STORY LINES

- Baylor softball (27-21) returns to the NCAA Division I Softball Championship as the Lady Bears travel to the Sunshine State for the Gainesville Regional, running May 21-23 at Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium. Fourth-seeded Florida (42-9) hosts BU, alongside the South Alabama Jaguars (30-19) and South Florida Bulls (29-17) for the weekend's double-elimination bracket.
- Every inning of the Gainesville Regional will be broadcast on the ESPN family of networks. Beth Mowins (pxp) and Michele Smith (analyst) will be on the call all weekend. Every Baylor game will continue to be broadcasted on 101.3 FM with Dan Ingham handling the commentary.
- BU earned an NCAA postseason bid for the 14th time in program history. Baylor is 47-30 all-time in the NCAA Tournament. The Lady Bears have advanced to at least a Super Regional round six times (2005, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2014, 2017). BU is 33-13 all-time in the first round.
- The Gainesville Regional field includes three teams that have made it to the Women's College World Series in the past decade. Baylor has made four World Series appearances, the last coming in 2017; Florida won back-to-back national titles in 2014 and '15 and was the runner-up in 2009, 2011 and 2017; and South Florida reached the World Series in 2012.
- Baylor is 5-5 all-time against Florida. After winning the first five games of the series vs. the Gators, BU has dropped the last five meetings, most recently two to the eventual national champions in the 2014 WCWS. Florida has wins over national seeds Florida State, Kentucky, LSU, Alabama and Missouri and lost to Alabama, 4-0, in the SEC championship game. The Gators are hitting .279 as a team with 50 home runs and have a pair of 16-game winners in the circle.
- Baylor is 2-0 all-time against South Alabama. The two teams met in 2010 in Waco before facing off in Gulfport in 2014. This year's USA team has wins over Georgia and third-seeded Alabama and lost to Louisiana in the Sun Belt Tournament championship game.
- Baylor is 1-2 all-time vs. South Florida. After dropping a pair of 1-3 contests in 1985 and 2004, BU won a 3-0 contest in 2014. The runner-up in the American Athletic Conference, South Florida played an ambitious schedule with four losses already to Florida and two to 11th-seeded Arizona. The Bulls lost to UCF in the AAC tournament semifinals.
- This season, the Lady Bears are 6-18 against 2021 tournament teams: Oklahoma (0-3), Iowa State (2-2), Oklahoma State (0-3), Mississippi State (1-0), Texas State (0-1), Texas (0-3), Ole Miss (0-1), Arkansas (0-1), McNeese (1-0), Louisiana (1-0), Arizona State (1-1), BYU (0-3).
- BU is one of five Big 12 teams to advance to the NCAA Tournament: No. 1 Oklahoma (Norman Regional), No. 5 Oklahoma State (Stillwater Regional), No. 12 Texas (Austin Regional) and Iowa State (Columbia Regional).
- This marks Baylor's first tournament bid since the 2018 season when the Lady Bears advanced to the College Station Regional. After an injury-filled 2019 season ended without a postseason berth, a promising 2020 season abruptly came to an end in March due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- After 20 seasons as an assistant coach for the Lady Bears, Mark Lumley retired in October before he passed away in December after his fourth bout with cancer. The Baylor players and coaching staff have all been wearing blue ribbons in his honor. This season is for Lum.

BAYLOR'S GIA RODONI PLAYING SIXTH SEASON FOR COACH LUM

Six years is a significant stretch of time in most any setting. Six years ago, David Letterman was still hosting late night television and TikTok didn't exist.

But six years is an eon in college sports. Consider that when Gia Rodoni first stepped into the circle for Baylor in 2016, one of the catchers she will throw to in 2021 was still in middle school.

Now all these years later, her timeline disrupted by injuries and a pandemic, Rodoni is among those players beginning a sixth season of college softball. And even as she watches with amusement while her newest teammates struggle with the same introductory classes that once bedeviled her, the best counsel she can offer them is never lose track of the clock.

