STORY LINES

LADY BEARS SET THREE BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP RECORDS IN QUARTERFINALS WIN OVER TEXAS TECH

Baylor dishd out 32 assists, made 44 field goals and had seven players in double figure Saturday in a 100-61 defeat of Texas Tech in which all three of those achievements resulted in Big 12 Championship records. Kalani Brown (14), NaLyssa Smith (14), Moon Ursin (12), Chloe Jackson (12), Lauren Cox (10), DiDi Richards (10) and Aqaira DeCosta (10) all reached double digits, setting a new record, and it was the first time since 2002 that a team had six with Oklahoma State holding the previous record. The 32 assists and 44 made field goals each broke records also previously set by Baylor. The 39-point margin of victory was the second-largest in Big 12 Championship history, and the 100 points was the most by a Baylor team in the Big 12 Championship.

BAYLOR LADY BEARS RUN TABLE FOR FOURTH TIME IN HISTORY WITH WIN AT WEST VIRGINIA

Baylor had to earn it, but the Lady Bears beat West Virginia on the road Monday to finish undefeated in conference play for the second-straight year and for the fourth time in school history. The Big 12 has seen an undefeated regular season six times with Oklahoma going 16-0 in 2006 and Nebraska 16-0 in 2010. Baylor has accomplished the other four feats with 18-0 marks in 2012, 2013, 2018 and 2019.

BAYLOR HISTORY IN THE CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

Baylor has nine Big 12 Conference Tournament championships, including eight of the last 10. If the Lady Bears add another, that will mark 20 Big 12 championships combined between regular season and tournament titles. The Lady bears are 40-13 all-time in the tournament and 39-9 under head coach Kim Mulkey. All-time vs. K-State in the tournament, Baylor is undefeated at 9-2 with the last matchup vs. the Wildcats coming last season in the quarterfinals where Baylor won 83-54.

LADY BEARS RACK UP BIG 12 POSTSEASON HONORS

Baylor head coach Kim Mulkey was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for the seventh time, Lauren Cox earned Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year honors for the second-straight season and Kalani Brown along with Cox were named All-Big 12 First Team members, the league announced Wednesday. In addition, Baylor landed guards Chloe Jackson and Juicy Landrum on the All-Big 12 Second Team while setting a record by landing three players from the same school on the Big 12 All-Defensive Team with DiDi Richards joining Cox and Brown. Brown's nod to the first team was her third, while Cox earned first-team honors for the second time.

STORY LINES

BROWN ACHIEVES 2,000 CAREER POINTS & 1,000 CAREER REBOUNDS MILESTONES IN SAME GAME

Senior Kalani Brown entered Feb. 20's game with Kansas at 11 points shy of 2,000 career points and two rebounds short of 1,000. Brown became the seventh player to reach 2,000 points, and the seventh player to reach 1,000 rebounds in BU history, but is just the sixth to reach both milestones joining a distinguished class that includes Suzie Snider-Eppers, Brittney Griner, Sophia Young, Nina Davis and Maggie Davis-Stinnett. Against Texas Brown moved to sixth all-time on the career points list (2,047) and fifth all-time on the rebounds list (1,044).

LADY BEARS ARE NO. 1 FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE 2013, BUT BAYLOR HASN'T GONE ANYWHERE

Much was made when Baylor returned as No. 1 in the Associated Press Top 25 Jan. 28. However, Baylor has ranked in the top 10 in the AP poll for 90 consecutive weeks with high-rankings of two with the lowest being 13 since the 2013-14 season prior to regaining the top spot. Those 90-straight weeks mark the third-longest active streak in the nation next to UConn and Notre Dame. In fact, Baylor holds the second-longest active streak of ranking in the AP Top 25 at 297 weeks.

COX & BROWN EACH NAMED FINALISTS FOR NATIONAL POSITION AWARDS; SEMIFINALIST FOR NATIONAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR; BROWN A NAISMITH PLAYER OF THE YEAR SEMIFINALIST

Feb. 14 Lauren Cox was named a finalist for the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame's Katrina McClain Award, honoring the nation's top power forward for the second-straight year, while Brown was named a finalist for the Lisa Leslie Award, honoring the nation's top center for the second-consecutive season Feb. 15.

