STORY LINES

- No. 2 Baylor heads to Lubbock for a top-15 matchup against Texas Tech at 3 pm CT Saturday.
- Saturday is the 141st series meeting dating back to 1937 and the first with both teams top-15 ranked.
- Baylor is 21-9 vs. Texas Tech since 2006, including 8-7 in games in Lubbock.
- BU won 57-52 in Lubbock on Jan. 7 last season, recording its first win in Lubbock since 2016.
- Baylor is 1 of 5 undefeated teams (min. 5 gms) and joins Michigan as the only undefeated Power-5 teams.
- BU leads the nation in scoring margin (+27.8) and ranks top-10 nationally in 3FG% (3rd, .428), turnover margin (4th, +7.3), scoring (5th, 89.0), assists (5th, 19.7), effective FG% (5th, .590), steal percentage (5th, 13.4), turnovers forced (5th, 19.3), offensive rebound pct. (6th, .387) and assist-turnover ratio (10th, 1.64).
- Baylor has won a school-record 11 consecutive games by double-digits (previous record 8 in 2011-12).
- Baylor is the nation's only team to win every game by 8+ points this season (min. 4 games played).
- BU has led by at least 13 points in every game this season and has led by 13+ at halftime in 8 of 11.
- Baylor's largest deficit this season is 4 points, and BU has trailed for only 19:07 of 440 minutes (4.3%).
- With a win, BU will start a season 12-0 for the 5th time in program history (1912, 2001, 2012, 2017).
- Baylor looks to start 5-0 in Big 12 play for the 3rd time in program history (1998, 2020).
- Baylor is 7-1 against ranked teams over the last two seasons, including a 4-0 mark away from home.
- BU's bench is out-scoring opposing benches 36-17 on average and has scored 33+ points in 9 of 11 games.
- Three members of the BU bench average 9+ ppg Flagler (10.1), Mayer (9.3) and Tchatchoua (9.0).
- Three members of the Bu bench average 9+ ppg Flagier (10.1), wayer (9.3) and Tchatchoua (9.0).
 Six Boars are exercise at least one mode 2 pointer per gome and sheeting at least 40% from 2 points.
- Six Bears are averaging at least one made 3-pointer per game and shooting at least 40% from 3-point range: Mayer (48), Cryer (46), Flagler (44), Butler (43), Mitchell (41) and Teague (40).
- Head coach Scott Drew is in his 18th season in Waco and is BU's all-time wins leader (353-213).
- Baylor is playing its 253rd game as a ranked team under Drew BU was ranked in 2 of 2197 games over the program's 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 250 of 432 games.
- Baylor has been top-5 ranked for 19-straight weeks. BU was top-5 for 12 weeks all-time prior to this streak.
- BU's streak of 28-straight AP polls ranked is the nation's 5th-longest active streak and longest in BU history.
- Baylor has led by at least 5 points in all 41 games since the start of 2019-20 (double-digit lead in 35 of 41).
- Baylor is 44-40 in Big 12 road games over the last 10 seasons, second-best behind Kansas (56-28).
- BU is 10-2 in Big 12 road games over the last 2 seasons (rest of league is 36-65 in B12 road games).
- BU has held 6 of its last 8 opponents to season-lows in points-per-poss., including each of the last 3 games.
- BU's defense has forced 14+ turnovers in 7 of its last 8 games, including 5 games with 20+ TOs forced.
- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in 3 of the last 5 seasons.
- BU is 1 of 5 Power-5 schools (Duke, Kentucky, UNC, Michigan St.) to win 18+ every year since 2008.
- Baylor returned four All-Big 12 players from a 2019-20 team which went 26-4 and spent five weeks ranked No. 1 nationally. The Bears finished last season ranked No. 4 in the coaches poll (No. 5 in AP).
- Baylor signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history (No. 4) in November. BU inked 5-star Kendall Brown, 4-star Langston Love and 4-star Jeremy Sochan for the 2021-22 season.

