GAME NOTES

- Tuesday is the 257th series meeting the most-played rivalry in Baylor history dating back 106 years.
- Baylor is 9-1 in its last 10 games vs. Texas since Feb. 20, 2016 (4-0 in Waco, 4-1 in Austin, 1-0 in KC).
- BU is 18-8 vs. Texas since snapping a 24-game series losing streak at the 2009 Big 12 Championship.
- Baylor swept Texas last year, winning 59-44 in Waco on Jan. 4 and 52-45 in Austin on Feb. 10.
- BU leads the nation in scoring margin (+24.8) and 3-point percentage (.434) and is top-10 nationally in steals (4th, 9.7), scoring (5th, 87.2), effective FG% (2nd, 58.6), offensive rebound pct. (4th, 38.6), assists (6th, 18.5), turnover margin (5th, +6.2), turnovers forced (6th, 18.6) and defensive turnover pct. (4th, 26.0).
- Baylor is the nation's only team to win every game by 8+ points this season (14 of 16 wins by 11+).
- BU is the nation's only team top-5 ranked in adjusted offensive (3rd) and defensive (1st) efficiency.
- BU has led by at least 10 points in every game this season and has led by 13+ at halftime in 10 of 16.
- Baylor has trailed for only 45:21 of 640 minutes (7.1%) this season and led wire-to-wire in 7 games.
- Baylor is 9-1 against ranked teams over the last two seasons, including 3-0 in true road games.
- Baylor needs a win to tie the best start to a season in program history (17-0 in 2011-12).
- Baylor's 16-game winning streak is the 3rd-longest in program history (23 in 2020, 17 in 2012).
- BU looks to start 9-0 in Big 12 play for the 2nd time in program history (first was 13-0 start last season).
- Baylor's 23-3 record in Big 12 play over the last 2 seasons is the league's best record in that span.
- BU is 12-2 in Big 12 road games over the last 2 seasons (rest of league is 42-74 in B12 road games).
- Jared Butler was named National Player of the Week on Jan. 26 after averaging 26.0 points and 7.0 assists in wins vs. Kansas and at OSU. He shot 13-of-16 (81.3%) from 3-point range last week.
- Baylor is 42-4 since MaCio Teague and Davion Mitchell became eligible at the start of 2019-20.
- Mitchell had a career-high 31 points Wednesday vs. K-State, including 22 pts in 12 second-half minutes.
- BU has 3 of 15 players on the Naismith Defensive POY midseason watch list Mitchell, Vital and Butler.
- BU's bench is out-scoring opposing benches 33-17 on average and has scored 33+ points in 11 games.
 Six Baylor players are shooting at least 37% on 3FGs and averaging at least one 3FG made per game:
- Mitchell (47%), Butler (45%), Mayer (45%), Flagler (43%), Cryer (43%) and Teague (37%).
- Three members of the BU bench average 8+ ppg Flagler (10.4), Mayer (8.4) and Tchatchoua (8.2).
- Head coach **Scott Drew** is in his 18th season in Waco and is BU's all-time wins leader (358-213).
- Baylor is playing its 258th game as a ranked team under Drew BU was ranked in 2 of 2197 games over the program's 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 255 of 437 games.
- Baylor has been top-5 ranked for 22-straight weeks. BU was top-5 for 12 weeks all-time prior to this streak.
- BU's streak of 31-straight AP polls ranked is the nation's 4th-longest active streak and longest in BU history.
- Baylor has led by at least 5 points in all 46 games over the last 2 seasons (double-digit leads in 40 of 46).
- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in 3 of the last 5 seasons.

