#### **TEAM NOTES**

- Baylor faced off against Utah for the first time in a Big 12 game tonight. Meetings in 2022 and 2023 came as non-conference games, both a pair of Utes wins.
- Baylor head coach Dave Aranda is 36-35 in his sixth year with Baylor.
  - Baylor is 24-28 in conference games in the Aranda era.
  - Baylor is 21-15 at home under Aranda.
- Baylor is 643-632-44 all-time.
- The Bears are 0-3 in night games in 2025 and 11-15 under Aranda.
- BU is 4-4 on artificial turf in 2025 and 32-25 under Aranda.
- Baylor is 1-1 in November and 10-10 under Aranda.
- Baylor is 1-12 (.083) against AP-ranked opponents since 2022.
- It was 79 degrees at kickoff, the warmest November kickoff in McLane Stadium history (since 2014) and only third November game in 70s.
- Baylor captains: Devyn Bobby, Josh Cameron, Sawyer Robertson, Keaton Thomas

### **OFFENSIVE NOTES**

- Baylor put up 563 offensive yards, 430 through the air and 133 on the ground.
- Third game this season that the Bears have put up over 500-yards offensively.
- Senior QB Sawyer Robertson threw 29-58-2 for 430 yards and three passing touchdowns.
  - Robertson has thrown multiple touchdown passes in 14 straight games, the longest active streak in the FBS.
    - Additionally, it is the longest streak by a Big 12 player since Baker Mayfield's 27-game run between 2016 and 2018.
  - Robertson joins Charlie Brewer (2018-19), Bryce Petty (2013-14), and Robert Griffin III (2011-12) of Baylor QBs that have put together 3,000-yard passing seasons in back-to-back years.
  - Robertson threw a career-high in attempts with 58 and was just 15 yards shy from tying his career-best in yards.
  - 58 pass attempts are the most by a Baylor QB since Charlie Brewer had 60 against OU on 9/29/18.
  - Robertson has 7,457 yards of total offense in his career, ranking fourth-best in program history.
  - Robertson has been responsible for 66 career TDs, fifth-best in career history.
  - Robertson has 38 TDs responsible for in 2025, moving him to fourth in program history behind Nick Florence (2012) at 43.
  - Robertson has thrown for 7,145 yards in his career, ranking fourth-best in BU history.
  - Robertson has thrown for 554 completions in his career, ranking fourth-best in BU history and is five shy from passing Shawn Bell (2003-06) for third.
  - Robertson has 59 career TD passes, ranking fifth-best in BU history and shy of Seth Russell (60 TDs; 2013-16) for fourth.
  - Robertson has thrown 29 TD passes in 2025, tying for fourth in program history.
- Senior WR Josh Cameron had a career-night with 165 yards and two touchdowns on 13 receptions.
  - Cameron had a career-best in yards and receptions.
  - Cameron is over 2,000 yards receiving in his career, becoming the 12th player in program history to accomplish that feat.
  - Cameron tied Lawrence Elkins, Melvin Bonner and Tyquan Thornton with his 19th career TD catch, ranking eighth place in program history.
  - His 161 career catches moves him in to sole possession of 11th in BU history.
- Senior WR Ashtyn Hawkins had a big night with seven receptions for 119 yards.
  - Hawkins' second 100-yard game of the season, last being at SMU (9/6/25).
- Hawkins brought down a Baylor-career long reception of 37 yards.
- Senior WR Kole Wilson ended with four receptions for 87 yards and one touchdown.
  - · Wilson earned his second-best receiving yards of the season.
  - Wilson hauled in a 63-yard reception, his longest reception since 2023.
- Sophomore running back Bryson Washington ended with 97 yards on 14 carries, his most yards and carries since Arizona State (9/20/25).

## **DEFENSIVE NOTES**

- BU allowed Utah to 483 offensive yards, 103 passing and 380 rushing.
- In the opening drive, Baylor defense held Utah's offense to only five plays and nine yards. It was the third time this season the Utes had not put points on the board in their game-opening drive, the last two times being against both ranked BYU and Texas Tech.
- Senior S Devyn Bobby led the team with 11 tackles, seven being solo, and one TFL.
  - Marked Bobby's first double-figure game since versus LSU (12/31/24).
  - Third time this season Bobby has led the team in tackles.
- Junior LB Keaton Thomas was second on the team in total tackles with eight, six being solo.
  - Thomas had two TFLs for a loss of four yards.
- Redshirt sophomore S Jacob Redding ended with seven total tackles, four being solo.
- Sophomore LB Kyland Reed picked up pass breakup of his career and ended with seven tackles and three solo.

## **SPECIAL TEAM NOTES**

- Freshman K Connor Hawkins went two-for-three in field goals with a long made field goal of 31 yards.
  - Hawkins has 14 FGs in 2025, ranking 11th in single-season history. He's made 82.4% of his FGs, which would rank fifth-best in single-season history.
- Sophomore P Palmer Williams punted three time for 141 yards with a long of 51 yards and one inside the 20.
- Baylor special teams blocked the first point after a touchdown since the 2022 Armed Forces Bowl (12/22/22). Blocked by Micah Gifford.
