STORY LINES

- No. 1 Baylor hosts Northwestern State at 7 pm CT Tuesday in its final game before Big 12 play.
- BU and NSU are meeting for the 10th time. BU is 8-1 in the series, including 2-0 in the Drew era.

 Baylor won 75-62 in the last meeting on Dec. 8, 2015. Rico Gathers had 31 points and 21 reboounds.
- BU has the nation's longest winning streak (17), with 9 at neutral sites and all wins by 8+ points.
- With a win, Baylor can tie the 4th-longest winning streak by any team in the Big 12's 26-year history.
- Baylor has won 35 straight non-conference games (+22.8 average margin) dating back to Nov. 2019.
- BU has won a school-record 20-straight home games, averaging a +26.6 scoring margin in those wins.
- Baylor is 32-1 at home over the last 2+ seasons, with the lone loss by 3 to Kansas on Feb. 22, 2020.
- Baylor reached No. 1 in the Dec. 13 AP Top 25, marking a 3rd-straight season the Bears held a No. 1
 ranking (only BU and Gonzaga) and 4th time in last 6 seasons (only BU, Gonzaga, Duke and Kansas).
- Tuesday is Baylor's 18th all-time game as a No. 1-ranked team BU is 15-2 while ranked No. 1.
- Baylor is 1 of 5 remaining undefeated teams (Baylor, Colorado State, Iowa State, LSU, USC).
- Baylor is the nation's only team to win every game by 8+ points this season and the first returning national champion to win its first 11 games by 8+ points since 1990-91 UNLV.
- BU overcame a 10-point deficit to win 78-70 for Scott Drew's 400th career win Dec. 18 at Oregon.
- The Bears held No. 6 Villanova to its fewest points since 1979 in a 57-36 win on Dec. 12 in Waco.
- BU has won 18-straight non-conference road/neutral games (last loss Nov. 8, 2019 vs. Washington).
- Baylor's bench has out-scored the opponents' bench in 10 of 11 games and by an average of 32-21.
- BU is allowing only 6.5 second-chance points per game, while scoring 13.2 second-chance points.
- Baylor is averaging 12 more field goal attempts per game than its opponents (BU 65, OPP 53).
- Baylor is averaging 12 more near goal attempts per game than its appointents (bo 63, 611 33).
 Baylor is the nation's only team ranked top-35 in scoring offense (20th) and scoring defense (6th).
- Baylor ranks top-15 nationally in scoring margin (1st, +26.1), steals (5th, 10.8), turnover margin (5th, +6.8), scoring defense (6th, 55.8), assists (6th, 19.2), turnovers forced (9th, 18.9), offensive
- rebounds (9th, 14.3), rebounding margin (13th, +9.8) and assist-to-turnover ratio (13th, 1.60).

 Baylor's defense has recorded 7 + steals and 13 + turnovers forced in all 11 games this season.
- BU has 10+ offensive rebounds in 15-straight games, the nation's 2nd-longest streak (Bowling Green-17).
- BU defeated now-No. 12-ranked Michigan State, 75-58, in the Nov. 26 Battle 4 Atlantis title game.
- BU's 45-straight weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 is the nation's 3rd-longest behind Gonzaga and Villanova.
- Baylor was No. 8 in the preseason AP Top-25, snapping a school-record streak of 29-straight weeks top-5 ranked. The Bears are currently on a school-record streak of 37-straight weeks top-10 ranked.
- BU is 18-3 against ranked teams since beating No. 17 Villanova to win the 2019 Myrtle Beach Invite.
- BU has won 8-straight games against top-10 ranked teams, defeating Nos. 5, 9, 6, 6, 10, 6, 1 and 6.
- Baylor has been ranked in all 25 spots in the AP Top 25 at some point in the last 7 years.
- BU has led by at least 4 points in all 71 games since the start of the 2019-20 season and built a
 double-digit lead in 62 of those games, including 38 of 41 games since the start of last season.

