A Quick Peek at the Cards

- ◆The Cardinals finished the regular season at 26-2 and an overall record of 28-2. The 28-0 regular season mark in 2021 was the first undefeated regular season in program history and was the best start since 2005 when the Cardinals started 20-0. Louisville was the first team to finish the regular season undefeated since Missouri in 2013.
- ◆The Cardinals are making their 31st NCAA Appearance and fourth-straight and eighth Sweet Sixteen.
- ◆The Cards earned four of the five major ACC Awards with Dani Busboom Kelly named as Coach of the Year, Claire Chaussee as Player of the Year, Amaya Tillman as Defensive Player of the Year and Raquel Lazaro as Setter of the Year. Those three were joined by Aiko Jones and Elena Scott on ACC First Team.
- Claire Chaussee reached her 1,000th career kill in the match against Wake Forest.
- ◆ Aiko Jones reached her 1,000th career kill in the match against North Carolina.
- Anna DeBeer returned to play, starting against NC State, after missing 12 matches.
- ◆Dani Busboom Kelly was named AVCA East Region Coach of the Year, Claire Chaussee was named East Region Player of the Year and Chaussee along with Amaya Tillman, Aiko Jones, Elena Scott, Raquel Lazaro were named to the First Team All-East Region
- ◆Louisville was 53-9 in sets in ACC Play.
- ◆ Claire Chaussee was named AVCA National Player of the Week and is a 4x ACC Player of the Week
- ◆The NCAA DI women's volleyball committee ranked UofL as the No. 2 overall seed and the No. 1 in the Louisville quarter
- ◆ UofL advanced to its first Final Four in program history in 2021.
- ◆The loss against No. 8 Ohio State snapped a 21-home match winning streak at L&N dating back to Oct. 23. 2020 vs. Pitt.
- ◆The Cards set a new attendance record of 1,258 for the L&N Arena versus Kentucky. They set a new school volleyball home attendance record at KFC Yum! Center versus Notre Dame (9,058)



This Week in Cardinal Volleyball

The No. 2 overall seed and the No. 1-ranked University of Louisville volleyball team hosts its third NCAA Sweet 16 in program history, facing No. 4 seeded Baylor on Thursday afternoon 30 minutes following the first match at the KFC Yum! Center.

The Cardinals host the Sweet 16 matchup between No. 3 seeded Oregon and No. 2 seeded Nebraska at the KFC Yum! Center on Thursday at 11:00 a.m.

How We Got Here

The Cards, who have yet to drop a set through the first two matches of the NCAA Tournament, notched their 20th sweep of the season and fifth straight against Purdue to move to a record of 28-2. UofL also swept the Samford Bulldogs.

A Look at the Competition Baylor

No. 4 seed Baylor will make its fourth-straight NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance and seventh straight tournament appearance facing off against the Cardinals. The Bears reach the Sweet 16 after knocking off two Texas teams in a sweep of Stephen F. Austin in the first round and a five-set thriller over Rice in the second round of the Tournament. The Bears have had 20+ wins in each of the seven seasons led by head coach Ryan McGuyre. Baylor brings a balanced offense with five players recording over 200 kills. Lauren Harrison, a senior outside, leads the team with 340 kills on the season with 185 digs and 50 blocks. Harrison's notched 19 kills and 10 digs in the second round match against Rice. Setter Averi Carlson commanded the offense and was named the Big 12 Freshman of the Year as she has recorded 1232 assists, 30 aces, 220 digs, and 30 blocks. Carlson was named to the All-Big 12 First team along with Harrison, Kara McGhee, and Mallory Talbert. McGhee is a 6-5 middle blocker who leads the Big-12 in blocks per set (1.51) and total blocks (172). The senior adds 278 kills hitting .369, three aces, and 39 digs. Talbert is a fifth-year middle blocker and ranks in the top-5 in the Big-12 for hitting percentage. Talbert has 221 kills

hitting .399, 25 aces, 67 digs, and 98 blocks.

Oregon

No. 3 seed Oregon heads to its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance under head coach Matt Ulmer who is in his sixth season. The Ducks (25-5, 17-3 Pac-12) reach the Sweet 16 after a sweep of Loyola Marymount in the first round and a 3-1 win against Arkansas in the second round. The wins completed a perfect season at home and tied its longest winning streak in program history with 15 straight wins.