"Just enjoy your time because it does fly by quick," Rodoni said.

Then she paused, as if suddenly aware that those words sound strange coming from her.

"Even my six years being here, I feel like it has flown by," she continued. "So a regular four year span is going to go by in the blink of an eye."

It is a familiar realization. It is also particularly bittersweet for Rodoni this spring. She wasn't supposed to still be in a Gettman Stadium dug-out in 2021. Mark Lumley was.

The NCAA decision to extend eligibility for athletes affected by the pandemic-shortened season gave her an extra year. She gained a season that she hopes her accumulated wisdom and perspective will allow her to enjoy to its fullest. But it arrives only after she lost a friend.

A Baylor assistant since 2001, Lumley passed away in December after a battle with cancer. Rodoni didn't get to spend another season with Lumley. So she will play her final one for him.

"He was a man like no other," Rodoni said. "He and my dad are my heroes. He knew how to love well, and he cared about you more as a person than you were a softball player. That's saying a lot because he loved softball, that was his whole life. He was always upbeat, always intentional in wanting to know how we were.

"He wanted to serve us and help us be the best person and player we could be."

Lumley is part of the reason Rodoni arrived at Baylor in the first place. Maybe the biggest reason. He showed her that Baylor was a place she wanted to be. He helped convince Baylor coach Glenn Moore she was a pitcher they needed. Growing up in California, the Texas school wasn't on her radar. Not until her dad told her to tag along with her older brother when he visited Baylor. She rolled her eyes, at least mentally, but reached out to Moore and made plans for a tour. Baylor was already recruiting Ari Hawkins, her travel ball teammate who went on to all-Big 12 honors, and Lumley offered a positive review when Moore sought more background about the team's pitcher.

And it was Lumley who took Rodoni on that tour. He made her feel at home in Waco, made her feel comfortable — even as the two of them careened the wrong way down campus roads in a golf cart. She committed almost on the spot.

It's remarkable to think that if not for a teammate's bout of wildness in 2016, Rodoni might be in line for a seventh season next year. Moore originally planned to redshirt her in that first year on campus. But with the Big 12 season approaching and Kelsee Selman struggling with control, he needed help in the bullpen. She didn't hesitate when he asked if she would sacrifice the redshirt despite having missed half the schedule. It didn't much matter that she ultimately didn't get many innings. She was in a place she wanted to be. Lumley had been right about that.

The innings eventually came, of course. Lumley had been right, too, when he told Moore that she was the real deal. She went 18-4 with a 1.86 ERA as sophomore, turning heads with two no-hitters in the same regional, then 23-12 with a 1.98 ERA as the ace the following season.

In some other universe, she would have piled up another 20 wins and 250 strikeouts in 2019 and gone on with her life. She would be wrapping up nursing school soon. That wouldn't be a bad version of the story, just different.

In our universe, her knee responded slowly to surgery that followed her junior season and she sat out that 2019 season.

Pitching has taken a physical toll on Rodoni, whose 5-foot-7 frame doesn't just bear the brunt of a lot of innings but a lot of pitches within those innings. In addition to the knee injury, Moore said she has had multiple rhizotomies, a surgical procedure intended to alleviate chronic back pain.

"I knew she was struggling," Moore said. "I knew it was not comfortable for her to go out. but she's not one to complain, either. I've coached few players that would pitch through the pain she pitched through. She gave us everything she had, and it was a very unselfish act."

What the coach calls unselfishness might be worrisome if it was born of desperation. If Rodoni returned for a sixth year or pitched through discomfort because she couldn't let go of some part of her identity. It's the difference between trying to make something last forever and making the most of the time you have. The redshirt season forced her to confront a world without softball. She is no longer afraid of it. She is ready for it. When it is time.

"I put that label of 'softball player' on myself so heavily that when it was taken away it absolutely destroyed me," Rodoni said of 2019. "I'm more than a softball player. 'Softball doesn't define me as a person. It took me a long time to figure out and realize there is a life after it.

