▶ The schools will be meeting for the 52nd time on Wednesday, as K-State owns a narrow 26-25 lead in the all-time series which dates back to the 1948 NCAA Tournament. However, Baylor has a 24-21 lead in the Big 12 era, including an 11-8 mark in games played in Waco. The Wildcats have won 3 consecutive over the Bears, including a dramatic 68-64 overtime win last season in Manhattan.

► Longtime friends Jerome Tang and Scott Drew will meet for the fourth time on Wednesday, as Tang got the better of Drew in 2 wins in 2023 and the overtime win in 2024. Tang spent 19 seasons alongside Drew as an assistant coach (2003-17) and associate head coach (2017-22) at Baylor.

LAST TIME OUT

► K-State showed fight and resilience against a top 10 ranked Kansas team before a sold-out crowd at Allen Fieldhouse, but the Wildcats could not quite dig itself out of a 14-0 deficit to start the game in falling 84-74 on Saturday in Dillons Sunflower Showdown.

► Junior **C.J. Jones**' pullup jumper gave K-State's its first points at the 15:30 mark, as the Wildcats clawed to within 32-26 with 2:45 before heading to halftime down 10. After trailing by as many as 15 points in the second half, they closed to with 6 points on 3 occasions, including 76-70 with 1:45 to play after senior Max Jones' 2 free throws. However, Kansas sealed the game with a free throw from senior Zeke Mayo and a jumper by senior Hunter Dickinson for a 79-70 lead with 42 seconds.

STORYLINES

▶ Newcomers have combined to score 958 (76.9 percent) of the team's 1245 points, accounting for 43 of 58 double-digit scoring games. Senior returner David N'Guessan has scored in double figures in 15 games, but the next 6 highest scorers are newcomers, including 11 double-digit scoring efforts by junior Brendan Hausen, 10 by senior Coleman Hawkins and 9 by senior Max Jones.

► N'Guessan has been the Wildcats' most consistent player, as he leads in both scoring (12.6 ppg.) and rebounding (7.2 rpg.) while hitting on 64.7 percent (86-of-133). He has scored in double figures in 5 of 6 Big 12 games, including consecutive double-double vs. TCU (1/4/25) and Oklahoma State (1/7/25). His 17 boards vs. the Horned Frogs tied for the third-most by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game.

▶ Hawkins is the only player in Division I averaging at least 10.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.0 blocks per game this season. He is the team's leading scorer in Big 12 play at 13.8 points per game, while averaging 6.3 rebounds, 4.3 assists, 1.7 steals and 1.0 blocks per game. He became the first Wildcat to post an points/assists double-double vs. Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse, as he collected his ninth career double-double with 15 points and a career-tying 10 assists.

► Led by longtime head coach Scott Drew, Baylor enters Wednesday's game with an 11-6 overall record, including a 3-3 mark in Big 12 action, after a 74-71 last-second loss to TCU on Sunday. The Bears have lost back-to-back games for the first time this season after losing at Arizona on Jan. 14. The loss to the



Horned Frogs was the first at home this season where the Bears are 8-1.

Baylor is averaging 80.8 points on 46.6 percent shooting, including 36.4 percent from 3-point range, while allowing 68.5 points on 43.4 percent shooting from the field, including 37 percent from 3-point range. The Bears are hitting on 70.8 percent from the free throw line.

Baylor is the Big 12 leader in offensive rebounds (13.4), while the Bears are second in the league in steals (9.0 spg.) and third in turnaround margin (+3.6) and turnovers forced (14.9). They are also near the top-50 nationally in scoring (80.8/51st) and scoring margin (+12.2/40th).

► Five Bears are averaging in double figures, including a near doubledouble by graduate transfer Norchad Omier, who leads the team in scoring (15.8 ppg.), rebounding (9.9 rpg.) and blocks (1.1 bpg.), Freshman V.J. Edgecombe is second in scoring at 12.8 points per game to go with 5.6 rebounds and a team-best 2.4 steals per game. Robert Wright (12.1 ppg.), Jeremy Roach (11.9 ppg.) and Jayden Nunn (10.5 ppg.) are averaging double figures. Wright averages a team-best 4.8 assists per game.

► The head coach of perhaps the greatest turnaround in college basketball history, Drew has a 455-250 record in his 22nd season at Baylor. He is 475-241 in his 23rd season overall, which includes one season at Valparaiso. He is 18-19 all-time vs. K-State, including 8-7 at home.

Brendan Wenzel's 3-pointer at the buzzer near the end of regulation gave TCU a 74-71 win over Baylor on Sunday afternoon. The Bears forced 17 turnovers, converting those into 21 points, including 11 steals.

► The Jayhawks jumped out to a 14-0 lead despite two called timeouts by head coach Jerome Tang as the Wildcats missed their first 7 field goals before junior C.J. Jones' pull-up jumper gave them their first points at the 15:30 mark.

► K-State scraped to within 6 points (32-26) with 2:45 before halftime on a dunk by junior **Ugonna Onyenso**, but Kansas was able to take a 10-point lead (39-29) into the locker room by scoring 7 of the half's last 10 points.

▶ In the second half, the Wildcats trailed by as many as 15 points before closing to within 6 points on 3 occasions, including 72-66 after a jumper by junior Brendan Hausen with 4:01 to play. Despite getting two chances after a stop on defense, K-State couldn't close the gap any further as junior Dug McDaniel and senior Coleman Hawkins each had shots blocked.

▶ K-State had one more opportunity down 76-70 with 1:45 to play after a pair of free throws from senior Max Jones, but Hausen's 3-pointer was off the mark, as Kansas sealed the game with a free throw from senior Zeke Mayo and a jumper by senior **Hunter Dickinson** for a 79-70 lead with 42 seconds left. The Javhawks connected on 5 of 6 free throws to finish off the game.

► Three Wildcats scored in double figures led by Hawkins' points/assists doubledouble of 15 points and a career-tying 10 assists to go with 7 rebounds while playing all 40 minutes. It was his ninth career double-double, including his third at K-State, and his second double-double of points and assists. He is first Wildcat player to post a points/assists double-double at Allen Fieldhouse.

► Hawkins was joined in double figures by fellow seniors David N'Guessan (13 points) and Max Jones (11 points). McDaniel and Onyenso each finished with 9 points, while freshman David Castillo added 6 points on a pair of free throws to go with 2 steals in a season-high 23 minutes.

Dickinson (25 points) and Mayo (24 points) combined for 49 points for the Jayhawks, who scored their 84 points on 55.4 percent (31-of-56) shooting, including 46 in the paint. Senior Dajuan Harris Jr. added 15 points, 5 assists, 5 rebounds and 2 blocks.

▶ K-State connected on 45.8 percent (27-of-59) from the field, including 23.1 percent (6-of-26) from 3-point range, and 73.7 percent (14-of-19) from the free throw line. The Wildcats turned the ball over a season-low 5 times, which was the lowest since the 2023 NCAA Tournament.

POSTGAME NEWS & NOTES

Kansas now leads the second-longest active rivalry in Division I, 206-96, including 96-35 at home... The Jayhawks have now won 19 straight at home.

▶ The 10-point loss was closest at Allen Fieldhouse since 2018

Hawkins' points/assists double-double was the second of his career and is his first since his triple-double (15 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists) vs. Syracuse on Nov. 29, 2022 while playing at Illinois... It was the 27th points/assists doubledouble in school history, including the first by a Wildcat at Allen Fieldhouse.

▶ Junior Ugonna Onyenso scored his Big 12 high with 9 points on 4-of-4 field goals and 1-of-1 free throws to go with 2 rebounds in 15 minutes off the bench.

Freshman David Castillo played a season-high 23 minutes, posting 6 points, 2 steals and an assist... His back-to-back 3-pointers in the second half snapped a streak of 18 consecutive misses.

■ HOW THE 'CATS WERE BUILT

'CATS WELCOME 10 NEWCOMERS, **INCLUDING 7 DIVISION I TRANSFERS**

▶ K-State brought in one of the top transfer classes with 10 newcomers, including 7 Division I transfers, one NJCAA Division II All-American, a Division II walk-on and a one high school prospect.

Among the 10 newcomers are 7 Division I transfers, including Baye Fall (Arkansas), Brendan Hausen (Villanova), Coleman Hawkins (Illinois), C.J. Jones (UIC), Max Jones (Cal State Fullerton) and Ugonna Onyenso (Kentucky).

► Hawkins, the Preseason Big 12 co-Newcomer of the Year and All-Big 12 Second Team selection, played in 126 games in his Illinois career. He is the first player with at least 900 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists, 100 blocks and 100 steals. He was an All-Big Ten pick in 2023-24, averaging 12.1 points, 6.1 rebounds, 2.7 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.1 blocks per game.

▶ Dubbed the "Amarillo Assassin", Hausen played in 66 games during his time at Villanova, becoming of the BIG EAST's top 3-point shooters. He has knocked down 88 3-point field goals in his college career, connecting on 1.3 makes per game on 39.5 percent shooting from beyond the arc.

