## STORY LINES

## STARTING FIVE

- Baylor hosts Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in the back half of a two-game homestand at Foster Pavilion on Sunday afternoon at 1. It is the first meeting between the two schools since 2007.
- **Aaronette Vonleh** is two points away from 1,000 career points, upping Baylor's total of players with 1k+ DI points on the roster to 5.
- BU is celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the program and the 20th Anniversary of the 2005 NCAA Championship in Alumni Weekend around the TAMU-CC game on Sunday.
- Baylor returns four 10+ game starters to the court in 2024 with **Sarah Andrews**, **Bella Fontleroy**, **Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** and **Jada Walker**.
- The Bears downed East Texas A&M 104-55 on Thursday evening in only the second game of the Collen era that ended in 100 points for the Bears.

## EYES ON THE ISLANDERS

- Baylor and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi are facing off for the fourth time in history on Sunday afternoon. The Bears have taken each of the previous three matchups, all in Waco.
- TAMU-CC has won three games to start the 2024-25 season, their best start since 2009-10.
- The Islanders defeated the Texas A&M Aggies in the season opener, 62-56, in College Station for their fourth victory over a Power Four team in program history, the first since 2009 at Alabama.
- TAMU-CC has an average scoring margin of 18.3 after facing TAMU, Texas State and Sul Ross State.
- Starters **Paige Allen** and **Mireia Aguado** lead the scoring for the Islanders, averaging 28 per game, while **Jaeda Whitner** has been a threat from beyond the arc, shooting 56.3 percent from three with nine made. Allen also leads the battle of the boards with 29 rebounds.

## WELCOME HOME!

- Baylor's game against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi is the main event of WBB's Alumni Weekend that celebrates the 50th Anniversary of the program and the 20th Anniversary of the 2005 NCAA National Championship.
- Over the weekend, former Bears were invited to a meet and greet with the team, practice, a tour of the sparkling new Foster Pavilion, dinner and there will be a postgame celebration on Sunday evening.
- 50+ former Bears are expected to return to Waco for the celebration, including members of the 2004-05 team, **Jordan Davis**, **Chanelle Fox**, **Melanie Schlemmer**, **Chelsea Whitaker** and assistant coach **Sophia Young Malcolm**, which will be celebrated during the first quarter of Sunday's game.
- BU will observe a pregame moment of silence for **Chameka Scott**, who was a member of the 2004-05 championship team and passed away from colon cancer in 2018 at the age of 33. Her mother, **Charmaine Scott Gibson**, will join the team in her place on Sunday.

## BIG NIGHT AGAINST THE LIONS

- Baylor had a record-setting night against the East Texas A&M Lions, defeating the Southland Conference team 104-55.
- The Bears' 104-point output was only the second 100+ point game in the Collen era.
- **Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** recorded her second-straight double-double with 22 points and 11 rebounds, her fifth career game with 20+ points.
- **Aaronette Vonleh** joined Buggs with 18 points and 11 rebounds for just the fifth double-double of her collegiate career.
- **Jada Walker**, **Bella Fontleroy** and **Yaya Felder** each ended the night with 10+ points, the first time the Bears had five in double figures since BU's game at West Virginia last season, Feb. 24, 2024.
- **Waiata Jennings** scored the first points of her DI career and freshman **Kayla Nelms** secured the first points of her collegiate career.
- Every available Bear scored in the contest against East Texas A&M.

## DOWN TO THE WIRE AT MKA

- Baylor suffered its first loss of the season at Oregon, 76-74, on Sunday night in Eugene.
- Down 62-48 at the start of the fourth quarter, the Bears outscored the Ducks, 26-10, in the first nine minutes of the final frame, but Oregon's four points in the last minute from **Deja Kelly** and **Elisa Mevius** secured the win for the home team.
- **Jada Walker** scored 24 on the evening to lead the green and gold, shooting 9-for-20 from the field in 36 minutes with another team-leading four steals.

