President and Director of Athletics at Tarleton. He has served as the Executive Deputy Athletics Director at West Virginia for the previous eight years, after a long tenure as Senior Associate AD at Texas Tech from 1997-2015. He previously worked in academic and student affairs at Oklahoma State from 1992-97 and also worked at Nebraska.
- Junior Victor Gabalis enters the year having started 11 games for the Texans at QB last year. He threw for 2,492 yards with 18 TDs and 13 interceptions, also rushing for a pair of scores. Senior tailback Kayvon Britten enters the year on the watch list for the Walter Payton Award, given to the nation’s top FCS player and is a preseason All-America honoree. He had an All-America season in 2023, toting it 183 times for 1,150 yards and 16 scores, adding 11 catches for 106 yards and a TD, his first season after transferring from an all-conference career at Arkansas-Pine Bluff, where he rushed for 1,063 yards and 16 TDs in 2022. Top receiving targets include preseason All-America WR Darius Cooper, who has 1,735 yards and 15 TDs in his career, including 1,063 yards receiving in 2022. Houston transfer WR Cody Jackson, four-year contributor Keyland Johnson, who has five TDs and 16 catches in his career and Idaho State transfer WR Benjamin Omayebu, who caught 64 balls for 671 yards last year. TE Dawson Hearne earned all-conference honors last year with six catches for 73 yards and a score.
- Defensively, Tarleton only has upperclassmen on its two-deep depth chart but must replace its top-two tacklers from 2023. Blake Smith made 63 stops a year ago with one interception, JACK Devin Sterling had 46 tackles, including eight for a loss in 2023, and cornerback Kasyus Kurns had 43 tackles and eight pass break-ups a year ago.

10TH ANNIVERSARY OF MCLANE STADIUM OPENING

- The game vs. Tarleton will mark the 10th anniversary of the opening of McLane Stadium, a 45,140-seat facility sitting on the banks of the Brazos River. McLane Stadium opened on Aug. 31, 2014 with a 45-0 drubbing of SMU in front of 45,733, the first game after a 2013 Big 12 Conference Championship season and the first game of a 2014 Big 12 Conference Championship season.

- Baylor owns an 81-37-4 all-time record in season lid-lifters.
- The Bears are 91-27-4 in home openers.
- Under Coach Dave Aranda, the Bears are 3-1 in season lid-lifters and 3-1 in home openers.

PRESEASON HONORS

- The Bears have had several players honored in the preseason during watch list season. Among the most notable include senior WR Monaray Baldwin, who is No. 41 on the Bruce Feldman Freak’s List, in addition to a spot on the Reese’s Senior Bowl Watch List. WR Josh Cameron is a preseason All-America selection as a punt returner, Ashytyn Hawkins is on the Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List, given to the nation’s best WR, and CB Caden Jenkins is a preseason all-conference pick.
- QB Dequan Finn is on the Maxwell, Davey O’Brien, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Preseason Watch List. Hall Presley sits on the College Sports Communicators Comeback Player of the Year Award Watch List and OLB Kyler Jordan is on the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List.
- RB Richard Reese sits on the Hornung Award and Jet Award preseason watch lists.

FINN IS QB1

- A story throughout the spring and into fall camp has been the battle for the starting quarterback job. The Bears returned junior QB Sawyer Robertson, who made four starts in his debut season in 2023 after transferring as a former four-star recruit from Mississippi State, and in the spring added former MAC Player of the Year Dequan Finn from Toledo.
- After the second scrimmage of fall camp and on Monday, Aug. 19, the Bears named Finn the starting quarterback. The 6-foot-2, 206-pound fifth-year senior played in 45 games over his career at Toledo, throwing for 7,074 yards with 63 TDs and 539 completions, also rushing for 1,840 yards and 26 TDs in his 32-start career, where he went 23-9 as a starter.
- Finn led Toledo to an 11-2 record in 2023 and an 8-0 mark in conference play, including 11 straight wins to end the regular season. A two-time invitee to the Manning Passing Academy, Finn was named 2023 MAC Championship Game MVP and the Boca Raton Bowl Offensive MVP a year after an all-conference season in a nine-win campaign as a junior.

FRESHMEN SNAPS LEAD BIG 12 IN 2023

- Baylor played a very freshmen heavy roster in 2023 and that total plays out when sorting the number of snaps played by freshman on offense and defense by Big 12 schools in the regular season.
- The Bears played a total of 4,505 snaps on offense and defense from freshmen, which was tops in the Big 12 and ahead of second place Iowa State (3,327) and third-place Oklahoma (2,612). Kansas played only 126 snaps on both sides of the ball by freshmen, tops in the league.
- Conversely, Baylor played the third-fewest snaps by freshmen in the Big 12, with 5,159 snaps by seniors. Iowa State played the fewest senior snaps (3,214), followed by West Virginia (4,038). Oklahoma State played seniors 11,713 snaps, with Texas Tech playing 11,617 snaps by seniors.
- Baylor ranked seventh in the Big 12 in terms of offensive/defensive snaps by juniors (led by WVU) and sixth by sophomores (led by Iowa State).

FOURTH-MOST WINS IN TEXAS IN LAST 10+ YEARS

- Through the 2023 season, Baylor has won 99 games since 2011, fourth-most among the state of Texas’ 12 FBS teams during that time.
- BU’s 99 wins in the last 10+ years are shy of Texas A&M (103), Houston (101), and TCU (101), and ahead of Texas (95), SMU (81), UTSA (78), Texas Tech (76), North Texas (70), Rice (60), Texas State (47) and UTEP (46).

- Several transfers have enrolled during the summer, including Rara Dillworth (East Carolina), Ronnie Mageo (Miss. Gulf Coast CC), Sidney Fugar (South Carolina), Colin Truett (UT Chattanooga), Colton Thomasson (Texas A&M), Tonga Lolohea (Tyler JC) and Elinus Noell III (Texas Southern).

**ADDING VIA THE PORTAL**

- Coach Dave Aranda has added 22 players via the transfer portal for the 2024 season. It marked the second largest portal addition for the Bears under Aranda, as BU added 13 players via the portal for the 2023 season, which came a year after adding a limited number for the 2022 season.
- Baylor has a total of 39 new players in 2024, with 56.4 percent of that group coming in the form of transfers, including walk-ons.

**FOURTH OLDEST NON-KICKER IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL**

- Baylor junior defensive lineman David Marshall is the fourth-oldest non-kicker in college football. Marshall joined the roster prior to the 2023 season after a junior college season at Navarro College. He previously served in the military.
- Only New Mexico's Colby Brewer (age 29), Arkansas WR Monte Harrison (27) and Kansas LB Alex Raich (27) are older than Marshall in college football.

**WELCOME TO THE FUDGE CENTER**

- On Monday, Aug. 19, after a weekend move, the Baylor football program officially opened the Fudge Family Development Center, a sparkling new \$89.6 million dollar facility that houses all things Baylor football.
- On the strength of a \$15 million dollar gift from the Fudge Family, Baylor has built one of the best football development centers in the nation, housing state-of-the-art locker rooms, team meeting spaces, walk-thru rooms, coaching offices, athletic medicine and strength & conditioning spaces. In addition, the facility added 20 yards and revamped the Allison Indoor Facility.