► C.J. Jones played in 62 games with 50 starts at UIC, averaging 9.0 points, 3.6 assists, 2.7 rebounds and 0.9 steals in 2 seasons. He led in assists (159) and minutes (1,102), while he was second in scoring.

Max Jones has scored nearly 1,400 points at Division II Tampa and Cal State Fullerton. He has played in 84 games with 81 starts and has compiled 26 20-point games and six 30-point games.

▶ McDaniel played 2 seasons at Michigan, where he averaged 11.8 points, 4.1 assists, 3.4 rebounds and 1.1 steals in 32.8 minutes per game. He led in scoring (16.3 ppg.), 3-point field goals (56), assists (4.7 apg.), steals (1.1 spg.) and minutes (35.4 mpg.) as a sophomore in 2023-24.

► Onyenso emerged as one of the top shot blockers at Kentucky with 82 blocks in a mere 40 games played. His 2.75 blocks average in 2023-24 would have ranked sixth nationally if he had played enough games.

► The team's only McDonald's All-American, Fall played in 9 games as a true freshman at Arkansas in 2023-24.

Sophomore Mobi Ikegwuruka averaged a double-double (19.0 ppg., 10.3 rpg.) while earning JUCO All-America honors at Ellsworth CC in Iowa.

Senior Spencer Bain played 4 seasons at Division II Flagler College before deciding to walk-on for his final season of eligibility in 2024-25.

► The lone freshman - David Castillo - played extensively with Team USA, while scoring more nearly 1,700 career points in his prep career.

NEED A BETTER START

Offense has been a primary culprit in the poor start to Big 12 play, as the Wildcats are averaging just 64.3 points on 42.6 percent (140-of-329) shooting, including 28 percent (40-of-143) from 3-point range. The team has hit 70 points just twice in 6 Big 12 games, including in the Wildcats' lone win vs. No. 16/17 Cincinnati (12/30/24). They have 62, 66 and 57 (twice) in the other 4 games.

► Even including the win over the Bearcats, the Wildcats have gotten off to poor offensive starts in Big 12 play, averaging 27.5 points on 37 percent (64-of-173) shooting in the first half compared to 36.8 points on 48.7 percent (76-of-156) shooting in the second half. The team has scored less than 30 first-half points in 4 of 6 Big 12 games, including exactly 24 points vs TCU (1/4/25), Oklahoma State (1/7/25) and No. 12/11 Houston (1/11/25).

► The Wildcats have scored 74 or more points in 6 of 7 wins, including 80 or more in 4 contests, highlighted by the school-record 120-point effort vs. UAPB (12/1/24). The 120 points topped the previous record of 116 set in a win at No. 6/6 Texas on Jan. 3, 2023, while they were the most-ever in a home game.

► K-State has hit on better than 50 percent from the field in 6 games, including a season-high 61.5 percent (40-of-65) vs. UAPB (12/1/24). The team connected on 57.8 percent vs. Cleveland State (11/9/24), 51.8 percent vs. GW (11/22/24), 58.9 percent vs. Longwood (11/25/24) and 51.1 percent at OSU (1/7/25).

BETTER FROM 3-POINT RANGE

► One of the top priorities for **Jerome Tang** this past offseason was getting better production from the 3-point line. Last season, K-State ranked last in the Big 12 and 289th nationally in 3-point percentage at 31.8, while the Wildcats were 183rd in the nation in 3-point field goals made/game at 7.4.

► Through 17 games, the Wildcats have made some improvement in that area, as they rank 207th nationally and 12th in the Big 12 in 3-point field goal percentage (33.4) and 112th in the nation and eighth in the league in 3-point field goals/game (8.4). They are also fourth in the Big 12 in attempts (25.2).

▶ K-State has connected on 10 or more 3-pointers in 5 games, including a near school-record 21 triples vs. UAPB (12/1/24). The 21 3-pointers are the second-most behind the record 23 set vs. Fresno State in 1994. The Wildcats made 10 or more treys in 4 other games, including vs. No. 12/11 Houston (1/11/25).

► Three Wildcats have already registered double-digit 3-pointers led by junior Brendan Hausen's 51 makes. Hausen ranks first in the Big 12 in 3-point field goals made (51) and 3-pointers/game (3.00) and second in 3-point attempts (129). He ranks among the top-75 nationally in all 4 categories. Ten players have at least 2 made 3-pointers, including 24 by senior Max Jones, 21 by senior Coleman Hawkins and 11 by David Castillo, CJ. Jones and Dug McDaniel.

OVERTIME STREAK SNAPPED

K-State saw its 12-game winning streak in overtime games end in the 73-70 loss to unbeaten Drake on Dec. 21 in the Wildcat Classic at the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City. In a game in which they trailed by as many as 20 points in the first half, the Wildcats seemingly tied the game at 70-all in overtime on a 3-pointer by senior Coleman Hawkins with 13 seconds before the Bulldogs' Bennett Sitrz's 3-pointer with 4 seconds left proved to be the game-winner.

► K-State's 12-game overtime winning streak was the second-longest in Division I history since 1950 and the second-longest current streak behind Florida State (14; 2018-current) and right ahead of Winthrop (10; 2017-current).

► K-State set the Division I single-season record with 7 overtime wins in 2023-24, which included Providence (73-70), Oral Roberts (88-78), North Alabama (75-74) and Villanova (72-71) in non-conference play and No. 9/9 Baylor (68-64), No. 4/4 Kansas (75-70) and West Virginia (94-90) in Big 12 action.

▶ The 7 overtime wins in 2023-24 set the Division I single-season record, snapping a tie of 6 with Wake Forest (1983-84), (hattanooga (1988-89) and Lafayette (2007-08). The 7 overtime wins also broke the school record of 5, while it was the most overtime games in school history (5 total set in 1992-93 and 2022-23). The 6 overtime home wins were also the Division I mark.

The loss also snapped coach Jerome Tang's 13-game personal winning streak in overtime game, which dated back to an overtime win as interim head coach at Baylor in 2013 over Texas.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

▶ K-State has posted a 187-61 (.763) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 146-18 (.894) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 130-14 (.903) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

K-State's 12-1 non-conference mark in 2022-23 was the best since the 2009-10 team went a program-best 13-1. The 6-5 record in 2024-25 is the worst since the 2020-21 season (4-5) and worst non-COVID season start since 1970-71 (5-6).

1700 WINS AND COUNTING

K-State entered the 2024-25 season as one of the winningest programs in Division I history, as the Wildcats have posted a 1,740-1,238 (.584) all-time record which includes 32 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships. The 1,740 wins tie Marquette for the 43rd-most in Division I history, including the seventh-most among current Big 12 schools.

■ HARTMAN TO HALL OF FAME

HARTMAN SELECTED TO NATIONAL COLLEGIATE BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME

► Legendary head coach Jack Hartman, who won a school-record 295 games during his illustrious 16-year tenure from 1970-86, was among eight individuals announced Dec. 31 to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2024.

► Hartman was the only head coach in the eight-man induction class, which included Dave Meyers (UCLA), Sihugo Green (Duquesne), Lennie Rosenbluth (North Carolina), Wayne Estes (Utah State), Sam Lacey (New Mexico State), John Rudometkin (USC) and Tom Stith (St. Bonaventure).

► Hartman won nearly 600 games in his legendary career, which included stints at Coffeyville (Kan.) Community College from 1955-62 and Southern Illinois from 1962-70. He won a NJCAA national championship at Coffeyville in 1961-62, going a perfect 32-0, while he led the Salukis to the 1967 NIT Championship with a 24-2 record.

► Hartman led K-State to a 295-169 (.636) record, 3 Big Eight regularseason conference titles (1971-72, 1972-73, 1976-77), 2 Big Eight Tournament championships (1977, 1980) and 9 postseason appearances (7 NCAA Tournaments) during his 16 seasons as head coach.

► Hartman saw the Wildcats post 20 or more wins 7 times, including 24 wins in both 1976-77 and 1980-81. He also guided the Wildcats to the NCAA Tournament 7 times (1972, 1973, 1975, 1977, 1980, 1981, 1982), including 4 trips (1972, 1973, 1975, 1981) to the Elite Eight.

► Hartman is the sixth person with K-State to be named to the Hall of Fame, including the fourth men's basketball head coach following Jack Gardner (2006), Tex Winter (2010) and his former player Lon Kruger (2022). In addition, former Wildcat players Rolando Blackman (2015) and Bob Boozer (2016) have also been elected to the Hall of Fame.

K-State has played over 400 games vs. ranked teams in their history, posting a 133-298 (.309) record, including 27-85 (.241) vs. the top-5, 55-150 (.267) vs. the top-10 and 78-211 (.271) vs. top-15.

K-State has 41 wins vs. ranked foes in the last 12 seasons, including 16 vs. the top 10 (one over No. 1), and 31 Top 25 wins at home.

