MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

• Baylor Captains: Charlie Brewer, Jalen Pitre, Tyquan Thornton, Jay Sedwick.

• Baylor won the coin toss and elected to defer to the second half.

• 14 seniors were honored before the game: Jared Atkinson, Blake Bedier, William Bradley-King, Jake Burton, Trestan Ebner, John Lovett, Garret McGuire, Michael McNair, Blake Perdue, Thor Rodoni, Jay Sedwick, Trystan Slinker, Raleigh Texada, Skyler Wetzel.

• Two father-and-son, player-coach duos went through senior day tonight with Skylar and David Wetzel (Associate AD for Football Ops), along with Garret and Joey McGuire (Associate HC).

TEAM NOTES

• With the win, BU has now defeated K-State three-straight times, including the last two times in McLane Stadium via game-winning field goals (28-yard GW field goal with eight seconds in 2018).

- The three-game win streak is the longest over K-State since the Bears won four straight from 2012-15.
- The Bears have scored in a school record 170 straight games.

• The BU defense now has 14 turnovers in seven games (came in 11th nationally in turnover margin).

• Baylor's defense held K-State in check on third down in the second half, after allowing the Wildcats to convert on 4-of-9 attempts in the first half, K-State went 0-of-4 in the final 20 minutes of action.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

• With his two rushing touchdowns, Charlie Brewer became only the third quarterback in BU history to have 20 + rushing touchdowns and moved up to T-9th overall among all BU players in career rushing touchdowns.

• Brewer's 63rd and 64th career TD passes moves him into sole possession of second all-time at Baylor behind on Robert Griffin III (78), while he has moved into first place in Baylor history in pass attempts passing Griffin III.

• Brewer's 85 (64 pass, 21 rush) total touchdowns moves him to 2nd passing Bryce Petty.

• Brewer's 349 yards through the air on 31-of-39 passing, were the most passing yards for him since he threw for 352 against Texas Tech (Oct. 12, 2019) last season. It was his 12th 300-yard passing game of Brewer's career and his first of the season. He trails only Bryce Petty (16) and Robert Griffin III (13) in career 300-yard passing games.

- Brewer set a new career-high with 23 rushing attempts, while gaining 56 yards and two scores. His last two-rushing TD game came against Oklahoma last year on Nov. 16, 2019.
- With his game-winning drive in the fourth quarter, **Brewer** has now led the Bears on six game-winning drives and the first of 2020.
- Twelve times in his career Brewer has thrown for a touchdown and rushed for a touchdown in the same game. The Bears are now 9-3 in those contests.

• John Mayers' game-winning 30-yard field goal as time expired was the second game-winner of his career. His first came back on Sept. 28, 2019 vs. Iowa State from 38 yards out with 21 seconds remaining in regulation.

Senior Trestan Ebner tallied his ninth career receiving TD to set a new BU record for receiving touchdowns by a running back. The score was the 19th overall in Ebner's career. He finished with five catches for 66 yards, including the one touchdown. Coming into the week Ebner was No. 1 among active FBS running backs in career receiving yards, he now has 1,222.

- For the 3rd time this season, **RJ Sneed** tied his career high with six catches to go along with 86 yards and a score.
- Josh Fleeks tied his career high and had a season high with six catches that went for a season-best 68 yards.
- Jalen Pitre and Abram Smith paced the defense with a team-best eight tackles each.
- J.T. Woods picked off his team-leading third interception in the first quarter and returned it 32 yards to setup Baylor's first score.
- Chirstian Morgan had his second career intereceptions (first since 2018) in the second quarter.