ARANDA TAKES OVER DEFENSE

- Coach Dave Aranda enters the 2024 season in his fifth season leading the Bears.
- Aranda has taken over defensive play calling duties and serves as the lead position coach for the inside linebackers in 2024. This came after he previously let his defensive coordinators call plays, including Ron Roberts and Matt Powledge. Powledge remains the defensive coordinator and is the safeties coach in 2024.
- Aranda led the LSU defense in 2019 as the Tigers posted a perfect 15-0 record and won the National Title with a 42-25 victory over Clemson in CFP National Championship Game.
- In six seasons as defensive coordinator at Power 5 schools from 2014-19, his defenses were ranked top-12 nationally in total yards five times. The units also ranked top-10 in scoring four times in seven years from 2013-19.

PERSON > PLAYER

- A hallmark of Coach Dave Aranda’s philosophy in building a program is placing an importance on understanding that the person is more important than the player. This mantra is executed in everything the program touches on a daily basis. Throughout the football building, signage adorns the walls that emphasize, “better people make better players” and that Baylor will “win with character”.
- Aranda preaches that players focus on today and be authentically themselves in an effort to be comfortable and confident in their roles.

FEMALE LEADERSHIP IN PROGRAM

- Baylor is one of just two power-4 conference schools in the country with a lead female sport program administrator and a female director of operations, with Deputy AD Jovan Overshown leading the program and Landrie Walsh serving as Director of Football Operations.
- Only Kansas State and Baylor qualify in this category, with Kacey Harper serving as the DFO for the Wildcats and Jill Shields as the SPA.
- There are 10 female DFOs in college football and just five in power-4 conferences, including three in the Big 12.

- Under Coach Dave Aranda, the Bears have consistently been one of the best teams in the nation in avoiding penalties. In 2023, the Bears led the Big 12 in fewest penalty yards per game and rank sixth nationally.

- Baylor athletics is in the midst of a historic run of success, including recent national titles in men’s and women’s basketball, and football coming off a Big 12 Conference Championship in 2021 and the 2022 Sugar Bowl.
- Since 2011, and as of the end of the 2023-24 athletics season, no other school can compete with Baylor’s run, as the Bears lead the nation in wins combined among football, and men’s and women’s basketball. Baylor has 46 more wins than the next closest school, UConn.

HANKINS TAKING AIM AT RECORD BOOKS

- Baylor returns a three-year starter in the field-goal role, redshirt junior Isaiah Hankins. Hankins has been the starting kicker for the majority of the 2021 and 2023 seasons. He opened the year in the role in 2022 before veteran John Mayers - who finished his career ranked third all-time in points scored - regained the job that he had previously lost to Hankins in 2021.
- Hankins, a native of Little Rock, Ark., is a lefty kicker who enters his fourth year on campus ranked among the program leaders in a bevy of kicking categories. In BU career history, he checks in the top 10 in points, field goals made, attempts, field-goal percentage, PAT kicks made, PAT attempts and PAT kick percentage. In Baylor single-season history, his 2021 season ranked him eighth in points scored, sixth in PATs made and PAT attempts, third in field-goals made and fourth in attempts in 2023.

NATION’S TOP-RANKED SPECIAL TEAMS UNIT IN 2023

- According to the 2023 FEI Rankings via BCFTOys.com, Baylor finished the year with the top-ranked special teams unit in college football. A combination of kickers Isaiah Hankins, kickoff specialist Jack Stone, punter Palmer Williams, long snappers Garrison Grimes and Dylan Schaub, and returners Josh Cameron and Richard Reese, helped the Bears lead the FEI special teams rankings.
- FEI Special Teams Ratings (SFEI) are opponent-adjusted possession efficiency data representing the scoring advantage per non-garbage possession a team’s non-offensive and non-defensive units would expect to have on a neutral field against an average opponent.

PALMER WILLIAMS FOR AN ENCORE

- A strength of the nation’s top-ranked special teams unit in 2023 was the emergence of freshman punter Palmer Williams. A 6-foot-2, 201-pound native of Advance, N.C., joined the program as the No. 3 punter recruit in the nation out of high school. He punted 37 times for 43.08 yards per punt with a long 53 and six punts of 50 or more yards.
- He downed eight punts inside the 20-yard line and allowed just one touchback, with 13 forced fair catches. A total of 20 of his 35 punts were either fair caught or downed inside the 20-yard line.

REESE’S PIECES

- Baylor junior running back Richard Reese enters his third year in the backfield for the Bears and is quickly carving out a spot in Baylor history with his production.
- The Bellville, Texas, native sits No. 36 all-time in Baylor rushing history entering his junior season. He is coming off a season that saw him rush for two TDs and 306 yards, a year after he ranked fifth among college football freshman in rushing with 982 yards and 14 TDs. His 16 career rushing TDs ranks shy of the top-10, which starts with Bryce Petty and Devin Chafin with 21 TDs.
- Reese was selected to attend the 2024 Big 12 Media Days in Las Vegas in the preseason and is a key member of a running back room that also includes Baylor’s top two rushers from 2023, Dominic Richardson and Dawson Pedergrass, and dynamic redshirt freshman Bryson Washington.
- Reese shined in 2023 as a kick returner, taking a pair of kickoff to the house for TDs in the season finale vs. West Virginia.

A 6-foot-2, 218-pound product of Alba, Texas, Pendergrass totaled 79 carries for 338 yards and a team-leading five TDs. He also caught 26 balls - fourth on the team - for 199 yards and two TDs.
- Among freshmen with 75 or more carries in 2023, Pendergrass ranked sixth in terms of total offensive grades.

LONG SNAPPER OF EXCELLENCE

- Baylor returns a three-year starter at long snapper in redshirt junior Garrison Grimes. After suffering a season-ending injury in week six at UCF, Grimes turned the job over to true freshman Dylan Schaub, a former high school linebacker who excelled in the role in place of Grimes, including a spot coming off the bench to snap the game-winning field goal of the UCF comeback win.
- Grimes is a clear leader of the team, is a 6-foot-4, 225-pound physical presence who has returned fully from injury to solidify the role again in 2024. Grimes boasts a tremendous ability as a punt coverage specialist and had a pair of fumble recoveries in a matchup with No. 4 Texas in 2023.
- Grimes, a native of American Fork, Utah, is the son of former Baylor offensive coordinator/tight ends coach Jeff Grimes. Jeff took over as the offensive coordinator at Kansas in the offseason and Garrison’s younger brother joined his father at Kansas as a walk-on defensive end.

WALK-ON TO WEAPON - THE JOSH CAMERON STORY

- Baylor junior wide receiver Josh Cameron is a veteran presence and leader for the BU wide outs. He came to the Bears as a walk-on receiver from powerhouse Cedar Park High School and quickly earned a role after his redshirt season.
- Cameron, a 6-foot-1, 218-pounder, is a noted tough-catch maker, with a real ability to make crucial, clutch catches while going across the middle. He has routinely been singled out as one of the best run blockers among the receiving corps while also showcasing an ability to be a surehanded option in punt returns.
- Largely limited to fair catches in his punt return role, when Cameron was unleashed in that role he excelled, including a 15.5 yard average in 2023 that saw him return a punt 70 yards. He enters the 2024 season in a position battle for the punt return job with speedy slot receivers like Jamaal Bell, Monaray Baldwin and Ashtyn Hawkins, but is also a preseason All-America selection by Phil Steele in the role.

