POST-MATCH INTERVIEWS

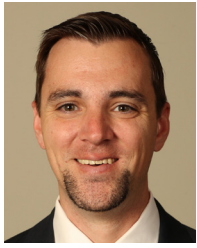
Baylor University is committed to a policy of equal access for both male and female reporters and photographers.

DR. LINDA LIVINGSTONE

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT
OKLAHOMA STATE, 1982

Dr. Linda A. Livingstone is the 15th president of Baylor University. She previously served as dean and professor of management at The George Washington University School of Business, as dean and professor of management at Pepperdine University's Graziadio School of Business and Management, and as a tenured faculty member and associate dean of graduate programs at Baylor's Hankamer School of Business.

As Baylor's president, Dr. Livingstone has overseen the development of Baylor's academic strategic plan, *Illuminate*, which details Baylor's pursuit of becoming a preeminent Christian research university, and the \$1.1 billion comprehensive campaign that undergirds *Illuminate*, called *Give Light*.

A strong voice for the role of faith-based institutions in American higher education, Dr. Livingstone has established herself as a scholar in organizational behavior, leadership, creativity, and university accreditation. She has been extensively published and cited in academic and professional outlets, including *American Business Review*, *Journal of Organizational Behavior*, *Journal of High Technology Management Research*, and the book *Business and Corporate Integrity: Sustaining Organizational Compliance, Ethics and Trust*. She serves on the Board of Directors of Capital Southwest Industrials, the Board of Trustees for Baylor College of Medicine, the Board of Directors of the American Council on Education and the Board of Directors for Independent Colleges and Universities of Texas, Inc. In addition, she was recently elected to the executive committee of Big 12 Conference Board of Directors, for which she serves as treasurer.

Dr. Livingstone was inducted into Oklahoma State's Hall of Fame in 2019. She also is a member of the Spears School of Business Hall of Fame and was the first recipient of the Outstanding Ph.D. Alumnus Award. She was recognized in 2015 with the OSU Distinguished Alumni Award.

A native of Perkins, Oklahoma, Dr. Livingstone played varsity basketball at Oklahoma State University, where she earned a Bachelor of Science in economics and management, a Master of Business Administration, and a Doctor of Philosophy in management and organizational behavior. Her husband, Brad, a high school history teacher, also played basketball at Oklahoma State. They have one daughter, Shelby, a current student at Baylor's George W. Truett Theological Seminary.

MACK RHOADES

VICE PRESIDENT / DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS
ARIZONA, 1993

Mack B. Rhoades, IV, who has provided outstanding leadership and vision for three NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision athletic programs, was named Baylor University's Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics on July 13, 2016.

Rhoades has organized a team of dynamic administrators and restructured the athletics department to maximize efficiencies across teams. His concept of Preparing Champions for Life has provided the ongoing vision for Baylor Athletics, which aims to bolster the student-athlete experience by focusing on the areas of academic achievement, athletic success, character formation and spiritual growth.

Rhoades has assisted University leadership in a campus-wide effort to structurally complete 105 recommendations related to Title IX and student safety.

The 2019-20 academic year, while cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic, brought success on and off the field for Baylor Athletics. Baylor was the nation's only school to finish the 2019 calendar year with football (No. 7), men's basketball (No. 6), women's basketball (No. 6) and volleyball (No. 3) all nationally ranked. Football advanced to the program's first-ever Big 12 championship game en route to playing in its first Sugar Bowl since 1957. Men's basketball and women's basketball were each projected to be a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Lady Bears brought home their 10th-straight, and 11th overall, Big 12 regular season championship, while the Bears were the No. 1 team in the country for five straight weeks, which tied the nation's longest streak since 2015 (Kentucky) and set a Big 12 record with a 23-game winning streak. Volleyball won its first Big 12 championship in program history and advanced to the program's first NCAA National Semifinals.

Overall, Baylor's 11 head-to-head sports compiled a 164-43-3 record (.781 winning percentage) during the 2019-20 academic year as 10 Baylor teams finished the term ranked, including six in the top-10.