QUICK HITS

- Baylor's 39-2 record over the last two seasons is the nation's best, and the Bears' 65-6 record over the last three seasons is 2nd-best nationally, trailing only Gonzaga (72-5).
- BU is playing its 290th game as a ranked team under Drew BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program's 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since January 2010, BU has been ranked in 274 of 411 games.
- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in 4 of the last 6 seasons since 2017.
- Baylor and Kansas are the only Power-5 schools to win 18+ games every year since 2008.
- BU finished last season ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding pct (No. 8) for a 7th consecutive year.
- BU led the nation in 3-point pct. last season (.413) and ranked 3rd nationally in turnover margin (+5.5) and scoring margin (+17.4). The Bears were also top-10 in scoring (6th, 82.9), steals (9th, 8.9/gm) and assists (10th, 16.9/gm).
- Baylor's streak of 9 consecutive postseasons is tied as the nation's 7th-longest active streak.
- Baylor's 2 losses last season were its fewest losses since going 13-0 in 1911-12.
- Baylor is 40-21 in postseason tournaments (conference, national) over the last 13 seasons.
- Baylor has won 20+ games in 12 of the last 14 seasons after recording only three 20-win seasons in the previous 100 years of Baylor Basketball (1946, 1948, 1988).
- Baylor is 14-3 in Big 12 road games over the last 2 seasons (rest of league is 59-99 in B12 road games).
- Baylor is 85-5 when leading at halftime over the last 5 seasons (55-2 over last 3 seasons, 24-0 last season).
- Baylor has won 91% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (202-21).
- BU is 64-4 when leading at any point in the 2nd half of a game over the last 2+ seasons.
- Baylor is 255-99 over the last 10+ seasons, averaging 24.5 wins per season since 2011-12.
- Baylor's 255 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (294).
- Baylor is 346-146 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- Five of Baylor's players have used or are currently using a redshirt year. Two after transferring to BU (Flagler, Tchamwa Tchatchoua), one before transferring (Bonner) and two as freshmen — Turner and Langston Love.
- Ten of Baylor's 11 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (16 of last 17 seasons).
- Baylor is 1 of 10 teams nationally to appear in every postseason since 2012 (7 NCAAs, 2 NITs).
- Baylor has the nation's 9th-longest active streak with at least one 3-point FG made in 973 straight games the
 last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was more than 30 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).
- BU is 7-1 all-time in Big 12/SEC Challenges, the best record of any team in either league. Combined with a 3-1
 mark in the Big 12/Pac-10 Series and 1-0 in the Big 12/Big East Battle, Baylor is 11-2 in conference challenges.
- Baylor has won 8 tournament titles under Drew 2007 Paradise Jam, 2011 Las Vegas Classic, 2013 NIT, 2016 & 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2017 Hall of Fame Classic, 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational and 2021 NCAA Championship.

BEARS MAKING BIG 12 HISTORY

 In the last three seasons, Baylor has recorded the longest winning streak in the Big 12 Conference's 26-year history (23 in 2019-20), 4th-longest in Big 12 history (18 in 2020-21) and 8th-longest in Big 12 history (17, active).

NOTEABLE STREAKS

- Baylor has won 17-consecutive games, tied as the 3rd-longest in school history and 8th-longest in Big 12 history.
- Baylor has won a school-record 35-consecutive non-conference games (last loss Nov. 8, 2019 vs. Washington).
- Baylor has won a school-record 20-consecutive home games (last loss Feb. 22, 2020 vs. Kansas).
- Baylor has won 20-consecutive non-conference home games (last loss Dec. 18, 2018 vs. SFA).
- Baylor has won 18-consecutive non-conference road/neutral games (last loss Nov. 8, 2019 vs. Washington).
- Baylor has won 34-consecutive games when leading at halftime (last loss Feb. 29, 2020 at TCU).
- BU has won 52-straight when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent (last loss March 2, 2019 at K-State).
- Baylor has won 30-straight games when shooting 50% or higher (last loss March 18, 2018 vs. Mississippi State).
- Baylor has won 32-straight when scoring 80+ points (last loss Jan. 5, 2019 vs. TCU).
- BU has won 31-consecutive games when holding an opponent below 70 points (last loss Feb. 22, 2020 vs. KU).
- BU has won 32-consecutive games when its bench outscores the opposing bench (last loss Feb. 29, 2020 at TCU)
- Baylor has won 20-consective games when Adam Flagler scores 10 + points (never lost).
- Baylor has won 8-straight games following a loss (last consecutive losses were March 9-14, 2019)

