Acrobatics & Tumbling

- No. 1 Acrobatics & Tumbling opens its 2026 season with a matchup at No. 11 Saint Leo in Florida on Friday night.
- The Bears are looking to extend their national-title streak to 11 straight and have won 50 straight meets.

Equestrian

- EQ opened its 2026 spring season with a 10-7 loss to No. 3 South Carolina in Waco. The Bears will host No. 4 Oklahoma State on Friday morning.
- The Bears earned event wins in Flat and Reining in the matchup with the Gamecocks. Lauren Reid was named Most Outstanding Performer in Flat, earning her fourth MOP of the year.

Softball

- SB opens its 2026 season with the annual Getteman Classic at Getteman Stadium on Thursday-Sunday. The Bears will play five games, including a season lid-lifter vs. No. 22 Mississippi on Thursday.
- The Bears will also face New Mexico, Wichita State (x2) and Northwestern State on opening weekend.
- Outfielder Brooklyn Carter was voted preseason All-Big 12 Conference after leading the team in hits (51), stolen bases (22) and runs scored (51) as a junior in 2025.

Men's Basketball

- MBB went 1-2 over the week with a road split at Cincinnati and West Virginia and a home loss vs. TCU. A win at WVU snapped the Mountaineers 16-game home winning streak.
- A key two-game stretch looms for the Bears, including a home tilt with Colorado on Wednesday, before a test at No. 7/9 Iowa State on Saturday in Ames.
- Cameron Carr leads the Bears, averaging 19.4 points and 5.7 rebounds. Tounde Yessoufou averages 17.3 points and 5.8 rebounds. Caden Powell leads the club with 7.1 rebounds per game.

Men's Tennis

- No. 20 MT returned to the court after a weather impacted first part of the week to post an efficient 4-0 win over Tulsa at Hawkins Indoor on Friday.
- The Bears now embark on a stout stretch, traveling to face No. 4 TCU on Thursday, before hosting Texas A&M on Monday, and the ITA National Indoors on Feb. 13-15.
- Alexandru Chirita and Connor Van Schalkwyk each lead the club with four singles wins.

Track & Field

- Track & Field competed in the DeLoss Dodds Invitational in Manhattan, Kan., over the weekend.
- The Bears were highlighted by Demario Prince breaking his own meet and facility records in the 60m hurdles and Amon Malakwen winning the 600-yard run, and the men winning the 4x400 relay. Freshman Success Oyibu won the women's 200m.
- BU will hit the road this week to compete in the Carolina Classic in Columbia, S.C.

Women's Basketball

- No. 14 WBB is in the midst of a two-game road swing, which included a loss at No. 22 West Virginia on Sunday and will feature a Wednesday night test at Cincinnati.
- The Bears also posted a 82-66 win over Houston on Tuesday to improve to 12-1 at Foster Pavilion on the year. The loss to WVU featured 30 Baylor turnovers and saw BU held to 29.8 percent from the field.
- Taliah Scott continues on an all-conference streak, averaging 20.2 points and 2.7 rebounds per game. Dariana Littlepage-Buggs averages 11 points and 10.7 rebounds per game.

Women's Golf

- No. 21 WG opened its spring season with a fourth-place finish at the UCF Challenge in Orlando last week. It was BU's sixth straight top-five finish.
- The Bears were led by sophomore Malena Castro and freshman Amelia Wan each firing 66s en route to top-10 finishes. Bridget Boczar had a four-under 68 on Monday and finished tied for 14th.
- Baylor ventures to Tucson, Ariz., for the Arizona Thunderbird Intercollegiate on Feb. 9-10.

Women's Tennis

- WT returned to the court after a weather impacted week to face off with SMU, with the Mustangs posting a 4-3 win over the Bears on Sunday.
- The Bears dropped the doubles point to open the match with SMU but got gutsy singles points from Zuzanna Kubacha, Kennedy Gibbs and Mu-Jie Tzeng. The match came down to court 1, which saw three tiebreakers between Na Dong and Gina Feistel, with Feistel winning the third set 7-6 (7-4).
- The Bears will face two stiff tests this week, hosting Rice on Friday and No. 23 Washington on Sunday.
