## THE OPENING TIP

- Gonzaga opens the regular season against No. 8 Baylor in the Findlay Toyota Tip-Off inside the Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena Monday at 8:30 p.m.
- The Zags have won 18 straight regular season-openers dating back to a 73-66 loss to Saint Joseph's in the 2003 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic in New York City.
- In last year's season-opener, Gonzaga beat Yale 86-71 at home. Braden Huff led the Zags with 19 points and nine rebounds, Ryan Nembhard played all 40 minutes and had 16 points and seven assists, and Nolan Hickman added 15 points in 39 minutes.
- GU cruised to a 109-52 win over Warner Pacific in an exhibition Wednesday. Four Zags finished in double-digit scoring led by Hickman's 19 points. Huff and Michael Ajayi had 14 points.
- The Zags are ranked No. 6 in the preseason Associated Press poll. GU received 1,157 points in the preseason ranking, along with a first-place vote.
- This marks the 24th straight season Gonzaga has been ranked in the AP poll. It's the 15th consecutive year the Bulldogs have appeared in the preseason poll, starting in the top-20 for the 12th straight season. Gonzaga joins Duke, Kansas, Kentucky, and North Carolina as the only programs that have appeared in each of the last 15 preseason AP Polls.
- Last season, the Bulldogs advanced to their ninth straight Sweet 16, the longest active streak in the nation, and finished with a 27-8 record. Gonzaga finished No. 15 in the final AP Poll.
- The Zags extended its NCAA Div. 1 record to 17 straight seasons of at least 25 wins. GU's 27-straight 20-win seasons ranks second behind for the longest active run in the country.
- Of the 12 possible players that could come back from last season, 10 return for the 2024-25 campaign, including all four starters. The Bulldogs welcome back 81 percent of last season's scoring, along with 71 percent of their rebounding.
- The Zags are bringing back six of its top seven scorers, along with 81.4 percent of the minutes played. Only four other programs in the country bring back a higher percentage of minutes played.

Gonzaga University head coach Mark Few has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in NCAA Division I basketball annals in his 25 seasons at the helm, and in the process has made Bulldog basketball a household name across the country. He served as an assistant coach at GU for 10 seasons prior to take the reins of the program. Few has put together one of the most dominating runs in NCAA history, especially in the West Coast Conference. The Zags have won or shared 22 regular season league titles in his 25 seasons (all but the 1999-2000, 2011-12 and 2023-24 seasons) and taken home the conference tournament championship 19 times. The Bulldogs won or shared 11 straight West Coast Conference regular-season titles from 2000-11 and from 2012-23, which are the third-best streaks all-time in the NCAA Division I ranks behind UCLA's 13 Pac-10 Conference titles from 1967-79 and Kansas's 14 Big 12 Conference titles from 2005-18. Few led Gonzaga to the national championship game in the program's first-ever Final Four in 2017, and again in the second Final Four in 2021. Under Few, GU has appeared in five Elite Eight appearances (2015, 2017, 2019, 2021 and 2023) and 13 Sweet 16 appearances (2000, '01, '06, '09, '15, '16, '17, '18, '19, '21, '22, '23, '24). He has coached 22 All-Americans, nine Academic All-Americans, 102 all-conference selections, 17 WCC Players of the Year, 10 league newcomers of the year and nine league defenders of the year. Few has also cultivated NBA talent, including current NBA players in Domantas Sabonis, Kelly Olynyk, Zach Collins, Rui Hachimura, Brandon Clarke, Jalen Suggs, Corey Kispert, Chet Holmgren, Andrew Nembhard, Julian Strawther and Anton Watson. He also helped recruit and develop Dan Dickau, Richie Frahm, Adam Morrison, Jeremy Pargo, Elias Harris, Austin Daye, Rob Sacre, Ronny Turiaf, Kevin Pangos, Filip Petrushev, Killian Tillie and Joel Ayayi all NBA players. Morrison was the highest-drafted player in GU history when he was taken No. 3 overall by the Charlotte Bobcats in 2006, but Holmgren was taken second overall by the Oklahoma City Thunder in the 2022 draft.