SERIES HISTORY VS. NORTHWESTERN STATE

- Baylor is 8-1 all-time against Northwestern State, including a 2-0 mark in the Scott Drew era.
- The teams first met in Natchitoches during the 1945-46 season, a 67-49 BU win. The next eight meetings have all been in Waco, with the Bears winning all but one (NSU won 65-60 on Nov. 25, 1997).
- In two meetings during the Drew era, the Bears fought for a 91-84 overtime win on Dec. 18, 2013 and most recently won 75-62 on Dec. 8, 2015. In the latest meeting, Rico Gathers had 31 points and 21 rebounds.

ONE OF FIVE REMAINING UNDEFEATED TEAMS

- Baylor is 1 of 5 remaining undefeated teams, joining LSU, USC, Colorado State and Iowa State.
- BU is the first returning national champion to win its first 11 games by 8+ points since 1990-91 UNLV.
- Baylor won its first 17 games by 8+ points last season and was one of the last two undefeated teams (Gonzaga).

LONGEST WINNING STREAK IN FERRELL CENTER HISTORY

- Baylor's current 20-game home winning streak is the longest in Ferrell Center history (est. 1988).
- The Bears broke the previous record of 15-straight wins with their victory over Central Arkansas on Nov. 17.
- Baylor has twice before won 15-straight at the Ferrell Center Feb. 21, 2015-Jan. 20, 2016 and Feb. 3, 2020-Jan. 11, 2011. This marks the 12th double-digit winning streak in Ferrell Center history (top 8 all in Drew era).

18-STRAIGHT NON-CONFERENCE WINS AWAY FROM HOME

- Baylor is on a school-record streak of 18-consecutive wins against non-Big 12 teams in road/neutral games.
- The Bears' last non-conference loss away from home was against Washington in the Armed Forces Classic on Nov. 8, 2019. That loss started the Bears' Big 12-record 23-game winning streak.
- Baylor's 18-straight non-conference wins away from home: vs. Ohio, at Coastal Carolina, vs. #17 Villanova, vs. UT-Martin, at Florida, vs. Louisiana, vs. Washington, vs. #5 Illinois, vs. Hartford, vs. Wisconsin, vs. #18 Villanova, vs. #10 Arkansas, vs. #6 Houston, vs. #1 Gonzaga, vs. Arizona State, vs. VCU, vs. Michigan State, at Oregon.

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- Scott Drew became Baylor head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 19th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (381).
- Drew is coaching his 597th game at Baylor (381-215). His .641 winning pct. is best in BU history among coaches with 40+ games, and he's the program's all-time wins leader with 180 more victories than any other coach.
- Baylor has a .704 winning percentage (347-146) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .721 winning percentage (256-99) over the last 10+ seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (51) is the youngest active collegiate head coach to win a National Championship.
- Baylor is playing its 290th game as a ranked team in Drew's 19 seasons. BU was ranked in 2 of 2,197 games over the program's first 97 seasons prior to Drew. Since January 2010, BU has been ranked in 274 of 411 games.
- In Drew's first 18 seasons at Baylor, 48 players have gone on to professional careers.

BEARS SHARE WEATLH IN WIN OVER ALCORN STATE

- Baylor rolled to a 94-57 win over Alcorn State on Dec. 20 in its final game before the Christmas break.
- Nine different Bears combined for 29 assists, and seven different Bears hit 3-pointers in the win.
- Flo Thamba and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua both posted career-highs of 16 points on a combined 14-14 FGs.