In addition, both players were named semifinalist for the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year award, and the post duo is still up for consideration for the Wade Trophy and the John Wooden Award.

March 4, Brown was among 10 semifinalists to be considered for the Citizen Naismith Trophy honoring women's basketball's top college player. Brown was the only Big 12 representative on the list, despite not being voted by Big 12 coaches as the Big 12 Player of the Year.

MULKEY NAMED TO NAISMITH WOMEN'S COACH OF THE YEAR LATE-SEASON WATCH LIST

Feb. 27 the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced the late-season candidates for the 2019 Werner Ladder Naismith Women's Coach of the Year Award, and Baylor's Kim Mulkey was named as one of the 15 coaches for consideration.

Entering into Saturday's Big 12 Championship semifinals, Mulkey has a career record of 568-99, good for an .852 winning percentage.

This season, the Lady Bears are 7-1 vs. the AP Top 25, including a win over No. 1 UConn Jan. 3 in Waco. Baylor's win at Iowa State Feb. 23 clinched the Lady Bears' 10th overall regular-season Big 12 title and ninth straight.

INTERIOR DEFENSE DOMINANT

While some may look at the fact that Baylor has surrendered 228 3-point field goals this season (most by a Big 12 school) as a negative, take into account that only 646 of 1,636 points given up by Baylor this season have come on two-point field goals. That's just 323 two-pointers in 30 games, which averages 10.8 2-point field goals per game or 21.6 points per game given up inside the 3-point arc this season.

THE BAYLOR LADY BEARS REGIME

2005 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The squad posted a 33-3 record and claimed the Big 12 Conference title with a 14-2 mark. En route to the program's first NCAA Championship, the Lady Bears defeated three No. 1 seeds. **Steffanie Blackmon** and **Sophia Young** were both named All-Americans. In addition to earning Big 12 Coach of the Year honors, **Mulkey** received the New York Athletic Club's prestigious Winged Foot Award.

2012 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The 2011-12 Lady Bear season was as perfect as it could be. En route to claiming its second NCAA Championship in seven years, Baylor ran the table, posting an unprecedented 40-0 mark and claiming both Big 12 Conference crowns. **Brittney Griner** and **Mulkey** swept player of the year and coach of the year honors, earning WBCA, USBWA, Associated Press, Naismith and Big 12 Conference recognition. Baylor was ranked No. 1 wire-to-wire in both polls and raced through conference play with a Big 12-record 18-0 mark. Griner and **Odyssey Sims** were named consensus All-Americans, while **Destiny Williams** was a WBCA All-America honorable mention honoree.

NCAA TOURNAMENT STAPLE & 8+-YEAR DOMINANCE

- The Lady Bears have made 16 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and 17 overall. Those appearances have resulted in two national championships (2005, 2012), three Final Fours (2005, 2010, 2012), five Elite Eights and 13 Sweet Sixteens.
- The Lady Bears are 19-time Big 12 Champions – most in Big 12 history – capturing 10 consecutive regular season titles and nine tournament titles.
- Baylor is 304-23 (.928) over the past eight seasons while posting a 153-7 (.955) mark in Big 12 play and a 24-1 (.958) in Big 12 Tournament play.
- 262 of Baylor's 304 wins since 2010-11 have been by 10 or more points, and only 14 times in that span has its winning margin been five or fewer points (most recently three, 70-67, at No. 6/8 Texas, Feb. 20, 2017).
- In Baylor's last 459 games, only three opponents (Texas, .516 and .515; Stanford, .509; West Virginia, .500) have shot 50 percent or above.
- Baylor's current streak of holding opponents to .500 or less from the floor is 34 games and the Lady Bears have done so in 70 of the last 71 games.

BIG 12 DYNASTY

- Baylor women's basketball has won a league-leading 19 Big 12 Conference titles, 10 regular season and nine tournament championships.
- Baylor has run the table in the conference three times (2012, 2013, 2018). It has only happened five times total in Big 12 history (Oklahoma: 16-0 in 2006; Nebraska: 16-0 in 2010).
- Baylor has advanced to the Big 12 Championship game eight seasons in a row and 12 times in program history.
- The Lady Bears have won seven of the last eight Big 12 Championship titles, besting No. 8/7 Texas, 77-69, in the 2018 final.

