October 26 and Nov. 1 the Lady Bears will play host to Langston and Texas A&M-Commerce, respectively in exhibition contests at the Ferrell Center with both matchups tipping at 7 p.m. Langston is an NAIA school out of Oklahoma, and Texas A&M-Commerce competes in the NCAA Division II's Lone Star Conference

THREE NATIONAL TOP-FIVE NODS & PROJECTED BIG 12 REPEAT PREDICTED

After a 33-2 season, a 10th consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16, a Big 12 regular season and championship title, the return of an All-American duo in Kalani Brown and Lauren Cox has the national media and Big 12 head coaches expecting another successful season for the Lady Bears.

Athlon Sports College Basketball Preview, Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook and Lindy's College Basketball have the Lady Bears selected as a preseason No. 3. No. 4 and No. 5 pick, respectively.

18-time Big 12 champion Baylor earned eight of 10 first-place votes in the 2018-19 Preseason Big 12 Women's Basketball Poll. The Lady Bears have won nine regular season and nine Big 12 Championship titles in the program's history, including eight-straight regular season titles.

TWIN TOWERS ACCOLADES POUR IN

Senior Kalani Brown and junior Lauren Cox have been tabbed by many as the best post combo in the nation, and the pair has combined for five preseason All-America honors with Brown taking home three and Cox a pair. Brown was a first-team selection by Athlon, Street & Smith's and Lindy's Sports while Cox earned second-team nods from Athlon and Street & Smith's.

Both players were selected to the Preseason All-Big 12 team and Brown was selected to repeat as Big 12 Player of the Year.

Brown has combined for eight all-America honors between her sophomore and junior seasons while Cox was honored twice after a successful sophomore season last year.

BACK FOR MORE: FOUR VETERANS BACK IN SUPPORT OF BROWN & COX

Junior Juicy Landrum, sophomores DiDi Richards, Moon Ursin and redshirt freshman Trinity Oliver all bring back experience as well for the Lady Bears in 2018-19. Landrum and Richards should see time early in the starting lineup, but other than Brown and Cox, just 16 starts are shared among the four returning players with Landrum taking 14.

Landrum could see time at the point guard position and the shooting guard spot; she shot .415 beyond the arc last season on 44 made 3-point field goals and is second among returners with 77 assists last season. Richards played in 33 of 35 games last season averaging 18 minutes per contest and 5.1 points per game; she's expected to be a go-to lockdown defender for the Lady Bears. Ursin averaged 10.5 minutes per contest last season in 28 games and will look to increase productivity her second season. Oliver missed all but seven games due to an ACL tear and was awarded a medical redshirt after a brief rookie campaign.

POINT GUARD BY COMMITTEE: COMBO GUARDS WILL HAVE TO STEP UP IN 2018-19

Head Coach Kim Mulkey said at the Big 12 Women's Basketball Tipoff Oct. 16 that she had never entered a season without knowing who her point guard would be. Well, in season No. 19, Mulkey and the Lady Bears will shuffle four players at the position after the dismissal of Alexis Morris in early September. (continued on page 2)

STORY LINES

Morris averaged just under double figures at 9.4 points per contest as Kristy Wallace's spell last season and was expected to take over the reins before a violation of team rules ended her tenure.

LSU transfer Chloe Jackson, Richards, Landrum and freshman Honesty Scott-Grayson have all worked out at the point guard position in the preseason. Jackson transferred with the intent of getting more experience at the point guard position, but hasn't played the 1 in college to this point.

Scott-Grayson is a true two but did play some point guard in high school while Richards and Landrum offer experience and leadership that has Mulkey considering the pair for playing time at the point.

NEWCOMER, JACKSON HONORED FOR POSSIBLE TRANSITION TO POINT

Chloe Jackson was a Second-Team All-SEC selection for the LSU Tigers last season after averaging 18.1 points per contest, she's just 49 points shy of 1,000 career points as a collegian, but she transferred to Baylor with the intention of learning the point guard position from Mulkey, one of the best point guards to ever play the college game.