COMEBACK FROM 10 DOWN IN FIRST ROAD TEST AT OREGON

- Baylor faced a 34-24 deficit 15 minutes into its first road game, but the Bears fought back to take a 42-41 lead with 17 minutes remaining and used a 12-0 run to a break a 51-all tie in a 78-70 win at Oregon on Dec. 18.
- Head coach Scott Drew recorded his 400th career victory (380 at Baylor) in his 20th season as a head coach.
- Kendall Brown scored a team-high 17 points (15 in 2nd half), including 9 as part of the decisive 12-0 run.
- James Akinjo had 17 points and a game-high 6 assists, and Adam Flagler had 16 points with 5 first-half treys.

DOMINANT WIN OVER NO. 6 VILLANOVA

- Baylor put together a dominant defensive performance in a 57-36 win over No. 6 Villanova on Dec. 12.
- The Bears held Villanova to its fewest points since 1979, lowest field goal percentage (.222) of the 21-year Jay Wright era and fewest points by any AP Top 10 team in the shot clock era.
- It was BU's 8th-straight win over top-10 ranked teams and improved BU to 13-1 vs. the Big East in the Drew era.
- James Akinjo had a game-high 16 points along with 7 rebounds and 5 assists, as BU improved to 3-0 vs. Villanova.

RANKED NO. 1 FOR THIRD-STRAIGHT SEASON

- Baylor reached No. 1 nationally on Dec. 13, marking a third-straight season with a No. 1 national ranking.
- BU was No. 1 for the first time on Jan. 9, 2017, spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 2019-20, was No. 1 in the
 preseason and week 1 coaches' polls last year and has been No. 1 for three weeks in 2021-22.
- Baylor has now been ranked No. 1 in 12 weekly polls all-time. The Bears are 15-2 when playing as a No. 1 team.
- Baylor joins Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas as the only programs ranked No. 1 in four seasons since 2016-17.

THIRTY-SEVEN STRAIGHT WEEKS AP TOP-10 RANKED

- BU is ranked No. 1 in the Dec. 27 AP Top 25, extending a school-record streak to 37-straight weeks top-10 ranked.
- With its No. 8 AP preseason ranking, Baylor's school-record streak of 28-straight weeks top-5 ranked was snapped.
- Baylor has been in the AP Top 25 a school-record 45-straight weeks, which is the nation's 3rd-longest active streak behind only Gonzaga (103) and Villanova (48).

FORTY-ONE WINS VS. RANKED TEAMS IN LAST SEVEN SEASONS

- Baylor has gone 41-35 against ranked teams since the start of the 2014-15 season (18-3 last 3 seasons).
- BU is 59-75 against AP-ranked teams since 2007-08 after going 17-122 in the program's first 101 seasons.
- Baylor has won multiple games vs. AP Top 25 teams in each of the last 14 seasons.
- The Bears have defeated at least five ranked teams in six of the last eight seasons.

NON-CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- Baylor is 13-1 against the Big East during the Drew era, 16-5 vs. the Pac-12 during the Drew era, and 17-10 against the SEC during the Drew era, including 12-5 since 2012-13 and 7-1 in the Big 12/SEC Challenge.
- The Bears are 5-0 against Big Ten teams since 2015, with wins against Michigan State (2016 B4A), Wisconsin (2017 HOF Classic), Illinois (2020 Jimmy V Classic), Wisconsin (2021 NCAAT) and Michigan State (2021 B4A).

NATION'S-BEST 18-3 VS. RANKED TEAMS OVER LAST TWO SEASONS

- Baylor is 18-3 against AP Top-25 ranked teams over the last two seasons. BU became the first team since Indiana in 1974-76 to win 10 of 11 games against ranked opponents before the Feb. 27, 2021 loss at Kansas ended the run.
- The record includes 11-2 away from home, with neutral wins vs. #17 Villanova (Nov. 2019), vs. #5 Illinois (Nov. 2020), vs. #18 Villanova (March 2021), vs. #10 Arkansas (March 2021), vs. #6 Houston (April 2021) and #1 Gonzaga (April 2021) and road wins at #22 Texas Tech (Jan. 2020), at #4 Kansas (Jan. 2020), at #15 Texas Tech (Jan. 2021), at #6 Texas (Feb. 2021) and at #6 West Virginia (March 2021).
- BU is 7-1 at home vs. ranked teams in the last 3 seasons wins vs. #12 Arizona (Dec. 2019), #18 Butler (Dec. 2019), #14 West Virginia (Feb. 2020), #9 Kansas (Jan. 2021), #17 Oklahoma State (March 2021), #18 Texas Tech (March 2021) and #6 Villanova (Dec. 2021), and the lone loss by 3 points to #3 Kansas (Feb. 2020).