## STORY LINES

- **Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** had her fifth straight game in double figures and got her first double-double of the season, 20th of her career.
- **Sarah Andrews** scored 13 in 36 minutes with six assists, her best since last season's contest (7) against Oklahoma State at Foster Pavilion.
- **BIG GAME BUGGS IN THE SEASON OPENER**
- Junior **Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** turned in 25 points in Baylor's season opener against Incarnate Word in 31 minutes.
- Buggs drained the first 3-pointer of her career late in the third quarter before sinking her second in the fourth.
- **Bella Fontleroy** set a career-best mark at 14 boards, with nine coming in the second half.
- **Jana Van Gytenbeek** and **Aaronette Vonleh** also ended the night in double figures.
- **Jada Walker** tied her assists career mark with 10.
- BU outrebounded UIW 47-22, 15-4 on the offensive glass.

## OLD KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- For the first time in the Nicki Collen era, Baylor's roster features more returners than newcomers.
- Only lost two starters: Aijha Blackwell and Dre'Una Edwards.
- With a combined 117 games played under Collen the season prior returning for Year Two (22-23) and 171 returning for Year Three (23-24), this season's roster will feature 226 games played last year under Collen, an over 30% year-over-year increase.
- 80% of last season's scoring returns for 2024-25, up from 56% in Year Three and 57% in Year Two.

## BEARS IN THE 1K CLUB

- Baylor's roster holds four student-athletes who have eclipsed the 1,000-career point mark at the Division I level.
- **Sarah Andrews** (1,405 pts - all at BU), **Yaya Felder** (1,135 pts - 272 at BU), **Madison Bartley** (1,063 pts - 56 at BU) and **Jada Walker** (1,048 pts - 316 at BU).
- BU's four ties the nations' best among power conferences with Illinois and Notre Dame.
- NJCAA transfer **Waiata Jennings** scored 1,227 career points in a two-year stint at Collin College, upping the total to five across collegiate competition.
- **Aaronette Vonleh** is on record alert, only 2 points away from 1,000.

## STRONG START, 5

- Junior **Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** averages the most points per game (22.0) in the Big 12 and is tied for 19th-most in the nation among DI players. Cincinnati's Jilian Hayes and Arizona State's Tyi Skinner are the only other representatives of the conference in the top 50 tied in 40th with 20.3 ppg.
- **Littlepage-Buggs** is one of 39 players in the nation with two double-doubles early in the season and is behind eight players with three. Vanderbilt's Khamil Pierre is the only player in the nation to double-double in every game with three or more games in the book. UAB's Jake Weathersby and South Carolina's Chloe Kitts each have two double-doubles in two games played.

## SOLVING THE BIG PROBLEM

- Waco welcomed Colorado transfer **Aaronette Vonleh** to the Bears' roster for the 2024-25 season.
- Netty joined Baylor after an All-Pac-12 stint with the Buffaloes that featured the 2023 Most Improved Player honor and led Colorado in points scored in 2024, averaging 14 points per game.
- The center combined for 890 points in Boulder and helped upset Kansas State in Manhattan in the second round of the NCAA tournament, tallying nine points and eight rebounds.
- She is Baylor's sixth-consecutive Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year, the program's 11th all-time, and shares the honor with TCU's Hailey Van Lith.
- Also featured on the All-Big 12 Preseason Team was **Sarah Andrews**, helping Baylor join K-State as the only schools with multiple mentions.
- In Netty's first game in the green and gold, the senior turned in 16 points in just shy of 21 minutes. Shooting 6-of-8 from the field, the Oregon native sunk her third-career 3-pointer, making one in each season at Colorado.
- Vonleh had just the fifth double-double of her career in Game No. 3 against East Texas A&M, tabbing 18 points and 11 rebounds.

## SCOUTING (THE) SZN

- The Bears' 13-game non-conference slate will tip off eight times from Foster Pavilion, only leaving Waco for one true road matchup in Oregon. Baylor faces UCLA on a neutral site in New Jersey for the Coretta Scott King Classic and will play three games from The Bahamas in the fourth annual women's Battle 4 Atlantis. The tournament from Paradise will open against Southern Miss on November 23.
- Based on the preseason rankings, Baylor will not face a ranked opponent on their true home court until February 24 at Kansas State. The first current ranked game at Foster Pavilion would be just over a week before (Feb. 11), hosting West Virginia.