Jackson's reputation at shooting guard, however, had the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA tab Jackson as one of 20 players to the watch list for the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award, which recognizes the top shooting guard in women's college basketball.

FIERCE FIVE: FISH EAGER TO MAKE MARK AFTER SELECTION AS NO. 1 RECRUITING CLASS

For the second time in program history, the Baylor women's basketball team signed the nation's top recruiting class and the "Fierce Five" freshmen are ready to lace them up for 2018-19. Caitlin Bickle, Aquira DeCosta, Queen Egbo, Honesty Scott-Grayson and NaLyssa Smith all signed with the Lady Bears and all were ranked in the Top 30 overall by ESPN Hoopgurlz and boasted a five-star rating.

NEW WAVE: Gietzen, Stinnett take over Baylor Lady Bears Radio Crew

After 22 years of the same play-by-play voice and 20 years of the same color analyst, the Baylor Lady Bears radio waves will bring two new voices to the air after Rick May (PBP) and Lori Fogleman (Color) retired following the 2017-18 season.

Former Houston Astros radio color analyst Bruce Gietzen and Baylor Athletics Hall of Famer Maggie Davis-Stinnett join the program as play-by-play and analyst, respectively beginning with the 2018-19 season.

Gietzen is the Director of Student Publications at Baylor while teaching in the journalism department and has more than three decades of media experience between print and broadcast. In addition to his three seasons with the Astros, Gietzen has been a contributing reporter to Fox, ESPN, CNN, ABC, MIR and the NRA.

Davis-Stinnett was a 2001 Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, a 2017 Southwest Conference (SWC) Hall of Famer and was one of the most decorated Lady Bears in program history. She amassed 2,027 points and 1,011 rebounds from 1986-1991 and was a three-time All-SWC performer in addition to the only player in league history with 2,000+ points and 1,000+ rebounds.

THE BAYLOR LADY BEARS REGIME

2005 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The squad posted a 33-3 record and claimed the Big 12 Conference title with a 14-2 mark. En route to the program's first NCAA Championship, the Lady Bears defeated three No. 1 seeds. Steffanie Blackmon and Sophia Young were both named All-Americans. In addition to earning Big 12 Coach of the Year honors, Mulkey received the New York Athletic Club's prestigious Winged Foot Award.

2012 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The 2011-12 Lady Bear season was as perfect as it could be. En route to claiming its second NCAA Championship in seven years, Baylor ran the table, posting an unprecedented 40-0 mark and claiming both Big 12 Conference crowns. Brittney Griner and Mulkey swept player of the year and coach of the year honors, earning WBCA, USBWA, Associated Press, Naismith and Big 12 Conference recognition. Baylor was ranked No. 1 wire-to-wire in both polls and raced through conference play with a Big 12-record 18-0 mark. Griner and Odyssey Sims were named consensus All-Americans, while Destiny Williams was a WBCA All-America honorable mention honoree.

NCAA TOURNAMENT STAPLE & 8-YEAR DOMINANCE

- The Lady Bears have made 16 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and 17 overall. Those appearances have resulted in two national championships (2005, 2012), three Final Fours (2005, 2010, 2012), five Elite Eights and 13 Sweet Sixteens.
- The Lady Bears are 18-time Big 12 Champions most in Big 12 history capturing nine consecutive regular season titles and nine tournament titles.
- Baylor is 275-22 (.920) over the past eight seasons while posting a154-8 (.951) mark in Big 12 play and a 23-1 (.958) in Big 12 Tournament play.
- 244 of Baylor's 275 wins since 2010-11 have been by 10 or more points, and only 14 times in that span has its winning margin been five or fewer points (most recently three, 70-67, at No. 6/8 Texas, Feb. 20, 2017).
- In Baylor's last 436 games, only three opponents (Texas, .516 and .515; Stanford, .509; West Virginia, .500) have shot 50 percent or above.
- Baylor's current streak of holding opponents to .500 or less from the floor is eight games.
- Baylor's 36-game string of holding its opponent to .500 or less from the field was broken

hy No. 6/6 Texas on Feb. 19, 2018.