BIG 12'S MOST WINS IN CONFERENCE CHALLENGES

- Baylor is 11-2 in conference challenges 7-1 in Big 12/SEC Challenge, 3-1 in Big 12/Pac-10, 1-0 in Big 12/Big East.
- BU's 7-1 Big 12/SEC Challenge record is the best by any team in either league and includes wins over half of the 14 SEC programs – Kentucky, Vanderbilt, Georgia, Ole Miss, Alabama, Florida and Auburn.
- Baylor is 7-1 in Big 12/SEC Challenges, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State are 6-2, Kansas and Texas Tech are 5-3, TCU is 4-4, Texas is 3-4, K-State and Iowa State are 3-5 and West Virginia is 2-6.
- Baylor's 11-2 record in conference challenges is best in the Big 12, followed by Oklahoma State (10-5), Kansas (9-6),
 Oklahoma (8-7), Iowa State (7-7), Texas Tech (6-8), Texas (6-8), K-State (5-9), TCU (5-6) and West Virginia (4-7).

PROTECTING HALFTIME LEADS

- Baylor is 85-5 when leading at halftime over the last five seasons since the start of 2017-18.
- Baylor has won 91% of its games (203-21) when leading at the half in the last 10+ seasons ...
 10-0 in 2021-22, 24-0 in 2020-21, 21-2 in 2019-20, 15-3 in 2018-19, 15-0 in 2017-18, 18-3 in 2016-17,

- BU has won 40% of games in which its been tied or trailing at the half since 2011-12, going 53-78 in those.

ANOTHER BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS TITLE

- Baylor won its second Battle 4 Atlantis title (2016, 2021) with wins over Arizona State, VCU and Michigan State.
 The Bears joined Villanova (2013, 2017) as the only 2-time Battle 4 Atlantis Champions.
- Baylor is now 39-12 in regular-season tournaments during the Drew era, including 26-4 since 2013-14.
- James Akinjo was named 2021 B4A MVP, while Kendall Brown joined him on the All-Tournament Team.
- Baylor defeated VCU, Michigan State and Louisville, respectively, to win the 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis.

BEARS NOTCH MARQUEE WIN OVER MICHIGAN STATE IN B4A TITLE GAME

- Baylor won the Battle 4 Atlantis title with a 75-58 win over Michigan State on Nov. 26. The 17-point margin of victory was the largest for a non-conference team against Michigan State since Nov. 15, 2016 (Kentucky, 69-48).
- BU faced its largest deficit at 36-31 with 2:20 left in the first half, then went on a 24-6 run and led by double-digits for the final 14 minutes. BU forced 19 turnovers and had 15 more field goal attempts than the Spartans.
- James Akinjo (game-highs 15 pts, 5 assists) was named MVP, and Kendall Brown was named All-Tournament.

HARD-FOUGHT B4A SEMIFINAL WIN OVER VCU

- Baylor overcame 13 first-half turnovers in a hard-fought 69-61 win over VCU in the Battle 4 Atlantis semifinals.
- The Bears led 29-27 at the break, then started the second half on a 9-0 run. VCU cut the deficit to 3 points with 11 minutes left, but BU responded with a 6-0 run and led by at least 4 points the rest of the game.
- BU was out-shot (42%-40%), but forced 19 turnovers and out-rebounded VCU 42-33. Matthew Mayer led BU with 15 points, while Kendall Brown added 14, and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua tied his career-high 13 points.