Entering the 2024-25 Season, Few:

- Is the winningest active coach by percentage at .836 (688-135)
- Second fastest to 700 wins in NCAA Div. 1 history, reaching the milestone in 840 games
- Is in the Top 15 among active Division I coaches for most 20-win seasons with 25, never having won less than 20 games in a season ... Is first for most consecutive 20-win seasons for active coaches with 25

Few won a gold medal with Team USA at the Summer Olympics in Paris. He was an assistant coach for Team USA on the 2023 FIBA World Cup and the 2024 Olympics. The staff included Head Coach and Golden State Warriors Head Coach Steve Kerr, Miami Heat Head Coach Erik Spoelstra and Clippers Head Coach Tyrone Lue. Few boasts plenty of USA Basketball experience. Serving as an assistant coach at the 2018 USA National Team minicamp, Few was named an assistant coach for the 2019 USA Men's Select Team, a team that helped prepare the USA World Cup Team prior to playing in China. He returned in 2021 as an assistant coach for the USA Men's Select Team to help prepare the gold medalist U.S. Olympic Team prior to playing in Tokyo. He served as head coach of the 2015 U.S. Pan American Men's Basketball Team, a squad composed of collegiate players, and led the team to a bronze medal, and he also was an assistant coach for the gold medalist 2012 USA U18 National Team and a court coach for the 2009 USA Men's U19 World Cup/World University Games Team training camp.

Few will receive the John R. Wooden Award "Legends of Coaching" Award, presented by Principal Financial Group, in 2025. The "Legends of Coaching" honor recognizes coaches who exemplify Coach Wooden's high standard of coaching success and personal integrity.

For all that Few has accomplished on the court, his achievements off of it are equally impressive. In 2002, Mark and his wife Marcy initiated the Spokane branch of Coaches vs Cancer. The Few's annual event would become the largest Coaches vs Cancer fundraiser across the country. Quietly and without fanfare, Few has created a culture of giving at Gonzaga. In 2007, Gonzaga began hosting the Ronald McDonald House Charities Classic. For six seasons, these annual games helped raise over \$750,000 for Spokane's Ronald McDonald House. Building on their success with Coaches vs Cancer, the Fews and others in the Spokane region launched the Community Cancer Fund in 2014 to keep more money in the local market while devoting more resources to cancer patients, their families and the local organizations that serve them. In the last six years, the Community Cancer Fund has raised over 17 million dollars bringing the total raised over 18 years between the organizations to well over 25 million dollars. Among the highlights, the charity established a 3-million-dollar endowment to fund Camp Good Times, a week-long summer camp for kids with cancer. The Community Cancer Fund worked to increase lodging options for cancer patients and their families traveling to the region for treatment, which included the completion and opening of a 5-million-dollar Hospitality Center at Kootenai Health and a campus expansion of Spokane's Ronald McDonald House.

#### SCOUTING THE BEARS

- Baylor welcomes nine new faces to the 2024-25 squad, aiming to replace four of their five starters off of last year's team, including a pair of first-round draft picks in Ja'Kobe Walter and Yves Missi.
- Potential top-5 NBA Draft pick VJ Edgecombe, and his star-studded classmates Jason Asemota and Rob Wright, should pick up the slack for some of those departures.
- The Bears brought in experienced transfers Jalen Celestine (California), Norchad Omier (Arkansas State and Miami) and Jeremy Roach (Duke) to help replace 71.4% of the scoring, 68.3% of the rebounding and 78.8% of the assists.
- Roach and Omier bring Final Four experience, as Roach helped his Duke team to the 2022 Final Four, while Omier led Miami to it's first-ever Final Four in 2023.
- Edgecombe is Baylor's fourth-straight Preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year.
- Roach was named the Big 12 Conference's co-Newcomer of the Year in addition to being voted to the Preseason All-Big 12 second team with Omier.
- Picked Fourth in the Big 12 Preseason Poll.

#### SERIES INFO

- Monday will be the eighth all-time meeting, with seven of the previous games have been on a neutral court, and five of the meetings have been decided by single digits.
- The Bulldogs won the first meeting between the programs, 77-75, on Nov. 29, 1991, in Fresno, Calif.
- The Zags won the first five meetings, but Baylor has won the last two matchups, the 2021 National Championship game in Indianapolis, and the latest in the 2022 Peacock Classic in Sioux Falls, S.D.
- In that 2022 meeting, Adam Flagler hit a pair of threes as No. 6 Baylor scored the final eight points of the game to rally past No. 14 Gonzaga 64-63.

#### UP NEXT

- Gonzaga hosts Arizona State in the first regular season game inside the McCarthy Athletic Center Nov. 10 at 2 p.m.
- It will be the first-ever meeting between the programs, and the first of a home-and-home series that concludes in Tempe next season.
- The Sun Devils open the regular season at home against Idaho State Tuesday, before welcoming WCC member Santa Clara Friday.
- Arizona State was picked 12th out of the 16 members in the Big 12 Conference preseason poll.