Nebraska

No. 2 seed Nebraska advances to an NCAA Regional for the 38th time in program history and for the 28th time in the past 29 seasons. The Huskers' 38 trips to an NCAA Regional are the most in NCAA history. Nebraska (26-5, 16-4 Big Ten) reaches the Sweet 16 with a sweep of Delaware State in the first round and a 3-1 win over Kansas in the second round.

About the Cards

The No. 1-seeded Cardinals advance to the Sweet 16 after back-to-back sweeps in the opening rounds against Samford and Purdue. UofL has moved to 28-2 (17-1 ACC) record this season and are making their fourth consecutive trip to the Sweet 16 and eighth in program history while hosting the NCAA Regional for the second straight season. The Cardinals are led by the ACC Player of the Year Claire Chaussee, who has 391 kills hitting .307, 16 aces, 176 digs, and 39 blocks on the season. Amaya Tillman, the ACC Defensive Player of the Year, leads the conference with 146 blocks (1.49 blocks/set) and adds 225 kills hitting .361, 18 aces, and 36 digs. The ACC Setter of the Year Raquel Lazaro has 992 assists, 52 kills, 20 aces, 217 digs, and 84 blocks on the season. Chaussee, Tillman, and Lazaro were named to the First Team All-ACC, along with opposite Aiko Jones and libero Elena Scott. Jones adds 260 kills, a team-high 42 aces, 98 digs, and 96 blocks. Scott leads the team with 404 digs and has 113 assists and 27 aces. The Cardinals are led by the ACC Coach of the Year Dani Busboom Kelly in her sixth season at the helm.

Cards Rake in AVCA East Region Honors

Claire Chaussee was named AVCA East Region Player of the Year. She is joined by First Team All-East Region teammates Amaya Tillman, Raquel Lazaro, Aiko Jones and Elena Scott.

Chaussee Named East Region Player of the Year

Chausee, the 2022 ACC Player of the Year is a four-time ACC Player of the Week and was named National Player of the Week. She ranked 16th in career

kills with 1,171 and was named All-Cardinal Classic ... Named ACC All-Preseason and leads No. 4 ranked team in kills and attacks. She was named to last year's All-Louisville Regional team, HM AVCA All-East Region team.

DBK wins East Region Coach of the Year

Head coach Dani Busboom Kelly was named the AVCA East Region Coach of the Year for the fourth time. She led the Cardinals to a 28-2 record, an ACC Championship, a No. 2 overall seed in the NCAA Championship and was voted as ACC Coach of the Year.

Cards Win ACC Title with sweep of ND

Senior middle blocker Amaya Tillman had 11 kills, with eight blocks, hitting .500 to lead the No. 4 Cards to a share of the ACC Championship as the Cardinals downed Notre Dame 25-22, 25-22, 25-13.

This is the Cards' fifth ACC title. UofL shares the title with Pitt. The Cardinals earned the tiebreaker with a 5-3 set advantage and received the ACC's automatic qualifier. Louisville ends the regular season with a 26-2 mark and went 17-1 in conference play.

Chaussee Wins ACC POY, Tillman is DPOY, Lazaro is SOY and DBK is COY

Atlantic Coast Conference Co-Champion Louisville earned four of the five season's awards to headline the 2022 All-ACC Volleyball honors.

Louisville graduate student outside hitter Claire Chaussee earned ACC Player of the Year, while her teammate, senior middle blocker Amaya Tillman was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Year. Lazaro was tabbed the ACC Setter of the Year. After leading the Cardinals to a regular season 26-2 regular-season record and third consecutive ACC Championship, Dani Busboom Kelly was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the third straight year and third time in her career.

Chaussee led the Cardinals with 3.81 kills per set to fuel the Louisville offense. She tallied 370 kills this season and registered four double-doubles, logging 10 or more kills 20 times. She helped keep Louisville's hopes at a share of the ACC title alive with a season-high 27 kills in a five-set victory over Georgia Tech. The Sun Prairie, Wisconsin, native was named ACC Player of the Week five times during the season. Tillman leads the conference in blocks per set with 1.53, totaling 141 on the season. The two-time ACC Defensive Player of the Year (2020) is tied for sixth nationally in blocks per set and tied for 25th-most blocks this season. She posted a season-best 10 blocks against Pitt and registered 15 games with five

or more blocks. Lazaro, a graduate transfer, amassed 925 assists this season running Cardinals' offense, averaging 9.95 assists per set. With six double-doubles this season, Lazaro recorded a season-best 57 assists in Louisville's five-set comeback over Georgia Tech. The Málaga, Spain, native helped lead the Cardinals to their third consecutive league title, clinching a share after a 3-0 sweep of Notre Dame on Wednesday where she had 29 assists.

