MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- The sellout crowd of 47,264 is the 6th biggest crowd in McLane history, 19th biggest crowd in Baylor history, regardless of stadium.
- The Bears have won eight straight games (dating back to 2018 season), tying for the fifth-longest winning streak in program history (longest since 9/4-11/5 2015)
- With the victory, the Bears are now bowl eligible for the ninth time in 10 seasons.
- The Bears will head to the 25th bowl game in school history and are 13-11 all-time in bowl games, seeking a fourth-consecutive victory.

• Head coach Matt Rhule has secured his fourth bowl berth as a head coach (2015 Boca Raton Bowl, 2016 Military Bowl, 2018 Texas Bowl). Rhule is 1-1 in bowl games (did not coach the Military Bowl game, had already taken the Baylor job).

- The Bears are 48-43-4 all-time in homecoming contests, including a 11-12 record in the Big 12 era.
- BU has won nine of its last 10 homecoming contests.
- In the first meeting between the Bears aned Red Raiders at McLane Stadium, the Bears are now 19-11 in Waco against TTU. The all-time series dates to 1929.
- The Bears have started the season 6-0 for the first time since starting the 2016 season 6-0.
- Baylor is in its 118th football season and third under Matt Rhule -- the Bears are 602-574-44 all-time and Rhule is 42-40 in his career (14-17 at BU).
- The win gives the Bears their first back-to-back-back Big 12 wins under Rhule and the first time the Bears have won three-straight in conference since 2016.
- The overtime contest is the first for the Bears since Nov. 27, 2015 at TCU.
- The game is the first overtime game in McLane Stadium history. The last overtime game for the Bears in Waco was a 2006 loss to Army.
- The Bears are 6-6 all-time in overtime contests.
- The Bears also defeated TTU in overtime in a 2012 contest at AT&T Stadium, 52-45.
- The Bears are 112-55-2 as a ranked team in program history.
- Baylor has scored in a school-record 156-straight games -- the previous school record was 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 Oct. 23, 1987.
- Baylor won the toss and deferred to the second half.
- Sam Tecklenburg, Jordan Williams, James Lynch and Clay Johnston served as team captains vs. Texas Tech.

TEAM NOTES

- Bears have forced a punt on all 6 opponent first possessions this year.
- The Bears are averaging 217.3 rushing yards per game in 10 games since the start of 2018 at home. The Bears are 8-2 in those games.
- The Bears are 11-3 when creating three or more turnovers in a game.
- Texas Tech had only allowed 4.0 sacks all season coming into the day and the Bears finished with 5.0 sacks on the day.
- The Bears added to their Big-12 leading 18 sacks with 5 vs. Texas Tech, giving them 23.0 on the season.
- After last week's contest being the first game with 10+ TFL since Nov. 24, 2017 at TCU, the Bears have put together back-to-back 10+ TFL performances, following last week's 15 TFL performance with 11 today vs. TTU.
- Matt Rhule coached teams have won 38-straight games when leading or tied entering the fourth quarter. They are now 39-4 all-time when leading or tied entering the fourth quarter.
- With 3 takeaways in the game, the Bears have now had 13 in eight games and only six in the previous 14 games.
- After totaling 10 interceptions in the first 25 games of the Rhule era, Baylor now has five interceptions in 2019, including four in the last three games.
- The Bears have 23 sacks through six games in 2019 after totalling just 25 in 2018.
- Through six games the Bears have held opponents to just 19 total first half points and only 6 second quarter points.
- Through six games the Bears have held opponents to just 43 points through the first three quarters.
- For the second time under Matt Rhule that Baylor has totaled three takeaways, with the first coming vs. K-State in 2018.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

• Dating back to the Texas Bowl, Charlie Brewer's streak of consecutive pass attempts without an interception was snapped at 147, good for the sixth-best streak in program history. His streak of 144 consecutive pass attempts without an interception entering the game ranked fourth-best nationally.

• LB Jordan Williams with his second interception of the season, also second of his career.

• K John Mayers was 2-for-2 on field goals on the day, first making his second made field goal of his career, a 37-yarder, 1 yard shy of his career-long and then made a 19-yarder as time expired to send the game into overtime.

- QB Charlie Brewer had a career-best three rushing TD performance, giving him 5 on the season and 12 for his career. His 12 rushing TDs are good for seventh-most in program history.
- OB Charlie Brewer is the first Baylor OB to rush for 3 TDs in a game since Bryce Petty in the Jan. 1, 2014 Fiesta Bowl vs. UCF.
- Fifth time QB **Charlie Brewer** has led a game-tying or game-winning drive in the fourth quarter.
- DL James Lynch with a huge pass breakup on fourth down to give the ball back to the Bears, his second of the season.
- DL James Lynch has 8.5 sacks on the season, putting him tied for 4th on the single-season list with Charles Benson (1982).
- DL James Lynch has 17 career sacks, good for second place on the Baylor career list and half a sack away from tying the program record.
- OB Charlie Brewer finished with 352 yards passing (24-for-37), his 10th game in 22 starts with 300 + yards passing, puts him in sole posession of third place on the Baylor career list of 300-yard passing performances.
- QB Charlie Brewer is the fourth player in BU history to throw for 6,000 or more yards in his career (now has 6,135 yards, putting him in sole posession of fourth place on the BU career list).
- QB **Charlie Brewer** now has 772 career attempts, moving him up to fifth-most in program history.
- LB Clay Johnston hauls in his first interception of the season and second of his career, with the first coming in 2016.
- LB Clay Johnston led the team in total tackles for the fourth-straight game, finishing with 10 tackles vs. Texas Tech. All four games being double-digit tackle performances.
- WR Denzel Mims has had at least one catch in 30 consecutive games and now has 2,408 career receiving yards, good for eighth-best in program history.
- WR Denzel Mims now has 152 career receptions, moving him up to eighth-most in program history.
- RB JaMycal Hasty now has 1,587 yards in his career, moving him up to 19th most in program history.
- RB John Lovett now has 1,407 career rushing yards, moving him up to 28th most in program history.
- WR Chris Platt appeared in his team-leading 49th career game, starting 31 of those.
- OL Sam Tecklenburg made his 31st-consecutive start, 34th start overall, best on the team.