BEARS PULL AWAY EARLY IN BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS WIN OVER ARIZONA STATE

- Baylor broke a 23-23 tie with a 19-4 run and led by double-digits for the final 22 minutes in a 75-63 win over Arizona State on Nov. 24 in the Battle 4 Atlantis first round. BU won despite shooting a season-low 42% from the field.
- Flo Thamba posted career-highs with 11 points in 23 minutes, while LJ Cryer (15 points) led the Bears in scoring for a 4th-straight game. Matthew Mayer (14), Adam Flagler (13) and Kendall Brown (10) also scored 10 + points.

SECOND-HALF SURGE LEADS TO BLOWOUT OF STANFORD

- Baylor led 34-28 at the break, then rushed out to a 24-3 run to start the second half and pulled away for a dominating 86-48 win over Stanford on Nov. 20. BU snapped Stanford's streak of 89-straight games with 50 + points.
- LJ Cryer (21 points) made his career-first start and had his 3rd-consecutive 20-point game, while James Akinjo (11 points, 11 assists) had his second-straight double-double after recording his career-first three days prior.

DREW'S 17-8 NCAA TOURNAMENT RECORD

- Head coach Scott Drew has a 17-8 record over nine NCAA Tournament appearances, including five Sweet 16s, three Elite Eights, one Final Four and one National Championship.
- Drew's 17-8 record (.680) is 7th-best among active coaches, trailing only Mike Krzyzewski (.764; 97-30), John Calipari (56-19; .747), Rick Pitino (33-22; .730), Chris Beard (.713; 10-4), Tom Izzo (.703; 52-22) and Bill Self (.700; 49-21).
- Drew has guided Baylor to nine of the last 12 NCAA Tournaments. Prior to Drew's arrival, Baylor had been to only four NCAA Tournaments, including just once in the 53 seasons preceding his arrival in 2003-04.
- In 2008, Drew guided Baylor to its first NCAA Championship appearance in 20 seasons (since 1988) and just its second appearance in 58 seasons since going to the eight-team tournament in 1950.

BEARS RETURN SEVEN LETTERWINNERS FROM NATIONAL TITLE TEAM

- Baylor lost four starters from last season's National Championship team, but the Bears returned seven lettermen.
- BU's seven returning lettermen entered this year with a combined 344 games (77 starts) of collegiate experience.
- Matthew Mayer (93 career games), Flo Thamba (82 career games, 30 starts), Adam Flagler (64 career games, 36 starts), Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua (60 career games, 11 starts), LJ Cryer (20 career games), Zach Loveday (13 career games) and Jordan Turner (12 career games) all returned from last year's National Championship team.

APPEARANCES IN SIX OF LAST SEVEN NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor appeared in the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time in the last seven tournaments.
- BU is 1 of 16 teams to appear in six NCAA Tournaments since 2014, joining Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan, Michigan State, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Purdue, VCU, Villanova, Virginia, Wichita State and Wisconsin.

SECOND-MOST WINS AMONG BIG 12 TEAMS IN LAST DECADE

- Baylor's 256-99 record since 2011-12 trails only Kansas (294-73) among Big 12 teams (thru 12/27/21).
- West Virginia (222-130) is 3rd, Iowa State (209-135) is 4th, Oklahoma (206-130) is 5th, Kansas State (199-145) is 6th, Texas (198-145) is 7th, Oklahoma St. (191-148) is 8th, Texas Tech (186-151) is 9th and TCU (174-165) is 10th.
- Baylor has averaged 24.5 wins per season over the last 10 full seasons since 2011-12.

BEARS WELCOME HIGHEST RANKED RECRUITING CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY FOR 2021-22

- Baylor signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history in November 2020, inking a trio of top-40 recruits for the 2021-22 season. BU's 2021 recruiting class was ranked No. 4 nationally by ESPN.
- The Bears signed 5-star forward Kendall Brown, 4-star guard Langston Love and 4-star forward Jeremy Sochan.
- Brown was ranked No. 12 nationally, Love was No. 23 nationally and Sochan was No. 40 nationally.
- Brown and Sochan debuted in the season-opener, but Love is out for the year with a knee injury.

