MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Baylor is 3-26 all-time against Oklahoma.
- Tonight's attendance of 50,223 is the largest in McLane Stadium history.
- The Bears are 1-2 in games where ESPN College Gameday has been to Waco.
- Baylor is in its 118th football season and third under Matt Rhule the Bears are 605-575-44 all-time and Rhule is 45-41 in his career (17-18 at BU).
- The Bears are 115-56-2 as a ranked team in program history.
- Baylor has scored in a school-record 160-straight games -- the previous school record was 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 Oct. 23, 1987.
- Oklahoma won the toss and deferred to the second half.
- Sam Tecklenburg, Jordan Williams, JaMycal Hasty and Chris Miller served as team captains vs. Oklahoma.

TEAM NOTES

- BU defense has now allowed only 6 points on 10 opening drives this season two FGs, 8 punts forced.
- Baylor's 14 first quarter points are the most 1st-quarter points scored in a Big 12 game since scoring 14 on Oct. 29, 2016 at Texas that was 30 Big 12 games ago.
- For the 9th time in 10 games the BU defense did not allowed a TD in the first quarter.
- The 31 points in the first half are the most scored by the Bears in a Big 12 game this season.
- The 31 first half points are the most in a first half of a Big 12 game since scoring 42 in the first half vs. Kansas on Oct. 15, 2016.
- Through 10 games the Bears have held opponents to just 51 total first half points and only 26 second quarter points.
- Rhule defenses have forced two or more turnovers in 35 of 85 career games coached, including seven times in 2019's first 10 games.
- Through 10 games the Bears have held opponents to just 100 points through the first three quarters.
- Baylor's defense was on the field for 13:18 of game time in the 3rd quarter, the most in any quarter since at least 2007.
- Rhule coached teams at Baylor are now 15-1 when leading or tied entering the fourth quarter.
- Matt Rhule coached teams are 26-9 when recording 2+ turnovers forced and have won 21 of the last 26 when doing so.
- The Bears added to their Big-12 leading sack total with 4 vs. Oklahoma, giving them 33.0 on the season.
- With 3 takeaways in the game, the Bears have now had 24 in 12 games after only six in the previous 14 games.
- After totaling 10 interceptions in the first 25 games of the Rhule era, Baylor now has 11 interceptions in 2019, including 10 in the last 7 games.
- The Bears' 11 interceptions are the most since having 12 in 2016.
- The Bears have 33.0 sacks through nine games in 2019 after totalling just 25 in 2018.
- The Bears had 33 sacks on the season, second most Baylor has had in a season since 2000.
- The Bears had three defenders finish with double-digit tackle totals for the second-straight game (Bernard 15, Miller 13, Black 12)
- The Bears forced 5 fumbles (recovered 2) were a season high.
- The Bears won the turnover battle in the game for the sixth time this season (2 fumble recoveries, 1 INT)

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- QB Charlie Brewer finished with 2 rushing TDs on the day (2 yd rush in the first quarter and a 4 yd rush in the second quarter), giving him now 9 rushing TDs on the season and 16 for his career, giving him sole possession of fourth place on the career rushing TDs by a QB.
- WR Denzel Mims has his sixth career multi-TD performance, his fourth alone of the 2019 season.
- WR Denzel Mims has 10 TDs on the season, putting him in 9th in BU single-season history.
- WR Denzel Mims now has 26 career TDs, putting him in sole posession of TDs in a career by a receiver.
- S Grayland Arnold hauled in his 4th interception of the season and fifth of his career. He has had 3 of those 5 INTs in the last 2 games.
- S Grayland Arnold now has more interceptions this season (4) than Baylor's entire defense had in 2017 (3).
- DT James Lynch forced his 2nd fumble of the year (also second of his career) and also recovered the fumble, his 2nd fumble recovery of the year, 3rd of his career.
- DL Bravvion Roy collected his third full sack of the season, giving him 3.5 sacks for 23 yards on the season.
- S Chris Miller set a new career high with 13 tackles, also a new career best of 11 solo tackles.
- LB Terrel Bernard collected a career-high 8 solo tackles and finished with 15 tackles, his third-straight game with double-digit tackles.
- LB **Henry Black** collected a career-high 12 tackles, along with a career-high 8 solo tackles.
- For the second-straight game LB Blake Lynch tied his career high with 1.5 sacks.
- LB Blake Lynch tied his career high with 2.0 TFL.
- QB Charlie Brewer remains ranked third all-time at Baylor with 7,113 passing yards in his career.
- With 48 career TD passes QB Charlie Brewer remains in sole possession of 4th all-time.
- QB Charlie Brewer now ranks second in program history with 574 completions after 18 against OU, moving him past Shawn Bell (559).
- QB Charlie Brewer remained 5th in rushing yards by a QB after 65 today to move to 817 for his career.
- QB Charlie Brewer 64 TD responsible for ranks fourth in Baylor history (16 rush, 48 pass)
- QB Charlie Brewer 27 TD responsible for is a new career high for Brewer and 8th most in BU single season history.
- WR Denzel Mims has had at least one catch in 34 consecutive games and now has 2,672 career receiving yards, moving him past Gerald McNeil (2,651) for 6th-most in program history.
- WR Denzel Mims now has 170 career receptions, passing Lanear Sampson (2009-12) and Dominique Ziegler (2003-06) for 7th-most in program history.
- WR Chris Platt hauled in 3 receptions, giving him 117 receptions on the season, moving him past David Gettis (116) to 17th-most in program history.
- RB JaMycal Hasty now has 1,874 rushing yards in his career, moving him up to 13th-most in program history.
- RB **John Lovett** now has 1,555 career rushing yards, moving him up to 20th-most in program history.
- TE Ben Sims made his first career start.
- WR Chris Platt appeared in his team-leading 53rd career game, starting 34 of those.
- OL Sam Tecklenburg made his 35th consecutive start, 38th start overall, tops on the team.