## ON THE DOTTED LINE

- Aliyah Matharu joins Baylor as a mid-year transfer after stops at Mississippi State, Texas and most recently, Florida. She is expected to be eligible near the beginning of conference play, which kicks off Dec. 21 at Kansas.
- The Washington, D.C., native was No. 2 in the SEC scoring ranks last season with 570 points, averaging 19 per game.

- Matharu was an Honorable Mention All-Big 12 pick at Texas and was named SEC Freshman of the Week twice her first season at Mississippi State.
- Head coach Nicki Collen signed Marcyayla Johnson on National Signing Day out of Tulsa, Okla.
- The Booker T. Washington HS soon-to-be graduate is rated four stars by 247Sports and is ranked 38th nationally. She is 11th among shooting guards and the sixth-best player out of Oklahoma.
- espnW HoopGurlz ranked Johnson 41st in the Class of 2025.

## NUMBERS TO WATCH

- **Aaronette Vonleh** is only two points away from 1,000 in her career. She would be Baylor's fifth active roster member to hit 1k points at the DI level and would give Baylor the lone lead among power conferences.
- **Sarah Andrews** is 15 assists away from 500 in her career. If she reaches this milestone, she will be just the fifth player to reach 500 in program history.
- Andrews is also 16 3-pointers away from breaking the all-time career record at BU of 258 set by Odyssey Simms (2010-14). 15 would tie the record for the fifth-year senior.
- **Madison Bartley** is 48 boards away from 500 career rebounds.

## STORY LINES

## IN THE PRESEASON RANKS

- Baylor opened the season ranked 12th in the nation by the Associated Press. The Bears' ranking in the AP poll was the 20th consecutive appearance in the preseason release. Among Big 12 schools, BU landed second in four league foes in the top 25.
- The Big 12 coaches picked the Bears to finish third in the conference with two first-place votes.

## KEEP WATCH

- Baylor landed three players on five preseason watch lists, announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club, the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame and the Los Angeles Athletic Club.
- **Sarah Andrews** earned spots on the Naismith Trophy Women's College Player of the Year watch list and the Ann Meyers-Drysdale watch list for the best shooting guard in the country.
- **Andrews** is one of nine watch list members from the 16-team Big 12 Conference. Iowa State and Kansas State each are represented by two student-athletes on the list.
- **Darianna Littlepage-Buggs** took her second-straight spot on the preseason list from the Katrina McClain Award for power forwards.
- **Aaronette Vonleh** landed among the top 20 for the Lisa Leslie Award for the best center in the nation.
- **Jada Walker** and **Yaya Felder** also received votes for the Naismith Starting 5 awards, but did not rank in the top 20.
- **Andrews** and **Littlepage-Buggs** were also named to the 50-player Wooden Award Preseason Watch List for the Wooden All-American and Most Outstanding Player Awards

## EVERYWHERE YOU LOOK

- The Big 12 is a full house with 16 member institutions heading into the 2024-25 academic year.
- Turning away from the home-and-away schedule lineup last year to account for the then-14 team league, the Bears host nine conference clashes and hit the road for nine.
- BU will host Colorado, Houston, TCU, BYU, Utah, Iowa State, Oklahoma State, Cincinnati and West Virginia at Foster Pavilion in 2025 and will travel to Colorado, Houston, TCU, Arizona, Arizona State, Kansas, Kansas State, Texas Tech and UCF. Only series against Colorado, Houston and TCU will be played at home and on the road.
- The conference lid-lifer at Kansas, scheduled for Dec. 21, is the first pre-Christmas conference opener for the Bears in the 43-year span of women's basketball in the NCAA. It is also BU's seventh opener on the road in the last 10 seasons.

## BEARS ON THE TELLY

- Baylor was selected for six national broadcasts in 2024-25: at Oregon (BTN), vs. UCLA (FOX), at TCU (ESPN2), Iowa State (FOX), at K-State (ESPN2) and TCU (FS1). Additionally, the championship and consolation games of the Battle 4 Atlantis will be on ESPN2 and ESPNU, respectively.
- Foster Pavilion will be showcased twice against Iowa State (Feb. 22) on FOX and against TCU (March 2) on FS1.
- Both sides of the Bears' home-and-home assignment against the Horned Frogs will be televised.