BROTHER BEAR

- Baylor has a pair of brothers on its 2024 roster, including defensive backs Caden and Cameren Jenkins, and offensive lineman Kaden and Koltin Sieracki.
- The Jenkins are reunited after Cameren started his career in the safety rotation at UNLV last year and joins his 2023 Freshman All-America brother, Caden, who starred at cornerback in 2023.
- The Sierackis are reunited after Kaden played his last two years for the Bears, redshirting in 2022 and earning a starting job in 2023. Koltin was a highly recruited prospect out of The Woodlands and is currently a true freshman who is fighting for time at center.

JONES, THOMAS LEAD INSIDE LINEBACKERS

- A story of spring and fall camp has been the play of Baylor’s inside linebackers. Led by sixth-year senior Matt Jones, and future standout JUCO transfer Keaton Thomas, the Bears are positioned to have that group be a unit of strength in 2024.
- Jones, a 6-foot-4, 245-pounder, has been a three-year starter for the Bears, including last two years at inside linebacker and one year at outside linebacker during the 2021 Big 12 Championship season. In 2023, Jones started all 12 games at inside linebacker and led the team with 82 tackles and 11.5 tackles for a loss. He added three sacks, five pass break-ups and one QB hurry with two 10+ tackle games.
- Since 2013, Jones 11.5 TFL were the fifth-most by a Baylor ILB, behind only Taylor Young’s 13.5 TFL in 2015, Eddie Lackey’s 13.0 in 2013, Terrel Bernard’s 12.5 TFL in 2021 and Bryce Hager’s 12.0 in 2014.
- It took Baylor very little time to recognize that Thomas had star potential opposite Jones at the linebacker level. Thomas was a choice to attend Big 12 Media Days, along with Jones, due to his clear vocal and physical leadership, in addition to this ability to change the game with a quick-twitch nature and athleticism. A former walk-on safety at West Virginia who transitioned to Northeast Mississippi Community College, Thomas, a 6-2, 224 pound native of Jacksonville, Fla., had 107 tackles - second most in junior college football - in 2023 as a redshirt freshman.
- This position group, coached by Dave Aranda and Jamar Chaney, also boasts several additional talented options, including redshirt sophomore Jeremy Evans, redshirt sophomore Carmello Jones, senior transfer Rara Dillworth, redshirt senior Josh White, and a freshman options in Kyland Reed.

DEEP RB ROOM

- Baylor’s running back room is loaded with talent, including 2022’s leading rusher, Richard Reese, who had 14 TDs as a freshman, and a pair of backs who ranked first and second on the team in rushing yards, senior Dominic Richardson and sophomore Dawson Pendergrass.
- Redshirt freshman Bryson Washington has also emerged as a key member of the room, after playing in three games in 2023 to maintain a redshirt and following an injury in fall camp that limited his ability to make a splash, despite being a story of spring practice.
- The tailbacks are set to shine in an new offense that shifts from the grind-it-out style of 2021-23, opening up the offensive attack under new offensive coordinator Jake Spavital, who while at his last stop in 2023 at Cal, helped Jayden Ott to a prolific season.

REVAMPING TIGHT ENDS

- From 2021-23 Baylor’s tight ends were coached by its offensive coordinator, Jeff Grimes, making him one of a handful of OCs nationally to also coach tight ends. This has led to a large amount of talent in the tight end room at the fingertips of new OC Jake Spavital.
- The Bears return several key players in the rotation at TE in 2024, including sophomore Matthew Klopfenstein and junior Kelsey Johnson. In addition, the Bears have welcomed dynamic talent Michael Trigg to the roster. A 6-foot-4, 246 pound fourth-year junior, Trigg transferred in the spring from Ole Miss and Southern Cal, as a former four-star, top-100 recruit. Trigg is a former Mackey Tight End of the Year Award Watch List member.
- In addition to Trigg, Klopfenstein and Johnson, the Bears have redshirt freshman Hawkins Polley as a key option, with Polley playing in two games that included a touchdown grab in an overtime clash with Houston. Veteran Gavin Yates has taken to the new Spavital system and gives the Bears great options at the up-back role, in addition to tight end sets and as a special teams force.

YOUNG DB TALENT

- Baylor had a smorgasbord of freshman talent on the field in 2023 and none shined more than a pair of freshmen corner backs, including Caden Jenkins and Carl Williams IV.
- Jenkins earned All-America honors while making seven starts. The 6-foot-1, 177-pounder had 37 tackles, three interceptions, three PBUs and two fumble recoveries.
- Williams emerged quickly as a leader for the defense, playing in all 12 games with five starts at STAR. He ranked No. 38 in the nation among all qualified cornerbacks in pass coverage. He came in as a cornerback and shifted full time to the STAR role midway through the year.
- Beyond Jenkins and Williams the Bears are boosted by Levar Thornton Jr., a redshirt freshman who stands 6-foot-3, Reggie Bush II, Tevin Williams III, and the return of senior Lorando Johnson, who started 12 games at CB for the Bears in 2022 before starting 12 games for Arkansas in 2023. Miami (Fla.) transfer Isaiah Dunson is working his way back from injury, and started the season opener in 2023.
- At safety, juniors Devin Lemear and Devyn Bobby have been key starters on the back end of the defense, and Chateau Reed had a breakout season where he started all 12 games at cornerback in 2023.

MCLANE STADIUM ENHANCEMENTS

- Baylor has enhanced the nation’s best game stadium, McLane Stadium, in the offseason, completing an eight-figure project, including installation of upgraded and additional videoboards, the construction of new production control rooms, and the addition of a premium hospitality structure.
- The LED ribbon board displays and the main videoboard display, which were original to McLane Stadium since its construction in 2014, have been upgraded to enhance both functionality and the visual elements of the fan experience. A high-quality video display is being added to the back of the main videoboard structure to add revenue opportunities and enhance the South Plaza experience on game days.
- The south end zone of McLane will become even more of a focal point during games, as a premium hospitality clubhouse will be added beneath the video board, providing a one-of-a-kind experience along with a Berm-view of the action.
- The construction of new production control rooms on the east side of the stadium will allow Baylor to produce multiple broadcasts at one time and fully centralize operations.

GRAB YOUR SNAXX

- A welcome addition to the Baylor secondary in the offseason was the re-addition of redshirt senior cornerback Lorando Johnson.
- Johnson played his first three years at Baylor and was a key member of the cornerback rotation, before transferring to Arkansas for the 2023 season. Johnson, nicknamed “Snaxx” for his love of snacks, started all 12 games at Arkansas between corner and nickel, with career highs in tackles (29), TFLs (4), and PBUs (5).
- Johnson, a 6-foot, 192-pounder started the Sugar Bowl in 2021 for the Bears, during his redshirt freshman season, then started 12 games in 2022. He has the ability to play both cornerback and STAR and brings an experience, competitive energy and juice to the secondary that benefits the back-end of the defense.