PLAYER NOTES

N'GUESSAN OFF TO STRONG START

Senior David N'Guessan is off to a strong start to his fifth and final year of college in 2024-25, as the De Lier, The Netherlands native has scored in double figures in a team-leading 15 games. He leads the Wildcats in scoring (12.6 ppg.), field goals made (86) and rebounding (7.2 rpg.) while connecting on a team-best 64.7 percent (86-of-133) from the field.

▶ N'Guessan made quite the season debut against New Orleans on Nov. 5 becoming the first Wildcat with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds in an opener since **Wesley Ivundu** (23 points, 10 rebounds) did it against UMES on Nov. 13, 2015. He scored his 21 points on 10-of-14 field goals to go with 15 rebounds, 2 assists, 1 steal and 1 block in nearly 31 minutes. It was his fourth career doubledouble and his first career 20-point, 10-rebound performance.

▶ N'Guessan has double-doubles in 2 of 6 Big 12 games, including 12 points and a career-best 17 rebounds at TCU (1/4/25) and 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds at Oklahoma State (1/7/25). His 17 boards tied for the third-most by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and were the most since **Michael Beasley** posted 17 rebounds aqainst Missouri on Feb. 16, 2008.

▶ N'Guessan, the last remaining member of the 2023 Elite Eight team, is in his third season at K-State after transferring from Virginia Tech in 2022-23. He has scored 666 points in his Wildcat career, connecting on 63.4 percent from the field, to go with 454 rebounds, 83 assists, 54 blocks and 59 steals in 80 games played with 56 starts. He has 6 career double-doubles.

▶ N'Guessan is coming off a career year in 2023-24, in which, he posted career-highs in points (265), double-digit scoring games (14), field goals made (111) and attempted (190), rebounds (230), assists (31), blocks (26), steals (24) and total minutes (935). He also collected 3 double-doubles.

▶ N'Guessan has been a part of 90 victories in college, including 3 trips to the NCAA Tournament (2021, 2022, 2023), an NIT appearance in 2024, an ACC Tournament title in 2022 at Virginia Tech and Elite Eight run in 2023 at K-State.

MR. ALL-AROUND

Senior wing Coleman Hawkins has proven himself to be an elite all-around player for the Wildcats, as he leads in assists (4.2 apg.), steals (2.1 spg.), blocks (1.3 bpg.) and minutes (32.9 mpg.) while he is second in rebounding (6.9 rpg.) and field goals made (69) and third in scoring (10.8 ppg.).

► Hawkins has registered at least 4 assists and 2 steals in 7 games played, while he has grabbed 5 or more rebounds on 14 occasions and has 7 games of at least 2 blocks. He has scored in double figures 10 times, including a season-high 20 points vs. No. 16/17 Cincinnati (12/30/24) on 7-of-13 field goals. He became the first Wildcat to record a points/assists double-double at Allen Fieldhouse with 15 points and a career-tying 10 assists for his ninth career double-double.

Hawkins ranks in the Big 12's top-15 in 6 categories, including minutes (32.5 mpg./4th), steals (2.1 spg./5th), assists (4.2 apg./9th), defensive rebounds (5.0/9th), blocks (1.3 bpq./10th) and rebounds (6.9 rpq./11th).

► Hawkins was named to the Paradise Jam All-Tournament Team on Nov. 25 after averaging 13.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.3 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.7 blocks in 34.3 minutes per game. He registered his first double-double as a Wildcat with his 19-point, 10-rebound effort vs. Longwood (11/25/24).

HAUSEN GOOD FROM 3

► Junior guard **Brendan Hausen** has given the Wildcats a scoring threat from 3-point range, as the Villanova transfer ranks first in the Big 12 in total 3-point field goals made (51) and 3-pointers/game (3.00), second in 3-point attempts (129) and fifth in 3-point percentage (39.5).

► Hausen has connected on at least 2 made 3-pointers in 13 of 17 games while he had a season-high 6 makes against Cleveland State (11/9/24) and at St. John's (12/7/24). He knocked down 5 treys vs. No. 12/11 Houston (1/11/25), while three times has 4 triples (New Orleans, Liberty and Wichita State).

► Hausen had his best shooting performance in the Big 12/BIG EAST Battle at St. John's (12/7/24), as he posted his second 20-point game of the season with a career-best 27 points on 9-of-17 field goals, including 6-of-10 from 3-point range. He scored 21 of his 27 points in the first half, becoming the 21st player in school history to score 20 or more points in an opening half.

► A starter in all 17 games, Hausen ranks second on the team in scoring (11.9 ppg.) while connecting on 41.3 percent from the field, including 39.5 percent from 3-point range. He is second on the team behind **David N'Guessan** with 11 double-digit scoring games, including 9 of the last 13 games.

► Dubbed the 'Amarillo Assassin' for his 3-point ability in high school, Hausen has totaled 139 made 3-pointers in his 83-game college career, making 41 percent from the field. He was Villanova's top 3-point shooting threat in 2023-24, totaling 61 makes on 38.1 percent shooting from the bench.

POINT GUARD BY COMMITTEE

► A weakness a year ago, head coach Jerome Tang made it a point to have options at the point guard position in 2024-25, bringing in transfers C.J. Jones (UIC) and Dug McDaniel (Michigan) to go with incoming freshman David Castillo. Throw in versatile big man Coleman Hawkins, who is second on the team with 3.9 assists/game, and the coaching staff have plenty of ball handlers.

► K-State is averaging 16.4 assists through 17 games this season, which ranks 49th nationally and sixth in the Big 12, while the team has assists on more than 60 percent of their made baskets (278 out of 451). The Wildcats have dished out more than 20 assists 3 times, including 30 on 40 field goals while breaking the school scoring record (120) vs. UAPB (12/1/24). The 30 assists tied for the second-most and the most since the record of 34 was set in 1985.

▶ McDaniel has started each of the first 6 Big 12 games after coming off the bench much of the season. He is second on the team in both assists (65) and steals (27) while averaging 28.8 minutes per game. He has at least 3 assists in 12 games, including a career-best 10 against UAPB (12/1/24). He has scored in double figures in 7 of the last 13 games, including a season-best 18 points vs. UAPB to post his first career double-double.

► Jones has started 8 games this season, averaging 6.4 points on 42.4 percent shooting with 1.9 assists and 1.4 rebounds in 19.6 minutes per game. He has at least 2 assists in 9 games, including a season-high 4 twice, while he scored a season-high 12 points vs. Mississippi Valley State (11/19/24).

► Castillo, who started vs. Drake (12/17/24) and Wichita State (12/21/24), played a season-high 23 minutes off the bench vs. No. 9/10 Kansas (1/18/25).

HOME SWEET HOME

▶ K-State has posted a 436-151 (.743) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 436 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.

▶ K-State finished the 2022-23 campaign with a 15-1 record at Bramlage Coliseum, which included an 8-1 mark vs. Big 12 foes. The 15 wins tied for the second-most in the arena's history and are the most since also winning 15 in 2013-14, while the 15-1 record is the best since going 16-1 in 2012-13.

► K-State has registered a 235-71 (.771) record at home over the past 19 seasons, including a 101-57 (.645) mark in Big 12 play. The 235 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 101 league victories at home are among the tops in the Big 12.

► K-State has defeated 51 ranked opponents in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 48 ranked Big 12 foes. Four No. 1 teams have been knocked off in the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016.

▶ K-State is now 34-7 at Bramlage Coliseum under head coach Jerome Tang, including 16-5 in Big 12 play. Tang is also 10-3 at home vs. AP Top 25 opponents, including 1-1 in 2024-25.

32nd Season Overall | 22nd Season in College

Jerome Tang, who was selected as the 2023 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year after guiding the Wildcats to a 26-win season and its 13th trip to the Elite Eight in his inaugural season, is in his third season as the 25th head men's basketball head coach at Kansas State in 2024-25.

With his relentless passion, energy and positivity, Tang has re-energized a K-State program which had endured three consecutive losing seasons before his arrival in 2022-23. In his first 2 seasons, he led the Wildcats to a 45-25 (.643) record, including 19 wins in Big 12 play, with consecutive postseason appearances (2023 NCAA Tournament, 2024 NIT) highlighted by the run to the Elite Eight. He is one of just 4 head coaches (Lon Kruger, Frank Martin and Bruce Weber) to help the Wildcats to the postseason in their first 2 seasons.

Among his 52 wins at K-State are 12 against teams ranked in the Top 25, including 6 Top 10 opponents. The 12 career Top 25 wins are the fifth-most in school history, while the 6 against Top 10 competition tie for the fourth-most. Ten of the 12 ranked wins have come in the friendly confines of Bramlage Coliseum, where Tang is 34-7 (.850) overall, including 16-5 (.800) in Big 12 play and 10-3 (.769) against ranked foes. The 10 career home Top 25 wins tie for the second-most by a head coach in school history.

In addition to the wins over ranked teams, Tang's teams have also proved to be clutch in his short tenure, posting a 13-1 mark in overtime games, including an NCAA single-season record 7 such wins in 2023-24. The 12-game winning streak in overtime games was the second-longest such streak in Division I history since 1950 and the second-longest streak behind Florida State (14; 2018-present) and right ahead of Winthrop (10; 2017-present). Including his time as interim head coach at Baylor, Tang is now 13-1 in overtime games.