QUICK HITS

- Baylor's 16-game winning streak is 3rd-longest in program history (23 in 2020, 17 in 2012).
- Baylor signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history (No. 4) in November. BU inked 5-star Kendall Brown, 4-star Langston Love and 4-star Jeremy Sochan for the 2021-22 season.
- BU was picked to win the Big 12 in the league's preseason coaches' poll for the first time.
- Baylor is 65-5 when leading at halftime over the last 4 seasons (35-2 over last 2 seasons, 14-0 this season).
- Baylor has won 90% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (183-21).
- BU is 130-23 since 2015-16 when leading at any point in the 2nd half of a game (42-3 last 2 seasons).
- Baylor's 23-game winning streak last season was the longest ever by a Big 12 team (previously 22 by 1996-97 KU).
- BU's 13-game conference winning streak last year was the longest in school history (previously 11 in 1946 SWC).
- Baylor has won 20+ games in 11 of the last 13 seasons after recording only three 20-win seasons in the previous 100 years of Baylor Basketball (1946, 1948, 1988).
- Baylor is 233-97 over the last 10 seasons, averaging 24 wins per season since 2011-12.
- Baylor's 233 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (274).
- Baylor is 324-144 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
 - Eight of Baylor's players either have used or are currently using a redshirt year. Four after transferring to BU –
 Flagler, Mitchell, Tchamwa Tchatchoua and Teague, and four as freshmen Moffatt, Turner, Vital and Dainja.
- Ten of Baylor's 11 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (15 of last 16 seasons).
- Baylor is 1 of 14 teams nationally to appear in every postseason since 2012 (6 NCAAs, 2 NITs).
- Baylor has the nation's 10th-longest active streak with at least one 3-point FG made in 948 straight games the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was more than 30 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- Scott Drew became Baylor head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 18th season at Baylor and is the school's all time wins leader (358).
- Drew is coaching his 572nd game at Baylor (358-213). His .627 winning pct. is best in BU history among coaches with 40 + games, and he's the program's all-time wins leader with 157 more victories than any other coach.
- Baylor has a .692 winning percentage (324-144) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .706 winning percentage (233-97) over the last 10 seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (50) is the youngest of 12 coaches nationally to take his current program to four Sweet 16s since 2010.
- Baylor is playing its 258th game as a ranked team in Drew's 18 seasons. BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games
- over the program's first 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since 2008-09, BU has been ranked in 255 of 437 games.
- BU is 1 of 5 Power-5 schools (Duke, Kentucky, UNC, Michigan State) with 18+ wins in every season since 2008.
- In Drew's first 17 seasons at Baylor, 44 players have gone on to professional careers.

DOMINANT DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCES

• BU has held 6 of its last 13 opponents to season-lows in points-per-possession.

• Baylor held lowa State to a season-low 0.86 PPP in Ames, limited Oklahoma to a season-low 0.92 PPP and then held TCU to a season-low 0.75 PPP in Fort Worth.

• Prior to those 3 games, BU held SFA (0.67), UAPB (0.59) and Central Arkansas (0.71) to season-low PPPs.

- BU held UT to 45 points in a 52-45 win in Austin on Feb. 10, sweeping the season series for a 5th time since 2010.
- Texas' 45 points were its fewest in a home game since Jan. 8, 1983 when Texas lost 51-43 to Kansas State.

THREE OF NATION'S BEST DEFENDERS

• Three Bears were named to the Jan. 28 Naismith Defensive Player of the Year watch list, making Baylor the only team with multiple honorees – **Davion Mitchell**, **Mark Vital** and **Jared Butler** were among 15 candidates.

- Jared Butler is up for the Wooden Award, Naismith Trophy, Lute Olson Award and Bob Cousy Award.
- Regarded as "the nation's best 2-way player," Butler is also 1 of 15 candidates for Naismith Defensive POY.
- Butler ranks top-3 in the Big 12 in steals (1st), 3FG% (1st), 3FGs (1st), assists (2nd), FG% (2nd) and scoring (3rd).
- Butler has 15 career games with 20+ points, including 3 games with 30+ points 22 vs. PVAM, 31 at Kansas, 30 vs. UCA, 22 vs. Villanova, 20 vs. UMES, 22 at Kansas, 20 at K-State, 21 vs. WVU, 22 at Oklahoma, 21 at WVU, 20 vs. Washington, 21 at Iowa State, 28 at TCU, 30 vs. Kansas and 22 at Oklahoma State.
- Over the last 2 seasons, Butler has 20-point games on the road against seven of nine Big 12 opponents, with the only exceptions at Texas Tech and at Texas.