ANOTHER STRONG CLASS HEADED TO WACO IN 2022

- Baylor's three-player 2022 signing class is ranked No. 13 nationally by ESPN.com.
- The Bears signed the highest-ranked recruit in program history with No. 3-ranked Keyonte George (IMG Academy).
- Baylor signed another guard with No. 53-ranked Dillon Hunter (Sunrise Christian) and added 4-star big man prospect Joshua Ojianwuna (NBA Global Academy – Australia).

ENTIRE STAFF BACK FOR FIFTH-STRAIGHT SEASON

- Scott Drew's entire coaching staff returned for the 2021-22 season, a fifth-straight season of continuity.
- Jerome Tang is in his fifth season as associate head coach and has been on Drew's staff all 19 seasons at Baylor.
- Assistant coaches Alvin Brooks III (sixth season) and John Jakus (fifth season) also return to the bench.
- Special assistant & director of player development Jared Nuness is back for his 12th season, while director of basketball operations Aditya Malhotra returns for his ninth season. Special assistant to the head coach Bill Peterson and director of video operations Ty Beard are both back for their fifth seasons.

ALL FOUR DEPARTED STARTERS NOW PLAYING PROFESSIONALLY

- All four departed starters from last season's National Championship team are now playing professionally.
- Davion Mitchell was drafted No. 9 overall by the Sacramento Kings.
- Jared Butler was drafted No. 40 by the New Orleans Pelicans (traded to Utah Jazz).
- MaCio Teague is playing on the Utah Jazz G-League team.
- Mark Vital is suiting up for the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs.

NINE CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON BERTHS

- Baylor is on a school-record streak of nine consecutive postseason berths and has appeared in 12 of the last 13
 postseasons. BU made seven postseason appearances in the program's 97 seasons prior to the Scott Drew era.
- Baylor is 1 of 10 teams to appear in every postseason since 2012, joining Gonzaga, Iona, Kansas, Michigan State, North Carolina, Oregon, Saint Mary's, Virginia and Wichita State.
- BU earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019 and 2021 and NIT bids in 2013 and 2018.
- Baylor has appeared in 12 of the last 13 postseasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor's only postseason berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).

NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER SUCCESS

- Baylor has posted a combined 174-34 record in November and December games during the Drew era, including a 92-12 mark in November and December games since 2013.
- The Bears are 86-15 in November games and 88-19 in December contests during the Drew era.
- BU is 46-7 in November games since 2013, with the only losses to No. 8 Syracuse (2013), vs. Illinois (2014) in Las Vegas, at No. 25 Oregon (2015), at No. 21 Xavier (2017), vs. Texas Southern (2018), vs. Ole Miss (2018) in Florida and vs. Washington (2019) in Alaska.
- BU is 46-5 in December games since 2013, with the only losses at No. 24 Texas A&M (2015), vs. No. 8 Wichita State (2017), at No. 22 Texas Tech (2017), at Wichita State (2018) and vs. SFA (2018).

SCOTT DREW COACHING TREE

- Three current Division I head coaches took their first DI head coaching jobs after stints on Scott Drew's BU staff.
- Matthew Driscoll is in his 13th season as head coach at North Florida after six seasons as a Baylor assistant.
- Grant McCasland is in his fifth season as head coach at North Texas. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.
- Paul Mills is in his fifth season as head coach at Oral Roberts. He was a member of Drew's original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.
- All 3 former assistants have led their teams to NCAA Tournaments Driscoll led UNF to the 2015 NCAA
 Tournament, while McCasland took UNT to the 2021 Second Round and Mills took ORU to the 2021 Sweet 16.

48 PRO PLAYERS IN DREW ERA

- In Scott Drew's 18 years at Baylor, 48 of his players have gone on to professional careers.
- Five Bears are currently on NBA rosters Jared Butler (Jazz), Davion Mitchell (Kings), Royce O'Neale (Jazz), Taurean Prince (Timberwolves) and Ishmail Wainright (Suns).
- In addition to the five current NBA players, eight more of Drew's former players have played in the NBA (most recent team) – Quincy Acy (Raptors), Freddie Gillespie (Raptors), Pierre Jackson (Mavs), Cory Jefferson (Suns), Perry Jones III (Thunder), Quincy Miller (Kings), Johnathan Motley (Clippers) and Ekpe Udoh (Jazz).