Tang has helped reestablish the "Octagon of Doom" as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball, as the Wildcats have played before nine sellouts while posting a 34-7 record at home with 10 wins over Top 25 foes, including a pair of top-5 wins over archrival Kansas, two over top-10 Baylor and No. 6/6 lowa State. The 15 home wins in 2022-23 were the most in nearly a decade (2014-15) and tied for the second-most in the arena's 35-year history. The eight sellouts in 2022-23 were the most since 2014-15, while the team ranked 23rd nationally in percentage capacity at 87.57 percent in the newly configured 11,010-seat arena.

Despite losing a pair of All-Americans in Keyontae Johnson and Markquis Nowell as well as a third starter in Nae'Qwan Tomlin right before the season, Tang kept the Wildcats in the NCAA Tournament conversation until the very end of the season before receiving a bid to the NIT, where they lost in the first round at lowa. The team posted a 19-15 overall record, which included a tie for ninth with Oklahoma in the new 14-team Big 12 with an 8-10 mark. Among the 19 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason (6 NCAA Tournament and 4 NIT teams), including No. 9/9 Baylor, No. 4/4 Kansas, No. 25/21 BYU and No. 6/6 lowa State.

The victories over the Bears and Javhawks came in overtime, as the Wildcats set a new Division I single-season record with 7 overtime wins, breaking the mark of 6 set by Wake Forest (1983-84), Chattanooga (1988-89) and Lafayette (2007-08). The 7 overtime wins also broke the school record of 5, set in 1992-93 and 2022-23, while it is the most overtime games in school history (5 total set in 1992-93 and 2022-23). The 6 overtime home wins are also a Division I record, surpassing the 5 by Cincinnati in 1966-67.

Armed with just two returning players, the Wildcats posted a 26-10 overall record in Tang's inaugural season, which included a tie for third place in the nation's most difficult conference – the Big 12 – with an 11-7 mark and the school's 13th appearance in the Elite Eight and the first since 2017-18. The 26 wins are the third-most in school history, trailing the school-record 29 in 2009-10 and the 27 in 2012-13, and just the eighth 25-win campaign. His 26 wins are the second-most by a first-year head coach in school history.

During the team's historic season, Tang coached a pair of All-Americans in 2023 Bob Cousy Award winner Markquis Nowell and forward Keyontae Johnson, who became the first duo in school history to each earn the recognition from The Associated Press when they were selected to the Third Team. Both players were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Johnson was the league's Newcomer of the Year. Nowell was selected as the winner of Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame after he finished second nationally in assists/game (8.3 apg.), total assists (297) and total steals (92) while ranking in the top-15 in four others. He was chosen the East Regional

Most Outstanding Player after guiding the Wildcats to the Elite Eight, averaging 23.5 points, 13.5 assists and 4.0 steals in his 4-game NCAA Tournament run, which included a tournament and school-record 19-assist performance in the win over Michigan State on March 23. Nowell was also named a Third Team All-American by The Sporting News, NABC and U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

The 2022-23 Wildcats set three school single-season records, including the mark for assists (611), while finishing No. 2 in points (2,742), field goals made (961), 3-point field goals made (258), free throw percentage (74.8) and steals (289) in school history. The 46.1 field goal percentage tied for the seventh-best in the shot clock era and the best since 2017-18. Nowell crushed the single-season marks for assists (297) and steals (92) while he and Johnson became just the second duo in school history to each tally 600 or more points in a single season.

Starting with the 2007-08 season, Tang was pivotal in helping Baylor to a stretch of 15 consecutive seasons of at least 18 wins, including a school-record 30 in 2011-12, en route to a 361-153 (.702) overall record and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Since 2010, the Bears have appeared in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 five times (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), three times advancing to the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and once to the Final Four (2021).

In his last three seasons (2019-22) at Baylor, Tang helped the Bears tally an 81-13 (.862) record, including a 43-8 (.843) mark in Big 12 play, with 22 wins over ranked opponents highlighted by the Bears' first National Championship in 2021, as they defeated No. 1 ranked Gonzaga, 86-70, in the national title game. The 2021 Bears also won their first Big 12 Championship in the league's 25-year history, which was the school's first conference title in 71 years, then followed it up with a second-straight crown in 2022 by winning their last five Big 12 games. Baylor's 55-9 (.859) record over the 2020-21 and 2021-22 season was the best among power conference teams.

Despite a season mired by injuries to key players, Tang helped Baylor navigate a successful 2021-22 season that ended in a heartbreaking 93-86 overtime loss to North Carolina in the NCAA Tournament. Down 25 points with 10 minutes left, the Bears rallied to force overtime before faltering late, 93-86, to finish the season with a 27-7 record, including a tie for first place in the Big 12 with a 14-4 mark. The team ran their winning streak to 21 games, including 15 straight to start the year, ascending to the No. 1 ranking for five consecutive weeks.

Baylor lost just twice during its historic national championship season in 2020-21, posting a 28-2 record and a 14-1 mark in Big 12 play which included schoolrecord 11 wins against ranked foes. The Bears enjoyed the best start in program history with an 18-game winning streak, which was the fourth-longest streak in Big 12 history. A school-record 3 Bears earned All-America honors, including Jared Butler becoming the first consensus First Team selection.

Tang helped Baylor to what was then the best season in program history in 2019-20, as the Bears spent five consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 nationally en route to posting a 26-4 record, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The team set a Big 12 record with 23 straight wins and were projected to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tang was part of the Baylor rebuild from the beginning, as he assisted Drew in guiding a Bear program that was crippled by NCAA sanctions into one that has advanced to the postseason 13 times in the last 14 seasons, including a current streak of 11 consecutive seasons, and 15 straight winning seasons

After going 36-69 in their first four seasons, Tang and the Bears were rewarded with their first NCAA Tournament berth in 20 seasons and just their second at the school since 1950 in 2007-08. The team lost to No. 18 Purdue in the first round to conclude the year with a 21-11 record, including 9-7 in Big 12 play, as Curtis Jerrells became the first All-Big 12 First Team selection since 2001.

Baylor posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, as the 2008-09 team advanced to its first Big 12 Championship game before finishing as the runner-up in the NIT. The Bears then made another significant step with two Elite Eight runs in a 3-year period, including the first in the modern era in 2009-10 and to cap a school-record 30-win season in 2011-12.

Prior to Baylor, Tang built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy, a birththrough-high school private school in Cleveland, Texas, as the head coach and athletic director, guiding the Eagles to 4 TAPPS Division A state championships (1995, 1999, 2000, 2001) from 1993 to 2003. His program gained national attention in 2001 when Cedrick Hensley scored 101 points in a game. Tang's most-publicized recruit - Vakeaton "Von" Wafer - became a McDonald's All-American before playing at FSU and being drafted by the L.A. Lakers in 2005.

Senior David N'Guessan registered his fourth career double-double with a game-high 21 points and 15 rebounds in helping K-State to an 89-65 win over New Orleans in the season opener for both teams on Nov. 5 before 9,155 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ N'Guessan had a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds) in the first half before earning his first career 20-point, 10-rebound performance of his college career. His 21 points were two shy of his career-high of 23 vs. Abilene Christian on Dec. 6, 2022, while his 15 boards were one short of his career-high of 16 against Iowa State in his last game at home on March 9.

▶ N'Guessan was joined in double figures by senior Max Jones (19 points) and junior **Brendan Hausen** (17 points), who combined for 8 of the Wildcats' 13 made 3-point field goals on the night. The 13 triples tied for the 10th-most in a game in school history and were the most since knocking down 15 against West Virginia in overtime on Feb. 26, 2024.

► Trailing by as many 10 points near the midway point of the first half, the K-State offense exploded for 74 of its 89 points in the last 29 minutes of action. The Wildcats ended the first half on a 29-7 run, flipping a 25-15 deficit with 10:15 to play into a 44-32 halftime advantage

► Hausen (12 points) and Jones (8) combined for 20 of the team's 29 points during this pivotal run, including 5 by Jones in the last 2 seconds of the half.

► K-State's lead never dropped below 18 points in the second half and grew to as many as 26 after a pair of free throws by junior **Dug McDaniel** with 5:47 to play. McDaniel dished out a game-high 8 assists to go with 6 points and 2 steals in 23 minutes off the bench in his first career action.

▶ The Wildcats finished the night with 24 assists on 34 made field goals with just 9 turnovers, the fewest in a game since posting just 5 in the win over Michigan State in the 2022 NCAA Tournament.

► K-State moved to 94-27 all-time season openers, including 82-10 at home and 30-3 at Bramlage Coliseum. The Wildcats have now won 19 of their last 22 openers

▶ New Orleans (0-1) saw three players score in double figures led by 19 from sophomore guard Jah Short. He was joined in double figures by senior James White (14 points) and junior Dae Dae Hunter (10 points).

