## **MISCELLANEOUS NOTES**

- The series between Baylor and Texas Tech now sits at 38-38-1 all-time. The Bears broke a two-game Tech winning streak with today's victory.
- When playing in a neutral location, Baylor holds a 6-4 advantage.
- With the victory, the Bears are now bowl eligible for the eighth time in nine seasons.
- The Bears will head to the 24th bowl game in school history and are 12-11 all-time in bowl games, seeking a third-consecutive victory.
- Head coach Matt Rhule has secured his third bowl berth as a head coach (2015 Boca Raton Bowl, 2016 Military Bowl). Rhule is 0-1 in bowl games (did not coach the Military Bowl game, had already taken the Baylor job).
- Baylor is in its 117th football season and second under Matt Rhule -- the Bears are 595-574-44 all-time and Rhule is 35-40 in his career (7-17 at BU).
- Baylor has scored in a school-record 149-straight games -- the previous school record was 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 Oct. 23, 1987.
- Texas Tech won the toss and elected to receive.
- OL Blake Blackmar, DT Ira Lewis, S Verkedric Vaughns and WR Chris Platt served as captains for today's game.

## **TEAM NOTES**

- With Platt's 100-yard receiving performance and Lovett's 100-yard rushing performance, the Bears have had 13 100-yard performances on the season.
- It is the 6th time this season that the Bears have had two 100-yard performers in a game and the third time with the combination of a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver.
- The Bears are 5-1 this season in games with with two 100-yard performers.
- The Bears boast fourth-quarter shutouts in the last three games of the season (at lowa State, vs. TCU, vs. Tech).
- Baylor's first TD drive went19 plays, Baylor's longest TD drive in plays since a 19-play TD drive vs Oklahoma State on Nov. 22, 2014.
- The last time Baylor had a longer scoring drive in plays was a 21-play TD drive at Oklahoma State on Oct. 29, 2011.
- Baylor's scoring drive went for 9:10, the longest scoring drive in TOP since at least 2005.
- Rhule-coached teams have won 31-straight games when leading or tied entering the fourth quarter. They are now 32-4 all-time when leading or tied entering the fourth quarter.
- In Rhule's five-year career as a head coach, his teams are 21-10 when posting a fourth quarter shutout.

## **INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- WR Denzel Mims now in sole posession of 10th in BU history with 16 receiving touchdowns in his career.
- WR Denzel Mims with two TD receptions on the day, becomes the first BU player to collect 2 TD passes in a game since he had 3 vs. Oklahoma last season.
- WR **Denzel Mims** now has 1,810 career receiving yards, remains 14th all-time.
- QB Charlie Brewer was 22-of-30 for 308 yards, 3 TD passes, 1 TD rushing and 1 INT.
- At AT&T Stadium (2017 and 2018 vs. Texas Tech), QB Charlie Brewer has a 69.9 percent completion percentage (65-of-93) with 6 passing TDs, 1 rushing TD, 725 passing vards and 2 INTs.
- Both of QB Charlie Brewer's performances vs. Texas Tech at AT&T Stadium were 300 + passing performances, 3 passing TD games.
- QB Charlie Brewer's 6th-career 300-yard passing game, tied for 4th-most in program history.
- QB Charlie Brewer's 10th career 200-yard passing game, tied for 8th-most in program history.
- QB Charlie Brewer with a season-long 41-yd TD pass.
- QB Charlie Brewer's 41-yd TD pass was his 3rd career TD pass of 40+ yards (first to a receiver) had a 52-yarder to Ebner vs WVU last year and a 58-yarder to Ebner at TCU last year.
- QB Charlie Brewer ties his career high with 3 TD receptions on the day, fifth-time in his career he has done so.
- QB Charlie Brewer now has 4,197 yards passing in his career, good for 10th-most in program history.
- QB Charlie Brewer has 358 career completions, good for 8th-most in program history.
- QB Charlie Brewer with his 6th rushing TD of the season, tying him for eighth on the program's single-season quarterback rushing TD list.
- WR Chris Platt moves into the top 20 in career receptions as he now as 97.
- . WR Chris Platt had 114 receiving yards today, his first 100-yard receiving day of the season, fourth of his career.
- WR Chris Platt now has 1,627 career receiving yards, good for 15th-best in program history.
- WR Tyquan Thornton with his third TD reception of the season, this one, a 41-yard TD reception is a career-long.
- FB **Koby Bullard** had the first offensive touch of his career, a carry for no gain in the second quarter.
- DT Ira Lewis collected his second sack of the season. Now has 2.5 sacks on the season, now has 11 for his career.
- CB Raleigh Texada with his second-career interception, also second of the season.
- LB Clay Johnston led the Baylor defense for the sixth time this season, finishing with 12 tackles (6 solo).
- LB Clay Johnston has had 72 total tackles over the last 6 games, average of 12 tackles per game.
- LB Clay Johnston finished with double-digit tackles for the fifth time this season.
- DE **BJ Thompson** with his fourth sack of the season.
- LB Blake Lynch collected his first-career interception.

- QB Charlie Brewer is responsible for 34 TDs in his career, one away from cracking the Baylor top 10.
- TE Tyler Henderson made his first collegiate start.
- RB John Lovett made his third start of the season (second straight), also third of his career.
- OL Patrick Lawrence and OL Blake Blackmar made their 37th and 36th consecutive starts, respectively. They also have both appeared in a team-best 50 career games.