"I'm a daughter, a sister, a friend, you name it"

Add aspiring nurse to that list. In fact, as much as she defined herself by softball prior to that revelatory redshirt season, nursing was a seed that had already taking root. Nursing school, and eventually a focus in pediatric nursing, has been her plan for a long time. With her present on hold this past year, she watched her future in the nurses on the front lines of the pandemic.

"It just reaffirms this is a job I want to be in and serve people," Rodoni said. "It's reaffirmed my heart for serving others. It reassured me this is what I want to do with my life after softball."

But only after one final season.

Rodoni said she cried for days when the 2020 season was canceled, uncertain whether she had unknowingly pitched her final game. So there wasn't a decision to make when the NCAA granted additional eligibility.

She wanted to get out there one more time.

It was in that final start of 2020, after all, that she had started to feel something like her old self again. She threw a one-hit shutout in that midweek start against Houston on March 10. Better yet, to her way of thinking, she struck out 11 batters. All of them struck out swinging, including the final two outs of the game. She knows she can trust the defense behind her. She has gotten better at letting them help her out. But there will never be anything quite as sweet as the swing and miss.

“As a pitcher I want to dominate hitters,” said Rodoni, who entered the season with the 10th best career strikeout rate among active Division I pitchers. “And that’s how I feel like I dominate them, is with swings and misses. That’s a confidence booster in itself.

“I was getting quite a few more of those in the last few games I threw. That was showing me I was hitting where I want to throw and moving the ball to different parts of the plate.”

Moore suggested that, his pitcher’s optimism aside, she wasn’t quite her old self last March. But he, Lumley and pitching coach Britni Newman, the same three people that had worked with her throughout her time in Waco, could see her getting there. That may again be the case this season. Moore would like to keep her innings down early in the season, circumstances willing. He knows that she will be ready when it counts by the time May rolls around.

He knows he can trust her. Lumley told him so many years ago.

“This season is for him,” Rodoni said of her late friend. “We want to play in honor of him. We just want to keep his positive energy and his love for softball at Getteman Stadium.

“Baylor softball won’t ever be the same without him.”

SHE WAS JUST ONE OF US

When Goose McGlaun got her student teaching assignment in the fall and saw that she was at Castleman Creek Elementary in the Midway school district, the Baylor softball player cringed at the thought.

“I had no desire to do elementary,” she said. “I just hadn’t worked with younger kids in a long time. Even when I’m back home (in Humble, Texas), most of the kids I work with are in middle school, probably 12 and older. Like, this was young, young kids that I was seeing every day.”

And she absolutely loved it.

“Honestly, I told my mentor at the end of the semester that I thought about getting my elementary certification just because I enjoyed it that much,” said McGlaun, who graduated in December with an undergrad degree in health, kinesiology and leisure studies and a master’s in sports pedagogy. “I loved them all, but kindergarten and 1st were my favorite.”

Goose, who ranks sixth all-time on Baylor softball’s career list for home runs (32) and RBI (126), clearly knocked this one out of the park.

“From the minute she walked in, she was just so easy to get along with, and I never felt like she was an intern. She was just one of us,” said Jalayne Rinewalt, the mentoring physical education teacher at Castleman Creek.

In an email to Joe Alford, McGlaun’s intern supervisor in the School of Education, Rinewalt wrote: “She didn’t just raise the bar for any future intern, she became a part of our team that will be missed deeply.”

With Rinewalt out with COVID when school resumed in January, the children in her classes asked assistant PE teacher Gina Allred about her, “but they asked about Coach McGlaun over and over,” she said.

“There’s just a softness about her when she’s working with the kiddos that is a real strength for her,” Rinewalt said. “She commands the classroom when she’s teaching . . . but to also be able to have a softness with the elementary age and be patient, she was really good at that. Those kids were so sad at the end of the semester when she was gone. They were like, ‘When is Coach McGlaun going to be back.’”

