TEAM NOTES

- Baylor moved to 555-99 under 19th-year head coach Kim Mulkey, improving to 27-7 all-time vs. ISU and 291-172 (.629) vs. Big 12 teams.
- Mulkey is 253-55 all-time vs. Big 12 opponents in the regular season (.821).
- Baylor has eight-straight wins over ISU.
- Baylor extended its winning streak at the Ferrell Center to 31 games.
- Baylor extended its win streak over Big 12 opponents at home in the regular season to 14, and improved its overall winning streak in the Big 12 to 28.
- Baylor is 37-3 vs. Top 25 teams at the Ferrell Center since the 2010-11 season, and 68-17 all-time under Mulkey.
- Starting lineup for the Lady Bears was Chloe Jackson, Juicy Landrum, DiDi Richards, Lauren Cox, and Kalani Brown, moving to 15-1 as a starting unit.
- Baylor out-rebounded ISU 36-27, making it 87 of the last 90 games in which the Lady Bears have out-rebounded their opponents.
- Baylor has out-rebounded all 17 opponents this season.

• The Lady Bears held ISU to 40.0% shooting from the field (22-55). In 639 of 654 games under Mulkey, the Lady Bears have held their opponent at or below 50 percent field goal shooting, with only seven of those efforts coming in the last 14 years.

- Baylor has assisted on 400 of 567 field goals this season marking 70.5 percent of field goals with an assist; Baylor had 29 on 34 field goals this evening vs. ISU.
- Baylor outscored ISU 8-0 on the fastbreak and has outscored its opponents this season 196-54.
- Baylor shot .531 from thje field, making the Lady Bears 210-1 under Mulkey when shooting 50 percent or better
- It was the second-straight game for Baylor to have five players in double figures scoring.

- Lauren Cox scored 22 points, her second-highest output of the season.
- Cox eclipsed the 1,000 career points mark, ending the game with 1,009 overall.
- It was the fifth-straight game in double figures for Cox, 12th this season, and 51st of her career
- Cox filled the stat sheet, pulling down 9 rebounds, dishing out a career-high 7 assists, and blocking 2 shots
- Cox has blocked at least two shots in 14 of 17 games this season
- Cox ranks 12th in the nation in Assist to Turnover ratio; 7:2 tonight
- Kalani Brown (18 points) scored in double figures for the 33rd time in the last 35 games (8th-straight), the 96th time of her career, and the 14th time this season.
- Brown pulled down 8 rebounds, giving her 939 for her career and moving her past Steffanie Blackmon for eighth all-time (Blackmon, 936, 2001-05)
- Brown's three blocks (all in the first half) gave her 200 for her career.
- Chloe Jackson scored 11 points, her 11th time in doiuble figures this season and 58th of her career.
- Jackson connected on five field goals, moving her past the 450 mark for her career.
- Jackson dished out 11 assists, giving her back-to-back 10 assist games.
- The last Lady Bear to have back-to-back double-digit assists was Niya Johnson (vs. Idaho, 16, 3/8/16; vs. Auburn, 10, 3/20/16 NCAA Tournament)
- Jackson's third career double-double was the first double-double by a Baylor player of the points/assists variety since Alexis Jones (24p, 10a, vs. #20 OU 1/29/2017)
- Juicy Landrum (16 points) scored in double figures for the 9th time in the last 13 games and 21st time of career.
- Landrum finished with six assists, moving her past the 200 mark for her career (204). It was her third time with 6+ assists this season.
- Landrum had 8 rebounds, her sixth time this season with eight or more.
- Landrum tied a career high with five steals, her most in a game this season.
- DiDi Richards scored a career-high 15 points, grabbed 6 rebounds and had 3 assists.
- It was Richards' second time in three games to score in double figures, the fifth time of her career and third time this season.
