- Baylor opens the Myrtle Beach Invitational on Thursday at 3:30 pm CT against Ohio.
- The game will be shown on ESPN2 with Rich Hollenberg and Fran Fraschilla calling the action.
- BU is facing a MAC team for the first time since defeating UNI on 12/22/03, the 5th win of the Drew era.
- Baylor is 33-12 in regular-season tournaments during the Drew era, including 20-4 since 2013-14.
- Baylor has trailed for only 3:39 of 120:00 game time this season, and never by more than 3 points.
- BU won its season opener vs. UCA 105-61, draining 18 3-pointers, the 2nd-most in program history.
- The Bears led for 36:27 vs. Washington in their 2nd game, but UW rallied to win 67-64 in Alaska.
- BU fought off a tough Texas State team in Game 3 to win 72-63 without Tristan Clark on Friday.
- Jared Butler has led the Bears in scoring in all 3 games this season (30-UCA, 18-UW, 15-TXST).
- Butler leads the Big 12 in scoring (21.0) and 3FGs (4.7), ranks 2nd in 3FG% (.560) and 4th in FG% (.583)
- Freddie Gillespie is 1 of 4 Big 12 players with multiple double-doubles. He ranks 3rd in the Big 12 in steals (2.7), 4th in blocks (2.0), 5th in rebounding (9.3) and 6th in field goal pct. (.536).
- MaCio Teague is 7th in the B12 in assists (4.3), 5th in 3FGs (2.3), 12th in steals (1.7) & 18th in scoring (12.7).
- Baylor is coming off its 10th 20-win season in the last 12 years. The Bears were a No. 9 seed in the 2019 NCAA Tournament, where they knocked of Syracuse before falling to No. 1 seed Gonzaga.
- BU is No. 24 in the most recent AP Top 25 and No. 23 in the preseason coaches' poll.
- Baylor has been in the Preseason AP Top 25 in 7 of 10 seasons since its first preseason ranking in 2010-11.
- Head coach Scott Drew is in his 17th season in Waco and is BU's all-time wins leader (318-210).
- Baylor returned 9 players with at least 26 games of Division I experience, including a pair of transfers who started in their BU debuts after sitting out last season Davion Mitchell and MaCio Teague.
- BU returned 8 letterwinners from last season, including 5 players who made at least 7 starts Mark Vital (34), Jared Butler (21), Tristan Clark (14), Freddie Gillepsie (11) and Devonte Bandoo (7).
- BU was picked 2nd in the Big 12 Preseason Coaches Poll, tying the highest in program history (2012-13). The Bears were picked 9th in last year's poll, but overcame a multitude of injuries to finish in 4th place.
- BU has advanced to the postseason in 8 straight seasons, tied as the nation's 10th-longest active streak.
- Baylor's streak of 11 consecutive seasons ranked was snapped last season, but the Bears have now been ranked in 12 of 13 seasons since 2007-08. BU was ranked only twice prior to the Drew era.
- Baylor is 38-11 in games against non-Big 12 teams over the last 4 seasons since 2016-17.
- Drew is coaching his 529th game at Baylor (318-210). His .602 winning percentage is best in BU history among coaches with 40 + games, and his teams have a .668 winning percentage since 2007-08 (284-141).
- Baylor is 47-5 in regular-season non-conference games against unranked teams since December 2014.
- BU has ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding pct. in 6 straight seasons (No. 2 last year).
- BU has been top-25 nationally in adj. offensive efficiency in 7 of the last 8 seasons (No. 20 last year).
- Baylor is 57-31 against non-conference teams in neutral/road games in the Drew era, including a 34-16 record in away games against non-Big 12 teams since 2011-12.

- Five of Baylor's 12 active players have used a redshirt year at Baylor, and the Bears have three players currently
- sitting out as redshirts Jordan Turner, Adam Flagler and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua.
- Davion Mitchell took over as Baylor's starting point guard replacing Makai Mason. Eight of Baylor's nine starting
 point guards during the Drew era have earned All-Big recognition (14 of last 15 seasons).
- BU is 41-72 against AP-ranked teams since 2007-08 after going 0-27 in Drew's first 4 rebuilding seasons.