• MaCio Teague has earned all-conference honors in all 3 collegiate seasons – All-Big South First Team in 2017 and 2018 at UNC Asheville and All-Big 12 Second Team in 2020 at Baylor.

- Teague ranks 8th in the Big 12 in scoring, 4th in the league in FG% and 3rd in FT%.
- Teague is the nation's only active player with 1,500 + career points (1,707), 400 + rebounds (493), 225 + assists (251), 125 + steals (132) and 200 + made 3-pointers (255).
- The Bears have gone 42-4 since Teague's first game at Baylor, including 23-3 in Big 12 play.
- Teague has started all but 3 games (Nov. 20, 2016, Feb. 18, 2020, Feb. 22, 2020) in his career.
- Baylor is 35-1 when Teague scores 10+ points he's averaging 9.5 ppg in 4 losses while at Baylor (8, 8, 13, 9).

"OFF NIGHT" MITCHELL UP FOR DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

• Davion Mitchell was named 2020 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, selected to the All-Big 12 Third Team and Big 12 All-Defensive Team and was a unanimous choice on the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.

- Regarded as "the nation's best on ball defender," Mitchell is 1 of 15 candidates for Naismith Defensive POY.
- Mitchell leads the Big 12 in assists, ranks 2nd in steals and 4th in assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Mitchell has started all 46 games at BU after coming off the bench in all 34 games as an Auburn freshman (2017-18).
- Baylor is 42-4 with Mitchell in the lineup, including a league-best 23-3 mark in Big 12 play over the last 2 seasons.
- When Mitchell has played 20+ minutes, his collegiate teams are 54-4 (12-0 at Auburn, 42-4 at Baylor).
- When Mitchell scores 10+ points, his collegiate teams are 27-1 (2-0 at Auburn, 25-1 at Baylor).

VITAL TO BEARS' SUCCESS

• Mark Vital is back after being named one of 4 Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Award finalists in 2020.

- "The nation's most versatile defender" Vital is again among 15 candidates for Naismith Defensive POY.
- Vital has played in 40 career Big 12 wins (40-21), passing A.J. Walton (39-29) for the school record.
- He was named to the 2020 All-Big 12 Third Team and was a unanimous 2020 All-Defensive Team selection.
- Vital posted a career-high 19 points on 8-of-9 from the field in the Jan. 23 win at Oklahoma State.
- In Baylor's Nov. 29, 2020 game vs. Washington, Vital's 15 rebounds matched all Washington players combined (15).
- That was the second time Vital accompished the feat, after doing so for the first time at Arizona in 2018.

BENCH TRIO SCORING WITH EFFICIENCY

• Adam Flagler, Matthew Mayer and LJ Cryer give the Bears a trio of efficient shooters off the bench.

• All 3 are shooting at least 43% from 3-point range – Mayer (.447), Flagler (.443), Cryer (.432) – and combined they've shot .441 from behind the arc (60-of-136) and averaged 3.8 made 3-pointers per game.

• Flagler has scored in double-figures in 9 of 14 games played this season, including five games with 15+ points,

Mayer has 10+ points in 7 of 16 games, and Cryer has twice scored 15+ points off the bench.

• Flagler has made at least one 3-pointer in 47 of 50 collegiate games. He's made multiple 3-pointers in 41 of 50 career games, including 26 games with 3+ made treys.

Mayer has scored in double-figures in 6 of the last 11 games and has posted at least 6 points off the bench in 12 of 16 games this season. He's shooting 53% inside the arc (33-62) and is leads the team with 23.2 points per 40 minutes.
Cryer has made a 3-pointer in 8 of 9 games with an attempt and is shooting .432 from 3-point range.

- Tchamwa Tchatchoua has made 45% of his FGs on dunks (24-of-53), including all 5 in the win over Washington.
- Tchamwa Tchatchoua leads the Bears and ranks 8th in the Big 12 with 6.4 rebounds per game.

BIG 12'S MOST WINS IN CONFERENCE CHALLENGES

• Baylor improved to 7-1 Big 12/SEC Challenges, which is the best by any team in either league and includes wins over half of the 14 SEC programs – Kentucky, Vanderbilt, Georgia, Ole Miss, Alabama, Florida and Auburn.

