STORY LINES

- No. 2 Baylor returns home to host Arkansas-Pine Bluff at 7 pm CT Monday at the Ferrell Center.
- Baylor is the Big 12's final undefeated team. The Bears lead the league in scoring (92.6), scoring margin (+27.8), field goal pct. (.521), 3-point pct. (.468), 3-pointers made (11.8/gm), assists (20.8/gm), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.60), rebounding margin (+11.4) and steals (9.0/gm). Baylor returned four All-Big 12 players from a 2019-20 team which went 26-4 and spent five weeks ranked No. 1 nationally. The Bears finished last season ranked No. 4 in the coaches poll (No. 5 in AP). Baylor has scored 80+ points in 5 straight games for the first time since December 2017. The Bears are looking for to reach 80+ points for a 6th-straight game for the first time since 1994. BU is looking to start a season 6-0 for the first time since starting 15-0 on its way to No. 1 in 2016-17. BU has won all 5 games by 13+ points and averages a +27.8 margin of victory (4 of 5 wins by 30+). Baylor's bench has 33 + points in every game and is out-scoring opposing benches 38-21 on average. Baylor is on a school-record streak of 16 straight weeks top-5 ranked (previously 6 straight in 2017). BU's streak of 25 consecutive AP polls ranked ties the longest in program history (25 in 2016-17). Baylor's defense forced 15 + turnovers in 20 of 35 games since the start of the 2019-20 season. • BU became the first team since 1992 to score 100 points in Manhattan in Saturday's win at K-State. BU forced a Ferrell Center-record 35 turnovers with 40 points off turnovers in the Dec. 9 win over SFA. • Baylor has led by at least 5 points in 35 straight games and built a double-digit lead in 29 of 35 games. Among BU returners is Jared Butler, who is the first preseason AP All-American in program history. BU also welcomes back MaCio Teague, an all-conference pick in all 3 of his collegiate seasons. BU returns two players who were semifinalists for the 2020 Naismith Defensive Player of the Year. Mark Vital was 1 of 4 finalists, while Davion Mitchell joined Vital among the 10 semifinalists. BU has 4 of the Big 12's top-15 scorers – Teague (6th), Flagler (7th), Butler (9th) and Mitchell (15th). Baylor is playing its 247th game as a ranked team under Drew – BU was ranked in 2 of 2197 games over the program's 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 244 of 426 games. Baylor is 51-11 in games against non-Big 12 teams over the last 5 seasons since 2016-17. Baylor is 105-8 in non-conference home games since 2007-08, including 66-4 since December 2012. BU has been top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage a nation's-best 7 straight years. Baylor is 1 of 5 Power-5 programs to win at least 18 games in each of the last 12 seasons since 2007-08, joining Duke, Kansas, Kentucky and Michigan State. Baylor has won 20 + games in 11 of the last 13 years. The Bears reached the 20-win mark only 3 times in 101 seasons prior to 2008. BU is averaging 24 wins per season since 2008. Head coach Scott Drew is in his 18th season in Waco and is BU's all-time wins leader (347-213). Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in 3 of the last 5 seasons. Baylor signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history (No. 4) earlier this month. - Baylor opened with a 112-82 win over ULL on Nov. 28. BU's 112 points were its most since 2017.
- BU then beat Washington 86-52 on Nov. 29 in Las Vegas, out-rebounding the Huskies 50-19.
- Baylor won 82-69 over No. 5 Illinois in Indianapolis on Dec. 2, recording the 9th top-5 win in program history.
- BU defeated SFA 83-52 on Dec. 9, turning a Ferrell Center-record 35 turnovers into 40 points off turnovers.
- Baylor won its Big 12 opener at K-State 100-69, becoming the first team to score 100 in Manhattan since 1992.

QUICK HITS

- BU was picked to win the Big 12 in the league's preseason coaches' poll for the first time.
- Baylor is 56-5 when leading at halftime over the last 4 seasons since 2017-18 (21-2 in 2019-20, 5-0 this season).
- Baylor has won 89% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (174-21).
- BU is 119-23 since 2015-16 when leading at any point in the 2nd half of a game (31-3 since 2019-20).
- Baylor's 23-game winning streak last season was the longest ever by a Big 12 team (previously 22 by 1996-97 KU).