## AN HONOR IN NEWARK

- Baylor will face UCLA at the Prudential Center in Newark, N.J., for the Coretta Scott King Classic on Jan. 20. The doubleheader will also host a showdown between Texas and Maryland.
- The Coretta Scott King Classic was created to honor the legacy of Mrs. King and celebrate female empowerment in sports and is the first time the names of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and Coretta Scott King have been licensed for a sporting event.
- The first-of-its-kind DH was formed through The King Center, FOX Sports, Harris Blitzer Sports & Entertainment and Playfly Sports.

## A GOLDEN CELEBRATION

- The 2024-25 season will celebrate the 50th Anniversary of Baylor women's basketball, a program with three National Championships, 24 Big 12 titles and the fourth-longest active NCAA Tournament appearance streak in the nation.
- An Alumni Weekend Celebration will be held around the Texas A&M-Corpus Christi game, welcoming back Bears of all years and specifically celebrating the 20th anniversary of the 2005 NCAA National Championship.

## HEAD COACH NICKI COLLEN • 4TH SEASON



Nicki Collen was introduced as the fifth Head Coach in Baylor women's basketball history on May 5, 2021. She enters her fourth season at the helm in 2024-25 after a contract extension to 2030 that was announced in July.

In her first season with the Bears, Collen recorded the most wins by a rookie head coach in the country with 28. She helped lead the Bears to their 12th-straight Big 12 regular-season title and their 11th-straight top-two seed in the NCAA Tournament.

Collen implemented her system, which featured more perimeter shooting. Baylor went from the bottom of the list nationally to just outside the top 50 in 3-pointers made. In her first season, the Bears set new program records for 3-pointers made (233) and attempted (678).

From her introductory press conference, the Naismith Coach of the Year semifinalist said the Bears would be playing their best basketball late in the season, and she was right. Baylor became the first team to defeat a ranked opponent twice in a three-day span since 1999 when the Bears downed Texas two times to open the month of February. Two weeks later, exactly a month after sitting at the bottom of the conference standings with an 0-2 record, BU was back atop the league's leaderboard.

Collen implemented the 1-0 mentality that paid off with a 25-point win at No. 8 Iowa State in front of a nearly soldout crowd of 13,000 raucous fans which clinched the conference crown. Baylor became the first team since Texas Tech in 2000 to start a Big 12 season 0-2 and go on to win the league.

After her first season ended in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Collen saw three of her players be selected in the 2022 WNBA Draft, tying a program record. Two of them - NaLyssa Smith (No. 2) and Queen Egbo (No. 10) marked the first duo to be taken in the top 10 in program history.

Collen's first recruiting class was ranked No. 9 nationally by ESPN HoopGurlz.

In year two, Collen mentored two all-conference selection, two unanimous Big 12 All-Freshman Team picks and the unanimous Big 12 Freshman of the Year, Darianna Littlepage-Buggs. Littlepage-Buggs earned eight Big 12 Freshman of the Week awards during the 2022-23 campaign, becoming the first BU rookie to earn it eight-or-more times in program history. Additionally, she ranked second in the Big 12 all-time in freshman of the week honors.

The Bears secured 20 wins for the 23rd-straight year, which is the second-longest active streak among Division I programs behind UConn's 30-straight 20-plus win seasons. Collen led Baylor to its 19th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2022-23 and 21st overall, as the Bears erased an 18-point deficit to win their opening-round game against Alabama.

Collen's Bears ended year three with a trip to the Sweet 16, highlighted by seven wins over AP-ranked opponents, the most among Big 12 programs. At the beginning of the 2023-24 season, the Bears compiled the second-best start in program history, behind only 2012's 40-0 season, totaling 14-straight non-conference wins. BU then opened the new Foster Pavilion on Jan. 3, 2024, with a strong 71-50 defeat of then-No. 23 TCU in the first conference game of the season.

BU extended the fourth-longest active NCAA Tournament appearance streak in the country to 20-straight with two wins to advance out of the Virginia Tech Regional.

Collen came to Baylor from the WNBA's Atlanta franchise, where she spent the last three seasons at the helm for the Dream. Her rookie season in Atlanta resulted in a 23-11 season in 2018, where she earned WNBA Coach of the Year honors and helped the franchise to the WNBA Playoff Semifinals.