Emily DeRatt, Baylor’s Director of Academic Services and softball team advisor, said McGlaun is “going to be a fantastic teacher and coach one day, and she will continue to represent Baylor wherever she goes.” Even if she did go into it somewhat begrudgingly, McGlaun developed a bond with the students and staff at Castleman Creek and found a real niche working with the younger children in pre-K through 4th grade.

“I would always tell my mentor that I’m afraid when I go to softball I’m going to have this high-pitch voice still – what I call my ‘kid language’ – and I’m going to be around older people,” McGlaun said. “But, she was like, ‘No, you’ll get used to it.’”

“And then, just making sure I explained it well, because there were times where I felt like I could have explained something better in my lesson. Going into the next grade, I was like, ‘OK, this time, I need to break this down more,’ or ‘I need to talk about this more.’ I would say by the end of the semester, it was fine.”

One thing McGlaun learned during the semester was how to use the green screen for warm-up videos and teaching virtually to all the students who were learning from home.

“Day One, I put her in front of the green screen to do a video,” Rinewalt said. “I just looked that up the other day and was like, ‘Aww, that was the first video.’ She just fit right in and did it, no problem.”

McGlaun and a group of the children were also part of a Kidz Bop video. “We zoomed in with two of the Kidz Bop kids and sang along to their Christmas songs, promoting their album,” she said. “We’re all in this Kidz Bop music video, so it’s pretty cool that I can tell my kids one day, ‘Hey, your mom’s in a Kidz Bop video!’”

With a demanding fall schedule that had McGlaun working at Castleman Creek from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, she had to try to squeeze in her weight workouts and softball practice when she could.

“I got where I would just work out before school, get my conditioning, running and lifting in on my own, and then go to school and go to practice,” she said. “Saturdays were good, because I was able to be there for all of our intrasquads and see some live pitching on those days. It was a little stressful at times.”

There were also some after-school throwing sessions with Rinewalt, a former softball player herself.

“I’m not sure how many interns can say they played catch with their mentor after school,” McGlaun said. “There were some teachers that would see us walking out to the parking lot with our gloves and were like, ‘Aww, that’s so cute.’”

At the same time, how many mentor teachers can say they’ve played catch with a first-team All-Big 12 first baseman and one of the best power hitters in Baylor softball history?

“When I saw that she played softball, I got really excited,” said Rinewalt, who showed a video of McGlaun’s three-run homer that beat Arizona, 6-5, in the 2017 Super Regional and sent the Lady Bears to their fourth Women’s College World Series. “And then, when I read her profile more closely, I was like, ‘Oh, not only does she play softball, she’s a beast. Suweet!’”

After a COVID-shortened 2020 season, McGlaun was one of four Baylor seniors who opted to return for the extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA. The 18th-ranked Lady Bears open the season Feb. 12-13 at the 35th annual Louisiana Classics in Lafayette, La., before hosting tournaments at Getteman Stadium the last two weekends in February.

Without the stress of classes, McGlaun said she can “just focus on softball and have fun and really enjoy it, because who knows what’s going to happen?”

“I may have an opportunity after this, but I may not” she said, “so I’m trying to really just give it my all so I can have no regrets when it’s all over.” At some point during the season, Rinewalt is hoping to take a bunch of her students to a game at Getteman Stadium “and just have this one big Goose section. We will be the loudest and most obnoxious group out there.”

VERSATILE TAYLOR ELLIS DOES IT ALL FOR BAYLOR LADY BEARS

A decade ago, Baylor coach Glenn Moore was watching Midway play a World Series softball game when the shortstop caught his eye.

Taking a relay throw in shallow left field, Taylor Ellis spun and threw a dart to home plate. Moore immediately called Baylor assistant coach Mark Lumley.

“I said ‘Are you watching the Little League World Series?’” Moore said. “He was and I said find out who this Ellis kid is because we can’t let her leave Waco. It was an arm like I had not seen in Little League play.”

Committing to Baylor when she was 13, Ellis never left Waco.