QUICK HITS

- Baylor needs a win to tie the 5th-longest winning streak in program history at 12-straight.
- BU was picked to win the Big 12 in the league's preseason coaches' poll for the first time.
- Baylor is 61-5 when leading at halftime over the last 4 seasons (31-2 last 2 seasons, 10-0 this season).
- Baylor has won 90% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (179-21).
- BU is 125-23 since 2015-16 when leading at any point in the 2nd half of a game (37-3 last 2 seasons).
- Baylor's 23-game winning streak last season was the longest ever by a Big 12 team (previously 22 by 1996-97 KU).
- BU's 13-game conference winning streak last year was the longest in school history (previously 11 in 1946 SWC).
- Baylor has won 20+ games in 11 of the last 13 seasons after recording only three 20-win seasons in the previous 100 years of Baylor Basketball (1946, 1948, 1988).
- Baylor is 228-97 over the last 10 seasons, averaging 24 wins per season since 2011-12.
- Baylor's 228 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (273).
- Baylor is 319-144 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- Eight of Baylor's players either have used or are currently using a redshirt year. Four after transferring to BU Flagler, Mitchell, Tchamwa Tchatchoua and Teague, and four as freshmen — Moffatt, Turner, Vital and Dainja.
- Nine of Baylor's 10 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (15 of last 16 seasons).
- Baylor is 1 of 14 teams nationally to appear in every postseason since 2012 (6 NCAAs, 2 NITs).
- Baylor has the nation's 10th-longest active streak with at least one 3-point FG made in 943 straight games the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was more than 30 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- Scott Drew became Baylor head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 18th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (353).
- Drew is coaching his 567th game at Baylor (353-213). His .624 winning pct. is best in BU history among coaches with 40+ games, and he's the program's all-time wins leader with 152 more victories than any other coach.
- Baylor has a .689 winning percentage (319-144) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .702 winning percentage (228-97) over the last 10 seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (50) is the youngest of 12 coaches nationally to take his current program to four Sweet 16s since 2010.
- Baylor is playing its 253rd game as a ranked team in Drew's 18 seasons. BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program's first 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 250 of 432 games.
- BU is 1 of 5 Power-5 schools (Duke, Kentucky, UNC, Michigan State) with 18+ wins in every season since 2008.
- In Drew's first 17 seasons at Baylor, 44 players have gone on to professional careers.

DOMINANT DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCES

- BU has held 6 of its last 8 opponents to season-lows in points-per-possession, including each of the last 3 games.
- In 3 games in 2021, Baylor has held lowa State to a season-low 0.86 PPP on its home court, limited Oklahoma to a season-low 0.92 PPP and then held TCU to a season-low 0.75 PPP on its home court.
- Prior to those 3 games, BU held SFA (0.67), UAPB (0.59) and Central Arkansas (0.71) to season-low PPPs.

- The Bears return home to host No. 6 Kansas at 8 pm CT on ESPN's Big Monday.
- BU then heads back on the road to face Oklahoma State in Stillwater at 1 pm CT Saturday on CBS.

A WIN WOULD ...

- Be Drew's 354th win at Baylor and improve Baylor's record to 320-144 since 2007-08.
- Tie the 5th-longest winning streak in program history and mark the 6th winning streak of 12+ games by Baylor.
- Make Baylor 12-0 for the fifth time in program history (1912, 2001, 2012, 2017, 2021).
- Mark the 3rd time Baylor has started Big 12 play 5-0 (1998, 2020, 2021).
- Improve Baylor to 40-10 all-time when playing as an AP Top 5 team.

SERIES HISTORY

- Saturday is the 141st all-time series meeting between Baylor and Texas Tech dating back to 1937.
- The teams have met twice annually since 1958, but this is the first meeting with both teams top-15 ranked.
- Baylor is 60-80 in the series, including a 19-49 mark in Lubbock and a 21-13 mark in the Scott Drew era.
- Baylor is 21-9 vs. Texas Tech since 2006, including 8-7 in Lubbock.