Prior to her arrival in Atlanta, she spent two seasons under former head coach Curt Miller of the Connecticut Sun, helping the franchise improve from fifth in the East Division to second from 2016 to 2017, respectively.

"I am thrilled to be the head coach at Baylor University. I believe it is the top job in the country for women's basketball," said Collen. "I am excited to begin working with this extremely talented team and I am grateful for the unwavering support of President Livingstone and Mack Rhoades. The success of this program speaks for itself, and I will begin working today to ensure Baylor women's basketball continues to be a program that excels at the highest levels."

Collen's collegiate coaching career spanned for nine seasons prior to her WNBA arrival. She spent two seasons as an assistant at Colorado State from 2000-2002, one season at Ball State from 2002-2003, one at Louisville from 2003-2004, three at Arkansas from 2011-2014 and two at Florida Gulf Coast from 2014-2016.

Her teams' combined record in nine seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant was 214-74, good for a .743 win percentage. As an assistant, Collen guided four different squads to the NCAA Tournament, reaching the second round in three of those seasons.

She spent six of her nine seasons as an assistant under her husband, Tom Collen's head-coaching tenures at Colorado State, Louisville and Arkansas. She also coached under Tracy Roller at Ball State and Karl Smesko at Florida Gulf Coast. Collen helped the FGCU program to a 64-9 record and the school's first NCAA Tournament win in her two-year tenure.

In her nine seasons at the collegiate level, Collen coached three All-Americans and saw three players selected in the WNBA Draft.

Collen's collegiate playing career began at Purdue in 1993-94, when the Boilermakers made an NCAA Final Four run with a 29-5 overall record and a 16-2 mark in the Big Ten. Her sophomore season, Purdue made another deep run with an Elite Eight appearance to go with a 24-8 overall record. She transferred to Marquette, where she tallied 421 assists in her final two seasons, averaging 7.0 per game in her last 60 collegiate games. She helped the Golden Eagles to two-straight NCAA Tournament appearances in 1997 and 1998.

Nicki and her husband Tom have three children, Connor, Reese and Logan.

- Baylor is 269-2 all-time when shooting 50 percent or better from the field and 40-0 when shooting 60 percent or higher. The Bears' last loss when shooting over 50 percent was to No. 22 Michigan on 11/27/22.
- 368 of Baylor's wins since 2010-11 have been by 10 or more points, and only 27 times in that span has its winning margin been five or fewer points.
- Since the 2010-11 season, Baylor is 48-10 vs. Top 25 opponents at home.
- Baylor is 360-114 (.761) vs. Big 12 opponents in the regular season all-time.

## THE BAYLOR BEARS REGIME

## 2019 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The 2018-19 Bears became just the third women's program in NCAA history to win three titles when Baylor beat Notre Dame, 82-81, April 7 in Tampa, Florida. **Chloe Jackson's** go-ahead scoop layup with under five seconds left propelled her to NCAA Final Four Most Outstanding Player honors to go along with a team-high 26 points in the game. The Bears rode the wave of two All-American posts with **Kalani Brown** and **Lauren Cox**, each earning multiple all-America honors. The pair led Baylor to its 10th regular-season and tournament championship in the Big 12 and **Kim Mulkey** was honored as national coach of the year by the USBWA, the Associated Press and the WBCA.

## 2012 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The 2011-12 Bear season was as perfect as it could be. En route to claiming its second NCAA Championship in seven years, Baylor ran the table, posting an unprecedented 40-0 mark and claiming both Big 12 Conference crowns. **Brittney Griner** and Mulkey swept player of the year and coach of the year honors, earning WBCA, USBWA, Associated Press, Naismith and Big 12 Conference recognition. Baylor was ranked No. 1 wire-to-wire in both polls and raced through conference play with a Big 12-record 18-0 mark. Griner and **Odyssey Sims** were named consensus All-Americans, while **Destiny Williams** was a WBCA All-America honorable mention honoree.

## 2005 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The squad posted a 33-3 record and claimed the Big 12 Conference title with a 14-2 mark. En route to the program's first NCAA Championship, the Bears defeated three No. 1 seeds. **Steffanie Blackmon** and **Sophia Young** were both named All-Americans. In addition to earning Big 12 Coach of the Year honors, **Mulkey** received the New York Athletic Club's prestigious Winged Foot Award.