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Drew is in his 19th season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (381).
- . Baylor has had a nation-leading four players selected in the NBA Draft since 2010 who weren't ranked in the ESPN100 out of high school — Quincy Acy, Ekpe Udoh, Pierre Jackson and Taurean Prince.
- Drew has graduated 54 players during his Baylor tenure, averaging 3 graduates per season.
- The Bears have advanced to postseason play in a school-record nine straight seasons (7 NCAA, 2 NIT).
- Baylor is 26-4 in regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, including 5 regular-season tournament titles.
- Drew has won 20+ games in 12 of the last 14 years the Bears had 3 seasons of 20+ wins prior to his arrival.

DREW IS THIRD BIG 12 COACH TO REACH 150 CONFERENCE WINS

- Scott Drew joined Rick Barnes and Bill Self as the only coaches to reach 150 Big 12 wins on March 4, 2021 vs. OSU.
- Drew needed 136 games over 2,940 days for his first 50 Big 12 wins (50-86), 88 games over 1,821 days for his next 50 Big 12 wins (50-38) and only 77 games over 1,493 days for his next 50 Big 12 wins (50-27).

POINT GUARDS THRIVE IN DREW'S SYSTEM

- Ten of Baylor's 11 starting point guards during the Scott Drew era have earned All-Big 12 recognition.
- Baylor's starting point guard has earned All-Big 12 recognition in 16 of 17 seasons since 2004-05.
- Jared Butler (2019, 2020, 2021), Davion Mitchell (2020, 2021), Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

HISTORY OF DEVELOPMENT WITH REDSHIRTS

- Baylor has a track record of success when redshirting players. Davion Mitchell, MaCio Teague, Freddie Gillespie, Mark Vital, Ekpe Udoh, Johnathan Motley, Cory Jefferson, Brady Heslip, Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. and Manu Lecomte have all gone on to professional careers after redshirting.
- Adam Flagler and Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua redshirted in 2019-20 while sitting out to satisfy NCAA transfer rules, while Jordan Turner elected to redshirt in 2019-20.

BAYLOR BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

- Baylor basketball is aired live via the Baylor Sports Network from Learfield on ESPN Central Texas and flagship station 1660AM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco and worldwide on Sirius/XM Radio.
- Games are broadcast by the "Voice of the Bears" John Morris, who was named NSMA 2019 Texas co-Sportscaster of the Year on Jan. 13, 2020, and former Baylor basketball standout Pat Nunley.
- Morris is in his 38th year doing BU broadcasts (27th full-time), and Nunley is in his 41st season as analyst.
- All of Baylor's games can be heard live on the Internet at www.BaylorBears.com and via the Tuneln App.

OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING A BAYLOR STAPLE

- Baylor has ranked top-10 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage in all eight seasons since 2013-14, including six times ranked in the nation's top-5. The Bears only cracked the top-20 once in Drew's first 10 years.
- Baylor's 8-year streak is the nation's best, and West Virginia (7 years) is the only other team with a 4+ year streak.
- Baylor currently ranks 6th nationally in offensive rebounding percentage, grabbing 40% of its missed field goals.
- Baylor finished ranked No. 5 nationally in 2020-21, No. 8 in 2019-20, No. 2 in 2018-19, No. 9 in 2017-18, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16, No. 1 in 2014-15 and No. 3 in 2013-14. Prior to that top-10 streak, BU's best rank was No. 16 in 2011-12.

BIG 12'S SECOND-BEST ROAD MARK SINCE 2012

- Baylor is 48-41 in Big 12 road games since 2012, 2nd-best in the league behind only Kansas (entering 2021-22).
- BU is 39-32 in Big 12 road games since 2014, which is also second-best in the league behind only Kansas.






