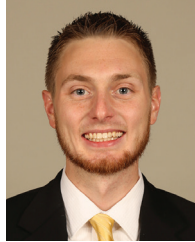

INTRODUCTION



## VICE PRESIDENT / DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

**MACK B. RHOADES, IV**

**VICE PRESIDENT / DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS**

Mack B. Rhoades, IV, who has provided outstanding leadership and vision for three NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision athletic programs, was named Baylor University's Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics on July 13, 2016.

Rhoades has organized a team of dynamic administrators and restructured the athletics department to maximize efficiencies across teams. His concept of Preparing Champions for Life has provided the ongoing vision for Baylor Athletics, which aims to bolster the student-athlete experience by focusing on the areas of academic achievement, athletic success, character formation and spiritual growth. Rhoades has assisted University leadership in a campus-wide effort to structurally complete 105 recommendations related to Title IX and student safety.

The 2018-19 academic year brought several strategic initiatives to the forefront of athletics beginning with December's unveiling of the "Baylor Built" character formation program. Rhoades appointed Marcus Sedberry, Senior Associate AD for Student-Athlete Success to spearhead the platform, which is a four-year, classification specific program, which aims to ensure Baylor student-athletes participate in 48 hours of character formation programming during their respective tenures. The holistic program encompasses character and leadership development, personal skills, social responsibility, community engagement and spiritual growth.

Rhoades, in a collective effort with a team assembled by Jovan Overshown, Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs, launched - in association with NIKE - the "Baylor United" brand and visual identity for the department in April of 2019. The process produced a unified color palette, updated primary and secondary marks, new wordmarks and custom brand font and numerical system.

In May of 2019, as part of the Baylor Athletics Master Plan portion of the university's \$1.1 billion "Give Light" campaign, Rhoades announced the department would build a new \$105 million basketball fieldhouse following the largest current gift in the university's history. An anonymous lead gift will spearhead the Baylor Basketball Pavilion to provide an electric atmosphere for the department's highly-successful basketball programs.

Rhoades has led national searches for three head coaching positions during his time at Baylor, ultimately bringing to Waco, Matt Rhule (Football) in 2016, Casie Maxwell (Equestrian) in 2017 and Brian Boland (Men's Tennis) in 2018.

Since his arrival, Baylor has had at least 17 of 19 teams reach postseason competition in all three years, including 18 of 19 teams in each of his first two years and 17 of 19 teams in 2018-19. During his tenure, Baylor teams have earned 14 Big 12 titles. Additionally, acrobatics and tumbling secured NCATA national championships in 2017, 2018 and 2019, adding to their record five-consecutive titles, and the Baylor women's basketball team took home its third national championship in 2019. National titles for acrobatics and tumbling and women's basketball in 2019 marked the first time in school history two programs have taken home national championships in the same academic year.

Baylor continued its successful run academically in 2018-19, recording its 22nd consecutive semester with a 3.0 or better cumulative student-athlete GPA in Spring 2019. Baylor led the Big 12 in Graduation Success Rate (GSR) for the fifth straight year while 114 student-athletes earned degrees in the academic year. Eight of 15 Baylor athletics programs tracked by the NCAA registered perfect one-year APR scores of 1,000 and five different teams led the Big 12 in multi-year APR for their respective sports (baseball, men's golf, soccer, softball and men's track).

The Bears remain committed to giving back with student-athletes volunteering more than 4,900 hours throughout the Waco community in the last two academic years. Baylor's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) collaborated with Waco Habitat for Humanity to serve the Waco community through hands-on labor and connected with families in the community.

For the 12th consecutive year, Baylor's Sports Ministry Team traveled to share the love of Christ. Baylor Athletics hosted three international mission trips in 2018-19 with 49 student-athletes participating in missions to Kenya, South Africa and Guatemala.

Rhoades joined the Baylor family from the University of Missouri, where he spent the previous year (2015-16) leading the 20-sport Southeastern Conference intercollegiate athletics department, and he previously served in similar capacities at the University of Houston (2009-15) and the University of Akron (2006-09).

His first year in Columbia saw Mizzou student-athletes register the highest one-semester grade-point in school history at 3.03 for the fall 2015 term; Barry Odom hired as the Tigers' head football coach; wrestler J'den Cox win an NCAA title and earn a berth on the 2016 U.S. Olympic Team; the Tigers' men's swimming and diving team place a program-best eighth at the NCAA Championship and its women's basketball program return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006. Bolstered by three top 11 NCAA

finishes--wrestling (sixth), men's swimming and diving (eighth) and women's swimming and diving (11th), Missouri finished 43rd in the final 2015-16 Learfield Directors' Cup standings.