Academically, Baylor student-athletes finished the year with a 3.60 GPA for the spring term, the best on record for a semester. The Bears have had a 3.0 term GPA or better for 24-straight semesters. Baylor led the Big 12 in Graduation Success Rate (GSR) for the sixth straight year, while 96 student-athletes earned degrees in the academic year. Nine of 15 Baylor athletics programs tracked by the NCAA registered perfect one-year APR scores of 1,000 and six different teams led the Big 12 in multi-year APR for their respective sports (baseball, men's cross country, men's golf, men's track and field, softball and volleyball).

Rhoades also oversaw the Baylor Bear Foundation as it reported more than \$19 million in annual giving to Baylor Athletics in 2019, the second-highest giving total in the foundation's 70-plus year history.

The 2018-19 academic year brought several strategic initiatives to the forefront of athletics beginning with December's unveiling of the "Baylor Built" character formation program. Rhoades appointed Marcus Sedberry, Senior Associate AD for Student-Athlete Success to spearhead the platform, which is a four-year, classification specific program, which aims to ensure Baylor student-athletes participate in 48 hours of character formation programming during their respective tenures. The holistic program encompasses character and leadership development, personal skills, social responsibility, community engagement and spiritual growth.

Rhoades, in a collective effort with a team assembled by Jovan Overshown, Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs, launched - in association with NIKE - the "Baylor United" brand and visual identity for the department in April of 2019. The process produced a unified color palette, updated primary and secondary marks, new wordmarks and custom brand font and numerical system.

In May of 2019, as part of the Baylor Athletics Master Plan portion of the university's \$1.1 billion "Give Light" campaign, Rhoades announced the department would build a new \$105 million basketball fieldhouse

following the largest current gift in the university's history. An anonymous lead gift will spearhead the Baylor Basketball Pavilion to provide an electric atmosphere for the department's highly-successful basketball programs.

Rhoades has led national searches for four head coaching positions during his time at Baylor, ultimately bringing to Waco, Matt Rhule (Football) in 2016, Casie Maxwell (Equestrian) in 2017, Brian Boland (Men's Tennis) in 2018 and Dave Aranda (Football) in 2020.

Baylor has had at least 17 of 19 teams reach postseason competition in his first three years, including 18 of 19 teams in each of his first two years and 17 of 19 teams in 2018-19.

Four teams earned postseason berths in 2019-20 as the winter and spring sports' postseason tournaments were canceled due to the pandemic.

During his tenure, Baylor teams have earned 15 Big 12 titles.

Additionally, acrobatics and tumbling secured NCATA national championships in 2017, 2018 and 2019, adding to their record five-consecutive titles, and the Baylor women's basketball team took home its third national championship in 2019. National titles for acrobatics and tumbling and women's basketball in 2019 marked the first time in school history two programs have taken home national championships in the same academic year.

The Bears remain committed to giving back with student-athletes volunteering more than 4,900 hours throughout the Waco community in the last two academic years. Baylor's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) collaborated with Waco Habitat for Humanity to serve the Waco community through hands-on labor and connected with families in the community.

For the 12th consecutive year, Baylor's Sports Ministry Team traveled to share the love of Christ. Baylor Athletics hosted one international mission trip in 2019-20 with 23 student-athletes participating in missions to Guatemala.

Rhoades joined the Baylor family from the University of Missouri, where he spent the previous year (2015-16) leading the 20-sport South-eastern Conference intercollegiate athletics department, and he previously served in similar capacities at the University of Houston (2009-15) and the University of Akron (2006-09).

His first year in Columbia saw Mizzou student-athletes register the highest one-semester grade-point in school history at 3.03 for the fall 2015 term; Barry Odom hired as the Tigers' head football coach; wrestler J'den Cox win an NCAA title and earn a berth on the 2016 U.S. Olympic Team; the Tigers' men's swimming and diving team place a program-best eighth at the NCAA Championship and its women's basketball program return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006. Bolstered by three top 11 NCAA finishes--wrestling (sixth), men's swimming and diving (eighth) and women's swimming and diving (11th), Missouri finished 43rd in the final 2015-16 Learfield Directors' Cup standings.

Rhoades and his staff developed a student-athlete enrichment program, Mizzou Made: Preparing Champions for Life. This innovative and comprehensive program is part of a campus community partnership focusing on life skills and career development among other core values.