LAST SEASON VS. TEXAS TECH

- BU swept the season series for the first time since 2015 with a 57-52 win in Lubbock and a 71-68 win in Waco.
- Baylor held No. 22 Texas Tech to a season-low 52 points in the win in Lubbock on Jan. 7. The 52 points were the
 fewest scored in a home game by a Chris Beard-coached team in his 5-year collegiate career.
- Baylor out-rebounded Texas Tech 44-25, grabbing more of its own misses than Tech (17 offensive rebounds vs. Tech's 15 defensive rebounds) and turning 17 offensive boards into 15 second-chance points.
- The rematch in Waco on March 2 went to OT, with BU pulling out a 71-68 victory. Devonte Bandoo hit a 3-pointer to tie it at 60 with 1:40 left, and the teams combined for 5 turnovers and only 1 shot the rest of regulation.
- MaCio Teague's step-back 3-pointer with 1:13 left in OT gave BU a 69-65 lead and provided the winning points.

FOUR ALL-BIG 12 PLAYERS RETURN

- All five Baylor starters were named to 2020 All-Big 12 teams, making BU the first team in the league's 24-year history with five players on All-Big 12 teams, and four of those players returned for the 2020-21 season.
- Jared Butler became Baylor's first underclassman named first-team All-Conference since Terry Teagle in 1980, and he was named a consensus third-team All-American. He's the Bears' first AP Preseason All-American.
- MaCio Teague has been all-conference in all three of his previous seasons. He was a first-team All-Big South honoree while at UNC Asheville in 2017 and 2018 and earned second-team All-Big 12 honors in 2020.
- Mark Vital and Davion Mitchell were both third-team All-Big 12 and Big 12 All-Defensive Team choices.

ONE OF FOUR PROGRAMS RANKED NO. 1 THREE TIMES SINCE 2017

- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in three seasons since 2017.
- BU was No. 1 for the first time on Jan. 9, 2017, spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 2020 and was No. 1 in the preseason and week 1 coaches' polls this year. All told, BU has been No. 1 for eight weeks since 2017.
- The Bears have been ranked in 24 of 25 AP Top 25 spots during the Drew era (all since 2008). The only spot Baylor hasn't been ranked in the AP poll is No. 8.

NINETEEN STRAIGHT WEEKS AP TOP-5 RANKED

- BU is No. 2 in this week's AP Top 25, extending its school-record streak to 19 straight weeks top-5 ranked. The Bears were top-5 ranked in 12 total weeks in program history prior to the current streak.
- Baylor's 5-week streak at No. 1 last season was the longest since Kentucky in 2015.
- Baylor has been in the AP Top 25 a school-record 28-straight weeks, which is the nation's 5th-longest active streak behind only Kansas (227), Duke (90), Gonzaga (85) and Villanova (30).

BREAKTHROUGH IN BIG 12

- BU is 118-80 in Big 12 play in 12 seasons since 2010 after going 59-149 in the league's first 13 seasons.
- BU is 132-97 in Big 12 play in 14 seasons since 2008 after going 45-131 in the league's first 11 seasons.
- Baylor is 44-40 in Big 12 road games since 2012, second-best in the league behind only Kansas (56-27).
- BU has won 8+ Big 12 games in 9 straight seasons after winning 8+ just 3 times in the league's first 15 years.
- BU has recorded double-digit Big 12 wins in 5 of the last 6 years and 7 of the last 11 seasons.

SECOND-MOST WINS AMONG BIG 12 TEAMS SINCE 2011-12

- Baylor's 228-97 record since 2011-12 trails only Kansas (274-66) among Big 12 teams (thru 1/15/21).
- West Virginia (199-124) is 3rd, Iowa State (197-119) is 4th, Kansas State (187-130) and Oklahoma (187-121) are tied for 5th, Texas (180-137) is 7th, Oklahoma St. (171-138) is 8th, Texas Tech (170-140) is 9th and TCU (161-155) is 10th.
- Baylor has averaged 24.1 wins per season over the last nine full seasons since 2011-12.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Drew is in his 18th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (353).
- Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren't ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school — Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson and Taurean Prince.
- Drew has graduated 52 players during his Baylor tenure, averaging 3 graduates per season.
- The Bears have advanced to postseason play in a school-record eight straight seasons (6 NCAA, 2 NIT).
- Baylor is 23-4 in regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, including 4 regular-season tournament titles.
- Drew has won 20+ games in 11 of the last 13 years the Bears had 3 seasons of 20+ wins prior to his arrival.