BIG 12 DYNASTY

- Baylor women's basketball has won a league-leading 18 Big 12 Conference titles, nine regular season and nine tournament championships.
- Baylor has run the table in the conference three times (2012, 2013, 2018). It has only happened five times total in Big 12 history (Oklahoma: 16-0 in 2006; Nebraska: 16-0 in
- Baylor has advanced to the Big 12 Championship game eight seasons in a row and 12 times in program history.
- The Lady Bears have won seven of the last eight Big 12 Championship titles, besting No. 8/7 Texas, 77-69, in the 2018 final.

HEAD COACH KIM MULKEY • 19TH SEASON



Success = Kim Mulkey. No matter what she's attempted in basketball, whether it be on the court or along the sideline, Mulkey has found success. In 18 seasons as a head coach, she has attained 539 career victories and ranks No. 2 among the winningest active Division I head coaches in winning percentage (.846). She is No. 3 all-time by percentage between two mentors, second-ranked Leon Barmore (.869) and Pat Summitt (.841).

Barmore is the only other coach to reach the 400-win and 500-win milestones quicker than Mulkey. Barmore reached 500 wins in 576 games, while Mulkey accomplished the feat in 594 games as a head coach. It took Barmore 13 seasons and three games to accumulate 400 wins, while Mulkey achieved it in 13 years and 32 games.

When the Women's Basketball Hall of Famer accepted the position as Baylor University's head women's basketball coach on April 4, 2000, few could have predicted the dramatic and prestigious transformation the program was about to undergo. Inheriting a program that was 7-20 in the year prior to her arrival and had registered 13 losing seasons in the 17 previous years, Mulkey has transformed the Lady Bears into a national power. The former Olympic Gold medalist has twice guided the Lady Bear basketball program to the pinnacle of women's basketball, 2005 and 2012 NCAA Championships, 17 NCAA Tournament appearances, 18 20-win seasons, 16 25-win efforts, nine 30-win campaigns and an NCAA record 40 victories and a perfect season in 2011-12. In addition, Mulkey has led the Lady Bears to three Final Four appearances (2005, 2010, 2012) and a record 18 Big 12 Conference titles.

The 2005 NCAA title was Baylor's first for a women's team sport, and just the second in school history overall. In winning the 2005 championship, Mulkey became the first person, man or woman, to win a basketball national championship as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

En route to the 2005 NCAA Championship, the Lady Bears won their first Big 12 Conference championship and followed with the conference tournament championship for the first of eight title sweeps.

The Lady Bears added to the trophy case with another Big 12 Tournament crown in 2009, claimed both the regular season and tournament crowns in 2011 and captured the regular season title by a record seven games over second place Oklahoma and Texas A&M and went on to earn the tournament crown in 2012. Baylor swept the Big 12 title race, winning both crowns in 2013 to become the first team to win three consecutive conference tournament titles. The Lady Bears continued to be dominant in the league, claiming both regular season and tournament titles in 2014, 2015 and 2016 to total an unprecedented six-straight regular season and six-straight tournament titles. In 2017, Baylor claimed its seventh regular season Big 12 championship in a row and advanced to the tournament title game for the seventh consecutive season before falling in the final. The Lady Bears returned to their seeing ways in 2018, claiming the program's eighth regular season title in a row with a perfect 18-0 mark and the Big 12 Championship title.

Mulkey, a 2000 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, came to Baylor from Louisiana Tech where she spent 19 years as either a student-athlete or coach in the legendary Lady Techster program. During her tenure in Ruston, Mulkey was associated with 11 Final Four squads and three national championship teams. She has either played or coached in the national championship game on eight occasions.