JACKIE MARSHALL BACK TO FULL HEALTH

- One of the most impactful injuries for the Bears in 2023 came in the form of defensive lineman Jackie Marshall, who went down during the spring and missed the 2023 season.
- Marshall, who played linebacker as a redshirt freshman in 2022 and earned praise as a future standout, was shifting full time to the defensive line to rave reviews in the spring before the 2023 season.
- Since returning from injury in the spring of 2024, Marshall has been a key member of the defensive line. An athletic 6-foot-3, 290-pounds, Marshall has worked hard to add strength to his frame and is positioned to have a big season as a redshirt junior, with the possibility of him getting a medical redshirt for his missed 2023 season.
- As a redshirt freshman in 2022, Marshall had 22 tackles, two for a loss and one fumble recovery, owning two QB hurries and three PBUs in 12 of 13 games.

SLEW OF ELITE WR OPTIONS

- The Bears are boosted by a group of standout wide receiver options in 2024, including key returners in Monaray Baldwin, Ketron Jackson Jr., Hal Presley and Josh Cameron. That group of four have played significant football and been key targets throughout their careers, with Baldwin, Jackson and Presley working through injuries over the 2022-23 seasons and Cameron establishing himself as a weapon after coming to the Bears as a walk-on from powerhouse Cedar Park High School.
- In addition to the veteran returnees, the Bears have added weapons in Ashtyn Hawkins, a transfer from Texas State, where he set the program standard in receiving, Nevada’s all-time leading kickoff returner Jamaal Bell, and freshman standout Jadon Porter.
- Additional options at WR include Cameron Bonner, Jonah Burton - who was a story of 2023 fall camp and earned starting roles in 2023.

OFFENSIVE LINE SEASONING

- The Baylor offensive line is looking to regain a pride point in the program after a season that saw the Bears play a bevy of youthful talent in 2023. BU returns four offensive line starters, welcomes some key transfers, and has created some talented depth in the offseason.
- From 2023, Baylor returns starting sophomore center Coleton Price, starting tackles in senior Campbell Barrington and sophomore Alvin Ebosole, and has competition at guard including junior Ryan Lengyel and transfers in junior Omar Aigbedion and junior Sidney Fugar. Freshman Koltin Price is in the mix at center and his brother, sophomore Kaden, was a key starter in 2023, seeing time at tackle and guard.
- The Bears have also added a transfer option at tackle in Colton Thomasson and center Colin Truett, with freshmen who redshirted in 2023, including Sean Thompkins and Isaiah Robinson, providing the line some depth.
- Baylor had one of the nation’s best offensive lines in 2021 when it won the Big 12 Championship and a productive group in 2022. With four freshman starting throughout the season in 2023, the Bears have gained valuable experience and have added strength to the group in terms of size.

CADEN JENKINS READY FOR ENCORE

- As a freshman Caden Jenkins was a big-play machine and earned freshman All-America honors as a second teamer from The Athletic. He had three interceptions to lead the Baylor defense, which ranked tied for second in the nation among freshmen.

HALL MAKES 40 UNDER 40 LIST

- Baylor first-year associate head coach / running backs coach Khenon Hall was honored as a member of the Dave Campbell’s Texas Football 40 Under 40 List, honoring the top up-and-coming football coaches in the state.
- Hall is a recruiting dynamo who joined the Bears after two seasons on the staff at SMU, where he was the running backs coach.
- Hall is a product of Dallas South Oak Cliff High School and boasts previous coaching stops at Texas Southern, Illinois State and New Mexico.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

- Baylor has forced considerably more turnovers than it has allowed in 48 games under head coach Dave Aranda.
- BU has 79 takeaways (51 INTs, 27 FR) and 56 giveaways (34 INTs, 22 FL) in 48 games under Aranda.
- Baylor has scored 15 non-offensive touchdowns in 48 games under Aranda – five kickoff returns (Reese x 2, Ebner x 3), five interception returns (Pitre x 2, McCarty, Walcott, Woods), one punt return (Holmes) and four fumble returns (Vaughns, Jenkins, Hall, Woods).

RANKED IN 10 OF LAST 14 SEASONS

- Baylor has been ranked in the AP Top 25 in 10 of 14 seasons since 2010, after going 17 years between national rankings (1993-2010). BU has been ranked in 23 of 25 spots since 2013 (exceptions No. 1 and No. 23).
- Baylor was ranked or receiving votes in 10 of 16 polls in 2022 and was receiving votes in the 2023 preseason poll.

## STAFF ADDITIONS

- Baylor had a productive offseason in terms of adding to its coaching staff. The Bears have a new offensive coordinator in Jake Spavital, the former Texas State head coach and most recently the OC at Cal, with previous stops at Texas A&M and West Virginia.
- Baylor added a recruiting dynamo in Khenon Hall, the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator, after he previously led SMU's recruiting efforts. New offensive line coach Mason Miller comes to the Bears from Tarleton, where he was the offensive coordinator and was a former head coach at McMurray. Miller is from the Air Raid tree, having served as the offensive line coach under Coach Mike Leach at Mississippi State and Washington State.
- The Bears have also added a new tight ends coach in longtime state of Texas assistant Jarrett Anderson, who served as the OC and longtime assistant at TCU, and one of the nation's best defensive line coaches in Inoke Breckterfield, who helped Washington to a 14-1 season in 2023 while leading that defensive front, and reunites Breckterfield with Coach Dave Aranda, who had him on his staff as the DC at Wisconsin.
- Baylor also welcomed Jamar Chaney as the inside linebackers coach after he coached linebackers at Western Kentucky. It is a key role as Aranda is the defensive play caller and leading the inside linebackers room.
- Beyond the on-field staff, the Bears have added coaching veterans to the quality control and graduate assistant staff, including former on-field coaches in Joe D'Orazio - from Maine - Weston Glaser - from Sam Houston - Mark Scott - who will lead special teams after serving in assistant role at Houston - and Kyle Segler - from ULM. GAs include former NFL wide out and Georgia staffer C.J. Germany, Elijah McQueen and former NFL offensive lineman Craig Watts. In addition, former college basketball player Duke DaRe is on the QC staff, along with returning QCs in Rhett Holcomb, Ryan Pollard and Joe Ludwig.
- Off the field, veteran administrator Jeff Grigus was elevated to Chief of Staff, Landrie Walsh directs all operations and the Bears added Callie Cameron as Director of Player Personnel, Earl Chevalier as Director of Player Development and Operations and former LSU safety Ed Paris as Assistant Director of Player Personnel.
- The Bears revamped their approach to NIL in the offseason, starting with a strong approach to retaining its youthful talent in November. Behind the addition of NIL General Manager David Kaye - a longtime administrator at Baylor - and Keava Soil-Cormier moving into the Associate AD for NIL Administration & Pro Relations role, the Bears have quickly emerged as an industry leader in the NIL space, working alongside the Baylor collective, GXG.