PROTECTING HALFTIME LEADS

- BU is 64-5 in its last 69 games when leading at halftime 10-0 in 2021, 21-2 in 2020, 15-3 in 2019 and 15-0 in 2018.
- Baylor has won 90% of its games (179-21) when leading at the half since 2011-12 (10-0 in 2021, 21-2 in 2020, 15-3 in 2019, 15-0 in 2018, 18-3 in 2017, 18-2 in 2016, 21-7 in 2015, 18-2 in 2014, 17-1 in 2013 and 26-1 in 2012).
- BU has won 39% of games in which its been tied or trailing at the half since 2011-12, going 49-76 in those.

BEARS ARE 7-1 VS. RANKED TEAMS OVER LAST TWO SEASONS

- Baylor is 7-1 against top-25 ranked teams since the start of the 2019-20 season. The Bears last loss against a ranked team before that stretch was to No. 4-ranked Gonzaga in the 2019 NCAA Tournament second round.
- BU is 4-0 away from home vs. ranked teams over the last two seasons, with neutral wins vs. No. 17 Villanova (Nov. 2019) and No. 5 Illinois (Nov. 2020) and wins at No. 22 Texas Tech (Jan. 2020) and at No. 4 Kansas (Jan. 2020).

THIRTY WINS VS. RANKED TEAMS IN LAST FIVE SEASONS

- Baylor has gone 30-33 against ranked teams since the start of the 2014-15 season (6-1 last season).
- BU is 48-73 against AP-ranked teams since 2007-08 after going 17-122 in the program's first 101 seasons.
- Baylor has won multiple games vs. AP Top 25 teams in each of the last 13 seasons entering 2020-21. The Bears have defeated at least five ranked teams in five of the last seven seasons dating back to 2013-14.

BUTLER BACK AFTER ALL-AMERICA SOPHOMORE SEASON

- Jared Butler was named to the Sporting News All-America Third Team and All-Big 12 First Team, becoming Baylor's first underclassman to earn All-America or All-Conference first team honors since Terry Teagle in 1980.
- Butler ranks top-5 in the Big 12 in steals (1st), assists (2nd), scoring (3rd), FG% (2nd) and A-T ratio (5th).
- Butler has 13 career games with 20+ points, including 2 games with 30+ points 22 vs. PVAM, 31 at Kansas, 30 vs. UCA, 22 vs. Villanova, 20 vs. UMES, 22 at Kansas, 20 at K-State, 21 vs. WVU, 22 at Oklahoma, 21 at WVU, 20 vs. Washington, 21 at Iowa State and 28 at TCU.
- Over the last 2 seasons, Butler has 20-point games on the road against six of nine Big 12 opponents, with the only
 exceptions at Texas Tech, at Texas and at Oklahoma State.

TEAGUE LOOKING FOR FOURTH ALL-CONFERENCE SEASON

- MaCio Teague has earned all-conference honors in all 3 collegiate seasons All-Big South First Team in 2017 and 2018 at UNC Asheville and All-Big 12 Second Team in 2020 at Baylor.
- Teague ranks 6th in the Big 12 in scoring, 5th in the league in FG%, 7th in FT% and 7th in 3-pointers made.
- Teague is the nation's only active player with 1,500+ career points (1,639), 400+ rebounds (475), 225+ assists (243), 125+ steals (125) and 200+ made 3-pointers (250).
- Teague has led the Bears in scoring in 11 of his last 23 games played (5 of 11 this season).
- Teague played in 90 consecutive games and made 86 consecutive starts before sitting out two games with a broken wrist. He has started all but 3 games (Nov. 20, 2016, Feb. 18, 2020, Feb. 22, 2020) in his career.
- Baylor is 31-1 when Teague scores 10+ points he's averaging 9.5 ppg in 4 losses while at Baylor (8, 8, 13, 9).