Rhoades and his staff developed a student-athlete enrichment program, Mizzou Made: Preparing Champions for Life. This innovative and comprehensive program is part of a campus community partnership focusing on life skills and career development among other core values.

Before moving to Missouri, Rhoades enjoyed five-and-a-half rewarding years guiding the athletic fortunes at the University of Houston as Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics. He reignited the Cougars' entire program, hiring 14 new head coaches, including 2015 FWAA First-Year Coach of the Year Tom Herman. Rhoades also oversaw a transformation of the student-athlete experience while also directing marked improvements in the areas of academics, facilities, fundraising and athletic success. In nearly every academic measurement, including grade-point average and the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, Houston registered record achievements. He also unveiled the Cougar Pride Leadership Academy to equip student-athletes with life-long leadership and life skills.

Houston's football team appeared in four bowl games during Rhoades' six seasons, and enjoyed a historic 2011 campaign which saw it climb to No. 6 in the BCS standings en route to a 13-1 record and its first season-ending finish in The Associated Press Top 25 since 1990.

Known as an outstanding fundraiser, Houston raised nearly \$100M and constructed \$160M in new facilities during his tenure, including a new on-campus football stadium, a men's and women's basketball training center, a golf academy and a short game facility. Rhoades also negotiated one of the nation's top five facility naming rights agreements at the collegiate level and secured a new multi-media rights deal for Houston. Cougar Pride, Houston Athletics' fundraising arm, set an annual donation record for the fifth-consecutive year in 2013-14 as more than 3,100 Cougar Pride members contributed \$4.5M to eclipse the previous mark of \$3.5M set the previous year.

Rhoades and University of Houston President Dr. Renu Khator successfully steered the institution into an exciting new era when it was invited in December 2011 to join The American Athletic Conference beginning with the 2013-14 academic year. Houston's first year in The American was arguably one of the finest in school history, as its 2013-14 teams combined for 157 victories, 17 American individual championships, 10 NCAA postseason berths and a pair of American team titles. That successful surge led to Houston's highest national finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup since 2000-01.

Rhoades served as chair of the American Athletic Conference Athletics Directors Committee, Athletics Directors Executive Committee and Athletics Directors Finance Committee after having served Conference USA as chairperson for its Championship and Site Selection Committees.

Prior to his arrival at Houston, Rhoades helped the University of Akron achieve unprecedented academic and athletic success. During his tenure, Zip student-athletes earned: 765 total Dean's List honors, 213 All-Conference honors, 83 Academic All-Conference awards, 20 team championships, 14 Conference Player of the Year awards and 12 All-America honors.

Rhoades' Akron tenure was also marked by the construction of a \$61.6M on-campus football stadium, the creation of a women's golf program, three-time recognition for the department's diversity strategy and the hiring of 11 head coaches. UA student-athletes also generously gave back the community during Rhoades' tenure providing more than 5,000 service hours to the greater Akron area during each of the 2006-07 and 2007-08 academic years.

He served as a member of the NCAA Division I Championships/Sports Management Cabinet--as well as its Administrative Committee, and led the Mid-American Conference External Affairs Committee. Rhoades also helped then-MAC Commissioner Rick Chryst negotiate an unprecedented TV contract for the league with ESPN.

Rhoades went to Akron after seven years at UTEP, where he worked his way up the department ranks to become the Miners Executive Senior Associate Athletics Director after starting as Assistant Athletics Director for Development. In his final position at UTEP, Rhoades oversaw all fundraising, the marketing and media relations offices as well as football external operations, men's basketball, men's golf, licensing, Miner Athletic Club and the athletics ticket office.

Baylor director of women's tennis Joey Scrivano is in his 19th season with Baylor in 2020-21.

In his 18 seasons leading the Baylor women's tennis program, Scrivano has put his Bears among the nation's elite, along with 19 combined Big 12 Conference championships between regular season and tournament titles. Scrivano led Baylor to an impressive 14-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament from 2005-18, and Baylor earned trips to the NCAA Final Four in 2008 and 2011. During that 14-year span, Baylor compiled an astounding 125-16 (.887) record. Scrivano was promoted from head coach to the director of women's tennis in July 2016.

Scrivano's impressive 145-28 (.838) mark in the Big 12, accompanies a 391-152 (.720) mark overall as the leader of the Baylor program. In his time at BU, he has been named the Big 12 Coach of the Year six times (2006, 2008, 2009, 2013, 2014, 2015) and the ITA Regional Coach of the Year three times (2006, 2008, 2010). In 10 of the last 15 seasons, the Bears punched tickets to the NCAA Sweet 16 and are a mainstay in the NCAA Tournament advancing to the postseason in 15 of the last 17 years.