HEAD COACH KIM MULKEY • 19TH SEASON



Success = Kim Mulkey. No matter what she's attempted in basketball, whether it be on the court or along the sideline, Mulkey has found success. In 18-plus seasons as a head coach, she has attained 568 career victories and ranks No. 2 among the winningest active Division I head coaches in winning percentage (.852). She is No. 3 all-time by percentage between two mentors, second-ranked Leon Barmore (.869) and Pat Summitt (.841).

Barmore is the only other coach to reach the 400-win and 500-win milestones quicker than Mulkey. Barmore reached 500 wins in 576 games, while Mulkey accomplished the feat in 594 games as a head coach. It took Barmore 13 seasons and three games to accumulate 400 wins, while Mulkey achieved it in 13 years and 32 games.

When the Women's Basketball Hall of Famer accepted the position as Baylor University's head women's basketball coach on April 4, 2000, few could have predicted the dramatic and prestigious transformation the program was about to undergo. Inheriting a program that was 7-20 in the year prior to her arrival and had registered 13 losing seasons in the 17 previous years, Mulkey has transformed the Lady Bears into a national power. The former Olympic Gold medalist has twice guided the Lady Bear basketball program to the pinnacle of women's basketball, 2005 and 2012 NCAA Championships, 17 NCAA Tournament appearances, 18 20-win seasons, 16 25-win efforts, nine 30-win campaigns and an NCAA record 40 victories and a perfect season in 2011-12. In addition, Mulkey has led the Lady Bears to three Final Four appearances (2005, 2010, 2012) and a record 18 Big 12 Conference titles.

The 2005 NCAA title was Baylor's first for a women's team sport, and just the second in school history overall. In winning the 2005 championship, Mulkey became the first person, man or woman, to win a basketball national championship as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

En route to the 2005 NCAA Championship, the Lady Bears won their first Big 12 Conference championship and followed with the conference tournament championship for the first of eight title sweeps.

The Lady Bears added to the trophy case with another Big 12 Tournament crown in 2009, claimed both the regular season and tournament crowns in 2011 and captured the regular season title by a record seven games over second place Oklahoma and Texas A&M and went on to earn the tournament crown in 2012. Baylor swept the Big 12 title race, winning both crowns in 2013 to become the first team to win three consecutive conference tournament titles. The Lady Bears continued to be dominant in the league, claiming both regular season and tournament titles in 2014, 2015 and 2016 to total an unprecedented six-straight regular season and six-straight tournament titles. In 2017, Baylor claimed its seventh regular season Big 12 championship in a row and advanced to the tournament title game for the seventh consecutive season before falling in the final. The Lady Bears returned to their seeing ways in 2018, claiming the program's eighth regular season title in a row with a perfect 18-0 mark and the Big 12 Championship title.

Mulkey, a 2000 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, came to Baylor from Louisiana Tech where she spent 19 years as either a student-athlete or coach in the legendary Lady Techster program. During her tenure in Ruston, Mulkey was associated with 11 Final Four squads and three national championship teams. She has either played or coached in the national championship game on eight occasions.

Over her 15-year stint as an assistant and associate head coach at her alma mater, Louisiana Tech posted a 430-68 (.864) record and advanced to seven Final Fours. Mulkey held the title of associate head coach for her final four seasons. Her responsibilities at Tech included coordinating recruiting, tutoring Lady Techster guards, overseeing the players' academic progress and running the summer camps. Because of her diligence, no Lady Techster was ever declared academically ineligible.

As a player, Mulkey led the Lady Techsters to a 130-6 (.956) record, two national titles and four Final Fours from 1980-84. During that time the 5-foot-4 playmaker, known for her spectacular passes and French braids, also led Louisiana Tech to its first two national

championships (1981 and 1982) and was a part of the USA's Gold medal-winning team at both the 1984 Olympics and the 1983 Pan American Games.