- Baylor Athletics has launched Baylor+, the official content platform for the Bears. It will offer fans an insider's look into the experiences of student-athletes and coaches as well as the compelling stories that shape Baylor Athletics. Baylor+ will feature exciting coverage of the current teams in Waco, while celebrating beloved Bears' Legends and pivotal moments from the past.
- Through an exciting new partnership with Sport & Story, the leading provider of creative storytelling content in college athletics, Baylor+ is unlike anything Baylor fans have experienced before. The platform will be the home for an extensive range of original content covering all of Baylor's sports programs, with behind-the-scenes access, captivating interviews, never-before-seen archival material and historical documentary films, as well as news and information.

## FOOTBALL HISTORY

- The Bears are entering their 123rd season of football in 2024. The Bears have fielded a varsity team every year since 1899, save the 1906, 1943 and 1944 seasons.
- BU has won nine conference titles, including in 2021, with three Big 12 Championships and six Southwest Conference Championships.
- Baylor's first season came in 1899-1900, a 5-1 record under Coach R.H. Hamilton that included two wins over Toby's Business.

## ONE STANDARD. ONE ACCORD.

- Baylor unveiled a mission statement under Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Mack Rhoades in the fall of 2018, "One Standard. One Accord", which is centered on the distinct purpose of *Preparing Champions for Life* through academic achievement, athletic success, spiritual growth and character formation.

- Baylor is situated on a 1,000-acre campus located on the Brazos River in Waco, Texas, and was chartered in 1845 by the Republic of Texas through the efforts of Baptist pioneers. 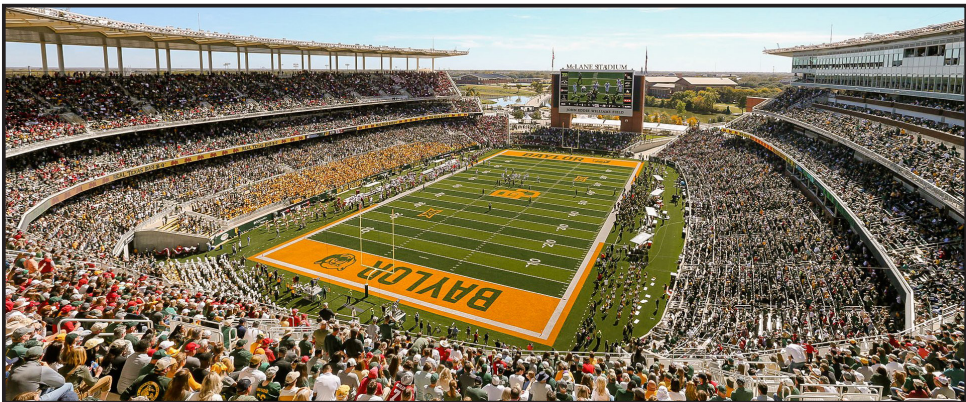

McLANE STADIUM



- McLane Stadium has served as the home of Baylor football since the 2014 season, when the Bears moved over from historic Floyd Casey Stadium, their home for the previous 64 seasons.
- The Bears own a 37-25 record at McLane Stadium and a 380-246-27 record overall at home over a span of 117 seasons.
- The season attendance record was set in 2014, the debut of McLane Stadium, when an average of 46,710 attended each game, with a total of 280,257. A total of 318,621 attended seven games during the 2019 season.
- The single-game record for attendance came in 2015, a matchup with Oklahoma that saw 49,875 attend at McLane Stadium.
- Under Coach Dave Aranda, the Bears own a 13-10 record at McLane Stadium.
- The stadium was built on a 93-acre site that includes 2,150 on-site parking spaces, 334 tailgating spots with 256 set for power and cable, 18 boat slips for Sailgating on the Brazos River and the Umphrey Pedestrian Bridge, connecting the stadium to Baylor’s picturesque campus.

- The stadium seats 45,140 and includes six founder’s suites, 36 suites, 79 loge boxes, club seating for 1,200, 200 concession points of sale and five retail stores.
- The Baylor locker room is 50 yards long and 17 yards wide.

STADIUM HISTORIES

- The 2013 season was Baylor’s 64th and final year of football at the 50,000-seat Floyd Casey Stadium. BU closed its run at the facility by winning its first Big 12 championship with a 30-10 victory over No. 23 Texas in the final game of the regular season.
- Originally named Baylor Stadium, the structure was built in 1950 after a bond sales program raised \$1.5 million for construction costs. The first game played in the new stadium was Sept. 30, 1950, a 34-7 Baylor victory over Houston.
- In 1989, the stadium was renamed Floyd Casey Stadium after longtime University supporter and trustee Carl B. Casey and his wife Thelma contributed \$5 million of an \$8 million renovation project in honor of his father, Floyd (the name change was officially announced at halftime of the 1988 Homecoming game).

- Prior to the building of Baylor Stadium in 1950, several playing sites were used by the Bears. Baylor’s first football squad took the field in 1899, but no records are available to prove where it played. Old newspaper clippings and yearbook articles only indicate the first three seasons were played on an extremely rough field close to the school.
- From 1902 to 1925, with the exception of 1906 when football was banned on campus because it was deemed too violent, the Bears played most of their games at Carroll Field, an on-campus facility (an unknown number of games were also played at the old Cotton Palace during this period).
- The Bears played at the Cotton Palace from 1926-29 before returning to Carroll Field from 1930-35. The team moved off the main campus for good in 1936 when it began calling the newly built Waco Stadium home.
- Waco Stadium was renamed Municipal Stadium in 1942, and it was where Baylor played through 1949 except for a break from 1943-44 because of the war effort.

**Blake Shapen** threw for 303 yards and two touchdowns and also scored on a nine-yard keeper before missing the last six minutes of the game in Baylor's season-opening loss to Texas State, 42-31. Baylor started the game with a bang, with Shapen hooking up with Hal Presley for a 40-yard pass down the far sideline, but the Bears were flagged for the first of five first-half false-start penalties and had to settle for a 23-yard field goal by Isaiah Hankins. After the Bobcats got on the board with a 10-yard pass from Finley to Mahdi out of the backfield, the defense came up with a big play when redshirt freshman **Devonte Tezino** sacked Finley and forced a fumble that freshman end **Trey Wilson** recovered at the Texas State 36. **Isaiah Hankins** booted a career-long 53-yarder to make it a one-point game. The Bobcats took a two-score lead, 21-6, on the back-to-back big-play touchdowns before Shapen scored from nine yards out for Baylor's first touchdown of the 2023 season. Converting on fourth down for the third time, Texas State drove it 75 yards in 12 plays and scored on a Jahmyl Jeter one-yard run in the final minute of the first half. Bears opened the second half quickly, nailing a 53-yard TD pass to **Drake Dabney**. Hankins hit his third FG of the night to bring the Bears within 11 before a Texas State 26 yd TD pass to Joey Hobert. Trying to rally from an 18-point fourth-quarter deficit, the Bears closed the gap with Shapen's two-yard TD pass to Dabney with 8:52 left in the game.