With 451 career head-coaching victories entering into the 2020-21 season, Scrivano ranks 25th all-time among NCAA women's tennis coaches and has the 12th most among active coaches. His .726 winning percentage is 16th best among active coaches and 26th best all-time.

Individually, Baylor has had an enormous amount of success under Scrivano. In 2005, Zuzana Zemenova became the first unseeded player in NCAA history to win the NCAA singles title. Zemenova, a five-time NCAA All-American, also earned her way back to the singles title match in 2008. Scrivano coached standout Lenka Broosova to BU career records for singles and doubles victories over her four years at Baylor. Most recently, Scrivano mentored Blair Shankle to singles All-American recognition after advancing to the NCAA round of 16 in 2017. In addition to achieving the highest individual singles ranking in program history (No. 3), Shankle garnered 2017 ITA Most Improved Senior and 2017 CoSIDA All-Academic All-America Third Team recognition. Shankle, the first player in program history to earn All-America accolades on the court and in the classroom, became the ninth player to register 100 career singles wins.

Twenty-Nine All-Americans have come thru Baylor on Scrivano's watch, including Broosova's five, Zemenova's five and Shankle's three honors.

Outside of his collegiate duties, Scrivano has twice been chosen to captain Texas' junior team at the USTA Girls 18s National Team Championships in 2013, 2015 and 2019. He has been instrumental in spreading youth tennis in the Waco community by starting the Baylor Cub Tennis program, which is a free clinic for area youths prior to home matches. The program has grown tremendously and is now in its sixth year.

The COVID-19 pandemic shortened what was looking to be a bounce-back season for Baylor under Scrivano. The Bears had compiled a 10-2 record and had won their first two Big 12 matches before the season was suspended. Baylor finished ranked No. 22 by the ITA.

Baylor's 2018-19 campaign was hampered by injuries and the Bears collected a 9-21 overall record, a 2-7 mark in Big 12 Conference play and advanced to the Big 12 Championship second round. Livia Kraus and Jessica Hinojosa earned All-Big 12 second team honors while Kris Sorokolet and Angie Shakhraichuk teamed up for second-team honors on the doubles court in the Big 12.

In 2017-18, The Bears' 18-14 overall record propelled the team to its 14th-straight NCAA Tournament. The Bears won eight of their last 11 regular-season matches and upset No. 18 Kansas to earn a spot in the semifinals round of the Big 12 Championship before falling to eventual champion, Texas.

In 2016-17, Scrivano led the Bears to the NCAA tournament after recording a 22-7 record overall and an 8-2 mark in Big 12 action. Baylor protected its home court with a perfect regular season record of 15-0. Four Lady Bears earned All-Big 12 recognition, led by first team singles and

doubles selection and eventual singles All-American senior Blair Shankle. Fellow senior Rhiann Newborn earned her first career honor with a second team All-Big 12 singles selection. Baylor, which advanced to the NCAA second round for the 13th consecutive year, closed the season with a No. 17 national ranking.

In 2016, Scrivano rallied his young squad with only one senior from a 5-11 record to close the year on a 13-4 run. After starting Big 12 play at 2-2, the Bears won four of their next five conference matches to tie for second in league play. Despite an early first round exit from the conference tournament, Scrivano's team earned its 12th-consecutive berth to the NCAA Championships and went on to upset No. 26 Wake Forest, 4-2, in first round action, before falling to fifth-ranked host Georgia. The Bears ended the year with an 18-15 record and final ranking of No. 40. Meanwhile, individually Blair Shankle ended the year at No. 75 in singles after a 16-6 season. She partnered with Kiah Generette to rank No. 22 in doubles as the duo advanced to the second round of the NCAA Championships.

In 2015, Scrivano led BU back to the NCAA quarterfinals for the first time since 2011 with a 28-7 record and a No. 8 national ranking. For his work, Scrivano was named the Big 12 Coach of the Year for the sixth time. At the conference level, Scrivano coached Baylor to a sweep of Big 12 regular season and conference championship titles. Individually, Scrivano mentored senior Ema Burgic, as she closed out a historic career by earning All-America honors in both singles and doubles. Sophomore Blair Shankle tallied doubles All-America accolades for a second-straight year.

