

**TEAM NOTES**

- Baylor celebrated its outright Big 12 Regular Season Championship postgame Saturday, the program’s 11th overall and 10th-straight.
- Baylor’s 10th-straight conference championship is the longest active regular-season title streak in the nation and the 10th-best streak of all-time.
- Baylor’s 11 regular season Big 12 titles overall are the 7th most in NCAA Division I women’s basketball since the 1999-2000 season (*see list to right, note that Baylor is the only team on the list advanced one. It is possible other teams on the list are close to or have already clinched divisional or regular season championships*).
- Baylor has 21 Big 12 Championships, all in the Mulkey era, with 11 regular-season titles and 10 Big 12 Tournament championships.
- Baylor improved to 603-100 (.858) under head coach Kim Mulkey.
- Baylor improved to 37-8 all-time vs. Kansas State [35-4 in the Mulkey era], and has 34-straight wins over the Wildcats.
- Baylor is now 169-7 (.960) vs. Big 12 opponents since the start of the 2010-11 season and 281-55 (.836) all-time under Mulkey.
- Baylor extended its Big 12 regular-season win streak to a Big 12 and school-record 57 games, and it also ranks as tied for the 6th-best conference win streak in NCAA history.
- Baylor the nation’s longest active home win streak with its 55th at the Ferrell Center; the streak is also the 11th-best home-win streak in NCAA history.
- Baylor posted a season-low seven turnovers and added 26 assists, good for a 3.7:1 assists-to-turnover ratio.
- Baylor has 36 double-digit runs this season after posting a 10-0 run in the first quarter.
- Baylor has held opponents to single-digit scoring in 33 quarters this season (K-State scored 6 in the second quarter).
- Baylor improved to 236-1 all-time under Mulkey when shooting 50 percent or better (.530, 35-66 tonight)

**INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- **Lauren Cox** (season-high 22 points, 10 rebounds) posted her seventh double-double of the season and 35th of her career.
- **Cox** is tied with LaNita Luckey for seventh all-time in Baylor career doubles (35).
- **Lauren Cox** (season-high 22 points) scored in double figures for the 16th time this season, 84th time in her career and in the fourth-straight game.
- **Cox** led the team by tying a season-high with four steals.
- **Cox** and **Juicy Landrum** tied for the team lead with two blocks.
- **NaLyssa Smith** (23 points, 13 rebounds) posted her 10th double-double of the season and 13th of her career.
- **Smith** (23 points) scored in double figures for the 21st time this season and 38th time of her career.
- **Smith** (13 rebounds) posted double-digit boards for the 11th time this season and 15th time of her career.
- **Smith** (13 rebounds) surpassed 400 career rebounds.
- **DiDi Richards** posted a career-high 10 assists.
- **Queen Egbo** (4 points) surpassed 500 career points with her third of four.
- **Juicy Landrum** (14 points) scored in double figures for the 16th time this season and 52nd time in her career.