POSTGAME NOTES

- BU is now 81-37-4 all-time in season openers and 91-27-4 in home openers.
- With a temperature of 99 degrees, it marked the hottest kickoff temperature in McLane Stadium history.
- It was Baylor's first 500+ yard total offensive performance since going for 501 vs. TCU in 2023.
- **Drake Dabney's** 100-yard receiving game was the first for a Baylor tight end since Ken Hodge went for 121 yards on six catches in 1964 vs. Oregon State.
- **Isaiah Hankins** made a career-long 53 field goal in the first quarter. It was Baylor's longest field goal since John Mayers made a 51-yarder vs. TCU in 2019.
- **Devyn Bobby, Kyler Jordan, Cooper Lanz, Tate Williams** and **Kaden Sieracki** each made their first-career starts.

Nearly pulling off a miracle finish, the Baylor Bears fell to 12th-ranked Utah, 20-13, at McLane Stadium. Overcoming a double-digit second-half deficit, the Utes scored twice in the last two minutes to hand the Bears their second-straight home loss to open the season. Making his first-career start, **Sawyer Robertson**, while filling in for an injured Blake Shapen, threw for 218 yards and also scored on a four-yard touchdown run in the first half. But a pair of second-half interceptions led to the 10 points that proved to be the difference. Baylor, took a 10-3 halftime lead on Robertson's four-yard TD run and the first of two **Isaiah Hankins** field goals. Hankins missed a 45-yarder late in the half. The Bears tacked on a Hankins' 24-yarder to go up 13-3 on the first series of the third quarter, but those would be the last points they scored. Utah had a 15-play, 88-yard drive that took more than eight minutes off the clock, tying it up on a seven-yard TD run by redshirt freshman quarterback Nate Johnson. After Utah tied it up, Robertson was picked off by safety Cole Bishop on a third-and-16 from his own 20-yard line. Jaylon Glover scored from 11 yards out to give the Utes their first lead of the game with 17 seconds left. Down to 14 seconds and no timeouts after the kickoff, Robertson hit **Hal Presley** for a short gain, then found him down the near sideline for a 47-yard pickup to Utah's 22-yard line with one second left. On the last play, on an attempt to find **Ketron Jackson Jr.**, the ball sailed over the Arkansas transfer's head as time expired.

POSTGAME NOTES

- This was the first all-time meeting in the series with the Utes.
- The Bears allowed only six points in the first three quarters, their fewest allowed since a shutout win over Texas Southern in 2021.
- The Bears are 37-20 all-time at McLane Stadium.
- Baylor is 14-8 under Aranda when scoring first.
- **Sawyer Robertson** threw for a career-high 218 yards and rushed five times for 19 yards and his first career TD.
- **Matt Jones** had a game-high nine tackles, with two pass break-ups.
- **Devyn Bobby** had a carer-best six tackles.
- **Caden Jenkins, Alvin Ebosele, Jonah Burton, Sawyer Robertson** and **Chateau Reed** each made their first-career starts.

Baylor leaned on its rushing attack to defeat the visiting Long Island Sharks, 30-7, in a game that included a two-hour-plus weather delay.

Freshman **Dawson Pendergrass** topped the 100-yard mark with 111 yards and one touchdown on 21 carries, while **Richard Reese** scored twice from 13 yards out and had 82 yards on 12 totes to help the Bears pick up their first win of the season and snap a six-game losing streak overall.

Baylor piled up 270 yards rushing for the game, with freshman **Bryson Washington** adding 45 yards on 10 carries. Making his second start, sophomore quarterback **Sawyer Robertson** completed 10-of-22 passes for 113 yards and one touchdown and added a 14-yard run.

Long Island, a sixth-year FCS program playing just its second Power 5 team, managed just 17 yards total until late in the first half and trailed 16-0 after a safety. But the Sharks got a fourth-down stop near midfield and got on the board with a 10-yard keeper by Chris Howell with 40 seconds left in the half.

After the teams went back to the locker rooms for an extended halftime that stretched into more than a two-hour delay, the Bears went 76 yards in 13 plays and went up 23-7 on Reese's second TD of the day.

The Sharks stuck to the ground and marched from their own 20 down to Baylor's 27, but sacks from **Mike Smith** and **Byron Vaughns** gave the Bears back the ball.

Baylor answered with a 10-play, 57-yard scoring drive and pushed the lead to 30-7 with Robertson's four-yard TD pass to tight end **Drake Dabney** on a perfectly executed play-action.

Long Island threatened again late, but Joey Spano's 43-yard field goal attempt was blocked by **Trey Wilson** and returned by **Alfonzo Allen** into LIU territory.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor allowed only 183 yards of total offense, its fewest total yards allowed since surrendering 166 vs. Kansas in 2021
- **Trey Wilson** blocked a field goal in the fourth quarter, marking Baylor's first blocked kick since a win over Texas State in 2022.
- The Bears recorded their first safety since Christian Morgan's in 2022 at Texas.
- **Richard Reese** rushed for the fifth multi-TD game of his career.
- **Dawson Pendergrass** had a career-high 111 yards rushing on 21 carries, both career highs, and scored his first career TD.
- **Bryson Washington** had a career-high 10 carries and 45 yards rushing

Using a balanced attack that included a 293-yard passing night by sophomore quarterback Quinn Ewers, the third-ranked Texas Longhorns defeated Baylor, 38-6, before a sellout crowd at McLane Stadium. This was the 113th meeting all-time and the last as Big 12 Conference foes.

Making his third-consecutive start, sophomore quarterback **Sawyer Robertson** was 20-of-35 for 203 yards and was picked off once. **RJ Martinez** was 9-of-18 for 102 yards, helping Baylor finish with 365 yards total offense and 19 first downs.

**Isaiah Hankins** kicked the first of two first-half field goals from 22 yards out, with the Bears getting points after a nine-play, 70-yard drive that included a 39-yard pass from Sawyer Robertson to **Ketrn Jackson Jr.**

Still trailing just 7-3 five minutes into the second quarter, the Bears gave up a 29-yard TD run by Ewers on a third-down play that capped a nine-play, 75-yard drive and extended UT's lead to 14-3 with 9:07 left in the half.

The Longhorns exploded for 21 points in a seven-minute stretch. Just after on a muffed punt return by Worthy, the Bears tacked on a 36-yard field goal by Hankins that made it 28-6.

Xavier Worthy had a 40-yard punt return after a three-and-out by the Baylor offense, which led to CJ Baxter bouncing it outside to score from seven yards out to make it 21-3.

After a fourth-down stop near midfield, it took Texas just five plays to march 46 yards and score on a two-yard run by Jonathon Brooks for his second touchdown of the night.

After taking a 28-6 lead at the half, the Longhorns tacked on a 37-yard field goal by Bert Auburn and a 21-yard touchdown pass from Ewers to Xavier Worthy that provided the final margin.

POSTGAME NOTES

- A crowd of 49,165 was the fifth-largest attendance in McLane Stadium history and the 11th in Baylor history.
- Baylor had a conference opener streak of six straight wins snapped.
- The Bears are 59-196-6 all-time against ranked foes.
- **Drake Dabney** caught two balls and now has 42 catches in his career, ranking sixth among tight ends in program history.
- **Matt Jones** finished with eight tackles, 3.5 for a loss and two sacks.
- **Garrison Grimes** recovered his first two career fumbles.
- **Isaiah Hankins** was 2-of-2 and has scored 135 points in his career, ranking tied with Ryan Havens (2003-06) for 10th in program history.