For the last five years, that arm Moore first witnessed long ago along with her fielding and hitting talents have been invaluable to the Lady Bears.

Whether it’s been shortstop, catcher or most recently third base, Ellis has stepped in where the Lady Bears have needed her the most and played at a high level.

“There’s a lot of versatile players in this game,” Moore said. “But she’s just been very unselfish about what I’ve asked her to do. Honestly, I think third has been her best position, and who would have thought that? Initially she was a little apprehensive about the decision, but she’s grown to love it. It’s a position she’s natural for, but she’s natural for a lot of positions.”

Ellis takes pride in her versatility. Though she was predominantly a shortstop for her Little League, travel ball and Midway High School teams, she’s willingly played other positions for the Lady Bears.

What’s best for the team has always trumped individual aspirations.

“Just being a student of the game, I’ve felt it’s important to learn different positions and be able to play where the team needs me,” Ellis said. “That’s my most important job as a teammate. I always thought I could be a lot more successful if I opened up my mind to play other positions.”

With her college softball career nearing an end, Ellis has become one of Baylor’s most productive hitters as a fifth-year senior. She’s the Lady Bears’ third-leading hitter this season with a .315 average while collecting three homers and 19 RBIs.

Ellis heads into Friday’s 11 a.m. Big 12 tournament opener against Texas Tech in Oklahoma City with a career-best 10-game hitting streak. A .272 career hitter with 12 homers and 97 RBIs, Ellis credits first-year hitting coach Steve “Hoot” Johnigan with helping her improve her batting average this season.

“He’s done a really good job of helping me prepare my mindset and approach,” Ellis said. “I’ve shortened my stance a little and have really focused on hitting through the ball. I’ve always been a real aggressive hitter, but now I try to have controlled aggression and swing at good pitches to have a better outcome.”

Though Ellis was young when she committed to Baylor, it wasn’t a big reach. She always wanted to attend Baylor and grew up watching All-Americans like catcher Chelsi Lake and third baseman Brette Reagan play for the Lady Bears.

“The player I looked up to most was Brette Reagan, mainly because she

was a position player like me,” Ellis said. “It’s been a blast to be able to play for what was my dream school throughout my entire childhood. It’s meant everything to me to wear this uniform and play at this school.”

Though she excelled at soccer and basketball as a youth, Ellis focused all her energy on becoming the best softball player she could be throughout her years at Midway High School.

Ellis proved to be one of the best softball players in Central Texas since her freshman year in 2013 when she was named the Tribune-Herald Super Centex newcomer of the year. Two years later, she earned Trib player of the year honors before receiving all-state recognition as a senior in 2016.

Ellis further developed her skills by playing for the Texas Glory travel ball squad which was coached by Kevin Shelton, the father of former Baylor all-Big 12 outfielder Kathy Shelton. Though Ellis played shortstop, she always took note of how other players handled their positions.

“Coach Shelton always said one of the best ways to get on the field was to be versatile,” Ellis said. “So I tried to learn every position, even if that meant watching how the first baseman or third baseman stood or how they played a bunt.”

That open-minded approach immediately paid off when she arrived at Baylor as she started 52 games as a freshman playing either shortstop or catcher for the Lady Bears’ 2017 team that reached the Women’s College World Series.

While her catching skills were raw, Moore loved her arm and her willingness to learn the position. All-Big 12 pitcher Gia Rodoni felt comfortable with Ellis behind the plate from the start.

“She’s very vocal,” Rodoni said. “I love a catcher who can talk to me. They don’t have to be the best fundamentally, but as long as they talk to me and I know they’re working just as hard, we go hand and hand. Her willingness to put work in wherever and to contribute to the team has been so huge for us.”

Rodoni threw a pair of no-hitters in the 2017 NCAA tournament regionals. Ellis caught the second one as the Lady Bears beat James Madison, 1-0, to advance to the Super Regional.