Over her 15-year stint as an assistant and associate head coach at her alma mater, Louisiana Tech posted a 430-68 (.864) record and advanced to seven Final Fours. Mulkey held the title of associate head coach for her final four seasons. Her responsibilities at Tech included coordinating recruiting, tutoring Lady Techster guards, overseeing the players' academic progress and running the summer camps. Because of her diligence, no Lady Techster was ever declared academically ineligible.

As a player, Mulkey led the Lady Techsters to a 130-6 (.956) record, two national titles and four Final Fours from 1980-84. During that time the 5-foot-4 playmaker, known for her spectacular passes and French braids, also led Louisiana Tech to its first two national

championships (1981 and 1982) and was a part of the USA's Gold medal-winning team at both the 1984 Olympics and the 1983 Pan American Games.

Mulkey averaged 6.38 assists and 1.56 steals per game and currently ranks second on Tech's all-time list in assists and 12th in steals.

In addition, the summa cum laude scholar was a two-time Academic All-American as a business major. In recognition of her success in the classroom and on the basketball court, Mulkey was inducted into the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America Hall of Fame in June 2003.

Her athletic career began at an early age. Mulkey, a native of Hammond, La., played Dixie Youth baseball as a 12 year old as well as two years of Pony League baseball and made the all-star team two of the three years. At Hammond High School, she led the basketball team to four-straight state championships, posted a 136-5 record and finished her career with a then-national record 4,075 points. She earned all-district, all-state and All-America honors each of her four years at Hammond High. She also graduated as her class' valedictorian with a perfect 4.0 grade point average. Mulkey has a street named after her in her hometown of Tickfaw, La.

Mulkey is a member of the National High School Hall of Fame, the Louisiana High School Hall of Fame, Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame and Louisiana Tech Athletics Hall of Fame. In 1999, she was the lone female named among the Louisiana Sports Writers top 25 athletes of the 20th century and was listed by Sports Illustrated as one of the top 50 sports figures of Louisiana for the 20th century. In June of 2000, she was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame located in Knoxville, Tenn. Additionally, Mulkey was inducted into the Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007 and entered the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in 2010. Born May 17, 1962, in Santa Ana, Calif., Mulkey has two children, daughter Makenzie (27) and son Kramer (24).

Makenzie (Robertson) Fuller serves as associate director of basketball operations for the Lady Bears. She was a four-year letterwinner on Baylor's basketball team, and during her career the Lady Bears posted an impressive 140-10 record, which included eight Big 12 crowns and an NCAA national championship (2012).

Fuller, a three-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree, was named to both Baylor's Dean's List and the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll numerous times. She earned both a bachelor and master's degree from Baylor and married former Baylor football and professional baseball player Clay Fuller in 2015.

Kramer attended LSU, where he played for the highly touted Tiger baseball team. He was a first team All-SEC shortstop and second team Louisville Slugger All-American in 2016, and garnered third team Collegiate Baseball All-American, honorable mention Perfect Game All-American and second team All-SEC accolades in 2017. After leading LSU back to the College World Series in 2017, which resulted in a runner-up finish, Kramer was selected in the fourth round of the MLB Draft by the St. Louis Cardinals. He plays shortstop for the Palm Beach Cardinals. the club's High-A affiliate.

Mulkey's autobiography, "Won't Back Down" with Peter May, a retired Boston Globe senior sportswriter, appeared in bookstores Nov. 5, 2007, and the paperback edition became available Sept. 8, 2008.

A LOOK BACK TO 2017-2018

NATIONAL AWARDS

- Kalani Brown was named to the 2018 National Ballot for the John R. Wooden award Presented by Wendy's.
- Brown was one of five finalists for the 2018 Lisa Leslie Award, announced March 2 by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA.
- On Feb. 11, Brown was selected as one of 30 players on the 2018 Women's Citizen Naismith Trophy Women's College Player of the Year late season team.
- Lauren Cox was one of five finalists for the 2018 Katrina McClain Award, which honors the nation's top power forward. The list of finalists was released by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA on March 1.
- Baylor head coach Kim Mulkey was named one of 10 finalists for 2018 Werner Ladder Naismith Women's College Coach of the Year, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Feb. 21.
- Mulkey, who was recently named a finalist for the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame 2018 Class, won the Naismith National Coach of the Year award in 2012 after leading Baylor to a 40-0 season and its second NCAA championship.

