

**TEAM NOTES**

- Baylor improved to 587-100 all-time under head coach Kim Mulkey while taking a 30-25 series lead over Oklahoma.
- The Lady Bears' win over the Sooners was Baylor's 10th-straight; the longest win streak for BU in the series while the Lady Bears have taken 19 of the last 20 contests from OU.
- Baylor extended its regular season Big-12 win streak to 43 games (last loss to Texas, Feb. 6, 2017).
- The Lady Bears' road win streak vs. Big 12 competition in the regular season reached 36 games, the second longest active streak in the nation (UConn) and third-best all-time.
- Baylor is ranked No. 6 by the *Associated Press*, which marks the 308th consecutive week the Lady Bears have been ranked in the AP Top 25 and the 101st-straight week in the Top 10.
- Baylor improved to 322-24 since the start of the 2010-11 season, which marks the second-best win pct. (.930) among all NCAA programs in that span.
- Baylor outscored the Sooners on the fastbreak 18-6 today; the Lady Bears have outscored opponents on the break this season 233-38.
- Baylor held Oklahoma to single digit scoring in the second quarter (8 points), holding its opponent to single digits for the 18th time this season.
- Baylor has 24 double-digit runs this season after the Lady Bears took the lead with a 29-0 run.
- The run was the second-longest run of the season behind BU's 37-0 run to open the season against New Hampshire.
- Baylor held Oklahoma without a bucket for 9:09 in the first half.
- Baylor improved to 14-6 in Big 12 openers under Mulkey and have won nine of their last 10 conference openers.
- Baylor has forced its opponents to commit 20 or more turnovers for the ninth time this season and for the fourth-straight game.

**INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- **Te'a Cooper** (career-high 32 points) scored in double figures for the 10th time this season and 42nd time in her career.
- **Cooper** posted her second career 30-point game and 10th 20-point game of her career. She surpassed 20 points for the second time in a Baylor uniform.
- **Juicy Landrum** (12 points) scored in double figures for the sixth time this season and 42nd time in her career.
- **Lauren Cox** (season-high 14 points) scored in double figures for the fourth time this season and 72nd time in her career.