▶ Junior Brendan Hausen led four Wildcats in double figures with a careerhigh 22 points, including 6 made 3-point field goals, as K-State earned a 77-64 win over Cleveland State on Nov. 9 before 9,928 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Hausen followed up his 17-point effort in the season-opening win over New Orleans on Tuesday night with his first career 20-point game. He became the first Wildcat with 6 made 3-point field goals since Tylor Perry did so against Cincinnati on March 3, 2024. He is now shooting 60 percent (12-of-20) from the field, including 55.6 percent (10-of-18) from 3-point range, after 2 games.

► Hausen was joined in double figures by seniors Coleman Hawkins (12 points), David N'Guessan (12 points) and Max Jones (11 points), Hawkins tied a career-high with 4 blocked shots to go with 5 assists, 3 steals and 2 rebounds in 31 minutes. N'Guessan went 6-of-6 from the field.

▶ K-State (2-0) never trailed in the contest, as the Wildcats connected on 57.8 percent (26-of-45) from the field, including 52.6 percent (10-of-19) from 3point range, with 16 assists on 26 made field goals. Thanks to Hausen's 6 triples, the team had double-digit 3-point field goals (10) for the second game in a row.

► The Wildcats, who led by as many as 23 points in the second half, were prevented from a larger victory by 19 turnovers, which the Vikings (1-2) converted into 21 points. The team had more turnovers in the first half (10) than they had in the entire game (9) against New Orleans.

► However, K-State was able to turn Cleveland State over 20 times, including 12 steals, scoring 24 points off miscues, Junior **Dug McDaniel** was responsible for 5 of the team's 12 steals, becoming the first Wildcat since Marquis Nowell to post 5 or more steals in a game in the 2023 NCAA Tournament.

Unlike the opener against UNO, the Wildcats got off to a fast start against the Vikings thanks in part to 6 early points from Hausen in a 10-2 start. The lead grew to 16 points (36-20) in the first half after a second 3-pointer from Hausen with 1:39 left before halftime.

▶ After CSU got to within 36-26 moments into the second half, K-State blew the game open by scoring 20 of the next 29 points to take its first 20-point lead at 56-35, forcing a timeout with 11:35 remaining. Back-to-back 3-pointers by Hausen and Max Jones gave K-State a 77-57 lead with 2:11 to play before CSU closed the final score to 77-64 with the game's final 7 points.

► A 16-2 run midway the first half gave LSU all the momentum it would need, as the Tigers shot 50 percent from the field to hand K-State its first loss of the season with a 76-65 win on Nov. 14 before 9,507 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ In the return of former Wildcat **Cam Carter**, who led all scorers with 20 points, the Tigers (3-0) were stellar on both end of the court, dominating the glass 43-25 while holding the Wildcats (2-1) to just 37.7 percent (23-of-61) from the field, including 23.8 percent (5-of-21) from 3-point range.

▶ LSU entered the game allowing just 60.5 points per game, including the nation's best 3-point field goal percentage defense (11.8 percent; 4-of-24)

Senior David N'Guessan and junior Dug McDaniel led the Wildcats with 16 points each. Senior Coleman Hawkins and junior Brendan Hausen each scored 8 points, as Hawkins eclipsed the 1,000-point barrier in his career with a lavup with 8:22 to play.

► K-State got off to a fast start, jumping out to 7-2 lead behind 5 early points from N'Guessan. However, LSU quickly caught back up with 7 straight points to take its first lead at 9-7. The teams went back and forth over the next few minutes before the Tigers erupted for 23 of the next 28 points to jump ahead by 17 points (43-26) with 2 minutes left in the half.

▶ The Wildcats got to within 10 points twice in the first few minutes of the second half before closing to 49-40 on a free throw by junior C.J. Jones and a layup by N'Guessan, but a 3-pointer from senior Jordan Sears ignited a 7-0 run that put the Tigers up 56-40 with 10:31 remaining.

▶ The lead would not dip below 10 points the rest of the way.

▶ K-State, which entered the game averaging 83 points on 50.8 percent shooting from the field, was held to season-lows in points, field goal percentage (37.7) and 3-point field goal percentage (23.8). The Wildcats connected on just 5 3-pointers after averaging 11.5 triples in the first 2 games.

N'Guessan scored his 16 points on 6-of-10 field goals, including a 3-pointer, and 3-of-6 free throws to go with 5 rebounds, 2 steals and an assist, while McDaniel made 7-of-15 field goals, including 2-of-5 from beyond the arc, with a game-high 5 assists and 2 steals.

K-State shook off a disappointing first half with a 16-3 run out of halftime, as the Wildcats ended their season-opening 4-game homestand with a 74-56 win over Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 19 before 8,416 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ On night when its 3-point shooting was off, K-State (3-1) used rebounding and free throw shooting to flip a 2-point halftime lead into an 18-point victory over Mississippi Valley State (1-4). The Wildcats held a 45-28 advantage on the glass, scoring nearly half their points in the paint (36), while converting on an impressive 25 of 27 attempts from the free throw line.

► The 92.6 free throw percentage was the second highest in a game all-time on a minimum of 20 attempts and the highest since connecting on 93.9 percent (31-of-33) at Texas on Jan. 3, 2023.

▶ Junior center Ugonna Onyenso paced three Wildcats in double figures with a career-high 16 points on 6-of-7 field goals and 4-of-4 free throws, while junior C.J. Jones and senior David N'Guessan added 12 and 10 points, respectively. Senior Coleman Hawkins made up for a poor offensive night with a careertying 13 rebounds, 4 assists and 3 steals.

The Wildcats opened the game 1-of-7 from the field, including 0-of-5 from 3point range. However, they turned their attention to the size advantage in the middle with Onyenso, who scored 8 points in a 12-0 run.

▶ The lead grew to 21-7 after the first made 3-pointer from freshman David Castillo, but the Delta Devils outscored the Wildcats, 16-2, over the next few minutes to tie the game at 23 with 30.3 seconds left. Castillo converted on a baseline jumper with 1.7 seconds to give K-State a 25-23 lead at the break.

▶ MVSU would tie the game just seconds into the second half before a 3pointer from junior Brendan Hausen ignited a 10-0 run that pulled K-State ahead at 35-25 The lead grew to 13 (41-28) after consecutive baskets by C.L. Jones then reached 16 (50-34) after a rare 4-point play from Hausen. Back-toback layups by sophomore Macaleab Rich and N'Guessan extended the lead to its largest at 62-43 right before the media timeout with 6:45 to play.

► The Delta Devils scored 9 in a row to once again get within 10 points at 62-52 with 4:38 to play before Hawkins' first field goal make of the game started a 9-0 run that pushed the Wildcats back out at 71-52 with 1:56 to play. Junior Max Jones (3 points) and N'Guessan (4 points) finished off the run.

Senior David N'Guessan paced five Wildcats in double figures with a near double-double, as K-State jumped out to a big lead en route to posting an 83-71 win over George Washington on day one of the Paradise Jam on Nov. 22 before 2,125 fans at the Elridge Wilburn Blake Sports and Fitness Center.

▶ N'Guessan finished a rebound short of a double-double with a team-high 17 points on 5-of-8 field goals and 7-of-10 free throws to go with a game-high tying 9 rebounds and 3 assists in 35 minutes.

► The Wildcats, who shot better than 50 percent in each half, got contributions from across the board, as N'Guessan was joined in double figures by junior **Dug** McDaniel (13 points), senior Max Jones (12 points), junior Brendan Hausen (11 points) and senior Achor Achor (10 points)

▶ It marked the first time this season that five Wildcats scored in double figures and the first time since a win over Texas at the 2024 Big 12 Championship.

► A sixth Wildcat - senior Coleman Hawkins - narrowly missed double figures with 9 points to go with a game-tying 9 rebounds and team-highs in both steals (3) and blocks (2) in 32 minutes.

► K-State used an emphatic start to upend previously unbeaten GW (4-1), putting together its most complete first half of the season in jumping out to a 19-point halftime lead. Eight different players scored in the opening half, as the Wildcats connected on 51.7 percent (15-of-29) from the field while holding the Revolutionaries to just 25 percent (7-of-28) shooting.

► The Wildcats led by 11 points (20-9) at the second media timeout then by 18 points (34-16) after a free throw by N'Guessan with 5:36 before halftime. After the Revs closed to with 37-25 with less than 3 minutes left, they responded with 6 straight points to end the half to go ahead 46-27 at the break.

► GW scored 9 of the first 12 points out of halftime and made numerous attempts at a comeback, including a 10-0 run that closed the deficit to 59-55 with 10:20 to play. However, each time, K-State provided an answer, including a 3-pointer from Hawkins and a 4-point play from senior Max Jones, that pushed the lead back out to 66-57 less than a minute later.

Although the Revs got to within 7 points twice down the stretch, including 71-64 with 7:09 to play, the Wildcats ran off 6 straight points to push the lead back to double figures and maintained it the rest of the way.