MITCHELL RETURNS AS STARTING POINT GUARD

- Davion Mitchell was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, selected to the All-Big 12 Third Team and Big 12 All-Defensive Team and was a unanimous choice on the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.
- Mitchell leads the Big 12 in assists and steals and ranks 3rd in assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Mitchell has started all 41 games at BU after coming off the bench in all 34 games as an Auburn freshman (2017-18).
- Mitchell has made a 3-pointer in 29 of the last 37 games and is shooting 37% on 3FGs in that stretch (50-of-136). Prior to that stretch, he shot .264 (19-of-72) from downtown over his first 38 collegiate games.
- When Mitchell has played 20+ minutes, his collegiate teams are 48-4 (12-0 at Auburn, 36-4 at Baylor).
- When Mitchell scores 10+ points, his collegiate teams are 23-1 (2-0 at Auburn, 21-1 at Baylor).

BENCH TRIO SCORING WITH EFFICIENCY

- Adam Flagler, Matthew Mayer and LJ Cryer give the Bears a trio of efficient shooters off the bench.
- All 3 are shooting at least 44% from 3-point range Mayer (.478), Cryer (.452), Flagler (.439) and combined they've shot .453 from behind the arc (43-of-95) and averaged 3.9 made 3-pointers per game.
- Flagler has scored in double-figures in 6 of 9 games played this season, including three games with 15+ points, Mayer has 10+ points in 5 of 11 games, and Cryer has twice scored 15+ points off the bench.
- Flagler has made at least one 3-pointer in 43 of 45 collegiate games. He's made multiple 3-pointers in 38 of 45 career games, including 24 games with 3+ made treys.
- Mayer has scored in double-figures in 4 of the last 6 games (10.5 ppg) and has posted at least 6 points off the bench in 10 of 11 games this season. He's shooting 57% inside the arc and leads the team with 24.4 points per 40 minutes.
- Cryer has made a 3-pointer in 6 of 7 games with an attempt and is shooting .452 from 3-point range.

VITAL TO BEARS' SUCCESS

- Mark Vital is back after being named one of 4 Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Award finalists in 2020.
- He was named to the All-Big 12 Third Team and was a unanimous All-Defensive Team selection.
- In Baylor's Nov. 29, 2020 game vs. Washington, Vital's 15 rebounds matched all Washington players combined (15). That was the second time Vital accompished the feat, after doing so for the first time at Arizona in 2018.
- Vital did not attempt a field goal in the Feb. 1, 2020 win over TCU, but he had a + 13 plus-minus in 22 minutes.

TCHAMWA TCHATCHOUA PROVIDING SPARK OFF BENCH

- Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua has played 15+ minutes off the bench in every game this season, including 7 games with 20+ minutes. He's had at least 6 points and 4 rebounds in 10 of 11 games.
- Tchamwa Tchatchoua has made 55% of his FGs on dunks (22-of-40), including all 5 in the win over Washington.
- Tchamwa Tchatchoua leads the Bears and ranks 7th in the Big 12 with 7.2 rebounds per game.

GAME-BY-GAME RUNDOWN

- Baylor opened with a 112-82 win over ULL on Nov. 28. BU's 112 points were its most since 2017.
- BU then beat Washington 86-52 on Nov. 29 in Las Vegas, out-rebounding the Huskies 50-19.
- Baylor won 82-69 over No. 5 Illinois in Indianapolis on Dec. 2, recording the 9th top-5 win in program history.
- BU defeated SFA 83-52 on Dec. 9, turning a Ferrell Center-record 35 turnovers into 40 points off turnovers.
- Baylor won at K-State 100-69 on Dec. 19, becoming the first team to score 100 in Manhattan since 1992.
- The Bears rolled to a 99-42 win over UAPB on Dec. 21, with Baylor's bench out-scoring UAPB's 55-0.
- BU returned from break with a 93-56 win over UCA on Dec. 29, led by Davion Mitchell's career-high 12 assists.
- Baylor wrapped up 2020 with a 105-76 win over Alcorn State on Dec. 30, scoring a season-high 59 first-half points.
- Baylor earned a hard-fought 76-65 win at Iowa State on Jan. 2, despite season-lows of 76 points and 10 assists.
- BU improved to 10-0 with a 76-61 win over Oklahoma on Jan. 6. BU's defense held OU to a season-low 61 points.
- BU overcame its first halftime deficit of the year by out-scoring TCU 40-21 in the 2nd half in a 67-49 win on Jan. 9.