- Baylor is 222-97 over the last 10 seasons, averaging 24 wins per season since 2011-12.
- Baylor's 222 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (271).
- Baylor is 313-144 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- BU returned 8 players with at least 30 games of DI experience, including a pair of sophomore transfers who joined the rotation after sitting out last season Adam Flagler and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua.
- Eight of Baylor's players either have used or are currently using a redshirt year. Four after transferring to BU Flagler, Mitchell, Tchamwa Tchatchoua and Teague, and four as freshmen Moffatt, Turner, Vital and Dainja.
- Nine of Baylor's 10 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (15 of last 16 seasons).
- Baylor is 1 of 14 teams nationally to appear in every postseason since 2012 (6 NCAAs, 2 NITs).
- Baylor has the nation's 10th-longest active streak with at least one 3-point FG made in 937 straight games the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was more than 30 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- Scott Drew became Baylor head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 18th season at Baylor and is the school's all time wins leader (347).
- Drew is coaching his 561st game at Baylor (347-213). His .620 winning pct. is best in BU history among coaches
- with 40+ games, and he's the program's all-time wins leader with 146 more victories than any other coach.
- Baylor has a .685 winning percentage (313-144) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .696 winning percentage (222-97) over the last 9+ seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (50) is the youngest of 12 coaches nationally to take his current program to four Sweet 16s since 2010.
- Baylor is playing its 247th game as a ranked team in Drew's 18 seasons. BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program's first 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 244 of 426 games.
- In Drew's first 17 seasons at Baylor, 44 players have gone on to professional careers.

ONE OF FOUR PROGRAMS RANKED NO. 1 THREE TIMES SINCE 2017

Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in three seasons since 2017.
BU was No. 1 for the first time on Jan. 9, 2017, spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 2020 and was No. 1 in the preseason and week 1 coaches' polls this year. All told, BU has been No. 1 for eight weeks since 2017.
The Bears have been ranked in 24 of 25 AP Top 25 spots during the Drew era (all since 2008). The only spot Baylor hasn't been ranked in the AP poll is No. 8.

SERIES HISTORY

Monday is the 4th series meeting and the first since 2004, a 63-53 Baylor win at the Ferrell Center.
All four series meetings have been at the Ferrell Center, with Baylor winning 72-45 in the first series meeting on the day before Y2K, Dec. 31, 1999. The Bears then won 85-40 on Nov. 22, 2000 and 63-53 on Dec. 1, 2004.

LAST TIME VS. UAPB

• Baylor recorded the 10th win of the Drew era when the Bears defeated UAPB 63-53 on Dec. 1, 2004.

• BU had only 5 scholarship players for the game, and three walk-ons combined to play 41 minutes off the bench.

• Aaron Bruce posted a game-high 17 points, while Patrick Fields added 16 points and a team-best 4 assists, Kevin

Shipman had 15 points and Tommy Swanson recorded a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

BEARS ARE 7-1 VS. RANKED TEAMS OVER LAST TWO SEASONS

Baylor is 7-1 against top-25 ranked teams since the start of the 2019-20 season. The Bears last loss against a ranked team before that stretch was to No. 4-ranked Gonzaga in the 2019 NCAA Tournament second round.
BU is 3-0 away from home against ranked teams over the last two seasons. BU defeated No. 17 Villanova in the 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational, then recorded road wins at No. 22 Texas Tech and No. 4 Kansas in January 2020.

FOUR ALL-BIG 12 PLAYERS RETURN

- All five Baylor starters were named to 2020 All-Big 12 teams, making BU the first team in the league's 24-year history with five players on All-Big 12 teams, and four of those players are back for the 2020-21 season.
- Jared Butler became Baylor's first underclassman named first-team All-Conference since Terry Teagle in 1980, and he was named a consensus third-team All-American. He's the Bears' first AP Preseason All-American.
- MaCio Teague has been all-conference in all three of his previous seasons. He was a first-team All-Big South honoree while at UNC Asheville in 2017 and 2018 and earned second-team All-Big 12 honors in 2020.
- Mark Vital and Davion Mitchell were both third-team All-Big 12 and Big 12 All-Defensive Team choices.

SIXTEEN STRAIGHT WEEKS AP TOP-5 RANKED

- BU is No. 2 in this week's AP Top 25, extending its school-record streak to 16 straight weeks top-5 ranked.
- Baylor's 5-week streak at No. 1 last season was the longest since Kentucky in 2015.

• Baylor's streak of 25 consecutive weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 ties the longest streak in program history, matching the 25 consecutive polls ranked in 2016-17.

A WIN WOULD ...

- Be Drew's 348th win at Baylor and improve Baylor's record to 314-144 since 2007-08.
- Make Baylor 6-0 for the first time since starting 15-0 in 2016-17.
- Improve Baylor to 34-10 all-time when playing as an AP Top 5 team.

NO RUST FOR BU OFFENSE AFTER LONG LAYOFF BEFORE BIG 12 OPENER AT K-STATE

- Despite going 9 days without a game and having only two days of practice before its Big 12 opener at Kansas State, BU rolled to a 100-69 victory on Dec. 19, becoming the first team to score 100 in Manhattan since 1992.
- Two Baylor guards posted double-doubles, with **MaCio Teague**'s 23 points and 10 rebounds and **Jared Butler's** 14 points and career-high 13 assists. **Davion Mitchell** added a career-high 20 points.