Mulkey averaged 6.38 assists and 1.56 steals per game and currently ranks second on Tech's all-time list in assists and 12th in steals. In addition, the summa cum laude scholar was a two-time Academic All-American as a business major. In recognition of her success in the classroom and on the basketball court, Mulkey was inducted into the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America Hall of Fame in June 2003.

Her athletic career began at an early age. Mulkey, a native of Hammond, La., played Dixie Youth baseball as a 12 year old as well as two years of Pony League baseball and made the all-star team two of the three years. At Hammond High School, she led the basketball team to four-straight state championships, posted a 136-5 record and finished her career with a then-national record 4,075 points. She earned all-district, all-state and All-America honors each of her four years at Hammond High. She also graduated as her class' valedictorian with a perfect 4.0 grade point average. Mulkey has a street named after her in her hometown of Tickfaw, La.

Mulkey is a member of the National High School Hall of Fame, the Louisiana High School Hall of Fame, Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame and Louisiana Tech Athletics Hall of Fame. In 1999, she was the lone female named among the Louisiana Sports Writers top 25 athletes of the 20th century and was listed by Sports Illustrated as one of the top 50 sports figures of Louisiana for the 20th century. In June of 2000, she was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame located in Knoxville, Tenn. Additionally, Mulkey was inducted into the Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007 and entered the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in 2010. Born May 17, 1962, in Santa Ana, Calif., Mulkey has two children, daughter Makenzie (27) and son Kramer (24).

Makenzie (Robertson) Fuller serves as associate director of basketball operations for the Lady Bears. She was a four-year letterwinner on Baylor's basketball team, and during her career the Lady Bears posted an impressive 140-10 record, which included eight Big 12 crowns and an NCAA national championship (2012).

Fuller, a three-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree, was named to both Baylor's Dean's List and the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll numerous times. She earned both a bachelor and master's degree from Baylor and married former Baylor football and professional baseball player Clay Fuller in 2015.

Kramer attended LSU, where he played for the highly touted Tiger baseball team. He was a first team All-SEC shortstop and second team Louisville Slugger All-American in 2016, and garnered third team Collegiate Baseball All-American, honorable mention Perfect Game All-American and second team All-SEC accolades in 2017. After leading LSU back to the College World Series in 2017, which resulted in a runner-up finish, Kramer was selected in the fourth round of the MLB Draft by the St. Louis Cardinals. He plays shortstop for the Palm Beach Cardinals, the club's High-A affiliate.

Mulkey's autobiography, "Won't Back Down" with Peter May, a retired Boston Globe senior sportswriter, appeared in bookstores Nov. 5, 2007, and the paperback edition became available Sept. 8, 2008.

2018-19 NOTES & STORY LINES

SENIOR NOTES

- **Kalani Brown** will wrap up a highly successful four-year career for the Lady Bears in 2018-19. Thus far, the Slidell, La. native is 130-9 (.935) with a Baylor uniform on, she's led the Lady Bears to four regular season and two Big 12 Championship titles, made three straight appearances in the NCAA Sweet 16 and two trips to the NCAA Elite Eight her first two years.
- Brown already has the top two season marks for a field goal percentage in Baylor history (.679 as a sophomore, .650 as a junior) and is second on the NCAA's career active leaderboard at .643.
- The reigning Big 12 Player of the Year is an 8-time all-American, and she earned Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year for the second-straight season along with four First-Team Preseason All-America accolades (*Lindy's Sports, Street & Smith's, Athlon Sports & Associated Press*).
- Senior graduate transfer **Chloe Jackson** will provide much needed floor experience to the Lady Bears in 2018-19. After Kalani Brown (91) and Lauren Cox's (65) combined 156 collegiate starts, the other Baylor returners have combined for just 76 starts (Landrum 43, Richards 31, Ursin 2). Jackson combined to start 61 contests in two seasons at LSU from 2016-18.
- Baylor is Jackson's third school as she started her career at NC State. She played just four games as a freshman in 2014-15 before an injury cut her rookie campaign short, and then she transferred to LSU, sat out a season in 2015-16, and then played two seasons where she was a second-team All-SEC honoree last year.
- Jackson surpassed 1,000 career points with her second bucket vs. South Dakota State Nov. 23 and has 1,031 entering the Morehead State contest, (5 at NC State, 944 at LSU, 82 at Baylor) she shoots .433 from the field for her career and .730 from the free-throw line. Her junior season, which garnered her second-team All-SEC honors came after averaging a team-leading 18.1 points per contest, and she shot a career-best .422 from the field.
- Through 30 games, Jackson has flourished in distributing the basketball while maintaining her scoring touch. She ranks 17th nationally and second in the Big 12 in assists per game at 5.6. Her season and career-high came vs. No. 20/22 Iowa State (1/23) when she had 11.
- Jackson is Baylor's primary point guard, but at the start of the season was named to the WBCA's Drysdale Award Watch List, which honors the nation's top shooting guard.