► Junior Dug McDaniel's 3-pointer at the buzzer rimmed off, as Liberty hung on for a 67-65 win over K-State in the semifinals of the Paradise Jam on Nov. 24 before 2.225 fans at the Elridge Wilburn Blake Sports and Fitness Center.

▶ Junior Brendan Hausen led four Wildcats in double figures with 14 points, all in the second half, joining seniors Coleman Hawkins (11 points), David N'Guessan (10 points) and Achor Achor (10 points) in double digits.

K-State got exactly what it wanted in the final sequence with 3 opportunities to either win or tie it after Hawkins pulled the Wildcats to within 67-65 with 42.5 seconds. Liberty was able to run it down to 14 seconds, however, Kaden Metheny's driving layup missed and McDaniel got the rebound. McDaniel raced up the court, missing a 3-pointer with 5 seconds before it was rebounded by N'Guessan. After N'Guessan's tip-in was off, McDaniel gave the Wildcats' one last chance, rebounding the miss and hoisting up a 3-pointer that rimmed out.

▶ In a game that was back and forth in the second half with both teams making big-time shots, it was the little things that proved to be difference for Liberty in victory. Each team had 13 turnovers, but it was the Flames who were best able to take advantage of those miscues, outscoring the Wildcats, 24-11, in points off turnovers. Liberty made 10 of 14 free throw attempts, including 6 in a row to end the game, after ranking 339th in the category in the NCAA at 60.2 percent. In contrast, K-State had just 5 free throw attempts, making four.

▶ K-State led by as many as 5 points (27-22) in the first half before Liberty ended the half on an 8-0 run to take a 32-29 lead. The Flames carried that momentum into the second half, running out to a 39-31 lead before the Wildcats closed to within a possession on several occasions.

▶ Behind the 3-point shooting of Hausen, K-State was able to tie it twice, first at 50-all then again at 55-all, before grabbing its only lead at 63-62 after Achor's layup with 2:31 remaining. Junior Colin Porter's second 3-pointer with 2:15 to play proved to be the game winner, which was followed by a pair of free throws from junior Owen Aquino with 50 seconds left, for a 67-63 lead.

► K-State connected on 45 percent (27-of-60) from the field, including 29.2 percent (7-of-24) from 3-point range, with 38 points in the paint.

▶ The tandem of Porter (17 points) and Metheny (13 points) combined for 30 points for Liberty, including 5 of the Flames' 9 3-point field goals.

► Senior **Coleman Hawkins** collected his first double-double as a Wildcat with game-highs in points (19) and rebounds (10), as K-State defeated Longwood, 80-64, in the third-place game of the 25th annual Paradise Jam on Nov. 25 before 2,225 fans at the Elridge Wilburn Blake Sports and Fitness Center.

► Hawkins, who also tallied 5 assists, 2 steals and 2 blocks, propelled a K-State offense that set season highs for field goal percentage (58.9) and 3-point field goal percentage (55.0) in ending the Paradise Jam on a winning note. He knocked down 5 of the Wildcats' 11 made 3-point field goals while connecting on 7-of-10 from the field. It marked his seventh career double-double.

► Hawkins was joined in double digits by juniors **Brendan Hausen** (16 points) and **Dug McDaniel** (11 points) and senior **David N'Guessan** (10 points).

► Hawkins was named to the Paradise Jam All-Tournament Team after averaging 13.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.3 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.7 blocks in 34.3 minutes in the 3-game tournament.

► Longwood (6-2), which has been the best program in the Big South the past 3 seasons, with 67 wins and 2 NCAA Tournament appearances, gave K-State a battle for much of the first half before Hawkins' first 3-pointer helped ignite a 22-11 run that carried the Wildcats to a 44-36 halftime advantage. The senior had 3 triples in the pivotal run.

► The Lancers got to within 44-39 moments into the second half but an 8-2 run capped by a dunk from N'Guessan pushed the lead to double figures and forced a timeout with 16:19 to play. The advantage grew to 62-47 after a 3-pointer from junior **C.J. Jones** at the first media timeout.

► A 6-0 run got Longwood to within 62-53 near the midway point of the second half, but a Hausen 3-pointer keyed a 16-4 K-State run that pushed the lead to its largest at 78-57 with just over 5 minutes to play. Sophomore **Macaleab Rich** had 8 points in the stretch as the Wildcats pounded the paint.

► K-State connected on a season-best 58.9 percent (33-of-56) from the field, including 55 percent (11-of-20) from 3-point range, while scoring half of its points in the paint (40). The 11 triples were the second-most this season and the third time that the Wildcats have hit on double-digit 3-pointers.

► Defensively, K-State held Longwood to 41.4 percent (24-of-58) shooting from the field, including just 13.3 percent (2-of-15) from 3-point range.

Senior Achor Achor led six Wildcats in double figures with a season-high 21 points, as K-State set the school single-game scoring record in a 120-73 win over UAPB on Dec. 1 before 7.971 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The 120 points eclipsed the previous mark of 116 set at No. 6/6 Texas on Jan. 3, 2023, while they were the most-ever at Bramlage Coliseum, surpassing the 115 scored against Delaware State in 1991 and Fresno State in 1994.

► The Wildcats (6-2) put on a clinic from the 3-point line, totaling 21 makes on a school-record 40 attempts from beyond the arc, falling just two triples shy of the school record of 23 set against Fresno State in 1994. Eight different players registered at least one made 3-pointer, while seven had at least 2 makes.

► The Wildcats connected on 61.5 percent (40-of-65) from the field, including 52.5 percent (21-of-40) from 3-point range, while they hit on 19 of 26 (73.1 percent) from the free throw line. The team had assists on 30 of their 40 field goals, including a career-high 10 from junior **Dug McDaniel**, who finished with his first career double-double with 18 points and 5 steals.

It marked the first time K-State has totaled 40 made field goals since a win over Missouri on Jan. 3, 1998, while it topped 30 assists for the first time since 2008. The 30 assists tied for the second-most in a game and were the most since the Wildcats set the school record with 34 in 1985.

▶ K-State jumped out to an 8-0 lead less than 2 minutes into the game and led 17-3 after three straight 3-pointers before UAPB called a second timeout at the 16:03 mark. The lead topped 20 points after a 9-2 run at 39-18 then grew to 30 points at 54-24 after a 13-4 run that included two 3-pointers by Castillo.

► The lead stood at its largest in the first half at 63-31 after consecutive baskets by N'Guessan and **Max Jones** right before halftime, as the 63 points were the third-most in school history and the most since 70 vs. Fresno State in 1994.

► The Wildcats continued to its hot shooting in the second half, scoring 8 of the first 10 points to double up the Golden Lions at 71-35 at the 17:50 mark. The lead topped 40 points at 79-39 after a 3-pointer from Achor with 15:39 left.

► A 3-pointer from Hausen gave K-State its first 100-point game since 2023 with 5:23 left before a 3-pointer from sophomore **Taj Manning** set the school scoring record at 117 points with 1:57 remaining. A 21st and final 3-pointer, this time by McDaniel, provided the final points at 120 with 1:03 remaining.

► An 18-5 run to open the second half helped St. John's seize the momentum en route to an 88-71 win over K-State in the sixth and final Big 12/BIG EAST Battle on Dec. 7 before a sold-out crowd of 5,602 fans at Carnesecca Arena.

► Junior Brendan Hausen led three Wildcats in double figures with a careerhigh 27 points, while seniors David N'Guessan and Coleman Hawkins added 15 and 11 points, respectively. Hawkins narrowly missed a double-double with a team-high 9 rebounds to go with a game-best 4 steals.

► K-State led by as many as 10 points in the first half, in which, the Wildcats got 21 points from Hausen, including 6 made 3-pointers. The 21 first-half points tied for the sixth-most in a first half in school history, as the junior became the 21st player to have 20 or more points in an opening half.

► The momentum swung to the side of St. John's (7-2) after halftime. After a basket by Hawkins pushed the lead to 41-35 to open the second half, the home team scored 18 of the next 21 points to go ahead 53-44 and force a timeout by head coach **Jerome Tang** at the 15:13 mark.

► The Wildcats got to within 12 points twice down the stretch, including 76-64 after a pair of free throws by junior **Dug McDaniel** with 4:02 remaining, but that would be the closest they would get. The Red Storm answered with an old-fashioned 3-point play, as they surged ahead by as many as 19 points in the waning minutes to cap an impressive second-half performance.

► Junior **Zuby Ejiofor** scored 17 of his game-high 28 points in the second half, as St. John's tallied 53 points after halftime on 52.8 percent (19-of-36) shooting.

► For the game, the Wildcats connected on a season-low 35.2 percent (25-of-71) from the field, including 32 percent (8-of-25) from 3-point range, while making 13-of-20 attempts from the line.

▶ Hausen scored his career-high 27 points on 9-of-17 field goals, including 6of-10 from 3-point range, and 3-of-4 free throws. N'Guessan, who has now scored in double figures in 10 consecutive games, scored his 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting with 7 rebounds and 2 blocks. Hawkins had 11 points to go with teamhighs in both rebounds (9) and steals (4).