#### A BEAR OF AN OPENER

- No. 8 Baylor is the highest ranked team the Bulldogs have opened a season with since beating No. 6/5 Kansas in the 2020 Ft. Myers Tip-Off, 102-90.
- Gonzaga is 1-3 all-time playing ranked teams in regular season-openers. GU beat No. 6 Kansas in 2020, but fell to No. 17 St. Joseph's in New York City, 73-66, in 2003. In 2001, GU lost at No. 2 Illinois, 76-58. No. 8 Kansas knocked off the Zags in the 1998 regular season opener in Lawrence, 80-66.
- The Bulldogs are 15-50 all-time versus Top-10 opponents, and 15-43 under Mark Few.
- Gonzaga has lost its last three matchups against Top-10 foes, dating back to a 79-76 win over No. 7 UCLA in the 2023 Sweet 16 in Las Vegas.

#### SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

- The Zags have won 18 straight regular season-openers dating back to a 73-66 loss to Saint Joseph's in the 2003 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic in New York City.

- GU has won 33 consecutive regular season home-openers since a 73-65 loss to Boise State on Dec. 7, 1988.
- Gonzaga has won all 18 regular season home-openers in the McCarthy Athletic Center and all 24 regular season home-openers under Mark Few.

#### ZAGS IN THE ARENA

- Gonzaga is 13-6 all-time in its games inside the Spokane Arena since it opened in 1995.
- In the 2022-23 season, GU cruised to an 88-72 victory over Kentucky in the Spokane Arena. The Top-5 matchup drew 12,333 fans, the largest crowd ever for any event in the history of the Spokane Arena.
- Last season, Gonzaga beat Pepperdine in the CCF Classic in the Spokane Arena, 86-60, in front of 12,015 fans.

#### ZAGS OPEN SEASON RANKED NO. 6 IN AP POLL

- Gonzaga was ranked No. 6 in the preseason Associated Press poll. The Bulldogs received 1,157 points in the preseason ranking, along with a first-place vote.



- This marks the 24th straight season GU has been ranked in the AP poll.
- It's the 15th consecutive year the Zags have appeared in the preseason poll, starting in the top-20 for the 12th straight season.
- Gonzaga joins Duke, Kansas, Kentucky, and North Carolina as the only programs that have appeared in each of the last 15 preseason AP Polls.
- Since 2017, GU averages a 7.25 ranking in the AP Preseason Poll, which ranks fourth in the nation.
- The Zags have finished in the Top-15 in each of the last eight final AP polls, the only program in the nation to accomplish that feat. GU has ended the past eight seasons with an average ranking of 5.25, which tops the country.

#### STEADY IN THE POLLS

- The Bulldogs have appeared in 149 out of the last 155 AP Polls all since the start of the 2017 season, only behind Kansas's 154 appearances.
- Gonzaga has an average ranking of 6.6 in the AP Polls since 2017, which is second behind Kansas at 6.0.

#### ZAGS SEVENTH IN COACHES PRESEASON POLL

- Gonzaga was ranked No. 7 in the preseason USA TODAY Sports/Coaches poll.
- Gonzaga opens in the top-20 of the poll for the 12th straight year. GU appears in the coaches' preseason poll for the 15th straight season.

#### THE SLATE

- Gonzaga and preseason No. 3 UConn square off in the Hall of Fame Series in New York City on Dec. 14.
- The Zags welcome No. 8 Baylor to the Spokane Arena for the regular season opener on Nov. 4.
- No. 23 Kentucky and the Bulldogs meet in Seattle on Dec. 7, before GU plays No. 22 UCLA in the West Coast Hoops Showdown in Inglewood, Calif., on Dec. 28.
- Arizona and Indiana are potential opponents in the Battle 4 Atlantis. Arizona is ranked No. 10 in the preseason AP Top 25, while Indiana is 17.
- Arizona State (Nov. 10), San Diego St. (Nov. 18), and Saint Mary's (Feb. 1, Feb. 22) all were receiving votes.
- During their non-conference slate, the Zags face a potential of six teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. Seven non-conference opponents won 20 or more games in 2023-24 and finished inside the Top 150 in last year's NET rankings.
- GU plays teams from nine different conferences, including the Big Ten, Big East, Big 12, SEC and potentially the ACC.
- The Bulldogs are a participant in this year's Battle 4 Atlantis and four more neutral site games.

