MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Since 2010, Texas leads the series 5-4.
- The Bears are 27-77-4 all-time against Texas, including a 10-47-2 mark in games played in Austin.
- Baylor is in its 117th football season and second under Matt Rhule -- the Bears are 593-571-44 all-time and Rhule is 33-37 in his career (5-14 at BU).
- Baylor's defense pitched a shutout in the second half, the first second-half shutout in the **Rhule** era; it marked the second time this season the Bears have shut out an opponent in a half (1st half vs. Kansas, Sept. 22).
- The second-half shutout was the first by a Baylor defense since a 38-10 win at Rice, Sept. 16, 2016. First in Big 12 play since Nov. 27, 2015 at TCU.
- Baylor has scored in a school-record 144-straight games -- the previous school record was 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 Oct. 23, 1987.
- Baylor won the toss and deferred. Texas received the kickoff to start the game.
- OL Blake Blackmar DE Greg Roberts, DT Ira Lewis and OL Pat Lawrence served as captains for today's game.

TEAM NOTES

- Matt Rhule coached teams are 20-8 when posting a fourth-guarter shutout.
- The Bears now have 18 touchdowns on 26 redzone trips this season. They have scored field goals on seven more trips this season.
- Overall the Bears have scored on 25-of-26 redzone trips this season.
- For the second-straight game, the Bears held their opponent scoreless in the third quarter.
- With CB Raleigh Texada's first-career INT, the Bears have had four turnovers (3 INT, 1 forced fumble/recovery) in the past two games. Prior to that the Bears generated two turnovers in the previous five games.
- The Bears had two more scoring drives of 10 or more plays today, giving them 12 total on the year.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- S/LB Blake Lynch tallied his first-career TFL. Finished with a career-high 10 tackles, second-most on the team.
- LB Clay Johnston tied his career-high with 13 total tackles (10 solo).
- Johnston collected his first sack of the season (second sack of his career).
- WR Denzel Mims hauled in his 4th TD of the season, 12th of his career on a 19-yard reception in the first drive of the game.
- WR Mims has had two or more catches in 17-straight games.
- WR Mims hauled in 3 receptions for 80 yards, including a game-long reception of 46-yards (his second-longest this season).
- WR Mims now has 100 career receptions, becoming the 18th man in school history to haul in 100+ receptions in a career.
- WR **Denzel Mims** now has 1,640 career receiving yards, good for 15th-most in program history.
- WR Jalen Hurd had a 2-yard rushing TD in the third quarter, his 3rd rushing TD of the year (6th total). He now had 32 career TDs, 23 career rushing TDs.
- QB Charlie Brewer was 6-for-6 for 52 yards and a 19-yard TD pass on the first drive of the game.
- CB Christian Morgan collected a career-high five tackles (three solo).
- CB Derrek Thomas had a career-high 6 tackles (five solo).
- S JT Woods posted a career-high 4 tackles.
- CB Raleigh Texada hauled in his first-career interception.
- K Connor Martin is in 5th place all-time in program history with 33 career field goals after nailing a 46-yarder.
- Martin remains ranked 8th in school history in total points with 156 among kickers.
- QB Charlie Brewer's 240 passing yards was his 5th 200-yard passing game of the season, 8th of his career (in 11 starts).
- WR Pooh Stricklin brought in a season-high 2 receptions for 39 yards.
- WR Chris Platt caught 5 passes on the day, has at least one catch in his last 17-straight games.
- WR Chris Platt's 5 receptions were a season-best.
- OL Patrick Lawrence and OL Blake Blackmar made their 32nd and 31st consecutive starts, respectively. They also have both appeared in a team-best 44 career games.
- CB Raleigh Texada made his third-career start at corner.
- S Christian Morgan made his second collegiate start at safety.
- P Drew Galitz cracked Baylor's career top 10 in 50-plus yard punts by adding three vs. the Longhorns giving him 27 for his career to rank 10th.
- Galitz had three punts inside the 20-yard line giving him 12 for the season, matching his career best (12, 2016).
