TEAM NOTES

- This was the second all-time matchup between Baylor and Arizona State, with the Sun Devils having the series lead over the Bears 2-0.
 - This was the first time the two faced off since the 1990 season.
- Baylor head coach **Dave Aranda** is 33-32 in his sixth year with Baylor.
- Baylor is 640-630-44 all-time.
- Baylor is 21-25 in conference games under Aranda.
- Baylor is 11-12 in conference home games under Aranda.
- Baylor is 19-14 at home under Aranda.
- BU is 11-14 during night games under Aranda.
- First time starter for Baylor: **Kobe Prentice**.
- Baylor captains: **DJ Coleman, Sawyer Robertson, Devonte Tezino and Michael Trigg**.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- The Baylor offense ended the day with 357 yards with 250 passing and 107 coming on the ground.
- Senior QB **Sawyer Robertson** went 25-39-1 for 250 passing yards and three touchdowns.
 - Robertson had his 12th 200+ passing yard game of career and fourth of the season.
 - Robertson is now the lone holder of No. 5 in program history with 43 career passing touchdowns, passing Nick Florence (2009-12).
 - Robertson is 156 passing yards away from entering the top-10 in program history of career passing yards, currently sitting at No. 11, passing Brad Goebel (1987-90).
- Sophomore RB **Bryson Washington** put up his third consecutive 100-yard game with 111 yards on 17 carries.
 - This marks Washington's ninth 100-yard game in his career, tying for 5th in program history with Abram Smith (2018-21).
 - Washington ran for a season-long rush of 41 yards, his longest rush since a 50-yard carry versus Kansas (11/30/24).
- Redshirt senior TE **Michael Trigg** had a big time game with a team-high 71 yards on five receptions and two touchdowns.
 - Marked the first multi-TD game for Trigg since against Central Arkansas (9/10/22) where he had a career-high of three.
 - Only the second multi-touchdown game of Trigg's career.
 - Trigg is now tied for fourth in program history of Baylor tight ends receiving touchdowns with six in the Green and Gold, tied with Brad Taylor (2007-10).
- Redshirt senior **Josh Cameron** brought down 65 yards on a team-leading six receptions.
- Senior WR **Kole Wilson** also had a touchdown for the Bears off two receptions and 16 total yards.
 - This marked Wilson's first touchdown in the Green and Gold.
 - Wilson extended his streak to 34 games with at least one reception, ranking No. 3 among NCAA.
- Senior WR **Louis Brown IV** hauled in a season-long reception of 23 yards, totaling 27 yards on two receptions.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Baylor's defense held Arizona State to 400 yards, 221 passing and 179 rushing.
- The Baylor defense battled to hold on against ASU, but the Sun Devils hit a game-winning field goal to seal it, the first game-winning field goal by an opponent since versus TCU (11/19/22).
- Redshirt junior LB **Keaton Thomas** led the team for the third game of the season with eight tackles, five being solo, including an assist TFL.
- Senior DL **Jackie Marshall** had a career-best game, tying his career-high with seven total tackles and three solo.
 - Marshall brought down a career-high of two TFLs for a loss of eight yards, including a sack for a loss of three yards.
 - It was Marshall's fourth career sack.
- Senior S **Devyn Bobby** brought down seven total tackles, five solo, including an assist TFL, his first of the season.
- Sophomore LB **Kyland Reed** forced his first fumble of his career.
 - Reed ended with four solo tackles.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Redshirt freshman K **Connor Hawkins** went 1-1, nailing a career-long 53-yard FG to put BU's first points on the board.
 - Hawkins' 53-yard FG ties for the longest made field goal by a Baylor player in McLane Stadium history, tying with Connor Hankins (2023).
- Junior P **Palmer Williams** put up two punts for 105 yards, both inside the 20 and for 50-plus yards, with a long of 53 yards.
 - Williams has 33 career 50+ yard punts and now sits tied for 10th with Adam Stiles (2000-01) and Drew Galitz (2015-18) in program history of career 50-plus yard punts.
 - Williams averaged 52.5 yards per punt.