Before moving to Missouri, Rhoades enjoyed five-and-a-half rewarding years guiding the athletic fortunes at the University of Houston as Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics. He reignited the Cougars' entire program, hiring 14 new head coaches, including 2015 FWAAs First-Year Coach of the Year Tom Herman. Rhoades also oversaw a transformation of the student-athlete experience while also directing marked improvements in the areas of academics, facilities, fundraising and athletic success. In nearly every academic measurement, including grade-point average and the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, Houston registered record achievements. He also unveiled the Cougar Pride Leadership Academy to equip student-athletes with life-long leadership and life skills.

Houston's football team appeared in four bowl games during Rhoades' six seasons, and enjoyed a historic 2011 campaign which saw it climb to No. 6 in the BCS standings en route to a 13-1 record and its first season-ending finish in The Associated Press Top 25 since 1990.

Known as an outstanding fundraiser, Houston raised nearly \$100M and constructed \$160M in new facilities during his tenure, including a new on-campus football stadium, a men's and women's basketball training center, a golf academy and a short game facility. Rhoades also negotiated one of the nation's top five facility naming rights agreements at the collegiate level and secured a new multi-media rights deal for Houston.

Cougar Pride, Houston Athletics' fundraising arm, set an annual donation record for the fifth-consecutive year in 2013-14 as more than 3,100 Cougar Pride members contributed \$4.5M to eclipse the previous mark of \$3.5M set the previous year.

Rhoades and University of Houston President Dr. Renu Khator successfully steered the institution into an exciting new era when it was invited in December 2011 to join The American Athletic Conference beginning with the 2013-14 academic year. Houston's first year in The American was arguably one of the finest in school history, as its 2013-14 teams combined for 157 victories, 17 American individual championships, 10 NCAA postseason berths and a pair of American team titles. That successful surge led to Houston's highest national finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup since 2000-01.

Rhoades served as chair of the American Athletic Conference Athletics Directors Committee, Athletics Directors Executive Committee and Athletics Directors Finance Committee after having served Conference USA as chairperson for its Championship and Site Selection Committees.

Prior to his arrival at Houston, Rhoades helped the University of Akron achieve unprecedented academic and athletic success. During his tenure, Zip student-athletes earned: 765 total Dean's List honors, 213 All-Conference honors, 83 Academic All-Conference awards, 20 team championships, 14 Conference Player of the Year awards and 12 All-America honors.

Rhoades' Akron tenure was also marked by the construction of a \$61.6M on-campus football stadium, the creation of a women's golf program, three-time recognition for the department's diversity strategy and the hiring of 11 head coaches. UA student-athletes also generously gave back the community during Rhoades' tenure providing more than 5,000 service hours to the greater Akron area during each of the 2006-07 and 2007-08 academic years.

He served as a member of the NCAA Division I Championships/Sports Management Cabinet--as well as its Administrative Committee, and led the Mid-American Conference External Affairs Committee. Rhoades also helped then-MAC Commissioner Rick Chryst negotiate an unprecedented TV contract for the league with ESPN.

Rhoades went to Akron after seven years at UTEP, where he worked his way up the department ranks to become the Miners Executive Senior Associate Athletics Director after starting as Assistant Athletics Director for Development. 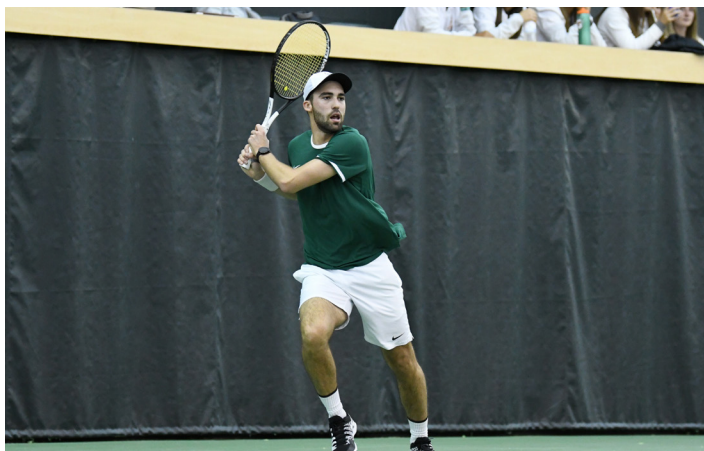