BEARS SHAKE OFF SLOW START TO RECORD ROAD WIN AT TCU

- Baylor faced a halftime deficit for the first time all season after Mike Miles hit a buzzer-beating 60-footer to give TCU
 a 28-27 lead at the break, but the Bears responded and led for the final 19:39 in a 67-49 win over TCU on Jan. 9.
- The Bears shot just 1-of-10 from 3-point range in the first half, but went 5-of-9 in the second half. Baylor's
 defense held TCU to 33% shooting in both halves and forced 22 turnovers.

BU HOLDS SOONER OFFENSE IN CHECK FOR 10TH-STRAIGHT WIN

- Baylor jumped out to a 16-2 lead and Oklahoma never got closer than 5 points the rest of the way, as the Bears held the Sooners to a season-low scoring output in a 76-61 win on Jan. 6 in Waco.
- BU's bench out-scored OU's 40-9, led by 16 points from Matthew Mayer and 15 points from Adam Flagler.

BEARS FIGHT FOR TOUGH ROAD WIN AT IOWA STATE

- Despite season-lows of 76 points and 10 assists, BU held on for a hard-fought 76-65 win at lowa State on Jan. 2.
- Baylor committed 17 turnovers, but forced 21 ISU turnovers. BU shot a season-wost 4-for-19 from distance.
- Jared Butler led BU with 21 points, 5 assists and 4 steals, while Mitchell and Teague added 13 points apiece.

BU TOPS CENTURY MARK FOR THIRD TIME IN WIN OVER ALCORN

- Playing its second game in as many days, the Bears rolled to a 105-76 win over Alcorn State on Dec. 30.
- The Bears' three starting guards combined for 45 points (13-22 FGs, 13-13 FTs), 16 assists and only 4 turnovers, led by **Davion Mitchell**, who posted his second-career double-double with 10 points and 10 assists.
- Six Bears scored in double-figures, including career-highs of 10 points for Jordan Turner and Zach Loveday.

BEARS ROAR BACK FROM BREAK IN WIN OVER CENTRAL ARKANSAS

- Baylor returned from its Christmas break with a 93-56 win over Central Arkansas on Dec. 29.
- The Bears posted 25 assists against only 10 turnovers, including a career-high 12 assists from Davion Mitchell.
- Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua had his first double-double of the season with 13 points and 11 boards.

BENCH TAKES CARE OF BUSINESS VS. UAPB

- Baylor's bench scored more points than the entire UAPB team in the Bears' 99-42 win on Dec. 21. The BU bench out-scored UAPB's bench 55-0, with a team-high 15 points from freshman LJ Cryer.
- BU committed only 5 turnovers, forced 23 turnovers and had 25 assists on 37 made field goals.

NO RUST FOR BU OFFENSE IN BIG 12 OPENER AT K-STATE

- Despite going 9 days without a game and having only two days of practice before its Big 12 opener at Kansas State, BU rolled to a 100-69 victory on Dec. 19, becoming the first team to score 100 in Manhattan since 1992.
- Two Baylor guards posted double-doubles, with MaCio Teague's 23 points and 10 rebounds and Jared Butler's 14 points and career-high 13 assists. Davion Mitchell added a career-high 20 points.

BU FORCES 35 TURNOVERS IN DOMINANT WIN OVER SFA

- Baylor forced a Ferrell Center-record 35 turnovers and rolled to an 83-52 win over SFA in its Dec. 9 home opener.
- The Bears snapped SFA's 18-game winning streak (which was the nation's 2nd-longest active streak) and handed SFA its largest margin-of-defeat in more than two years a 38-point loss at Miami on Nov. 13, 2018.

