

**TEAM NOTES**

- Baylor clinched a share of its 10th-straight regular season Big 12 Championship and 11th overall.
- Baylor’s 10th-straight conference championship is the longest active regular-season title streak in the nation and the 10th-best streak of all-time.
- Baylor’s 11 regular season Big 12 titles overall are the 7th most in NCAA Division I women’s basketball since the 1999-2000 season (*see list to right, note that Baylor is the only team on the list advanced one. It is possible other teams on the list are close to or have already clinched divisional or regular season championships*).
- Baylor has 21 Big 12 Championships, all in the Mulkey era, with 11 regular-season titles and 10 Big 12 Tournament championships.
- Baylor improved to 602-100 (.858) under head coach Kim Mulkey.
- Baylor improved to 31-25 all-time vs. Oklahoma [27-18 in the Mulkey era], and has 11-straight wins over the Sooners.
- Baylor is now 168-7 (.960) vs. Big 12 opponents since the start of the 2010-11 season and 280-55 (.836) all-time under Mulkey.
- Baylor extended its Big 12 regular-season win streak to a Big 12 and school-record 56 games, and it also ranks as the 7th-best conference win streak in NCAA history.
- Baylor extended its road win streak in Big 12 contests in the regular season to 44 games, the third-longest conference road win streak in NCAA history.
- Baylor held West Virginia to six points in the first quarter and nine points in the third, the 31st & 32nd times this season the Lady Bears defense has held an opponent to single digits in a quarter.
- Baylor went on a 17-0 run extending from the last four points of the second quarter to the first 13 of the third; it was the Lady Bears’ 35th double-digit run of the season for Baylor.

**INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- **Te’a Cooper** finished with 17 points, the 55th time in her career to score 10+ and the 23rd time this season.
- **Lauren Cox** finished with 12 points, the 83rd time in her career and 15th time this season to reach double figures.
- **Cox** led Baylor with nine rebounds and two blocks.
- **Cox** and **DiDi Richards** led Baylor with five assists.