- Drew is now in his 17th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (318).
- Drew is coaching his 529th game at Baylor (318-210). His .602 winning percentage is best in BU history among coaches with 40+ games, and he's the program's all-time wins leader.

• Baylor has a .668 winning percentage (284-141) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .672 winning percentage (193-94) over the last 9 seasons since 2011-12.

- Drew (49) is the youngest of 12 coaches nationally to take his current program to four Sweet 16s since 2010.
- In Drew's 17 seasons as Baylor head coach, BU has been ranked in 215 of 529 games. Prior to Drew, BU was ranked
- in 2 of 2,197 games over 97 seasons. In 11 seasons since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 212 of 394 games.
- In Drew's first 16 seasons at Baylor, 42 players have gone on to professional careers.

BU's previous games against current members of the MAC were in 1962 vs. Toledo (loss), 1975 vs. Eastern Michigan (loss) and 2003 vs. Northern Illinois (win). The win vs. Northern Illinois was Drew's 5th victory at Baylor.

SUCCESS IN TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor is 33-12 in regular-season tournaments during the Scott Drew era.
- The Bears are 20-4 in their six regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, going 3-1, 3-1, 3-1, 4-0, 4-0 and 3-1.

• BU advanced to championship games in the 2007 Paradise Jam (won), 2008 76 Classic (lost), 2011 Las Vegas Classic (won), 2013 Maui Invitational (lost), 2014 Las Vegas Invitational (lost), 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis (won) and 2017 Hall of Fame Classic (won).

• Baylor has won four regular-season tournament titles under Drew – the 2017 Hall of Fame Classic, the 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis, the 2011 Las Vegas Classic and the 2007 Paradise Jam.

- Baylor was ranked No. 16 in the preseason AP Top 25 poll, which tied the 2nd highest preseason ranking in BU history.
- BU has been in the preseason AP Top 25 in 7 of 10 seasons since the program's first preseason ranking in 2010-11.
- Thursday is Baylor's 215th games as a ranked team, with 212 of those coming in the last 12 seasons.

• Baylor's highest preseason ranking was No. 12 in 2011-12. The Bears were No. 16 in 2010-11 and 2019-20, No. 19 in 2012-13, No. 22 in 2015-16, No. 24 in 2017-18 and No. 25 in 2013-14.

- Drew is in his 17th season at Baylor and is the school's all time wins leader (318).

EIGHT CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON BERTHS

• Baylor is on a school-record streak of eight consecutive postseason berths, surpassing the total number of postseason berths in the program's 97 seasons prior to the **Scott Drew** era.

• Baylor is 1 of 14 teams to appear in every postseason since 2012, joining Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Iona, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan State, New Mexico State, North Carolina, Oregon, Saint Mary's, Virginia and Wichita State.

- BU earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2019 and NIT bids in 2013 and 2018.
- Baylor has made postseason appearances in 11 of 12 seasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor's only postseason berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).
- Baylor is 21-10 in postseason national tournaments during the Drew era after going 3-9 prior to Drew's arrival.

- Be Drew's 319th win at Baylor and improve Baylor's record to 285-141 since 2007-08.
- Move Baylor to 39-11 in games against non-Big 12 teams since 2016-17.
- Make Baylor 148-34 in November/December games under Drew, including 75-15 in November games.

GILLESPIE GROWING INTO STARTING ROLE

- Freddie Gillespie has started 12 of the last 15 games since entering the starting lineup on Feb. 9, 2019 vs. K-State.
- Gillespie did not play in 8 of 9 games immediately preceding Tristan Clark's injury last year, but he joined the rotation for the first game without Clark on Jan. 12, and he became a starter 8 games later (started 9 of final 12 games).
- Gillespie has posted double-doubles in 2 of 3 games this season after doing so in 1 of 26 games played last year.
- Gillespie is 1 of 4 Big 12 players with multiple double-doubles (Doolittle-OU, Haliburton-ISU, Samuel-TCU).
- Gillespie ranks 3rd in the Big 12 in steals (2.7), 4th in blocks (2.0), 5th in rebounding (9.3) and 6th in FG% (.536).

