TEAM NOTES

• The 2019 regular season title is the program's 10th overall and ninth-straight (outright title clinched Feb. 23 in Ames). It is the 19th title in **Kim Mulkey's** tenure between regular season and tournament championships.

• The streak of nine-straight Big 12 regular season championships ties Baylor for the 10th longest streak of regular season titles in Division I women's basketball history.

- The 10 regular season Big 12 titles ties Baylor for ninth most all-time among Division I women's basketball schools since the 1999-00 season.
- Baylor moved to 566-99 under 19th-year head coach Kim Mulkey, improving to 42-11 all-time vs. Oklahoma State and 302-172 (.637) vs. Big 12 teams.
- Baylor is 36-8 vs. Oklahoma State under Mulkey and winners in 21 of the last 22 games.
- Mulkey is 264-55 all-time vs. Big 12 opponents in the regular season (.828).
- Baylor extended its overall win streak vs. Big 12 opponents in the regular season to 40.
- Baylor extended its win streak at the Ferrell Center to 37 games.
- Baylor has the nation's longest active winning streak at 19 games.
- Starting lineup for the Lady Bears was Chloe Jackson, Juicy Landrum, DiDi Richards, Lauren Cox, and Kalani Brown, they improved to 25-1 as a unit.
- Baylor out-rebounded OSU 60-32, marking the 27th time this season out of 28 games that the Lady Bears have out-rebounded their opponents.

• The Lady Bears held Oklahoma State to 26.9% shooting from the field (14-52). In 650 of 665 games under Mulkey, the Lady Bears have held their opponent at or below 50 percent field goal shooting, with only seven of those efforts coming in the last 14 years.

• Baylor has assisted on 644 of 899 field goals this season marking 71.6 percent of field goals with an assist; Baylor had 19 on 29 field goals this afternoon vs. Oklahoma State.

- Baylor outscored Oklahoma State 9-2 on the fastbreak and has outscored its opponents this season 307-73.
- The Lady Bears had three double-figure rebounders (Kalani Brown- 13, NaLyssa Smith- 11, Queen Egbo- 10) for the first time since Dec. 13, 2017 vs. McNeese St.
- Baylor registered its second-straight game with double-digit blocks as a team (10 today, 10 vs. Texas).
- The Lady Bears recorded their 27th and 28th runs this season of 10+ or more.
- In 12 of 17 Big 12 games this season, Baylor has at least one 10+-Zero Run, and in 19 of 28 games overall.
- Baylor outscored Oklahoma State 54-24 to end the game after the Lady Bears led by two at the 1:06 mark of the second quarter.

- Kalani Brown (14 points, 13 rebounds) recorded her 37th career double-double, one shy of fifth place in Baylor history (38, Jackie Reiter, 1980-84)
- It was Brown's 38th time with double figures in rebounds in her career and 7th time this season.
- Brown added three blocks, her sixth time this season with three or more.
- Juicy Landrum scored 14 points, her fourth-straight game in double figures, 30th of her career and 17th this season.
- Landrum connected on three 3-pointers, eclipsing the100 career 3-pointers mark with her first.
- Queen Egbo (11 points, 10 rebounds) registered the third double-double of her career.
- NaLyssa Smith pulled down 11 rebounds, her third game this season with double-digits and first since Arizona State (Nov. 11).
- Lauren Cox's five rebounds moved her past the 700 career rebound mark (704).
- DiDi Richards filled the stat sheet with six rebounds, six assists, two blocks (tied for season-high) and just one turnover.