▶ In pregame, St. John's honored its legendary head coach Lou Carnesecca, who passed away at 99. Both coaches wore sweaters to commemorate the affable Carnesecca, who never had a losing season in 24 seasons.

Junior Bennett Stirtz's 3-pointer with 4 seconds remaining in overtime spoiled K-State's spirited comeback, as Drake remained unbeaten with a 73-70 overtime win in the 13th Wildcat Classic on Dec. 17 at the T-Mobile Center.

▶ Down by as many as 20 points in the first half, K-State (6-4) rallied to take the lead with 9:04 remaining on a layup by senior David N'Guessan. The Wildcats led 60-57 with 4:32 to play before the Bulldogs (10-0) tied it at 63-all with 23 seconds remaining to force overtime.

▶ In the extra session, Drake jumped out to a 70-64 lead with 2 minutes left before K-State rallied to tie it at 70-all on a 3-pointer by senior Coleman Hawkins with 13 seconds. However, on the ensuing possession. Stirtz knocked down the game-winning 3-pointer with 4 seconds to play before senior Max Jones' desperation 3-pointer was off the mark at the buzzer.

The loss was the first in overtime in Jerome Tang's coaching career (13-1), including his first at K-State (12-1). He was a perfect 13-0 in his head coaching career prior to the extra-session loss, which included one overtime win as interim coach at Baylor in 2013 to go with 12 while at K-State (2022-present).

Hawkins was one of four Wildcats to score in double figures with a team-high 16 points on 6-of-9 field goals to go with 5 rebounds and team-highs in assists (5), steals (4) and blocks (2). He has now registered at least 4 assists and 2 steals in 7 of 10 games this season, while he has grabbed 5 or more rebounds on 7 occasions and has had 4 games of at least 2 blocks.

► Hawkins was joined in double figures by senior David N'Guessan (13 points), senior Max Jones (12 points) and junior Dug McDaniel (10 points). N'Guessan has now scored in double figures in 11 consecutive games dating back to last season, including all 10 this season.

▶ For the game, the Wildcats connected on 50 percent (26-of-52) from the field, including 38 points in the paint, while hitting on 33.3 percent (7-of-21) from 3-point range and 55 percent (11-of-20) from the free throw line. The team had 21 assists on 26 made field goals.

► Stirtz finished with 22 points, while fellow transfer Mitch Mascari added a game-high 25 points, as he converted on 8-of-11 field goals, including 8-of-10 from beyond the arc. They were joined in double figures by sophomore Cam Manyawu, who added 11 points.

► A 12-3 midway through the second half provided the lift Wichita State needed in a tight game, as the Shockers ended a 5-game losing streak to Kansas State with an 84-65 win on Dec. 21 before 8,253 fans at Koch Arena

Wichita State (9-3) exploded for 55 second-half points on 63 percent (17-of-27) shooting, including 75 percent (3-of-4) from 3-point range, to blow open a game that was single digits for much of the night. The Shockers were also stellar from the free throw line, connecting on 18-of-20 attempts.

Senior Xavier Bell scored 13 of his game-high 24 points in the second half to pace four Shockers in double figures, while junior Corev Washington (18 points, 10 rebounds) and senior Quincy Ballard (10 points, 10 rebounds) each had double-doubles. Fifth-year Justin Hill also had 13 points.

K-State was led by sophomore Macaleab Rich, who posted his first career 20-point game with a career-high 20 points on 8-of-13 shooting, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range. Junior Brendan Hausen added 13 points on 4-of-8 field goals, all from 3-point range.

▶ The Wildcats trailed for much of the first half before an 18-6 run to end the half gave them a 33-29 lead heading into the halftime break. The team went back and forth in the early going before a pivotal 12-3 run by the Shockers gave them a 56-48 lead with 9.38 to play

► A free throw by Hausen cut the deficit to 60-54 just after the third media timeout with 7:33 left, however, the Shockers scored on 3 straight possessions to push the lead into double figures at 66-54 and force a timeout by head coach Jerome Tang with 5:33 remaining.

Although K-State scored on back-to-back possessions out of the timeout to get within 66-58, WSU answered back with 5 of the next 7 points to go back up by double figures at the final media timeout with 3:41 to play. The lead exploded from there, as the Shockers ended their 5-game losing streak.

▶ For the game, the Wildcats connected on 36.2 percent (25-of-69) from the field, including 28.1 percent (9-of-32) from the 3-point range, and made just 6of-15 free throws.

▶ The game was the last in a series that began in 2021. The Wildcats won the first 3, including 65-59 at INTRUST Bank Arena on Dec. 5, 2021, 55-50 at home on Dec. 3, 2022, and 69-60 in Kansas City on Dec. 21, 2023.

► Senior Coleman Hawkins and junior Dug McDaniel combined for 37 points, as K-State put together its best all-around performance of the season to earn a 70-67 win over No. 16/17 Cincinnati in the Big 12 opener for both teams on Dec. 30 before 9,970 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

Although Hawkins and McDaniel were the headliners with 20 and 17 points. respectively, several Wildcats came up clutch in the waning minutes to help snap a 3-game losing streak and earn their first victory over the Bearcats (10-2, 0-1 Big 12) since the 1958 NCAA Tournament.

► K-State led by as many as 9 points in the second half before Cincinnati used an 8-2 run to tie the game at 56-all with 5:31 to play. Senior David N'Guessan, who was the third Wildcat in double figures with 13 points, responded with an old-fashioned 3-point play to give the home team a 59-56 lead at the final media timeout with less than 4 minutes remaining.

▶ However, the Wildcats couldn't shake the Bearcats as they pulled to within one possession several times in the last few minutes.

► Leading 63-61 with just over a minute to play, senior Max Jones drove to the basket and converted on a turnaround jumper to extend the lead to 4 points. After UC answered to pull within 65-63 on the next possession with 27 seconds, Hawkins made the first free throw before missing the second. However, Jones was there to grab the offensive rebound and tip it out to junior **C.J. Jones**, who gave K-State a 68-63 lead with a pair of free throws with 20 seconds left.

► Following a basket from the Bearcats with 8 seconds, **C.J. Jones** converted on 2 more free throws for a 70-65 lead before UC's Dillon Mitchell scored the final points on a putback with 1 second left.

Hawkins led the way with game-highs in points (20), rebounds (10) and steals (4), as he recorded his eighth career double-double and his second in a Wildcat uniform. It was his eighth career 20-point game and his first at K-State.

▶ McDaniel fell one point shy of his season-high with 17 points on 7-of-13 field goals in his second start of the season, while N'Guessan recorded double figure points for the 11th time in 12 games with 13 points to go with 7 rebounds.

▶ For the game, K-State shot 43.6 percent (24-of-55) from the field, including 52 percent (13-of-25) in the second half. The defense turned the Bearcats over 15 times, resulting in a 15-8 advantage in points off turnovers.

Senior Noah Reynolds' layup with 12 seconds to play capped a 7-0 gameending run by TCU, as the Horned Frogs rallied past K-State for a 63-62 win on Jan. 4 before 6,108 fans at Schollmaier Arena.

► K-State (7-6, 1-1 Big 12) led 62-56 after a 3-pointer by senior Max Jones with 3:14 to play before TCU (8-5, 1-1 Big 12) rallied for the victory to remain unbeaten at home. The Wildcats took the 6-point lead after getting a jumper from junior Dug McDaniel and layups from sophomore Macaleab Rich and senior David N'Guessan during a 9-4 run while holding a narrow 53-52 lead

▶ Following a tip-in by sophomore Vasean Allette after an offensive rebound, senior Brendan Wenzel knocked down a 3-pointer to pull the Horned Frogs to within 62-61 with 1:17 to play.

▶ Both teams came up empty on the next two possessions before N'Guessan was fouled after grabbing his career-best 17th rebound of the game with 24 seconds left. However, the senior couldn't convert on the 1-on-1 free throw opportunity, as Wenzel secured the rebound and fed it to Reynolds, who converted on a layup with 12 seconds.

► Coach Jerome Tang called a timeout with 9.5 seconds to set up the potential game-winning play, but McDaniel's layup was off the mark at the buzzer.

▶ The Wildcats connected on 54.8 percent (17-of-31) of its field goals in the second half after hitting on a season-low 26.3 percent (10-of-38) in the first half when they trailed by as many as 8 points. They were able to close to within one possession at 27-24 at the halftime break after a jumper from senior **Coleman** Hawkins and a 3-pointer from junior Brendan Hausen.

► For the game, K-State shot 39.1 percent (27-of-69) from the field, including 21.4 percent (6-of-28) from 3-point range, while making just 2 of 5 attempts from the line. The Wildcats owned a 40-30 advantage in points in the paint.

McDaniel was one of four Wildcats to score in double figures with 12 points on 6-of-15 field goals to go with a game-high 5 assists. 5 rebounds and 2 steals in his second consecutive start. He was joined in double figures by Hawkins (11 points), N'Guessan (10 points) and Hausen (10 points).