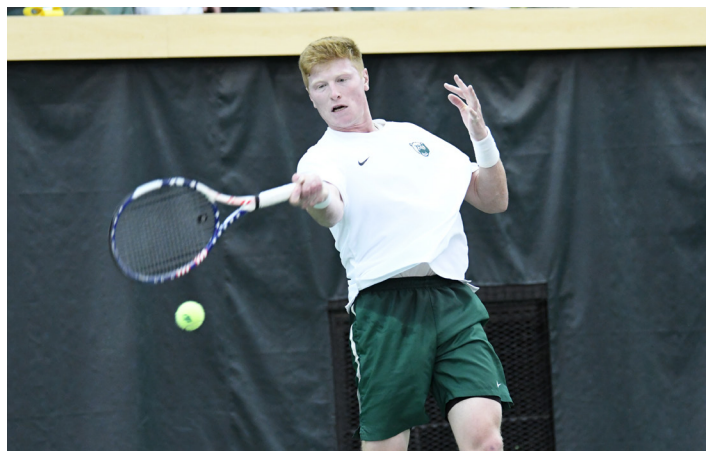

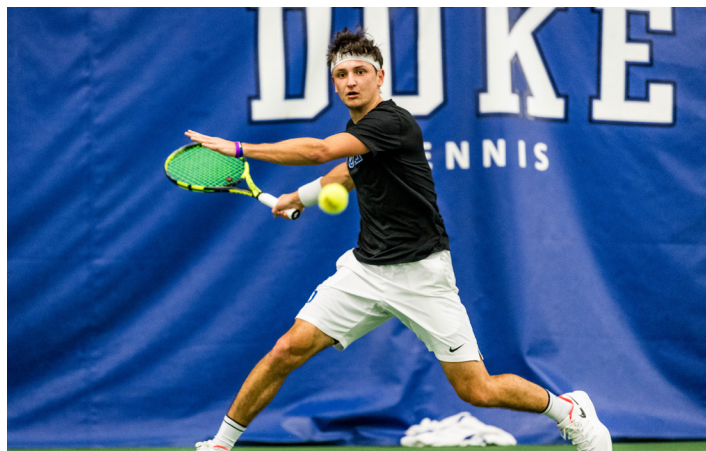

Michael Woodson was named interim head coach for the 2020-21 season. He enters his fifth season with the Bears after previously serving as associate head coach. He was the assistant coach for three seasons before being promoted in Dec. 2019.

Woodson also served a stint as the program's interim head coach from May 13 to May 24, 2018, prior to Brian Boland's hire as the Director of Tennis.

Despite the 2020 season being cut short, Woodson and the Bears recorded a 13-3 record and a perfect 10-0 mark in Waco.

In 2019, Woodson helped Baylor reach its 13th NCAA quarterfinal appearance and earn the program's ninth Big 12 postseason title. Individually, he mentored ITA Doubles All-Americans and All-Big 12 honorees Jimmy Bendeck and Sven Lah and saw them post the second-most wins in BU history with a 28-7 record. He also saw Adrian Boitan go 16-4 on the singles court and earn Big 12 Freshman of the Year, ITA Regional Rookie of the Year and Big 12 Championship MOP honors. Woodson also guided Matias Soto to his first career All-Big 12 singles honors with an 18-5 spring record.

During the 2017-18 season, Woodson helped guide Baylor to its 21st consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and a 21-10 overall record without a senior on the roster. Woodson mentored three All-Big 12 honorees in Sven Lah, Roy Smith and Will Little. Lah and Smith finished their freshman seasons with an impressive 17-2 doubles record and earned first team and all-tournament recognition. Little compiled a 17-9 overall singles record and his second straight All-Big 12 honor while earning his first all-tournament award.

In his first season in Waco, Woodson contributed immediately as BU advanced to its 17th Sweet 16 appearance in the last 19 years. He helped coach senior Max Tchoutakian to a 15-3 singles record and guided Johannes Schretter and Jimmy Bendeck to an 11-3 doubles record. During the summer, he served as the USTA National Collegiate Team coach.