opposing team. For example, she held Katie Lou Samuelson of UConn to 12 points on 4-of-16 shooting Jan. 3, and she held OSU's Vivian Gray to a dozen on 5-of-16 from the floor Jan. 30. Both those players rank in the top 50 nationally in points per game. Richards' numbers aren't flashy, but respectable, she's averaging 1.2 steals per game for the year and 1.3 in Big 12 play, but she's anchoring the defensive unit that is leading the nation for the third-straight year in field goal percentage defense. For her efforts, Big 12 coaches voted her as a member of the 2019 Big 12 All-Defensive Team Wednesday.

BALANCED EFFORT LEADING BAYLOR IN 2018-19

Despite having the No. 1 team in the country and in the Big 12, Baylor has taken home just one weekly Big 12 Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week award. Juicy Landrum and Nalyssa Smith earned those honors, respectively, sharing with another Big 12 player in each case. This result is partly due to the offensive balance that the Lady Bears have shown all season. Four players average in double figures for Baylor led by All-Americans Kalani Brown (15.4 ppg) and Lauren Cox's (12.4 ppg). The duo's numbers are down from a season ago, partly due to the fact that freshmen posts Smith (8.4 ppg) and Queen Egbo (5.7 ppg) are able to spell the starters off the bench with offensive production. And, also guards Juicy Landrum and Chloe Jackson are each sharing the scoring load at 11.3 and 11.1 points per contest, respectively.

POUND THE PAINT, CLEAN THE GLASS, D-UP: LADY BEARS AMONG NATION'S BEST IN REBOUNDING, SCORING EFFICIENCY, DEFENSE

In 14 statistical categories, the Lady Bears rank in the top 10 nationally. But, the Lady Bears (thru games March 6) rank tops in the nation in defensive rebounds per game (33.0), rebound margin (+16.6) and field goal percentage defense (.310) while ranking fourth in field goal percentage (.500). Kalani Brown ranks seventh in the nation in field goal percentage at a .621 clip. In addition to the nation's best defensive field goal percentage, the Lady Bears rank tops in the nation in blocked shots per game (7.1), led by Lauren Cox's 2.48 per contest. Baylor's rebounding is a staple of the program, and the Lady Bears have out-rebounded its opponents in 28 of 29 games this season, Baylor won the rebounding battle in 34 of 35 contests last year, and in 97 of the last 101 contests, BU has had the upper hand on the boards.

LADY BEARS ON THE RUN

Baylor has 29 runs this season of at least 10 unanswered points including at least one in 12 of the 18 Big 12 contests. In 20 of 30 games this season, the Lady Bears have had at least one such run, and Baylor has also put together five runs of 20 or more points. In addition, Baylor is dominating opponents in transition, out-scoring opponents 327-77 on the fast break this season.

SHARING IS CARING: BAYLOR LEADS NATION IN ASSISTS PER GAME

Baylor's 22.6 assists per contest ranks best in the nation (thru March 6) while the Lady Bears rank third in assists-to-turnover ratio at 1.70:1. Chloe Jackson's 5.7 assists per contest (ranks 17th nationally) and 2.38:1 assists-to-turnover ratio (ranks 32nd nationally) lead Baylor. DiDi Richards is averaging 4.1 assists per contest while ranking 19th nationally in assists-to-turnover ratio at 2.62:1 and post Lauren Cox ranks 24th in that category at 2.62:1. Juicy Landrum also ranks fifth in the Big 12 in assists-to-turnover ratio while third on the team at 3.8 assists per contest. As a team Baylor's ball distribution has been the hallmark of the offense in 2018-19. In fact out of Baylor's 920 made field goals this season, the Lady Bears have assisted on 654 marking 71.2 percent of the team's buckets coming on an assist from a teammate.