In 2014, Scrivano guided his team to titles in the Big 12 regular season and at the conference championship. With a solid core group made up of three seniors, Scrivano's squad produced a 26-7 overall record and ended the season ranked No. 14 in the country. BU advanced to the NCAA round of 16, but the Lady Bears were at their best in Big 12 play, tallying the program's seventh undefeated (9-0) league season and the first since 2010. Scrivano was named Big 12 Coach of the Year, his fifth league honor. Individually, Scrivano helped Shankle have a breakout freshman season, as she led the team with 24 victories. He also mentored returning All-American Burgic through injuries as she rebounded to be named the Big 12 Championship Most Outstanding Player. Shankle partnered with Victoria Kisialeva to earn All-America doubles honors by advancing to the NCAA doubles championship quarterfinals.

In 2013, Scrivano earned Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year honors by guiding a young squad to the program's ninth consecutive NCAA appearance and ninth Big 12 regular season title. After starting the season 7-13, Scrivano led his team to nine consecutive victories and an 8-1 conference mark. The Lady Bears finished the season with wins in 10 of their last 12 matches to post a 17-15 overall record. Baylor ended the season ranked No. 20, and Scrivano helped sophomore Burgic earn Big 12 Player of the Year honors and All-American status with a No. 11 final ranking. Scrivano also coached Burgic and Kisialeva to a No. 10 final ranking, as the duo earned doubles All-America recognition.

In 2012, the Lady Bears finished second in the Big 12, posting a 25-8 overall record and a 7-2 mark in conference play. Scrivano led the team to its eighth consecutive NCAA round of 16 run. Five Lady Bears finished in the Top 20 in singles and three placed in the Top 10 in doubles in the ITA Texas Region rankings.

During the 2011 season, Scrivano led the Lady Bears to their second NCAA Final Four appearance in the last four seasons and finished the year with a 29-4 record, including Big 12 regular season and tournament championships. Baylor ended the season ranked No. 6, marking the fourth consecutive season it finished the year in the Top 6.

In 2010, Scrivano's team completed its third consecutive undefeated (11-0) Big 12 regular season and went on to win its fifth consecutive Big 12 tournament championship. Baylor, which achieved the program's first No. 1 ranking, entered the NCAA Team Championship as the top overall seed, but fell to eventual champion Stanford, 4-2, in the quarterfinal round. Baylor held the nation's No. 1 ranking for five weeks during the season.

The Lady Bears were represented in the 2010 NCAA singles championship by Broosova, who finished in the round of 16, and Nina Secerbegovic, who earned a spot in the quarterfinals and ended the season with a team-best 43 singles victories. Secerbegovic and Broosova were named All-Americans for their performances, while Broosova teamed with Csilla Borsanyi in the doubles tournament to earn All-America honors after reaching the quarterfinal round.

Scrivano kept the Bears at the top of the Big 12 and on the brink of a second Final Four appearance in 2009. After winning his fifth consecutive Big 12 regular season title and fifth consecutive Big 12 tournament title, Scrivano led the Bears to the Elite Eight before losing, 4-3, to fifth-seeded Notre Dame and ending the season ranked No. 6 nationally. In addition, Scrivano's doubles tandem of Broosova and Borsanyi made a spectacular run to the Final Four in NCAA doubles action.

A banner year came for the Lady Bears in 2008, which compiled a 32-3 dual match record, went 11-0 in Big 12 regular season play, achieved a midseason ranking of No. 2 in the nation and finished the season ranked No. 4.

Scrivano coached his 2007 Lady Bears to their third consecutive Big 12 regular-season title. Scrivano's squad finished the season with a 24-7 record, capturing the Big 12 tournament championship for the second-straight season and advanced to the NCAA round of 16 for the third time in as many years.

In 2007, Zemenova earned her third consecutive Big 12 Player of the

Year award and the Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship and Leadership Award, an honor not bestowed upon a Baylor athlete since 1997. Along with Zemenova's storied success, first-year member Broosova made her mark, winning the Big 12 No. 3 singles title and earning Southwest Region Rookie of the Year honors.

In 2006, the Lady Bears claimed their third Big 12 regular season title, going undefeated (11-0) for the second-straight year, and tallying their first Big 12 postseason championship after defeating Texas in the finals. In the NCAA Tournament, Baylor soared through the first three rounds, before falling to No. 4 Florida. Baylor's advancement to the quarterfinals was a first in program history.

Under Scrivano's guidance, the 2005 Lady Bears posted a 24-6 mark and ended the year ranked No. 14 in the ITA Poll. Baylor produced the program's first perfect Big 12 record, breezing through league play with an 11-0 mark. Freshman sensation Zemenova claimed the NCAA singles championship, becoming the first unseeded NCAA champion and the program's first singles All-American. Zemenova was also named the women's tennis Honda Broderick Award winner.