BUTLER TAKING OVER

- Jared Butler has led Baylor in scoring in all 3 games this season after doing so in 6 of 34 games last year.
- Butler posted 30 points in the season-opener vs. UCA, the most by a Big 12 player this season and the 2nd-most of his career behind a 31-point effort at Kansas on March 9, 2019.
- Butler leads the Big 12 in scoring (21.0) and 3-pointers made per game (4.7), ranks 2nd in 3-point FG percentage (.560), 4th in field goal percentage (.583) and 14th in minutes (31.0).
- Butler has scored at least 15 points in all 3 games this season, his career-long streak of 15+ point games.

TEAGUE CONTINUING STREAKS

• MaCio Teague has played in 70 consecutive games and made 66 consecutive starts during 3 collegiate seasons (2016-17 & 2017-18 at UNC Asheville, 2019-20 at Baylor). He has started all but one game (Nov. 20, 2016).

• Teague has made at least one 3-pointer in 28 consecutive games, including 23 of 28 games with multiple 3FGs.

• Teague ranks 5th in the Big 12 in 3-pointers made (2.3), 7th in assists (4.3), 12th in steals (1.7), 12th in field goal percentage (.455) and 18th in scoring (12.7).

BREAKTHROUGH IN BIG 12

- BU is 113-94 in Big 12 play in 12 seasons since 2008 after going 45-131 in the league's first 11 seasons.
- BU is 99-77 in Big 12 play in 10 seasons since 2010 after going 59-149 in the league's first 13 seasons.
- Baylor is 34-38 in Big 12 road games since 2012, second best in the league behind only Kansas (44-24).

- Texas (155-123) is 7th, Oklahoma State (147-122) is 8th, Texas Tech (144-124) is 9th and TCU (139-135) is 10th.
- Baylor has averaged 24 wins per season over the last seven seasons since 2011-12.

PROTECTING HALFTIME LEADS

• Baylor is 34-4 in its last 38 games when leading at the half, including 15-3 last season and 15-0 in 2017-18.

• Baylor has won 88% of its games (149-20) when leading at the half since 2011-12 (1-1 in 2019-20, 15-3 in 2018-19, 15-0

- in 2017-18, 18-3 in 2016-17, 18-2 in 2015-16, 21-7 in 2014-15, 18-2 in 2013-14, 17-1 in 2012-13 and 26-1 in 2011-12).
- BU has won 37% of games in which its been tied or trailing at the half since 2011-12, going 44-74 in those.

• Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

DOUBLE-DIGIT NON-CONFERENCE WINS IN 11 OF LAST 13 YEARS

• Baylor has begun Big 12 play with double-digit wins in 5 of the last 6 seasons and 11 times in the last 13 years. All told, Baylor has gone 142-26 prior to Big 12 play over the last 14 seasons dating back to 2006-07, including a 9-9 record against AP Top 25 teams.

• BU entered Big 12 play 8-4 in 2018-19, 10-2 in 2017-18, 12-0 in 2016-17, 10-2 in 2015-16, 11-1 in 2014-15, 12-1 in 2013-14, 8-4 in 2012-13, 13-0 in 2011-12, 10-3 in 2010-11, 12-1 in 2009-10, 12-2 in 2008-09, 12-2 in 2007-08 and 10-3 in 2006-07. The Bears are 2-1 in non-conference this season.

• The only other schools with three such players were Colorado, Marquette, Missouri, New Mexico and Connecticut. Baylor developed Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson and Taurean Prince into NBA Draft picks after joining the program as unranked recruits.

 Baylor has won multiple games vs. AP Top 25 teams in each of the last 12 seasons. The Bears have defeated at least five ranked teams in four of the last six seasons dating back to 2013-14.

OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING BECOMING A BAYLOR STAPLE

• Baylor has ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage in every season since 2013-14, including five times ranked in the nation's top-4. The Bears only cracked the top-20 once in Drew's first 10 years.

• Baylor's 6-year streak is the nation's best, and West Virginia (5 years) is the only other team with a 3+ year streak. Baylor ranked No. 2 nationally in 2018-19, No. 9 in 2017-18, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16, No. 1 in 2014-

15 and No. 3 in 2013-14. Prior to that 6-year top-10 streak, BU's best rank was No. 16 in 2011-12.