Ellis came through with her bat in the Super Regional against heavily favored Arizona when she drilled a key two-run double to help the Lady Bears pull off a 6-4 win to tie the series at a game apiece. Baylor went on to win the third game, 6-5, to advance to the program’s fourth World Series under Moore.

After watching the Lady Bears play in World Series in 2007, 2011 and 2014, it was a surreal experience for Ellis to be standing in Oklahoma City’s USA Softball Hall of Fame Stadium as a player.

“It was kind of weird, like an out of body experience,” Ellis said. “I remember walking into the stadium and they packed the house. There was not one open seat for any of the games. It was a really good time for us as a team. It was really cool for little girls who were once dreaming to be out there looking up and seeing little girls that used to be us.”

Ellis helped the Lady Bears reach NCAA regionals in 2018, and they appeared on their way back in 2020 before the season ended abruptly in March due to the COVID-19 shutdown.

When the NCAA ruled that the 2020 season didn’t count against players

eligibility, it didn't take Ellis long to announce that she was coming back for a fifth season.

"It was just disbelief at first that our season ended," Ellis said. "So as soon as we got the opportunity to come back, it was yes, I didn't even have to think about it. I felt I had more to give to this program, my family and myself, and this year has been good for me."

Ellis' love for the game filters across to her teammates. When they see how much the opportunity to play means to her, they want to match her passion.

"I think Taylor is one of the most passionate players I've ever been around," said Baylor leftfielder Lou Gilbert. "She's got this crazy passion for the game and to play the game. And she's the perfect team player, where she'll play anywhere we need her to. She does her job in the lineup and she does her job on the field and off the field."

Ellis completed her master's degree in sports management this spring after earning her bachelor's degree in health and kinesiology after just 3½ years. She's planning to start a career as a sports agent.

"I was going to stay at Baylor regardless to get my master's, so when I got a chance to play another year it was a once in a lifetime deal that I couldn't pass up," Ellis said. "I want to help athletes get on professional teams. I want to start with the WNBA and also handle contracts overseas."

After playing for a World Series team as a freshman, Ellis hopes to bookend her career in the same spot. With her career ticking down, she's savoring every minute on the field.

"I didn't think about it much until the last week or so," Ellis said. "Now it's reached the point where it's 'Is this the last one?' That's kind of scary and a harsh reality to face. But getting this extra year to play has been great for me personally because I could write my own ending."

Even more than the jokes, the dancing, the Lumisms – “nobody really knows what they mean” – Mark Lumley is respected as one of the greatest softball coaches in the game.

“I knew when I interviewed him that he certainly had a clue about the game,” Baylor head coach Glenn Moore said of the 64-year-old Lumley, who’s retiring on Wednesday after 20 years at Baylor and a 37-year career that included two seasons with Moore at LSU and 12 years as the head coach at Flowering Wells High School in Tucson, Ariz.

“It didn’t take me long to know that this guy has a gift when it came to the game and how to teach. It’s difficult to teach at the highest level. You have to know when to teach and when not to teach. That’s something we all struggle with as coaches, because many times players come here having had incredible success, so they’re not coachable right away. I just think he’s an incredible teacher.”

Lumley, promoted to associate head coach in 2006, has helped the Lady Bear program make it to 13 NCAA regionals and four trips to the Women’s College World Series while compiling an overall record of 775-377.

pitching coach Britni Newman, a part of the coaching trio that has been together for the last 17 seasons, the third-longest tenure in the nation.

“He’s taught me so much about life. He’s taught me so much about my faith, based on his actions and how he lives his life. And he’s very talented as a coach. That’s been his calling in life, and he’s definitely fulfilled it.”

Since an initial diagnosis in 2007, Lumley has now had four different bouts with cancer. He had his prostate removed in ‘07, went through chemo treatments in 2015 when cancer was found in his lymph nodes and then had surgery in November 2018 for colorectal cancer.

Back on the field coaching full-time during a 2020 season cut short by COVID-19, Lumley found out that the cancer had spread to his vertebrae in March. On the day the team was leaving for a trip to Houston and then Florida, he woke up and told his wife, Stacey, “My back is killing me. There is no way I’m going to be able to go anywhere.”