BU FORCES 35 TURNOVERS IN DOMINANT WIN OVER SFA

• Baylor forced a Ferrell Center-record 35 turnovers and rolled to an 83-52 win over SFA in its Dec. 9 home opener.

• The Bears snapped SFA's 18-game winning streak (which was the nation's 2nd-longest active streak) and handed SFA its largest margin-of-defeat in more than two years – a 38-point loss at Miami on Nov. 13, 2018.

BEARS NOTCH TOP-5 WIN OVER ILLINOIS IN JIMMY V CLASSIC

- Baylor recorded its first ranked win of the season by beating No. 5 Illinois 82-69 in the Jimmy V Classic on Dec. 2.
- Four BU guards all scored in double-figures and combined for 56 points, led by Adam Flagler's 18 off the bench.
- There were 10 lead changes in the game, and score was tied 43-43 with 13:16 left. BU used a 6-0 run to take the lead for good, and put the game away with a 9-0 run over 75 seconds to take a 65-61 lead with 7 minutes left.
- After being out-rebounded 25-18 in the first half, Baylor out-rebounded the Illini 20-10 after the break.

TWO 30-POINT WINS IN VEGAS TO OPEN SEASON

- Baylor's season started three days later than expected, but the Bears came out strong scoring 112 points in a 30-point win over Louisiana-Lafayette and then taking down Washington 86-52 the following day.
- The Bears drained 15 treys and had 25 assists on their way to 112 points in the opener vs. Louisiana-Lafayette.
- BU out-rebounded Washington 50-19, with Mark Vital (15) recording as many rebounds as all Washington players combined (15 + 4 team rebounds). It was the second time Vital accomplished that feat (2018-19 at Arizona).

- BU is 129-97 in Big 12 play in 14 seasons since 2008 after going 45-131 in the league's first 11 seasons.
- Baylor is 42-40 in Big 12 road games since 2012, second-best in the league behind only Kansas (55-27).
- BU has won 8+ Big 12 games in 9 straight seasons after winning 8+ just 3 times in the league's first 15 years.

VITAL TO BEARS' SUCCESS

- Mark Vital is back after being named one of 4 Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Award finalists in 2020.
- He was named to the All-Big 12 Third Team and was a unanimous All-Defensive Team selection.
- In Baylor's Nov. 29, 2020 game vs. Washington, Vital's 15 rebounds matched all Washington players combined (15).
 That was the second time Vital accompised the feat after doing as for the first time at Arizona in 2019.
- That was the second time Vital accompished the feat, after doing so for the first time at Arizona in 2018.
- Vital did not attempt a field goal in the Feb. 1, 2020 win over TCU, but he had a + 13 plus-minus in 22 minutes.
 Vital filled the stat sheet in the Jan. 29 win at Iowa State, posting 8 points, 9 rebounds and 7 assists in 31 minutes.

TEAGUE LOOKING FOR FOURTH ALL-CONFERENCE SEASON

• MaCio Teague has earned all-conference honors in all 3 collegiate seasons – All-Big South First Team in 2017 and 2018 at UNC Asheville and All-Big 12 Second Team in 2020 at Baylor.

- Teague played in 90 consecutive games and made 86 consecutive starts before sitting out two games with a broken wrist. He has started all but 3 games (Nov. 20, 2016, Feb. 18, 2020, Feb. 22, 2020) in his career.
- Teague led Baylor in scoring in 6 straight games (15+ points in each) before injuring his wrist at Texas on Feb. 10.

- Baylor is 25-1 when Teague scores 10+ points. He's averaging 9.5 ppg in BU's 4 losses with him (8, 8, 13, 9).

MITCHELL RETURNS AS STARTING POINT GUARD

• Davion Mitchell was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, selected to the All-Big 12 Third Team and Big 12 All-Defensive Team and was a unanimous choice on the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.

- Mitchell has started all 35 games at BU after coming off the bench in all 34 games as an Auburn freshman (2017-18).
- Mitchell has made a 3-pointer in 26 of the last 31 games and is shooting 40% on 3FGs in that stretch (46-of-116).
- Prior to that stretch, he shot .264 (19-of-72) from downtown over his first 38 collegiate games.
- Last season, he ranked 8th in the Big 12 in steals (1.5), 4th in A:T ratio (1.70) and 7th in assists (3.8).
- Mitchell joined Mark Vital to make BU the only school with two Naismith Defensive Player of the Year semifinalists.

- When Mitchell scores 10+ points, his collegiate teams are 20-1 (2-0 at Auburn, 18-1 at Baylor).