• Baylor is 11-2 in conference challenges – 7-1 in Big 12/SEC Challenge, 3-1 in Big 12/Pac-10, 1-0 in Big 12/Big East.

TWENTY-TWO STRAIGHT WEEKS AP TOP-5 RANKED

• BU is No. 2 in the Feb. 1 AP Top 25, extending its school-record streak to 22 straight weeks top-5 ranked. The Bears were top-5 ranked in 12 total weeks in program history prior to the current streak.

- Baylor's 5-week streak at No. 1 last season was the longest since Kentucky in 2015.
- Baylor by week should also a school-record 31-straight weeks, which is the nation's 4th-longest active
- streak behind only Kansas (231), Gonzaga (89) and Villanova (34).

BEARS INK HIGHEST-RANKED RECRUITING CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY FOR 2021-22

• Baylor signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history in November, inking a trio of top-40 recruits for the 2021-22 season. BU's 2021 recruiting class was ranked No. 4 nationally by ESPN.

- The Bears signed 5-star forward Kendall Brown, 4-star guard Langston Love and 4-star forward Jeremy Sochan.
- Brown is ranked No. 12 nationally, Love is ranked No. 23 nationally and Sochan is ranked No. 40 nationally.
- Brown attends Sunrise Christian Academy in Bel Aire, Kan. and is a Cottage Grove, Minn. native.
- Love attends Montverde Academy in Florida and is a University City, Texas native.
- Sochan attends Orange Academy in Germany and is a Southampton, United Kingdom native.

FOUR ALL-BIG 12 PLAYERS RETURN

- All five Baylor starters were named to 2020 All-Big 12 teams, making BU the first team in the league's 24-year history with five players on All-Big 12 teams, and four of those players returned for the 2020-21 season.
- Jared Butler became Baylor's first underclassman named first-team All-Conference since Terry Teagle in 1980, and he was named a consensus third-team All-American. He's the Bears' first AP Preseason All-American.
- MaCio Teague has been all-conference in all three of his previous seasons. He was a first-team All-Big South honoree while at UNC Asheville in 2017 and 2018 and earned second-team All-Big 12 honors in 2020.
- Mark Vital and Davion Mitchell were both third team All-Big 12 and Big 12 All-Defensive Team choices.

BREAKTHROUGH IN BIG 12

- BU is 122-80 in Big 12 play in 12 seasons since 2010 after going 59-149 in the league's first 13 seasons.
- BU is 136-97 in Big 12 play in 14 seasons since 2008 after going 45-131 in the league's first 11 seasons.
- Baylor is 46-40 in Big 12 road games since 2012, second-best in the league behind only Kansas (56-30).
- BU has won 8+ Big 12 games in 10 straight seasons after winning 8+ just 3 times in the league's first 15 years.
- BU has recorded double-digit Big 12 wins in 5 of the last 6 years and 7 of the last 11 seasons.

SECOND-MOST WINS AMONG BIG 12 TEAMS SINCE 2011-12

Baylor's 233-97 record since 2011-12 trails only Kansas (275-69) among Big 12 teams (thru 1/31/21).

- Texas (181-138) is 7th, Oklahoma St. (174-139) is 8th, Texas Tech (171-143) is 9th and TCU (161-157) is 10th.
- Baylor has averaged 24.1 wins per season over the last nine full seasons since 2011-12.

THIRTY-TWO WINS VS. RANKED TEAMS IN LAST SEVEN SEASONS

- Baylor has gone 32-33 against ranked teams since the start of the 2014-15 season (6-1 last season).
- BU is 50-73 against AP-ranked teams since 2007-08 after going 17-122 in the program's first 101 seasons.
- Baylor has won multiple games vs. AP Top 25 teams in each of the last 14 seasons (including this season).
- The Bears have defeated at least five ranked teams in five of the last seven seasons entering 2020-21.

PROTECTING HALFTIME LEADS

• BU is 68-5 in its last 73 games when leading at halftime – 14-0 in 2021, 21-2 in 2020, 15-3 in 2019 and 15-0 in 2018.