BEARS NOTCH TOP-5 WIN OVER ILLINOIS IN JIMMY V CLASSIC

- Baylor recorded its first ranked win of the season by beating No. 5 Illinois 82-69 in the Jimmy V Classic on Dec. 2.
- Four BU guards all scored in double-figures and combined for 56 points, led by Adam Flagler's 18 off the bench.
- There were 10 lead changes in the game, and score was tied 43-43 with 13:16 left. BU used a 6-0 run to take the lead for good, and put the game away with a 9-0 run over 75 seconds to take a 65-61 lead with 7 minutes left.
- After being out-rebounded 25-18 in the first half, Baylor out-rebounded the Illini 20-10 after the break.

TWO 30-POINT WINS IN VEGAS TO OPEN SEASON

- Baylor's season started three days later than expected, but the Bears came out strong scoring 112 points in a 30-point win over Louisiana-Lafayette and then taking down Washington 86-52 the following day.
- The Bears drained 15 treys and had 25 assists on their way to 112 points in the opener vs. Louisiana-Lafayette.
- BU out-rebounded Washington 50-19, with Mark Vital (15) recording as many rebounds as all Washington players combined (15 + 4 team rebounds). It was the second time Vital accomplished that feat (2018-19 at Arizona).

BEARS INK HIGHEST-RANKED RECRUITING CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY FOR 2021-22

- Baylor signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history in November, inking a trio of top-40 recruits for the 2021-22 season. BU's 2021 recruiting class was ranked No. 4 nationally by ESPN.
- The Bears signed 5-star forward Kendall Brown, 4-star guard Langston Love and 4-star forward Jeremy Sochan.
- Brown is ranked No. 12 nationally. Love is ranked No. 23 nationally and Sochan is ranked No. 40 nationally.
- Brown attends Sunrise Christian Academy in Bel Aire, Kan. and is a Cottage Grove, Minn. native.
- Love attends Montverde Academy in Florida and is a University City, Texas native.
- Sochan attends Orange Academy in Germany and is a Southampton, United Kingdom native.

BIG 12'S SECOND-BEST ROAD MARK SINCE 2012

- Baylor is 44-40 in Big 12 road games since 2012, 2nd-best in the league behind only Kansas (thru 1/15/21).
- BU is 35-31 in Big 12 road games since 2014, which is also second-best in the league behind only Kansas.

- Baylor is on a school-record streak of eight consecutive postseason berths, surpassing the total number of postseason berths in the program's 97 seasons prior to the Scott Drew era.
- Baylor is 1 of 14 teams to appear in every postseason since 2012, joining Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Iona, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan State, New Mexico State, North Carolina, Oregon, Saint Mary's, Virginia and Wichita State.
- BU earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2019 and NIT bids in 2013 and 2018.
- Baylor has made postseason appearances in 11 of 12 seasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor's only postseason berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).
- Baylor is 21-10 in postseason national tournaments during the Drew era after going 3-9 prior to Drew's arrival.

FIVE MARCH MADNESS APPEARANCES IN LAST SIX TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor has appeared in five of the last six NCAA Tournaments dating back to 2014.
- BU is 1 of 22 teams (1 of 15 in Power-5) to appear in five NCAA Tournaments since 2014, joining Arizona, Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Iowa State, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan, Michigan State, New Mexico State, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Providence, Purdue, VCU, Villanova, Virginia, Wichita State, Wisconsin and Xavier.

POINT GUARDS THRIVE IN DREW'S SYSTEM

- Nine of Baylor's 10 starting point guards during the **Scott Drew** era have earned All-Big 12 recognition.
- Baylor's starting point guard has earned All-Big 12 recognition in 15 of 16 seasons since 2004-05.
- Davion Mitchell (2020), Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

44 PRO PLAYERS IN DREW ERA

- In Scott Drew's 17 years at Baylor, 44 of his players have gone on to professional careers.
- Six of Drew's players have been in the NBA recently, and they all graduated from Baylor Quincy Acy (Suns), Johnathan Motley (Suns), Royce O'Neale (Jazz), Taurean Prince (Cavs), Ekpe Udoh (Jazz) and Freddie Gillespie (Mavs).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT - FROM UNRANKED TO NBA DRAFT PICKS

- Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren't ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school.
- The only other schools with three such players were Colorado, Marquette, Missouri, New Mexico and Connecticut.
- Baylor developed **Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson** and **Taurean Prince** into NBA Draft picks after joining the program as unranked recruits.