BIG 12 AWARDS

- Kim Mulkey was a unanimous selection for Big 12 Coach of the Year, her sixth career selection (2005, 2011-13, 2015, 2018).
- Kalani Brown was named Big 12 Player of the Year, the seventh BU player to earn the honor, and it was accompanied by her second-consecutive unanimous selection to the All-Big 12 First Team.
- Lauren Cox earned Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year after averaging 2.7 blocks per contest; she was the fourth Baylor player to earn the award, and it marked the seventh time a Baylor player had won the honor (Brittney Griner X4, Abiola Wabara, Odyssey Sims). Cox was also an All-Big 12 First-Team selection.
- Kristy Wallace closed her career with a first-team All-Big 12 selection and a Big 12 All-Defensive Team nod.
- Dekeiya Cohen was an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selection in her final season with the Lady Bears.
- Alexis Morris earned a spot on the Big 12 All-Freshman team.

BIG 12 DOMINANCE

- Baylor compiled a dominant +27.6 scoring margin and an +18.7 rebounding margin against Big 12 opponents on the way to a flawless 18-0 mark in league play. The Lady Bears have won each of the last eight Big 12 regular season titles and nine overall.
- The Lady Bears defeated each conference opponent by double digits in the regular season, with the exception of No. 6/6 Texas (6-point win on Feb. 19), and 13 of 18 league teams by at least 20 points.
- Baylor compiled a 50.2 field goal percentage, 34.8 three-point field goal percentage and 75.4 free throw percentage in conference play, while holding opponents to 32.9 percent from the floor, 28.3 from long range and 64.5 from the foul line in the regular season.
- Baylor women's basketball has won a league-leading 18 Big 12 Conference titles, nine regular season and nine tournament championships.
- The Lady Bears claimed their eighth consecutive regular season conference championship
 by winning their first 16 league matchups with two games to spare with the Feb. 19 win
 over Texas in Austin being the clincher. Baylor added its 17th victory at TCU on Feb. 24 and
 capped off its perfect conference regular season with a win over West Virginia on Feb. 26.
- Baylor has run the table in the conference three times (2012, 2013, 2018). It has only happened five times total in Big 12 history (Oklahoma: 16-0 in 2006; Nebraska: 16-0 in 2010).
- Baylor has advanced to the Big 12 Championship game eight seasons in a row and 12 times in program history.
- The Lady Bears have won seven of the last eight Big 12 Championship titles, besting No. 8/7 Texas. 77-69. in the 2018 final March 5.

SUFFOCATING DEFENSE

- Baylor led the nation in field goal percentage defense at a .325 clip, total rebounds with 1,706 and defensive rebounds per game at 33.0.
- Last season the Lady Bears limited 23 opponents to 10 points or less in a quarter 36 times.
- The Lady Bears ranked second in the nation in blocked shots with 237 and were fourth in blocks per game at 6.8.
- Lauren Cox ranked 15th in the nation in blocks per game at 2.71 and ranked 14th overall with 92 on the season.

OWNING THE GLASS

- Baylor's 46-game streak of out-rebounding its opponent ended in the NCAA Regional Semifinals loss to Oregon State as the Beavers grabbed one more rebound (39) than the Lady Bears. Still, the Lady Bears out-rebounded their opponents in 34 of 35 contests last season.
- In the last two seasons Baylor has out-rebounded its opponent in 69 of 72 contests.
- Kalani Brown ranked No. 17 in the nation in total rebounds with 357.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2018-2019