Completing the biggest comeback in program history, Baylor scored 29 unanswered points in the last 19 minutes to pull out a 36-35 stunner over the UCF Knights before a packed house in the first Big 12 game at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

**Blake Shapen** completed 21-of-34 passes for 293 yards and one touchdown and also scored on a two-yard run in helping the Bears improve to 2-3 overall and 1-1 in Big 12 play.

**Monaray Baldwin** had a monster game with seven catches for 150 yards, scoring on a five-yard TD pass and then getting Baylor in position for the final score with a 36-yard catch and run down to UCF's 15-yard line.

Scoring in again the first half, Baylor marched 72 yards on 10 plays and scored on a two-yard keeper by Shapen on third-and-goal. He was 4-7 for 61 yards on the drive but was sacked three times in the first half.

Burned by big plays, Baylor gave up first-half touchdowns of 79, 65 and 86 yards and was down 28-7 at the break.

Trailing 35-7 late in the third quarter, the Bears closed the gap with a 30-yard field goal by Hankins at the 3:20 mark after a 10-play, 50-yard drive.

Scoring twice in a three-minute mark in the fourth quarter, Baylor got within 35-26 on a **Dawson Pendergrass** six-yard TD run, the Baldwin TD grab and a pair of two-point conversions.

**Caden Jenkins** scooped up a fourth-quarter fumble and returned it 72 yards for a touchdown that made it a two-point game, 35-33, with 6:02 still left in the game.

After a quick three-and-out by the Knights, Baylor answered with a nine-play, 61-yard drive, capped by **Isaiah Hankins**' 25-yard, chip-shot field goal that gave the Bears their first lead of the game, 36-35, with only 1:21 left and UCF out of timeouts.

Colton Boomer missed a 59-yarder on the last play of the game after the Knights picked up a first down at the Bears' 42-yard line for one last shot.

The Bears were 1-for-6 on fourth down and lost to Texas Tech, 39-14, Saturday night at McLane Stadium.

**Blake Shapen** passed for 314 yards and a touchdown, but was sacked six times and lost a fumble as the Bears dropped their third home game of the season and fell to 2-4 overall and 1-2 in the Big 12.

In his second-straight and sixth career start, Behren Morton threw for 180 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for another one to lead the Red Raiders to their second-consecutive win.

**Monaray Baldwin** provided the biggest highlight for the Bears with a 71-yard touchdown pass from Shapen that made it a two-score game early in the fourth quarter, 24-11.

But the Red Raiders answered right back, going 65 yards in eight plays and scoring on an 18-yard TD run by Tahj Brooks, who rushed for 170 yards on 31 carries.

Baldwin added a 39-yard grab on Baylor's next series, but the Bears had to settle for **Isaiah Hankins**' second field goal of the night, this one from 33 yards. And Tech closed out the scoring with Morton's 10-yard TD run to make it 39-14.

Tech led 17-3 at the break on Morton TD passes of 13 yards to Coy Eakin and a 16-yarder to tight end Baylor Cupp. The Bears' lone first-half score was a 33-yard field goal by Hankins in the second quarter, coming after a fumble recovery by **Garmon Randolph**.

Cupp scored again on the Red Raiders' second possession of the second half, catching an 18-yard pass from Morton to cap a 13-play, 85-yard drive after another failed fourth-down play by the Bears.

Isaiah Hankins made four field goals, including a career-long 54-yarder, as Baylor defeated the Cincinnati Bearcats, 32-29, Saturday afternoon before a crowd of 38,193 at Nippert Stadium.

Blake Shapen threw for 316 yards and one touchdown and rushed for another to help the Bears remain unbeaten on the road.

Answering a UC score, Baylor took the lead for good early in the second quarter on a three-yard run by Shapen, capping off a seven-play, 75-yard drive.

On the ensuing kickoff, Braden Smith bobbled it on the catch, then fumbled it away into the arms of Byron Vaughns for an easy return from inside the 10-yard line to make it a double-digit lead, 17-7.

Hankins nailed another one from 43 yards to give the Bears a 20-14 halftime lead.

Shapen found Ketrn Jackson for a 55-yard pass on the opening drive of the third quarter and then got with Jake Roberts from six yards out for his first touchdown in a Baylor uniform to make it 26-14.

In a big red-zone stop, Jones missed Payten Singletary on a fourth-down pass from the 15-yard line that was broken up by Devin Lemear. Back-to-back 20-yard plays on a Shapen pass to Monaray Baldwin and a run by Dominic Richardson led to a 46-yard field goal by Hankins that pushed the lead to 29-14 late in the third quarter.

Hankins made it a 4-for-4 day when he split the uprights with another 43-yarder that made it 32-21.

The Bearcats made things interesting at the end, coming back from a double-digit deficit to make it a three-point game with 5:03 left when quarterback Emory Jones completed a 28-yard TD pass to Xzavier Henderson and then went to Evan Prater for the two-point conversion.

But the Baylor defense came up with a big stop near midfield when Corey Gordon Jr. broke up a fourth-down pass as Cincinnati turned it over on downs for the third time. The Bearcats rolled up 450 yards total offense, including 288 on the ground, but was just 2-for-4 in the red zone.

Dawson Pendergrass had a pair of touchdown rushes and Monaray Baldwin had 117 yards receiving but Baylor football could not complete a second-half comeback, falling to Iowa State Cyclones, 30-18 on Saturday, before a Homecoming crowd of 43,528.

Pendergrass, the Baylor standout freshman running back, was stopped on fourth down with just over four minutes left, thwarting the potential comeback bid and allowing Iowa State to close out the game with its first win over the Bears in the last three meetings.

Pendergrass's second TD of the day pulled the Bears within nine, 27-18, but the two-point conversion failed and then Iowa State capped a time-consuming drive with a 30-yard field goal by Chase Contreraz that gave the Cyclones a 12-point lead.

Baylor made things interesting, driving inside ISU's 25-yard line, but Pendergrass was stopped short of the first-down marker on a fourth-and-three from the 23.

Iowa State cruised in the first half, going up 17-0 on a Rocco Becht 18-yard TD pass to Jayden Higgins, a one-yard run by Cartevious Norton and the first of three field goals by Contreraz, this one from 42 yards.

After Devyn Bobby picked off a Becht pass, the Bears got on the Board just before the half on an eight-yard run by Pendergrass, who finished with 76 yards combined rushing and receiving on 11 touches. **Isaiah Hankins'** extra point was blocked, leaving the score at 17-6 going into intermission.

The Cyclones took their biggest lead of the game, 27-6, on a 49-yard TD run by Norton and a Contreraz field goal from 45 yards.

But Baylor answered with a pair of second-half touchdowns on a 69-yard pass from **Blake Shapen** to Baldwin and a five-yard run by Pendergrass. The Bears' comeback fell short with two failed two-point conversions and the late stop by the Cyclones.

Shapen completed 24-of-41 passes for 239 yards and one touchdown with his first interception of the season. Baldwin had another big game with six catches for 117 yards.

