- BU earned three MOPs with Lauren Jorgenson in Fences, Madison Mitchell in Flat and Taylor Smith in Horsemanship.
- Heads on the road for a meet at No. 7 Fresno State on Feb. 7

#### Indoor Track & Field

- TF competed at the DeLoss Dodds Invite over the weekend in Manhattan, Kansas, recording nine personal best marks, four facility records and a program record across the six event titles.
- Alexis Brown jumped to a 22-3 mark in the women's long jump, breaking the meet, facility and Baylor program record — the record that she had already broken just three weeks ago.
- Nathaniel Ezekiel made his indoor debut for the season, winning the 400m by two seconds and breaking the meet and facility record.

#### Softball

- Softball opens its season this week at the Aggie Classic where they will face ACU, Purdue, Texas A&M, Utah State and Villanova from Thursday-Saturday.
- BU Softball was ranking in all four preseason polls to open the 2025 season, while numerous players picked up preseason accolades.
- The Bears open the year with head coach Glenn Moore beginning his 25th season at Baylor as the Bears' all-time winningest coach. Straight off the heels of a Super Regional finish to the 2024 season, the Bears are looking to build on the momentum of last season to propel BU to its first WCWS since 2017.

- The Bears had a stellar night from the arc against Cincinnati, tying the program record with 17 3-pointers in their 39-point win over the Bearcats.
- Bella Fontleroy led the squad with a career-high 29 points and seven threes.

- Fresh off its biggest win of the season against No. 11 Kansas, Baylor heads to the Hub City for a Super Tuesday Showdown in search of another ranked win against former Baylor player and Scott Drew assistant, Grant McCasland on ESPN2.
- Baylor has 70 conference wins over the last six seasons, second only to Kansas' 72, the next closest team in that span is Texas Tech with 54.
- The last time out, Baylor won its fifth-straight game against the Kansas Jayhawks in dramatic fashion, 81-70
- Down by 19 at the break, BU erased the KU lead less than seven minutes into the second half, and matched the largest halftime comeback in Big 12 history.
- In the process Baylor became the only team over the last 15 seasons to beat a ranked opponent by double-digits after trailing by 20+.

- No. 27 WGOLF is competing at the PDI Intercollegiate in Orlando Fla., through Tuesday.
- The Bears surged out to a first-round lead with an 11-under 277, BU's 11-under 277 tied for the 10th-best round in program history on a par-72 course.

- MT completed a home stretch of three matches over the weekend, falling to #10 San Diego on Friday 4-3, and winning both matches on the Sunday double-header against New Mexico and Rice 6-1.
- Out of the 12 single matches played on Sunday, the Bears won 11 of them.
- Against Rice in doubles, Baylor took the doubles point by defeating the Owls in dominant fashion on Courts One and Three 6-0, including a ranked matchup on Court One.
- Oskar Brostrom Poulsen remains undefeated in singles, opening the spring going 5-0 on Court Two.