#### BULLDOGS PICKED TO WIN WCC

- For the 22nd time in the last 24 seasons, the Gonzaga men's basketball team was selected as favorites in the West Coast Conference preseason coaches' poll. The annual poll, along with the WCC Preseason Team, was released at the WCC Media Day event at the Resorts World Resort.
- Except for last season and in 2017-18, the Zags have been first place in every WCC preseason poll since 2001. GU received nine of the league's 11 first place votes in the poll.
- Coaches are not allowed to vote for their own team.
- Saint Mary's and San Francisco collected the other

two first place votes in this year's poll. The Zags had 99 points in the poll, while Saint Mary's was second with 86, and Santa Clara was third with 81. San Francisco and Washington State rounded out the top-half.

- The Bulldogs have won 24 of the last 27 WCC regular season titles, 20 of which have been won outright.
- GU has 26 WCC regular season titles overall, including 22 of the last 24.
- Gonzaga has appeared in 27 straight WCC Tournament Championship games, which is the longest streak of its kind in the nation. The Zags have won the conference tournament title 10 times in the last 13 years.

#### QUARTET TABBED PRESEASON ALL-WCC

- Michael Ajayi, Nolan Hickman, Graham Ike, and Ryan Nembhard were all named to the conference's preseason team. Ike and Nembhard earned the recognition for the second straight season. Ajayi, Ike, and Nembhard were all named First Team All-Conference last season, while Hickman was second team.
- It's the third time four GU players were named to the same WCC preseason team, and the first since 2018.

#### ANOTHER HIGH KENPOM RANKING

- Gonzaga came in at No. 9 overall and No. 2 in the metrics' offensive efficiency scale in KenPom's preseason metric rankings.
- Houston sits atop the ratings, with Duke, Auburn, Alabama and UConn in the Top 5. Kansas, Iowa State, Arizona and Purdue round out the Top 10.
- On top of having the No. 2 offense, the Zags are No. 45 in adjusted defensive efficiency. GU's defense ranked 51st last season.
- Referred to as KenPom, the advanced analytics website ranks all 364 Division-I men's college basketball teams based on numerous factors. It considers aspects such as a team's offensive and defensive efficiencies, tempo, luck and strength of schedule.

#### EXPERIENCE IS KEY

- Of the 12 possible players that could come back from last season, 10 return for the 2024-25 campaign, including all four starters.
- The Bulldogs welcome back 81 percent of last season's scoring, along with 71 percent of their rebounding.
- The Zags are bringing back six of its top seven scorers, along with 81.4 percent of the minutes played, which is the highest retention rate for GU in almost 20 years. Only four other programs in the country bring back a higher percentage of minutes played.
- Three Gonzaga players have played in over 100 games, with Ryan Nembhard at 99.
- Four Zags have scored over 1,000 points, and Nolan Hickman is at 937.
- Six Bulldogs averaged double-digit scoring last season, while Ben Gregg scored nine points per game.
- Six GU players have pulled down over 300 rebounds in their career, and three have dished out over 200 assists.

He returned in 2021 as an assistant coach for the USA Men's Select Team to help prepare the gold medalist U.S. Olympic Team prior to playing in Tokyo.
- Few served as head coach of the 2015 U.S. Pan American Men's Basketball Team, a squad composed of collegiate players, and led

the team to a bronze medal, and he also was an assistant coach for the gold medalist 2012 USA U18 National Team and a court coach for the 2009 USA Men's U19 World Cup/World University Games Team training camp.

## ZAGS AT THE OLYMPICS

- Coach Few wasn't the only Gonzaga representative at the Summer Olympics in Paris.
- Andrew Nembhard and Kelly Olynyk were on the Canadian roster, while Rui Hachimura returned for Japan, and Filip Petrushev competed for Serbia.
- Petrushev led Serbia to a bronze medal, averaging 9.7 points at 67.6 percent shooting from the field, which was fifth in the tournament. He added 4.5 rebounds.
- Hachimura averaged 22 points in three games, with 6.5 rebounds.

- Mark Few will receive the John R. Wooden Award "Legends of Coaching" Award, presented by Principal Financial Group, in 2025. Coach Wooden's grandson-in-law Craig Impelman was proud to announce Few's selection at the Los Angeles Athletic Club's annual Wooden Award Tip-Off Luncheon.
- The "Legends of Coaching" honor recognizes coaches who exemplify Coach Wooden's high standard of coaching success and personal integrity and was adopted by the Wooden Award Steering Committee in 1999.

- Few will be presented the honor alongside the 2025 Wooden Award winners presented by Principal on April 11, 2025.