SENIOR NOTES

- Kalani Brown will wrap up a highly successful four year career for the Lady Bears in 2018-19. Thus far, the Slidell, La. native is 102-8 (.927) with a Baylor uniform on, she's led the Lady Bears to three regular season and two Big 12 Championship titles, made three straight appearances in the NCAA Sweet 16 and two trips to the NCAA Elite Eight her first two years.
- Brown is climbing Baylor's top-10 career list for field goals made, free throws made, blocks and double-doubles.
- Brown already has the top two season marks for a field goal percentage in Baylor history (.679 as a sophomore, .650 as a junior) and is on pace to crack the top 10 in games played, points and rebounds.
- The reigning Big 12 Player of the Year is an 8-time all-American, and she earned Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year for the second-straight season along with three First-Team Preseason All-America accolades (Lindy's Sports, Street & Smith, Athlon Snorts).
- Senior graduate transfer Chloe Jackson will provide much needed floor experience to the Lady Bears in 2018-19. After Kalani Brown (62) and Lauren Cox's (35) combined 97 collegiate starts, the other Baylor returners have combined for just 16 starts (Landrum 14, Richards 1, Ursin 1). Jackson combined to start 61 contests in two seasons at LSU from 2016-18.
- . Baylor is Jackson's third school as she started her career at NC State. She played just four games as a freshman in 2014-15 before an injury cut her rookie campaign short, and then she transferred to LSU, sat out a season in 2015-16, and then played two seasons where she was a second-team All-SEC honoree last year.
- . Jackson has 949 career points (5 at NC State, 944 at LSU) and shoots .422 from the field for her career and .728 from the free-throw line.
- Her junior season, which garnered her second-team All-SEC honors came after averaging a team-leading 18.1 points per contest, and she shot a career-best .422 from the field.
- At the guard position, she's averaged 4.8 rebounds per contests including a career-best 5.1 rebounds per contest as a sonhomore in 2017-18.
- Jackson is expected to see time at both the point and shooting guard position for the Lady Bears.

DOUBLE TROUBLE BACK FOR MORE

- Two all-America posts are a luxury, and Kalani Brown & Lauren Cox are back on the same floor once again in 2018-19. Brown took home Big 12 Player of the Year honors while Cox was the Big 12 Defensive Player of the year and Brown earned six all-America selections while Cox garnered two.
- Brown (702) and Cox (519) combined for 40.5 percent of the Lady Bears' offensive output last season and 69.7 percent of Baylor's offensive output among returnees for this season.
- The pair also accounted for 40.3 percent of Baylor's total rebounds total with Brown grabbing 357 and Cox colleting 331. The combined 688 boards are also 59.6 percent of the rebound production among returnees.
- The duo sent back a combined 142 shots with Cox blocking 92 shots and Brown adding 50; that's 59.9 percent of the team's total blocks last season.

- The Lady Bears' 2018 class, comprised of forward Caitlin Bickle (Cave Creek, Ariz.), forward Aquira DeCosta (Sacramento, Calif.), forward Queen Egbo (Houston, Texas), guard Honesty Scott-Grayson (Brick, N.J.) and forward NaLyssa Smith (Converse, Texas), is ranked No. 1 by both ESPN
- Each player owned a five-star rating and ranked in the Top 30 overall by ESPN Hoopgurlz, solidifying Baylor's most talented class to date. The only other consensus top-ranked class in program history came in 2008-09, when Brittney Griner (No. 1 by ESPN Hoopgurlz), Mariah Chandler (No. 16), Jordan Madden (No. 58), Shanay Washington (No. 64) and Kimetria Hayden (unranked) signed NLIs.
- Four players, DeCosta, Egbo, Scott-Grayson and Smith, were included on the 2018 Naismith Trophy Midseason Girls Basketball Watch List, honored as 2018 McDonald's All-Americans and recognized as 2018 Jordan Brand All-Americans.
- DeCosta and Smith were both included on the list of 10 semifinalists for the 2018 Naismith National Girls' High School Player of the Year award. DeCosta advanced as one of five finalists.
- Smith won an 18U USA Basketball gold medal at the 2018 FIBA World Championships in Mexico City and was named Preseason Co-Freshman of the Year by the Big 12 Coaches in the 2018-19 Preseason Big 12 awards.