Scrivano came to Baylor from the University of South Alabama, where he led the women's tennis team to three conference championships and three NCAA Tournament berths in his first three years as head coach. Scrivano accomplished the same feat in his first year at the helm of Baylor's women's program. In fact, he guided the Lady Bears to their first Big 12 championship in women's tennis.

Scrivano, who was hired in July of 2002 as Baylor's associate director of intercollegiate tennis and head women's tennis coach, inherited a team that had placed fourth in the Big 12 the previous season, was bypassed for the NCAA Tournament, graduated an All-American, lost the Big 12 Freshman of the Year and returned only three position players. Scrivano was able to bring in players to bolster the roster and dramatically improved the returning players. The result, a 9-2 Big 12 record and a conference championship. The fact that the Lady Bears did so well was impressive given the fact that they had only one player ranked among the Top 100 in singles all season and no doubles tandem ranked at all.

Scrivano knew about Baylor and its tennis facilities prior to taking the job. He got a look at the Baylor tennis program and facilities during the 2002 season when he brought his then-40th ranked South Alabama team to the Baylor Tennis Center and promptly handed Baylor's 19th-ranked team a 7-0 blanking.

While he was head coach at the University of South Alabama, the Jaguars posted a 60-18 record and won three-straight Sun Belt Conference titles in three seasons. In addition, the Jaguars made it to the round of 16 in the 2000 NCAA Tournament and to the second round in each of his last two seasons.

Scrivano was twice named Sun Belt Coach of the Year (2001, 2002) and was selected ITA South Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

Scrivano joined the South Alabama staff in 1999 as a men's and women's assistant coach. He helped guide the women's program to its first NCAA Elite Eight appearance, beating No. 8 UCLA and No. 9 Pepperdine along the way. He served as an assistant coach at Northwestern in 1998 and an assistant coach at the University of Mobile in 1997.

Scrivano has also been the head coach three times for the Tennis Europe National Team, which prepared U.S. juniors for ITF European tournaments.

His broad range of experience in the collegiate ranks and with U.S. juniors, serves him well in tennis recruiting wars, which are an important part of building a successful collegiate tennis program.

Scrivano played collegiate tennis at Eastern Michigan University, where he received a bachelor of science degree in communication in 1997.

Scrivano is a native of Cambridge, Ontario, Canada. He married the former Courtney Pahmeyer in November 2014. The couple has two sons, Nicolo and Luca. Courtney also works in the Baylor Athletics department as Assistant AD for Marketing.

Baylor Athletics Hall of Famer Lenka Broosova returned to Baylor as the Associate Head Coach in December of 2020.

Broosova comes to Baylor following a seven-year stint as an Assistant Coach at the University of Tulsa. There, she helped lead the Golden Hurricane to three American Athletic Conference titles in 2015, 2016 and 2018. She was promoted to Associate Head Coach in 2017, and she also helped guide Tulsa to the NCAA Round of 16 in 2018 while the program achieved its highest NCAA ranking at No. 14.

Prior to her time at Tulsa, she played two years professionally from 2011-12 and was Baylor's Director of Tennis Operations from 2010-11.

Broosova should be no stranger to Baylor tennis fans. Her impressive resume on the court for the Bears resulted in a 2020 induction into the Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame. She left Baylor with 154 singles wins and 120 career doubles victories – both of which stand as the all-time record.

A three-time All-American in doubles and two-time All-American in singles, Broosova was named the Big 12 Player of the Year as a senior in 2010. She helped Baylor to a sweep of the Big 12 regular-season and tournament titles in her four-year career (2007-10) and four NCAA Tournament appearances, including the NCAA semifinals in 2008 and the quarterfinals as a senior when the Bears achieved their first-ever No. 1 ranking.

Broosova graduated from Baylor in 2010 with a degree in speech communication, and she is a native of Banksa Bystrica, Slovakia.

## BIG 12 CONFERENCE STANDINGS

Baylor's success in the Big 12 under head coach Joey Scrivano has been unparalleled. Since Scrivano took over in 2003, Baylor has a combined league mark of 143-28, including an 126-23 run over the past 15 seasons. The Lady Bears have won 10 of the last 15 Big 12 regular-season titles and eight of the last 14 tournament crowns.

Until an early season conference loss to Kansas State in 2011, Baylor registered 57 consecutive victories over Big 12 opponents, including 43 in a row in the regular season. The streak lasted from March 4, 2007 until March 18, 2011, spanning more than four years.