“I took him to the emergency room, and that’s when they found the cancer in the bone,” said Stacey Lumley, Mark’s wife of eight years. “Being in the bone, it’s horrific. It’s just overwhelming, because I hate to see him hurt like that.”

One thing he’s never done, though, is give up. Every time the cancer has come back, he has continued to fight with everything he has.

“Honestly, it’s amazing, because he would come to practice and act like nothing was wrong,” said former Baylor outfielder Kyla Walker (2016-20). “The cancer came back when we were going to (College Station) for regionals my junior year. He got the news, still came to regionals and was like, ‘I’ll worry about it after.’ It was just amazing to see how he handled it and how he could fight. It made me realize that softball is something so small. If I don’t do well at hitting or outfield, it’s not that big of a deal. It gives you a different perspective.”

Moore, who’s had Lumley by his side for the last 22 years, said it’s been “unbelievable how he’s fought, at times when I believe I would have thrown in the towel.”

“He was out here at times when he shouldn’t have been here, when he

should have been taking care of himself,” Moore said. “I’m not saying this because he’s about to retire, I’m saying this because that’s who he is. He has always put others ahead of himself. I admire him for how he’s been driven by doing that.”

Even within the last week, weakened by the cancer and groggy with pain medication, he told Stacey, “I still feel like I have stuff to do.”

“He’s just a fighter,” she said, “and he will be all the way through this.”

They’ve been together for so long, Moore said it would be like “cutting off my right arm” when Lumley retires

“I’m not excited about it, but in this life, we’ve got to get tough and we’ve got to march on,” Moore said. “That’s what Mark wants and desires. He wants to be out there on the field, of course, but he loves our program. As a tribute to him and what he’s done for our program, it needs to carry on.”

A native of Tucson, Lumley graduated from the University of Arizona in 1985. As the head coach at Flowering Wells, he led the team to a No. 5 national ranking by USA Today, earned Coach of the Year honors from the Arizona Coaches Association in 1998 and from the Daily Star-Tucson Citizen in 1993 and ‘97.

Obviously well-respected in the Arizona softball circle, Lumley was inducted into the Flowering Wells High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2014 with former Baylor All-American Ashley Monceaux. University of Arizona coach Mike Candrea commented on a Facebook post, “Lum is one of the finest human beings I have ever known.”

When Moore went looking for an assistant coach in August 1998, Lumley showed up for an interview wearing a three-piece suit . . . with the temperature in Phoenix, Ariz., hovering around 110 degrees.

“I thought, this guy is serious,” Moore said in an interview earlier this year with the Waco Tribune-Herald. “Probably 20 minutes into the interview, Mark was asking, ‘Where do I sign?’ That was the beginning of a lifetime friendship.”

In his two years as the hitting coach at LSU, the Tigers won back-to-back SEC championships and came within one win of reaching the World Series in 2000. That year, LSU finished eighth nationally in batting average (.310), 13th in slugging percentage (.430) and 20th in scoring (5.07 runs per game).

Newman, an All-American pitcher at LSU, said Lumley “taught me how to advance my game as a player way back when I played for him many years ago.”

“One thing I loved about him is he just knew how to connect with athletes,” she said. “He’s such a people person, and he has just such a personality to where he could connect with different athletes.”

Lumley’s success elevated to an even higher level in his 20 years at Baylor, coaching multiple All-American hitters.

Jordan Strickland, who hit 14 homers and drove in 49 runs for the 2014 World Series team, said Lumley was “just super encouraging, loves softball more than anybody and just wants his players to be the best and to have all the tools.”

“His passion for softball drove him to know so much about the sport, and he just loved hitting,” Strickland said. “I think because he had coached so long, he always tried to have these innovative drills or ideas

and never wanted us to be bored with anything. He wanted us to constantly be growing.”

