TEAM NOTES

- This marks the 13th meet up between the two.
- WVU leads the all-time series, 8-5 and 6-1 in Morgantown.
- Today's win marked the first time in program history Baylor has won in Morgantown.
- Baylor head coach Dave Aranda is 29-29 in his fifth year with Baylor.
 - Baylor is 19-24 in conference games in the Aranda era.
 - Baylor is 10-15 on the road in the Aranda era.
- Baylor is 636-606-44 all-time.
- Baylor is 3-2 this season when opponent scores first.
- Baylor's win today made the Bears bowl eligable for the 27th time in program history, the 12th time in the last 15 years.
- The win gave BU its fourth straight win, its longest win streak since winning four straight twice in 2021.
- Baylor captains: Josh Cameron, Treven Ma'ae, Sawyer Robertson, Keaton Thomas

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- The Bears finished with 512 total offensive yards, 329 passing and 183 rushing.
- The last four games of Baylor total offensive yards: 529, 565, 499, 512.
- Last time Baylor had four straight games of 498 + offensive yards was 2016 season.
- The Bears' 49 points is the most points Baylor has put up against West Virginia since 2015 (BU, 62-38).
- 49 is the most points Baylor has put up in Morgantown since 2012 (WVU, 70-63).
- Baylor came out hot, scoring 21 points in the 20. Last time Baylor scored 21 points in the 20 was at West Virginia in 2022.
- 21-21 (42) points in the 20 ties for second in highest scoring quarters for both teams. Last time BU went 21-21 in the 20 was also at West Virginia in 2012 (9/29/2012).
- The 35 points in the first half was the most points BU has put on the board in the first half this season.
- Junior OB Sawyer Robertson broke his career-high in passing yards with 329, going 26-36 and three TDs.
- Tied for 6th in single-season passing TDs in program history (22), tied with Robert Griffin III (2010) and Blake Szymanski (2007).
- Went 12-12 to open the game.
- Redshirt freshman RB Bryson Washington ended the day with 123 yards on 18 carries and three rushing TDs.
 - Washington put the first points on the board with a 22-yard receiving TD his first receiving TD of his career.
 - Washington ended with career-high of 59 receiving yards on five catches.
 - Washington is first Baylor player with seven rushing TDs in a two-game span since Terrance Ganaway had two vs. Texas and five vs. Washington in 2011.
 - \bullet Marked Washington's fourth 100+ yard rushing game \cdot three of them being in the last four games.
- Washington scored one touchdown on a 51-yard long run, the longest run of his career.
- Redshirt junior WR Josh Cameron earned 101 yards on five receptions and one touchdown.
- Cameron recorded his eighth receiving TD of the season currently tied for 12th in single-season receiving TDs.
- Marked Cameron's second 100 + yard game of his career/season.
- Senior WR Monaray Baldwin hauled in a season-high of receiving yards with 82 yards on three receptions and one touchdown.
- Baldwin's TD came from a 40-yard long pass tying his career long play of the season.
- Senior WR Ashtyn Hawkins had seven receptions for 52 yards a season-high of receptions.
- Sophomore RB Dawson Pendergrass acheived his fourth TD of the season on a 15-yard rush up the middle.
- Pendergrass finished with 68 yards on 11 attempts.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Baylor defense brought down four sacks and eight TFLs for a total of 29 yards lost.
- Redshirt sophomore LB Keaton Thomas led the defense and earned his second consecutive double digit tackle game of the season with 12 tackles, eight being solo.
- 12 total tackles ties his career high and eight solo tackles marks career high.
- Brought down his second sack of his career.
- Senior LB Matt Jones ended with six tackles, five being solo, one sack, one PBU and one QBH.
 - Jones now in sole possession of 7th in program history of TFLs (35.0), passing Mike Singletary (1977-80).
 - He is just one sack shy from entering top-10 of career sacks in program history.
- Redshirt junior DL Jackie Marshall brought down his third sack of his career, ending with five total tackles, three being solo.
- Redshirt sophomore S Corey Gordon Jr. earned his first start of the season, fifth of career.
- Gordon finished with five total tackles, three being solo, and picked off his third interception of the season.

SPECIAL TEAM NOTES

- Sophomore P Palmer Williams punted three times for 136 yards, averaging 45.3 yards per punt, with a long punt of 52.
 Williams now in three-way tie for 7th in all-time season leaders of 50 + yard punts with 19.
- Senior WR Jamaal Bell returned three kickoffs for 81 yards, including long 41-yard return, averaging 27 yards per return.
- Second longest kick return of the season.