- Baylor has won 90% of its games (183-21) when leading at the half since 2011-12 (14-0 in 2021, 21-2 in 2020,
- 15-3 in 2019, 15-0 in 2018, 18-3 in 2017, 18-2 in 2016, 21-7 in 2015, 18-2 in 2014, 17-1 in 2013 and 26-1 in 2012).
- BU has won 40% of games in which its been tied or trailing at the half since 2011-12, going 50-76 in those.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Drew is in his 18th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (358).
- Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren't ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson and Taurean Prince.
- Drew has graduated 52 players during his Baylor tenure, averaging 3 graduates per season.
- The Bears have advanced to postseason play in a school-record eight straight seasons (6 NCAA, 2 NIT).

- the season, and those two wins are the only times a Bruce weber-coached team has allowed 100+ points. This was the second time in PU bistory to searce 100 points twice in a second year on exponent (1070 year)
- This was the second time in BU history to score 100 points twice in a season vs. an opponent (1979 vs. TCU).
- It was BU's most points in regulation of a Big 12 game and 2nd-largest margin of victory in a conference game.
- Davion Mitchell posted a career-high 31 points, including 22 points in just 12 second-half minutes.

STRONG SECOND HALF THE DIFFERENCE IN WIN AT OKLAHOMA STATE

- Baylor trailed 34-25 late in the first half, the first time the Bears faced a deficit greater than 4 points all season, but the Bears turned up the intensity in the second half and pulled away for an 81-66 win at Oklahoma State on Jan. 23.
- BU trailed 50-48 with 12 minutes left, then went on a 19-1 run and led by double digits the rest of the way.
- Jared Butler hit 3-pointers on 3-consecutive trips to turn a 3-point lead into a 12-point lead with 8 minutes left.
 Butler finished with 22 points, while Mark Vital had a career-high 19 points on 8-of-9 from the field.

- BUTLER'S 30 LEAD BEARS PAST NO. 9 KANSAS
- Baylor jumped out to an 11-2 lead and led wire to wire in a 77-69 victory over No. 9 Kansas on Jan. 18.
- The Bears got 30 points from Jared Butler, who made 7-of-9 from 3-point range and added 8 assists.
 BU took a 41-28 halftime lead and led by at least 5 points for the final 36 minutes of game time.
- Mark Vital contributed 10 rebounds and a highlight-reel block, while MaCio Teague added 13 points.

DEFENSE STANDS TALL, OFFENSE SHINES LATE IN ROAD WIN AT NO. 15 TEXAS TECH

- Baylor held No. 15 Texas Tech to a season-low 18 first-half points, but the Bears trailed 45-44 with 7:14 left before going on a 17-6 run over the next 4:23 to pull away late in a 68-60 win in Lubbock on Jan. 16.
- Adam Flagler posted 15 points off the bench, including the go-ahead jumper to spark the late 17-6 run.
- Davion Mitchell led the Bears with 17 points, while MaCio Teague added 14 points.
- Jared Butler scored his only 7 points over a 70-second stretch in the final 5 minutes, including a pair of 3-pointers.

BEARS SHAKE OFF SLOW START TO RECORD ROAD WIN AT TCU

- Baylor faced a halftime deficit for the first time all season after Mike Miles hit a buzzer-beating 60-footer to give TCU a 28-27 lead at the break, but the Bears responded and led for the final 19:39 in a 67-49 win over TCU on Jan. 9.
- The Bears shot just 1-of-10 from 3-point range in the first half, but went 5-of-9 in the second half. Baylor's defense held TCU to 33% shooting in both halves and forced 22 turnovers.

BU HOLDS SOONER OFFENSE IN CHECK FOR 10TH-STRAIGHT WIN

- Baylor jumped out to a 16-2 lead and Oklahoma never got closer than 5 points the rest of the way, as the Bears held the Sooners to a season-low scoring output in a 76-61 win on Jan. 6 in Waco.
- BU's bench out-scored OU's 40-9, led by 16 points from Matthew Mayer and 15 points from Adam Flagler.