Becht threw for 238 yards for the Cyclones, while Eli Sanders was the game's leading rusher with 90 yards on 14 totes.

In the first matchup of former Southwest Conference rivals in 28 years, the Cougars picked up their first Big 12 road victory in their debut season in the league. Baylor fell to 1-6 at home this season, including 0-4 in conference play.

Baylor overcame a double-digit second-half deficit to tie it on **Blake Shapen's** one-yard TD pass to tight end **Hawkins Polley** with 29 seconds left in regulation and took its only lead of the game on **Dawson Pendergrass'** one-yard TD run and **Isaiah Hankins'** extra point in OT.

But Houston scored in seven plays. A fumble by Smith into the end zone that was recovered by **Chateau Reed** was overturned by replay, and the UoHF quarterback scored on a sneak from inside the 1 on the very next play.

The Bears answered Houston, marching 75 yards in eight plays and scoring on a 38-yard TD pass to **Drake Dabney** on a flea-flicker play that included **Monaray Baldwin** flipping it back to Shapen.

On the ensuing possession, Baylor had a second-goal from the 2-yard line, but the Bears settled for a 27-yard field goal by Hankins that tied it up at 10-10.

Houston went back up, 17-10, when Smith found running back Tony Mathis Jr. for a 24-yard TD reception on a drive that took just five plays to cover 75 yards.

The Cougars had a chance to put the game away, but the Baylor defense held, forcing a 44-yard field goal try that Martin missed wide right.

Out of timeouts, Shapen connected with Polley on the short TD pass with defensive lineman David Ugwoegbu in his face.

In the OT period, Shapen hit a wide-open Dabney for 23 yards down to the 2, then Pendergrass finished it off with his fifth rushing touchdown of the season.

Going for the win in the first overtime period, Houston quarterback Donovan Smith scored from one yard out and then added the two-point conversion on a QB draw to lift the Cougars to a 25-24 win over the Baylor Bears.

Kansas State's defense scored off turnovers in each half to help the 25th ranked Wildcats pull away for a 59-25 victory over the Baylor Bears Saturday afternoon at Bill Snyder Family Stadium in a matchup of the last two Big 12 champions.

**Blake Shapen** threw for 253 yards and a career-high four touchdowns to lead the Bears, who fell to 3-7 overall and 2-5 in the Big 12. K-State improved to 7-3 and 5-2.

Will Howard accounted for four of the Wildcats' six offensive touchdowns, completing 19-of-29 passes for 235 yards and three touchdowns and also scoring on a one-yard TD run. Howard set the school record with his 45th career touchdown pass.

But the separator for KSU was a 15-yard fumble return by Desmond Purnell in the first quarter and Keenan Garber's pick-six return near the end of the third.

The Bears scored a touchdown on their opening drive of the game for the first time this season, capping a five-play, 72-yard drive with a 13-yard TD pass from Shapen to freshman **Dawson Pendergrass** that tied it up at 7-7 early.

After the Wildcats scored 28 unanswered points on two TD passes and a one-yard TD run by Howard and Moore's fumble return, the Shapen-to-Pendergrass connection worked again from the 1-yard line to make it a three-score game, 35-13.

The Bears used a razzle-dazzle play to get on the board midway through the third quarter. Shapen caught a backward pass from **Dominic Richardson** and connected with tight end **Drake Dabney** for a 63-yard touchdown that got it back to a three-score game, 38-19.

Dabney had his second 100-yard day of the season and his career with 105 yards on four catches. In one of his best games in a Baylor uniform, Richardson rushed for 89 yards on 17 carries and caught one pass for eight yards.

K-State scored again late after Baylor's fourth turnover of the day, with backup quarterback Avery Johnson connecting with tight end Garrett Oakley for a 28-yard TD pass.

Shapen led a 10-play, 77-yard fourth-quarter drive and hooked up with **Monaray Baldwin** for his fourth TD pass of the day with 20 seconds left in the game.

Stopped in the 10-yard line on its first two possessions, TCU scored on essentially its next six drives and pulled away for a 42-17 win over the Baylor Bears Saturday afternoon in the 119th all-time meeting of the two teams at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Josh Hoover threw for 412 yards and two touchdowns and also scored on a three-yard run to help keep the Horned Frogs alive for a bowl berth, needing to beat 14th-ranked Oklahoma next week in Norman.

Baylor came up with a couple big defensive stops early, with **Cooper Lanz** forcing a fumble by Emani Bailey at the 2-yard line that was recovered by cornerback **Caden Jenkins** and returned out to the 31. And then, Bailey and Savion Williams were stopped for no gain on back-to-back plays from the 6-yard line to turn it over on downs.

The Bears trailed just 14-10 at the half and 21-17 midway through the third quarter, when **Blake Shapen** scored on a two-yard keeper. But TCU scored 21 unanswered points, the last one coming after Baylor went for it and failed on a fourth-down play from its own 31.

Shapen was 20-of-30 for 197 yards, hitting **Dominic Richardson** for a 10-yard TD pass in the first quarter, and also rushed nine times for 42 yards. Richardson added 67 yards on 17 totes, while freshman **Dawson Pendergrass** had 43 yards combined rushing and receiving on 15 touches.

After Baylor pulled within 21-17 on the Shapen keeper, the Horned Frogs put the game away with touchdown runs by Hoover, Bailey and Trey Sanders. TCU finished with 531 yards total offense, including 431 through the air.

- **Blake Shapen** threw for 197 yards and a score on 20-of-30 passing. Shapen rushed his fourth TD of the year, a career high.

Despite a 4th-down stop with just over four minutes to play and a four-point lead, West Virginia rallied to beat Baylor, 34-31, in Saturday's season finale at McLane Stadium.

A pair of missed field goals, including one from 32 yards out that would have given the Bears a seven-point lead with 1:14 left, also proved to be critical.

Going 80 yards in six plays, the Mountaineers (8-4, 6-3) got the game winner on Garrett Greene's 29-yard TD pass to running back Jahiem White with just 23 seconds on the clock.

Down to 18 seconds after the kickoff, Baylor got as far as its own 46-yard line before time ran out.

The Bears managed just 86 yards offense in the first half, but were able to keep it close with back-to-back kickoff returns for touchdowns of 96 and 93 yards by sophomore running back Richard Reese, trailing 27-14 at the break.

Filling in, Sawyer Robertson completed his first 10 passes and connected with Ketrone Jackson on a 38-yard touchdown pass on the opening drive of the third quarter as part of a 14-point quarter.

After the defense forced a three-and-out, Robertson hit Jackson for another 38-yard pass, then converted a fourth-down play with a keeper before Dominic Richardson went in untouched for a two-yard TD run to give the Bears their first lead of the game, 28-27.

The Bears tacked on a 39-yard field goal by Isaiah Hankins in the fourth quarter to extend the lead to 31-27 and came up with a huge fourth-down stop near midfield. With a chance to run out the clock, Baylor failed to convert on just its second trip into the red zone when Hankins missed the chip-shot field goal wide right.

West Virginia, shut down for most of the second half, put it together on that six-play, 80-yard drive that took just 51 seconds.
