TEAM NOTES

- Baylor has the nation's longest active winning streak at 34 games.
- Baylor's 67.9 field goal percentage tonight is fourth-best in a game in program history.
- Baylor's 34-straight wins is the 13th longest winning streak in NCAA history, and is the second best BU win streak (42, 2011-13).
- Baylor's win streak at the Ferrell Center improved to 44 games (last loss, Feb. 6, 2017 to Texas, 85-79).
- Baylor's 44-straight home-court wins is tied for the 24th best home winning streak in NCAA history and the second-best Baylor home-win streak (69, 2011-14)
- Baylor's last non-conference loss at home came Jan. 13, 2014 vs. UConn (66-55). Since then, the Lady Bears have won 54-straight non-conference home games at the Ferrell Center including 15 NCAA Tournament contests.

- Baylor head coach Kim Mulkey improved to 581-99 all-time with the win (.854).
- Baylor is 154-3 all-time vs. non-conference opponents at the Ferrell Center under head coach Kim Mulkey.
- Baylor began the season ranked No. 2 by the Associated Press, which marks the 302nd consecutive week the Lady Bears have been ranked in the AP Top 25.
- Baylor is now 224-1 all-time under Mulkey when shooting 50 percent or better (67.9 on 36-53 shooting tonight).

• In 665 of 680 games under Mulkey, the Lady Bears have held their opponent at or below 50 percent field goal shooting (17.5 tonight) with only seven of those efforts coming in the last 16 seasons.

• Baylor has 14 double-digit runs this season with three tonight against Lamar.

• Baylor Lamar to single digits in all four quarters, marking the eighth, ninth, 10th and 11th times, respectively, that Baylor's defense has accomplished the feat this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- NaLyssa Smith (18 points) scored in double figures for the 23rd time in her career and in all five games this season.
- NaLyssa Smith surpassed 400 career points in tonight's win and now sits with 406 career points.
- NaLyssa Smith was a perfect 8-for-8 from the field, good for the fifth-best performance in Baylor history for most field goals made without a miss in a game.
- NaLyssa Smith had a career-high three steals, surpassing her previous best of two against Texas Tech on Feb. 2.
- Queen Egbo (12 points) scored in double figures for the 13th time in her career and in all five games this season.
- Queen Egbo (10 rebounds) posted double-figure rebounds for the second-straight game and sixth time in her career.
- Queen Egbo (12 points, 10 rebounds) posted her fifth career double double and second of the season.
- Te'a Cooper (12 points) scored in double figures for the fourth-straight game and 36th time in her career.
- DiDi Richards tied a career-high three blocks (accomplished three other times).
- Erin DeGrate (19 points) scored in double figures for the fourth time this season and 29th time in her career.
- Erin DeGrate led the team in scoring for the first time this season.
- Caitlin Bickle dished out a career-high five assists, surpassing her previous best of four against HBU on Nov. 14.
- Baylor post players NaLyssa Smith (8-8), Erin DeGrate (8-9), Queen Egbo (6-8) and Caitlin Bickle (3-4) combined to shoot 25-29 from the floor (.862).