HISTORY OF DEVELOPMENT WITH REDSHIRTS

- Baylor has a track record of success when redshirting players. Ekpe Udoh, Johnathan Motley, Cory Jefferson,
 Brady Heslip, Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. and Manu Lecomte have all gone on to professional careers after redshirting.
- Mark Vital, Freddie Gillespie, MaCio Teague and Davion Mitchell have earned All-Big 12 honors after redshirting.
- Adam Flagler and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua redshirted last season while sitting out to satisfy NCAA transfer rules, while freshman Jordan Turner elected to redshirt last year. Dain Dainja is redshirting in 2020-21.

BIG 12'S MOST WINS IN CONFERENCE CHALLENGES

- Baylor is 10-2 in conference challenges 6-1 in Big 12/SEC Challenge, 3-1 in Big 12/Pac-10, 1-0 in Big 12/Big East.
- BU's 6-1 Big 12/SEC Challenge mark includes wins over Kentucky, Vanderbilt, Georgia, Ole Miss, Alabama and Florida.
- Baylor's 6-1 record is the best by any team in the Big 12/SEC Challenge. Kansas, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State are 5-2, while TCU and Texas Tech are 4-3, K-State, Texas and Iowa State are 3-4 and West Virginia is 2-5.
- Baylor's 10-2 record in conference challenges is best in the Big 12, followed by Oklahoma State at 8-4, Kansas and Oklahoma at 7-5, Texas and Iowa State at 6-6, K-State and Texas Tech at 5-7, TCU at 4-4 and West Virginia at 2-6.

OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING BECOMING A BAYLOR STAPLE

- Baylor has ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage in every season since 2013-14, including five times ranked in the nation's top-4. The Bears only cracked the top-20 once in Drew's first 10 years.
- Baylor's 7-year streak is the nation's best, and West Virginia (6 years) is the only other team with a 3+ year streak.
- Baylor finished ranked No. 8 nationally in 2019-20, No. 2 in 2018-19, No. 9 in 2017-18, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16, No. 1 in 2014-15 and No. 3 in 2013-14. Prior to that top-10 streak, BU's best rank was No. 16 in 2011-12.

BAYLOR BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

- Baylor basketball is aired live via the Baylor Sports Network from Learfield IMG College on ESPN Central Texas and flagship station 1660AM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco and worldwide on Sirius/XM Radio.
- Games are broadcast by the "Voice of the Bears" John Morris, who was named NSMA 2019 Texas co-Sportscaster of the Year on Jan. 13, 2020, and former Baylor basketball standout Pat Nunley.
- Morris is in his 37th year doing BU broadcasts (26th full-time), and Nunley is in his 40th season as analyst.
- All of Baylor's games can be heard live on the Internet at www.BaylorBears.com and via the TuneIn App.

SCOTT DREW COACHING TREE

- Three current Division I head coaches took their first DI head coaching jobs after stints on Scott Drew's BU staff.
- Matthew Driscoll is in his 12th season as head coach at North Florida after six seasons as a Baylor assistant.
- Grant McCasland is in his fourth season as head coach at North Texas. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.
- Paul Mills is in his fourth season as head coach at Oral Roberts. He was a member of Drew's original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.

GRADUATING 91 PERCENT OF SENIORS

- Since **Scott Drew** took over the Baylor Basketball program in 2003, 34 of 37 scholarship players who have played their fourth years of collegiate eligibility under Drew have graduated from Baylor.

- Special assistant & director of player development Jared Nuness is back for his 11th season, while director of basketball operations Aditya Malhotra returns for his 8th season. Special assistant to the head coach Bill Peterson and director of video operations Ty Beard are both back for their fourth seasons.






