- Weather at Kickoff: 64, sunny, North wind at 4 mph
- Today's game was televised nationally on FS1.
- Today's game marked the 78th all-time meeting between Texas Tech and Baylor and the first in Waco since 2007.
- Baylor won the coin toss and deferred to the second half. Tech is 4-2 on coin tosses this year.
- Texas Tech wore red helmets, white tops and black pants for the first time this season. It moves to 1-1 in this combination since 2009.
- Today's game captains were Terence Steele (OL), Eli Howard (LB), Douglas Coleman III (DB) and Adrian Frye (DB).

ROSTER NOTES

- Quarterback Jett Duffey received his second start of the season and fifth in his career.
- Safety Adrian Frye, returned to the lineup after sitting out last week against Oklahoma State.
- Sophomore KeSean Carter got his first start of the season at wide receiver. He also started one game in 2018.
- Redshirt freshman Weston Wright started at right guard for the second time this season while Terence Steele moved back to right tackle.
- Freshman Dadrion Taylor made his second straight start, first at Spur after earning the nod at safety in place of Adrian Frye last week.
- Junior Evan Rambo received the start at Raider, his first start at Texas Tech.

- Gives Texas Tech a 3-3 overall record.
- Gives Texas Tech an 1-2 Big 12 record.
- Gives Texas Tech a 1-2 record against ranked foes this season.
- Gives Texas Tech a 38-39-1 all-time record against Baylor, including 18-11 in Waco.
- Gives Texas Tech a 17-7 record against Baylor during the Big 12 era.
- Moves Texas Tech to 6-1 against the Bears in Waco during the Big 12 era.
- Moves Texas Tech to 7-6 all-time in overtime contests.
- Gives Matt Wells a career record of 1-1 against Baylor.

- Gives Matt Wells a career record of 3-3 at Texas Tech.
- Gives Matt Wells a 47-37 record all-time as a head coach.

TEXAS TECH TEAM NOTES

- Texas Tech played its first overtime game since 2017 against Kansas State and got its first overtime win since beating TCU in two OTs in 2016.
- The Texas Tech defense has not only opened with a three-and-out in 5-of-6 games, but shutout its opponent in the first quarter in 5-of-6 games.
- Texas Tech has collected at least three interceptions in back-to-back games for the first time since doing so against SMU and New Mexico in 2003.
- Texas Tech has now forced a turnover in four-straight games, including three or more turnovers in three of the last four games.
- Texas Tech had its second game with a 100-yard receiver and rusher, with RJ Turner racking up 138 yards through the air and SaRodorick Thompson gaining 153 on the ground.
- Ten different receivers caught a pass on Saturday It's the fifth time in six games Tech has hit 10-plus receivers.
- Texas Tech moved to 3-2 when its scores first under head coach Matt Wells.
- Texas Tech is now 2-2 in day games, 0-3 in away games, and 3-1 under Wells when leading at the half.
- Texas Tech has now scored in 276-straight games dating back to the 1997 season, a streak that now ranks ninth nationally and second in the Big 12 Conference.

NOTING THE RED RAIDERS

OFFENSE

- **Jett Duffey** completed 31-of-42 passes for 362 yards and a score. It's the third 300-yard game of his career and second this season.
- **SaRodorick Thompson** led Tech on the ground with 28 rushes for 153 yards, the first 100-yard game of his career and most rushing yards in a game since Justin Stockton's 161-yard performance against Kansas in 2017. He has now led the Red Raiders in rushing four times this season. He took over the team lead for rushing, upping his season total to 413. He tallied a four-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, his fourth of the season and seventh in his career. He also matched set a season high with five catches that went for 24 yards.
- **RJ Turner** led Tech in receiving with 7 catches for 138 yards. His 79-yard catch and run marked the longest play for Tech this season and the longest reception in his career. It was his first 100-yard game as a Red Raider.
- **T.J. Vasher** hauled in his 17th career touchdown grab and fourth of the season. He finished with six catches for 46 yards and the score. It marked his 22nd straight game with a catch.

DEFENSE

- **Douglas Coleman** recorded his sixth interception in the last four games, which put him in the national lead. He now has nine for his career. He is the fourth Red Raider dating back to 2000 with four interceptions in the first five games of the season. Six interceptions mark the most in a season by a Red Raider since Darcel McBath had seven in 2008. His total moves him into a tie for seventh on Tech's single-season leaderboard with Elmer Tarbox (1937), Tate Randle (1979), Boyd Cowan (1987), Bart Thomas (1994) and Ryan Aycocock (2003). He finished with eight tackles on the day.
- **Evan Rambo** recorded his first interception as a Red Raider and first since his 2016 season as a Cal Bear. He returned it 23 yards to set up Tech's first points of the day.
- **Jordyn Brooks** racked up another TFL for to give him 11.5 in just six games, He finished with eight tackles and two QBH on the day.

- **DeMarcus Fields** recorded a season-high in tackles with seven for the game. He also recorded his third tackle for a loss of the season.
- **Broderick Washington** had a sack to go with five tackles. He now has 2.5 sacks on the season.
- **Ja'Marcus Ingram** snagged his first interception as a Red Raider and second in his collegiate career.
- **Eli Howard** got his second sack of the season and finished with two tackles and a quarterback hurry.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- **Trey Wolff** connected on 3-of-3 field goals Saturday with makes from 40, 25 and 35 yards out. He nailed his second make of 40-plus yards this season. He also remained perfect on extra points, going 3-for-3 on Saturday to move to 21-for-21 this season.
- **Austin McNamara** averaged 44.5 yards on four punts Saturday. He boomed his second 60-plus yard kick with his first boot, then downed a punt inside the five on his next attempt. This season, six of his punts have been downed inside the 10-yard line, including one in every game.