BEARS FIGHT FOR TOUGH ROAD WIN AT IOWA STATE

- Despite season-lows of 76 points and 10 assists, BU held on for a hard-fought 76-65 win at lowa State on Jan. 2.
- Baylor committed 17 turnovers, but forced 21 ISU turnovers. BU shot a season wost 4-for-19 from distance.
- Jared Butler led BU with 21 points, 5 assists and 4 steals, while Mitchell and Teague added 13 points apiece.

BU TOPS CENTURY MARK FOR THIRD TIME IN WIN OVER ALCORN

- Playing its second game in as many days, the Bears rolled to a 105-76 win over Alcorn State on Dec. 30.
- The Bears' three starting guards combined for 45 points (13-22 FGs, 13-13 FTs), 16 assists and only 4 turnovers, led by **Davion Mitchell**, who posted his second-career double-double with 10 points and 10 assists.
- Six Bears scored in double figures, including career highs of 10 points for Jordan Turner and Zach Loveday.

BEARS ROAR BACK FROM BREAK IN WIN OVER CENTRAL ARKANSAS

- Baylor returned from its Christmas break with a 93-56 win over Central Arkansas on Dec. 29.
- The Bears posted 25 assists against only 10 turnovers, including a career high 12 assists from Davion Mitchell.
- Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua had his first double-double of the season with 13 points and 11 boards.

BENCH TAKES CARE OF BUSINESS VS. UAPB

- Baylor's bench scored more points than the entire UAPB team in the Bears' 99-42 win on Dec. 21. The BU bench out-scored UAPB's bench 55-0, with a team-high 15 points from freshman LJ Cryer.
- BU committed only 5 turnovers, forced 23 turnovers and had 25 assists on 37 made field goals.

NO RUST FOR BU OFFENSE IN BIG 12 OPENER AT K-STATE

- Despite going 9 days without a game and having only two days of practice before its Big 12 opener at Kansas State, BU rolled to a 100-69 victory on Dec. 19, becoming the first team to score 100 in Manhattan since 1992.
- Two Baylor guards posted double-doubles, with **MaCio Teague**'s 23 points and 10 rebounds and **Jared Butler's** 14 points and career-high 13 assists. **Davion Mitchell** added a career-high 20 points.

BU FORCES 35 TURNOVERS IN DOMINANT WIN OVER SFA

- Baylor forced a Ferrell Center-record 35 turnovers and rolled to an 83-52 win over SFA in its Dec. 9 home opener.
- The Bears snapped SFA's 18-game winning streak (which was the nation's 2nd-longest active streak) and handed SFA its largest margin-of-defeat in more than two years – a 38-point loss at Miami on Nov. 13, 2018.

BEARS NOTCH TOP-5 WIN OVER ILLINOIS IN JIMMY V CLASSIC

- Baylor recorded its first ranked win of the season by beating No. 5 Illinois 82-69 in the Jimmy V Classic on Dec. 2.
- Four BU guards all scored in double-figures and combined for 56 points, led by Adam Flagler's 18 off the bench.
- There were 10 lead changes in the game, and score was tied 43-43 with 13:16 left. BU used a 6-0 run to take the
- lead for good, and put the game away with a 9-0 run over 75 seconds to take a 65-61 lead with 7 minutes left. • After being out-rebounded 25-18 in the first half, Baylor out-rebounded the Illini 20-10 after the break.

TWO 30-POINT WINS IN VEGAS TO OPEN SEASON

- Baylor's season started three days later than expected, but the Bears came out strong scoring 112 points in a 30-point win over Louisiana-Lafayette and then taking down Washington 86-52 the following day.
- The Bears drained 15 treys and had 25 assists on their way to 112 points in the opener vs. Louisiana-Lafayette.
 BU out-rebounded Washington 50-19, with Mark Vital (15) recording as many rebounds as all Washington players combined (15 + 4 team rebounds). It was the second time Vital accomplished that feat (2018-19 at Arizona).

• Matthew Driscoll is in his 12th season as head coach at North Florida after six seasons as a Baylor assistant.

• Grant McCasland is in his fourth season as head coach at North Texas. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.

• Paul Mills is in his fourth season as head coach at Oral Roberts. He was a member of Drew's original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.