## NCAA TOURNAMENT STAPLE &amp; 11-PLUS YEAR DOMINANCE

- The Bears have made 20-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and 22 overall. Those appearances have resulted in three national championships (2005, 2012, 2019), four Final Fours (2005, 2010, 2012, 2019), 10 Elite Eights and 16 Sweet Sixteens.
- The Bears are 24-time Big 12 Champions-- most in Big 12 history --capturing 12 of the last 14 regular season titles, 13 overall & 11 tournament titles.
- Baylor is 442-53 (.898) over the past 12 seasons while posting a 224-25 mark in Big 12 play and 30-4 in Big 12 Tournament play during that span.
- 366 of Baylor's 442 wins since 2010-11 have been by 10 or more points, and only 27 times in that span has its winning margin been five or fewer points.

## BIG 12 DYNASTY

- Baylor women's basketball has won a league-leading 24 Big 12 Conference titles -- 13 regular season and 11 tournament championships.
- Baylor has run the table in the conference four times (2012, 2013, 2018, 2019). It has only happened six times in Big 12 history (Oklahoma: 16-0 in 2006; Nebraska: 16-0 in 2010).
- Baylor has advanced to the Big 12 Championship game 15 times in program history.
- The Bears have won six of the last 11 Big 12 Championship titles, last besting No. 17/20 West Virginia, 76-50, in the 2021 final.

## PAUL AND ALEJANDRA FOSTER PAVILION

The Paul and Alejandra Foster Pavilion along with the Jay & Jenny Allison Development Center is the new home for Baylor's championship-winning Men's and Women's Basketball teams, having played 35 seasons inside the historic Ferrell Center. The Pavilion is a state-of-the-art contemporary field house seating 7,500 fans, located along the banks of the Brazos River on the west side of Interstate 35. Inside, fans are closer to the court to create a true home court advantage.

The Foster's location on the banks of the Brazos allows for the community to be a part of the building's foundation. As a stop on the Riverwalk, the pavilion will be woven into the established traditions of the Waco community. Our fans can enjoy time at local businesses before taking in a game. Just across the interstate from the new Mark & Paula Hurd Welcome Center, this transformative building bolsters the Baylor campus landscape.

The benefit of the new pavilion seating is a more dynamic fan experience. At a capacity of 7,500, fans feel closer to the action and make a dynamic impact on the competition. The new elevation will allow fans to directly access their seat from the concourse, whether you are in premium or standard seating. Fans with premium seating will have access to the Courtside or Sideline Club. The Foster Pavilion will house an exclusive premium entrance, unique to those with premium seating. The Courtside Club is reserved for Champions Row ticket holders. The Sideline Club is located underneath the Club and Loft seats.

The concourse will feature new concession opportunities as well as unique vendor activations. Fans will be welcomed by an energetic atmosphere, cultivated by both the Baylor and Waco communities.

The project scope of the Foster Pavilion & Development Center includes:

- A 223,547-square-foot facility
- Capacity for 7,500 fans including standing-room-only areas for approximately 500 spectators
- Two separate premium club spaces at a combined 8,500 square feet
- Two 2,000-square-foot video end boards
- Visiting locker rooms with the flexibility to accommodate two to four teams
- The Jay & Jenny Allison Development Center for Baylor's championship women's and men's basketball teams, including:
  - Private entrance and elevator, separate practice courts, dedicated locker rooms and team lounges
  - Office facilities for each coach and administration
  - Shared sports performance-related spaces, including strength and conditioning, athletic training/treatment, hydrotherapy, nutrition and more
- Enhancements for the arena to support additional events, such as concerts, performances and public events, including stage rigging, full catering kitchen and cooking capability, additional dressing rooms for performers and related offices

Ground was broken on the state-of-the-art Foster Pavilion on May 2, 2022, with the playing floor installed on November 6, 2023. The inaugural men's basketball game came against Cornell on Tuesday, January 2, 2024, with BU winning 98-79. The inaugural women's basketball game was played on Wednesday, January 3, 2024, against TCU, BU winning 71-50.