MULKEY SIGNS TOP RECRUITING CLASS

- The Lady Bears' 2018 class, comprised of forward **Caitlin Bickle**, forward **Aqira DeCosta**, forward **Queen Egbo**, guard **Honesty Scott-Grayson** and forward **Nalyssa Smith**, ranked No. 1 by both ESPN Hoopgurlz and Prospect's Nation.
- Each player owned a five-star rating and ranked in the Top 30 overall by ESPN Hoopgurlz, solidifying Baylor's most talented class to date. The only other consensus top-ranked class in program history came in 2008-09, when Brittney Griner (No. 1 by ESPN Hoopgurlz), Mariah Chandler (No. 16), Jordan Madden (No. 58), Shanay Washington (No. 64) and Kimetria Hayden (unranked) signed NLLs.
- Four players, DeCosta, Egbo, Scott-Grayson and Smith, were included on the 2018 Naismith Trophy Midseason Girls Basketball Watch List, honored as 2018 McDonald's All-Americans and recognized as 2018 Jordan Brand All-Americans.
- DeCosta and Smith were both included on the list of 10 semifinalists for the 2018 Naismith National Girls' High School Player of the Year award. DeCosta advanced as one of five finalists.
- Smith won an 18U USA Basketball gold medal at the 2018 FIBA World Championships in Mexico City and was named Preseason Co-Freshman of the Year by the Big 12 Coaches in the 2018-19 Preseason Big 12 awards.

50 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: BAYLOR NEARLY UNBEATABLE WHEN HITTING HALF ITS SHOTS

In just one occurrence since Kim Mulkey's arrival at Baylor in the 2000-01 season have the Lady Bears lost a game when shooting 50 percent or better. Baylor's record under Mulkey when shooting 50 percent or better is 215-1, and the Lady Bears are 36-0 when shooting 60 percent or better. The lone loss came in the 2017 NCAA Tournament when Baylor fell to Mississippi State in the Elite 8, 94-85 on March 26 despite shooting 53.3 percent from the floor.

ABOUT BAYLOR'S HISTORIC WIN OVER NO. 1 UCONN

Two elite programs met in Waco Jan. 3, and for the first time in school history (previously 0-14) the Baylor Lady Bears knocked off a No. 1-ranked team with UConn falling 68-57 at a sold-out Ferrell Center on ESPN. Not only did Baylor win the game, the Lady Bears put an end to a long line of streaks set by the Huskies, who are the standard for women's basketball with 11 NCAA Championships. Baylor's victory ended a streak of 126 consecutive regular season games for the Huskies and a streak of 55 consecutive regular season road wins. UConn had won 209 straight games in regulation; it's last loss in regulation also came to No. 1 Baylor Dec. 18, 2011.

The Lady Bears' 11-point win was the largest margin of victory for a team vs. UConn since Feb. 27, 2012 when UConn fell to Notre Dame 72-59. In addition, Baylor's defense held UConn to just a 29.4 shooting percentage, its lowest in any game the past 20 seasons.

Baylor became the third Big 12 school to ever defeat a No. 1 team joining Texas Tech who accomplished the feat twice and Texas, and just the second time that a Big 12 team has beaten a No. 1 in a non-conference matchup.

BU's big win kept an overall home win streak at the Ferrell Center alive at 28 games while extending its non-conference home win streak to 47 games.

Kalani Brown didn't shy away from the spotlight when the lights came on Jan. 3 vs. No. 1 UConn. In front of a sold-out crowd at the Ferrell Center and nationally televised on ESPN, the senior post put up 22 points and a season-high 17 rebounds. She was 11-for-17 from the floor in 36 minutes of play. Her games that week also included performances vs. UTRGV and at Texas Tech, but ESPNW.com singled out her performance against the No. 1 Huskies and tabbed her National Player of the Week on Jan. 7.