Walker, who has known Lumley since she was in the third grade when Baylor started recruiting her older sister, Kayce, said he was always available for a little extra batting practice.

“If I ever felt like my hitting was a little off, I would just text Lum,” said Walker, who set a program record with a .409 career batting average. “He’d say, ‘Well, I’m at the field, you can come whenever.’”

After struggling at the plate in a midweek game against Texas, Strickland went to the batting cage at around 10 p.m., and Lumley “came in there and started hitting with me.”

“That was just the epitome of him,” she said. “He was always helping out players, never said no to a hitting lesson. But at the same time, he was the light spirit of the coaching staff.”

Ever ready with the jokes, Lumley played good cop to Moore’s bad cop at times.

“We all have our roles, and he always knew what was the best way to go about fulfilling that role,” Newman said. “If Coach Moore got on the girls, Coach Lumley sensed, ‘OK, we’ve got to lighten the mood up here a little bit.’ He had kind of a sixth sense of when he needed to step in, when he needed to press a point a little firmer, or if he needed to tell a joke and get everybody laughing.”

Moore said, “Typically, whatever we were doing was well-planned out, but he has certainly helped me be a better teacher because of playing the role he’s had to play.”

After meeting and becoming friends at Bridgepoint Fellowship church 12 years ago, Mark and Stacey started dating four years later and were married on Dec. 28, 2012.

Mark proposed at a softball team dinner, because “he felt like he had a better chance of me saying yes if he did it in front of the whole team,” Stacey said. “He said he knew I wouldn’t want to let the girls down.”

“His reasoning was that if she said no, she would have 18 of his girls to answer to,” Strickland said. “It was just so sweet and so special, and of course Stacey has been amazing throughout all of this. That was my junior year, so getting to meet her and spend time with her those two years left in my playing career, it was neat just to see him so happy.”

Stacey, who has three sons (Trey, Mason and D.J.), said Mark “had a heart for a single mom because his mom was a single mom.”

“He said he had always hoped that his mom would try again and she didn’t,” Stacey said, “so he kind of opened my heart to ‘Maybe it is OK to try this love thing again.’ I had already made up my mind, both of us had. Mark was really that way. He was set in his ways and he had his world moving smoothly. There was nobody to take care of, other than his dog. That dog was his world. We were both kind of at that point where this is what it is and God just wants us to be by ourselves. But, obviously, that wasn’t the truth. It’s been a blessing for both of us.”

Moore said Stacey has been a “godsend.”

“This guy would spend five hours at home and the rest of the time in the office, and it was just unhealthy how he was so absorbed by the job,” Moore said. “Certainly, she balanced him out and has been a godsend for him, looking after him and giving him great joy.”

Arranged by longtime friend and local softball enthusiast Kyle Heard, a drive-by parade in Lumley’s honor back in April attracted an estimated 200 cars and 1,000 people to show support for Lumley in his latest battle with cancer.

“Kyle told Coach Moore that there would be maybe 10 to 15 cars,” Stacey said. “Mason had gone up to get in line, and he called and told me how long the line was. So, I knew probably 10 minutes before they got here that it was going to be that big. Mark went out front and saw the police car, and he said, ‘Somebody’s in trouble.’ I think it took him a minute for it to register that this was for him. And then he started bawling like a baby. He was so overwhelmed.”

Moore said he couldn’t even make eye contact as he drove by, instead just flashing a thumbs-up sign to his longtime friend.

“That’s just the effect that he’s had not only in Waco but nationwide,” Moore said. “Someone called him a rock star when we were at a convention one time, just because when he walks up, everybody starts yelling at him and coming up and making jokes with him. He’s just very much loved.”

His feelings for Coach Lum, Moore said, are “tough to put in words.”

“He’s closer to me than my brothers, and I have a close relationship with them. But, he’s just been my side for so long now. I have to say, he’s the best man I’ve ever met in my life. I’ve never seen someone so unselfish and giving and loyal. He just has a heart for people and, in particular, for all the players we coach.”
