THE MATCHUP

- Baylor is the second of two teams on Tennessee's non-conference schedule it has never played before, alongside Montana, which it beat, 92-57, on Nov. 13.
- After going 24-11 (11-7) and, for the fifth time in a row, reaching at least the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Baylor placed fourth in the Big 12 preseason poll.
- Fifth-year forward Norchad Omier, a Preseason Second Team All-Big 12 designee, leads the Bears in points (15.4) and rebounds (10.0) per game.
- UT owns a 31-31 all-time record against current Big 12 schools, with Baylor the lone school in the 16-team league it has never faced.
- Rick Barnes is 167-99 in his 38year career against the current Big 12 membership. He has defeated all but one team, BYU (0-1), at least once. He is 9-8 versus such foes while at Tennessee.
- Barnes spent 17 years (1998-2015) as the head coach at Texas. During that time, he went 186-94 (.664) in league play, including 28-6 versus Baylor. He was 2-3 verus the Bears in the Big 12 Tournament.

NEWS & NOTES

- Tennessee is 8-2 all-time in the Bahamas, with the first nine outings all in the Battle 4 Atlantis. It went 2-1 in 2013 (fifth place), 2-1 in 2017 (third) and 3-0 in 2022 (champion). The Volunteers, who beat third-ranked Kansas to claim that 2022 title, have won five in a row in the Bahamas.
- In Rick Barnes' tenure, UT is 11-10 in its eight multi-team event (MTE) appearances. That includes an 8-5 record outside the continental United States.
- Tennessee owns 14 titles at non-home in-season tournaments:
 2022 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2010 NIT Season Tip-Off, 2000 Rainbow Classic, 1988 McDonald's Classic, 1986 Sugar Bowl Classic, 1975 Sugar Bowl Classic, 1974 Big Sun Invitational, 1965 Gulf South Classic, 1963 Gulf South Classic, 1963 Virginia Tech Tournament, 1958 Midwestern Invitational, 1949 Corn Bowl and 1941 Sugar Bowl Classic.
- UT also won 20 of the 24 Volunteer Classics, which it hosted annualy from 1966-67 to 1989-90.

NEWS & NOTES

- Aided by his 26 points in the win over Virginia, the top total by a Volunteer this season, Chaz Lanier became the fourth player on the Tennessee roster with over 1,000 collegiate points.
- In UT's first five games, it led for 188:22 of a possible 200 minutes and trailed for only 4:39.
- Through five outings, the Vols' largest deficit is three points. Meanwhile, they have held a lead of at least 26 points in each game.
- The Volunteers place fifth in KenPom's national rankings, trailing only Gonzaga, Auburn, Houston and Duke. UT is first in the country in KenPom adjusted defensive efficiency (88.8), a stat it has finished top-five in each of the last four years.
- Tennessee is seeking a 6-0 start for the second time in five years, alongside 2020-21 (7-0).
- The Vols are 15-5 in their last 20 games versus AP top-15 teams, dating to a win over #6 Arizona on 12/22/21. It is 9-1 when the opponent is ranked in the No. 10-15 range, as well as 5-3 with the game at a neutral site.

WINNING WAYS

Over the last eight seasons (2017-25), Tennessee paces all SEC teams in total wins (176) and is tied for first in postseason victories (18). It also places a close second in overall winning percentage (.727), league victories (86) and league winning percentage (.688). In that span, UT has three SEC titles, claiming the regular season crown in both 2018 and 2024, plus the tournament title in 2022.

In just the last four years (2021-25), the Volunteers top the SEC in total victories (84) and winning percentage (.750), plus co-lead the SEC in league victories (39) and league winning percentage (.722). More information can be found on Page 3.