▶ N'Guessan tallied his fifth career double-double, including his second this season, with his 10 points and career-high 17 rebounds. The 17 rebounds tie for the third-most by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and the most since 2008.

Oklahoma State blew open a tight contest with a 15-0 run to end the first. half, as the Cowboys earned their first Big 12 win of the season with a 79-66 win over K-State on Jan. 7 before 5,540 fans at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

Oklahoma State (9-5, 1-2 Big 12) held a narrow 28-24 lead at the final media timeout of the first half with 3:54 to play before a driving layup by senior guard Khalil Brantley spurred a 15-0 run that flipped a two-possession game into a 19point halftime advantage for the Cowboys.

▶ Five players scored for OSU in the decisive run, including 4 each by Brantley and graduate Abou Ousmane, 3 by senior Bryce Thompson and 2 each by graduates Marchelus Avery and Brandon Newman. Brantley capped the impressive run with a steal and pullup jumper at the buzzer.

► K-State twice cut the lead to 11 points in the second half, including 52-41 after an 11-2 run with 12:46 to play, but a 3-pointer from Thompson with the shot clock running down ignited a 9-0 run that pushed the lead back to 20 at 61-41 near the midway point of the half.

Most of the damage came off 19 Wildcat turnovers that the Cowboys turned into 31 points. The 31 points off turnovers tie for the fourth-most ever allowed and the most since Baylor scored 34 points off turnovers on Jan. 27, 2021.

► Although plagued by the 19 turnovers, the K-State offense did connect on 50 percent or better from the field for the sixth time this season, finishing at 51.1 percent (24-of-47), including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) in the second half. However, the Wildcats were dismal from 3-point range, making just 21.4 percent (3-of-14) of their shots from beyond the arc.

Senior Coleman Hawkins led three Wildcats in double figures with 18 points on 7-of-13 field goals to go with 5 rebounds, 3 steals, 2 assists and 2 blocks in 32 minutes. Fellow senior David N'Guessan posted his sixth doubledouble, including his second in a row, with 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds to go with 4 assists, 2 steals and 2 blocks to his stat line. Senior Max Jones scored in double figures for the sixth time this season with 10 points.

▶ For the game, OSU shot 47.5 percent (28-of-59) from the field, including 42.9 percent (9-of-21) from 3-point range, while making 14 of 18 attempts from the free throw line. Ousmane led all scorers with 27 points on 11-of-15 field goal attempts, while Avery and Thompson added 13 and 10 points, respectively.

A hot-shooting Houston built a near insurmountable lead in the first half, as the No. 12/11 Cougars extended their winning streak to 8 games with an 87-57 win over K-State on Jan. 11 before 8,332 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Houston (12-3, 4-0) connected on 57.6 percent (19-of-33) of its field goals in the opening half to build as much as a 24-point lead as the Cougars used a 16-2 run to flip a 4-point deficit (5-9) into a double-digit advantage (21-11) with 10:45 remaining.

► K-State was able to cut the deficit to 60-46 with a 12-4 run near the midway point but the reigning Big 12 regular-season champions responded with another 16-2 run to reestablish control of the game with 5 minutes remaining.

▶ Five Cougars scored in double figures led by 15 points from junior guard Emanuel Sharp, while sophomore forward Joseph Tugler added a doubledouble with 13 points and game-high 10 rebounds to go with 2 blocks. Graduate L.J. Crver and senior Ja'Vier Francis chipped in 11 points each, while graduate J'Wan Roberts had 10 points, 6 rebounds and 3 assists.

► The 30-point loss was the fifth-largest defeat in a home game. It was the largest setback since a 100-69 loss to Baylor on Dec. 19, 2020.

Junior Brendan Hausen was one of two Wildcats to score in double figures. scoring his game-tying 15 points on 5-of-11 field goals from 3-point range. Senior Max Jones had his season-high in a Big 12 game, scoring 12 of his 13 points in the second half.

► Houston, which ranks first in scoring defense (54 ppg.), field goal percentage defense (34.3) and scoring margin (+22.3), lived up to its billing, as the Cougars held the Wildcats to a season-low 57 points on 40.4 percent shooting. They posted a 44-20 rebounding advantage, scoring 20 second chance points off 16 offensive rebounds. They also scored 21 points off 15 Wildcat turnovers.

Offensively, the Cougars connected on 49.3 percent (34-of-69) from the field, including 42.9 percent (6-of-14) from 3-point range, as 52 of their 87 points came in the paint. They had just 5 turnovers. The 52 points in the paint are the third-most allowed in the past 25 seasons.

The series is now tied at 5-all after Houston won its second in a row since ioining the Big 12. This was just the third meeting between the schools in Manhattan and first since 1971.

Senior Elijah Hawkins' layup with 5:28 remaining proved to be the gamewinner in a defensive slugfest, as Texas Tech held on late for a 61-57 win over K-State on Jan. 14 before 8,019 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

In a game where points were at a premium it was Texas Tech which was able to grind out a Big 12 win, as the teams combined for 13 points in the final 10:07.

Following the Hawkins' layup, neither team scored for more than 5 minutes before junior Darrion Williams' second chance layup with 17 seconds gave the Red Raiders a 4-point lead. On the last possessions of the game, freshman David Castillo missed from 3-point range with 12 seconds followed by a missed layup from senior Coleman Hawkins with 6 seconds

► All told, K-State did not score in the final 5:50 of the game, making just 1 of its last 12 field goals, including 8 consecutive misses to finish the game. The 57 points matched their season-low for the second consecutive game, as the Wildcats registered season-lows for second-half points (24) and second-half field goal percentage (29.6; 8-of-27) after leading 33-31 at the half.

► The dismal offensive performance overshadowed an impressive defensive effort, as K-State held Texas Tech to a season-low 61 points, nearly 25 points under their scoring average (85.6 ppg.). The Red Raiders entered the game ranking in the top 25 of seven offensive categories nationally.

Four Wildcats scored in double figures led by junior Brendan Hausen's 13 points on 4-of-9 shooting, including 3-of-8 from 3-point range. Hawkins added 12 points to go with 5 rebounds, 3 assists and 2 steals, while senior David N'Guessan scored in double figures for the team-leading 14th time with 11 points. Senior Max Jones had a near double-double with 10 points and a season-high 9 rebounds in nearly 39 minutes of action.

▶ Williams paced all scorers with 16 points for the Red Raiders, finishing the night 7-of-15 from the field with 4 rebounds and 3 assists in 35 minutes. Hawkins had a near points/assists double-double with 14 points and a gamehigh 10 assists to go with 5 rebounds in a team-high 37 minutes.

► The loss was K-State's fourth in a row, including their second straight at home. The Wildcats have now lost 7 of their last 8 games.

► The Red Raiders have now won the last 3 in the series, including their first win in Manhattan since 2021.

K-State showed fight and resilience against a top 10 Kansas team before a sold-out crowd at Allen Fieldhouse, but the Wildcats could not quite dig itself out of a double-digit deficit to start the game in falling 84-74 on Jan. 18 in the annual Dillons Sunflower Showdown.

► The Jayhawks jumped out to a 14-0 lead despite two called timeouts by head coach Jerome Tang as the Wildcats missed their first 7 field goals before junior C.J. Jones' pull-up jumper gave them their first points at the 15:30 mark.

▶ K-State (7-10, 1-5 Big 12) scraped to within 6 points (32-26) with 2:45 before halftime on a dunk by junior Ugonna Onyenso, but Kansas was able to take a 10-point lead into the locker room.

▶ In the second half, the Wildcats trailed by as many as 15 points before closing to within 6 points on 3 occasions, including 72-66 after a jumper by junior Brendan Hausen with 4:01 to play. Despite getting two chances after a stop on defense, K-State couldn't close the gap any further as junior Dug McDaniel and senior Coleman Hawkins each had shots blocked.

► K-State had one more opportunity down 76-70 with 1:45 to play after a pair of free throws from senior Max Jones, but Hausen's 3-pointer was off the mark, as Kansas sealed the game with a free throw from senior Zeke Mavo and a jumper by senior Hunter Dickinson for a 79-70 lead with 42 seconds left. The Javhawks connected on 5 of 6 free throws to finish off the game

► Three Wildcats scored in double figures led by Hawkins' points/assists doubledouble of 15 points and a career-tying 10 assists to go with 7 rebounds while playing all 40 minutes. It was his ninth career double-double, including his third at K-State, and his second double-double of points and assists. He is first Wildcat player to post a points/assists double-double at Allen Fieldhouse

Hawkins was joined in double figures by fellow seniors David N'Guessan (13) points) and Max Jones (11 points). McDaniel and Onyenso each finished with 9 points, while freshman David Castillo added 6 points on a pair of free throws to go with 2 steals in a season-high 23 minutes.

► K-State connected on 45.8 percent (27-of-59) from the field, including 23.1 percent (6-of-26) from 3-point range, and 73.7 percent (14-of-19) from the free throw line. The Wildcats turned the ball over a season-low 5 times, which was the lowest since the 2023 NCAA Tournament.


