MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

• Tonight's matchup was just the second time Baylor and UTSA met on the gridiron. The series record is now 1-1.

- Baylor holds a 372-229-31 all-time record against current Division I schools in the state of Texas. BU is 69-35-2 against current members of Conference USA.
- Baylor is in its 117th football season and second under Matt Rhule -- the Bears are 589-568-44 all-time and Rhule is 29-34 in his career (2-11 at BU).
- Baylor has scored in a school-record 139-straight games -- the previous school record was 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 Oct. 23, 1987.
- Baylor won the toss and chose to defer.
- WR Jalen Hurd, P/K Drew Galitz, OL Blake Blackmar, DE Xavier Jones served as captains for the Bears.

TEAM NOTES

• Baylor has scored in 8 straight quarters to start a season for the first time since 2014. First time scoring in 8 straight quarters at any point in a season since a 14-quarter streak from Sept. 16-Oct. 25, 2016.

• Tonight's win continues Matt Rhule's six season-streak of sealing the deal when leading or tied entering the fourth quarter.

• Rhule-coached teams have won 28 straight games when leading or tied entering the fourth, and are 29-4 overall.

• When leading entering the fourth quarter, Rhule has won 26 straight games and is 27-3 overall.

• Baylor defense with back-to-back tackles for loss to start the game, First a TFL by DE James Lynch for a loss of nine, then a shared TFL on the next play from Lynch and LB James Lockhart for a loss of a yard.

• The defense collected 4 sacks (1 Bernard, 1 J. Lynch, 1 Lewis, 1 D. Williams), the most since the Bears had 4 in the 2016 Cactus Bowl.

• Both WRs Hurd (136 yds) and Mims (133 yds) had 100-yard receiving performances, the first time the Bears have had two 100-yard receiving performances since Mims and Trestan Ebner on Oct. 21, 2017 vs. West Virginia.

- The Bears successfully executed an onside kick in the second quarter, the first time the Bears have attempted an onside kick since the fourth quarter vs. West Virginia on Oct. 21, 2017.
- Baylor has won five of its last six road openers.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- OB Charlie Brewer was 23 of 34 for 328 yards and 3 TDs. It is his fourth career 300 yard passing performance.
- QB Brewer is the 5th player in program history with 4 games of 300 + passing yards, joining Bryce Petty (16), RG3 (13), Nick Florence (9) and Seth Russell (6).
- OB Brewer's 328 passing yards are the 2nd-most of his career and 58th-most in program history (20th-most in a road game)
- RB JaMycal Hasty achieved his first-career receiving TD, a three-yard reception in the first quarter.
- CB Derrek Thomas collected his second career interception in the first quarter, the first of his Baylor career.
- LB Terrel Bernard collected his first-career sack for a loss of 12 yards.
- LB Bernard with a career high and team leading 7 tackles (4 solo).
- DE James Lynch had 2.5 tackles for loss in the game, a career-high for the sophomore.
- WR Jalen Hurd tallied his first career 100-yard receiving performance, finishing with a team and career-high 136 yards on 8 catches and 1 TD.
- WR Hurd's 7-yd TD reception in the third quarter is his eighth collegiate receiving TD, second as a Bear.

• WR Denzel Mims had his sixth-career 100-yard receiving game, which ranks 11th-best in program history. He finished with 133 yards on 8 catches and 1 TD. His 22-yard pass reception in the third quarter was his first TD of the season.

- WR Mims now sits at 1,324 yards, ranking 21st in career receiving yards. He is now averaging 17.42 yards per reception (76 career receptions).
- K/P Connor Martin was 3-for-3 (47-yarder in the 10, 32-yarder in the 20. 38-yarder in the 40), bringing his career marks to 25-for-29, .862 percent for career, now ranks 1st on Baylor's highest FG percentage list for a career more than 10% better than the previous record of .731 by Terry Syler (38-of-52).
- K/P Martin is one point shy of tying Bubba Hicks (121, 173-75) for 10th all-time in career points (120) for kickers after scoring 13 Saturday at UTSA.
- DT Ira Lewis picked up his first sack of the season for a loss of 10 yards. He now has 9.5 sacks career sacks for 69 yards.
- TE Tyler Henderson had his first-career reception in the third quarter.
- WR Mims (8 catches) has had two or more catches in 14-straight games.
- WR Chris Platt caught 4 passes on the day has at least one catch in his last 12-straight games.
- RB Hasty's three yard TD reception extends his active catch streak to eight games with at least one catch.
- RB John Lovett let the Bears with 47 yards rushing on nine carries.
- FR CB Kalon Barnes finished with a career high 2 tackles (1 solo).
- OL Patrick Lawrence and OL Blake Blackmar made their 27th and 26th consecutive starts, respectively.
- TE Christoph Henle made his first-career start at UTSA.
- QB Charlie Brewer made his sixth-career start.
- LT Eleasah Anderson made his first-career start at UTSA.