Prior to coming to Waco, Woodson had been a member of the Valparaiso men's tennis coaching staff since the 2012-13 season, after concluding a three-year career on the court for the Crusaders. In May 2015, Woodson was promoted to associate head coach and went on to help Valpo set a school record for wins (22-6), claim conference regular season and tournament titles and earn the program's first-ever NCAA Championship appearance.

In his four years as a Crusader assistant, Woodson's teams racked up a 73-34 record. He had five players earn first team All-Horizon League accolades and three more card second-team honors. Nineteen times Valparaiso players won conference Player of the Week honors under Woodson. Individually, Woodson helped Jeffrey Schorsch become the winningest singles player in school history and win back-to-back Horizon League Player of the Year honors. He also guided Charlie Ernhardt to break the all-time doubles win record at Valpo. Meanwhile, Woodson's student-athletes also secured a pair of league Freshman of the Year awards during his Valpo tenure.

During his playing career with the Crusaders, Woodson was a three-year starter who split time between No. 5 and 6 singles, while appearing at No. 2 and 3 doubles for the Brown and Gold. For his senior season, Woodson was named a team captain for the Crusaders. Woodson was recognized with the Bill Steinbrecher Sportsmanship Award and the athletic department's Laurel Award, which honors the graduating senior student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade point average.

Woodson graduated from Valparaiso in May of 2012 as a triple major in biology, chemistry and exercise science. He also earned a master's degree in sport administration from Valpo in December of 2013.

He married his wife, Vanessa, in July 2017. The couple has two children, Jordyn and Kiley.

In 2019, van der Merwe was a part of the team's 13th NCAA quarterfinal appearance and ninth Big 12 postseason title run. He mentored Big 12 Individual Champion and All-Big 12 honoree Will Little at No. 4 singles as well as All-Americans Jimmy Bendeck and Sven Lah. He guided Little and All-Big 12 honoree Matias Soto to an 8-4 record on the doubles court.

Izak van der Merwe (pronounced EE-zah-k vun dur Mer-vuh) competed on the ATP World Tour from 2005 to 2014, earning a career-high No. 94 doubles ranking and No. 113 singles ranking and winning a total of 17 ATP Challenger Tour singles and doubles titles. He was a singles semifinalist at the SA Open in 2011 and a quarterfinalist at the U.S. Grass Court Championships a year later.

He also competed as part of Team South Africa in 13 Davis Cup ties from 2006 to 2014 where the team made four World Group Playoff appearances.

A Johannesburg, South Africa native, van der Merwe played collegiate tennis at Old Dominion and was the school's first two-time ITA Collegiate Tennis All-American and the only Monarch to reach the national semifinals in the NCAA, All-American and & ITA Indoor national championships.

He earned All-America status in doubles (2004) and singles (2004, 2005) and capped off his Monarch career with a 73-27 singles record and 73-33 doubles record. He was inducted into the Old Dominion Sports Hall of Fame in 2014.

Van der Merwe earned a bachelor of business administration degree in finance from ODU in 2005. He graduated with his masters of business administration degree from University of Texas at Dallas in 2015.

George Goldhoff joined the Baylor men's tennis staff in August 2020 as a volunteer assistant coach. He spent three years playing professionally on the ATP Tour from 2017-2020 following a four-year collegiate career at the University of Texas.

Goldhoff compiled a 45-17 doubles record in ITF events in 2019, reaching a career-high ranking of No. 357. He won six ITF doubles titles during the 2019 season, including the Cancun Tennis Cup, Claremont Club Pro Classic and Harlingen Country Club Pro Circuit.

As a Longhorn, Goldhoff amassed 65 career singles victories and 55 career doubles wins. During his senior season, he helped UT to a victory in the ITA Kick-Off Weekend event by upsetting the No. 2-ranked singles player in the nation.

Goldhoff competed in the No. 1 singles slot as a junior in 2016, going 11-11 on the year. He posted a 17-10 singles record in 2015, including two victories in the NCAA team tournament.

As a freshman, he was named the 2014 ITA Texas Region Rookie Player of the Year. In the fall of 2013, he was a singles quarterfinalist at the ITA All-American Championships after defeating the No. 1 ranked player in the nation.

Goldhoff began his collegiate career ranked as the No. 8 player in the Preseason ITA Newcomers/Freshmen Rankings.

Goldhoff graduated from Texas in 2017 with a degree in physical culture and sports.