Under Busboom Kelly's direction, Louisville worked its way to the 2022 ACC title. With a 26-2 record, the ACC Co-Champion earned a No. 1 seed in the 2022 NCAA Tournament. Louisville is second nationally in blocks per set and 10th nationally in hitting percentage (.289). The Cardinals face the second most difficult schedule in the nation, owning nine wins against ranked opponents in 2022.

All three award winners were named to the All-ACC Teams with Chaussee, Tillman and Lazaro earning first-team honors along with teammates Aiko Jones and Elena Scott.

Chaussee Earns 4th Player of the Week

Chaussee led fourth-ranked Louisville with 13 kills in the No. 4 Cards' sweep of No. 7 Pitt on Senior Night. The Sun Prairie, Wisconsin, native recorded her 20th match with double digit kills and also had three aces and three digs. Chaussee shined in the third set against the Panthers, recording two of her three aces and three of her 13 kills - the final kill securing the match for Louisville.

Chaussee Named Player of the Week

Chaussee had a career-high 27 kills and her fourth double-double of the season adding 10 digs to lead the No. 5 University of Louisville volleyball team to a comeback win over No. 13 Georgia Tech after dropping the first two sets on Friday in Atlanta. Chaussee Named AVCA National Player of the Week/ACC Player of the Week

University of Louisville volleyball fifth year outside hitter Claire Chaussee has been named the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) National Player of the Week. Chaussee, the Atlantic Coast Conference Volleyball Player of the Week as well, turned in a stellar week to help No. 2-ranked Cardinals defeat two top-25 opponents in rival No. 13 Kentucky and No. 9 Stanford. She opened the week with 16 kills hitting .371, six digs, and two blocks against the Wildcats in a five-set thriller that was aired on ESPN. The 6-O Sun Prairie, Wisconsin native recorded 19 kills hitting .310 and four digs against Stanford. Chaussee has 113 kills through ten matches, hitting an impressive .310 on the season.

Busboom Against Ranked Teams

ACC Winning Streak Snapped

Louisville had the nation's second-longest winning streak against conference opponents. The Cardinals won 38 consecutive league matches before losing to Pitt on Oct. 23, 2022. The last team to beat Louisville was Pitt ... two years to the day ... on Oct. 23, 2020. WKU has the longest streak in the nation at 58 straight in CUSA.

UofL boasts a No. 2 RPI as of Nov. 21

The Cardinals' stands at No. 2, the best in the ACC RPI stands for Ratings Percentage Index and the index comprises a team's winning percentage (25%), its opponents' winning percentage (50%), and the winning percentage of those opponents' opponents (25%). The opponents' winning percentage and the winning percentage of those opponents' opponents both comprise the strength of schedule (SOS). Thus, the SOS accounts for 75% of the RPI calculation and is 2/3 its opponents' winning percentage and 1/3 its opponents' opponents' winning percentages.

Louisville Tops ACC Preseason Poll

Louisville has been selected as the preseason favorite to win the 2022 ACC Volleyball Championship following a vote of the league's head coaches. The Cards received 10 first-place votes, while Pitt earned five.

Louisville, which won the ACC last season with a perfect 18-0 record, returns all but two starters to its lineup, including preseason All-ACC selections Claire Chaussee, Anna DeBeer, Aiko Jones, Elena Scott and Amaya Tillman. Both the Cardinals and Panthers advanced to last season's NCAA Championship semifinals and each finished with more than 30 wins.

Pitt finished second in the voting with 185 points, followed by Georgia Tech (173), Miami (150) and Florida State (145). North Carolina earned 134 points and was picked sixth, with NC State (116), Duke (105), Notre Dame (87) and Clemson (72) rounding out the top 10. The Tigers were followed by Wake Forest (63 points), Virginia Tech (48), Boston College (39), Virginia (36) and Syracuse (31).

Cards Seeded No. 2

In 2022, the Cardinals are seeded as overall No. 2 seed and headline the Louisville quarter. The No. 1 seed in 2021 was the highest-ever for UofL in NCAA play. Previous seeds are #9 in 2005, #10 in 2012, and #11 in 2020.

Cards Have 5 ACC Titles

The 2022 ACC title is the fifth in the last nine seasons for the Cards. They have three outright titles. Louisville won the crown in 2020 and shared the championship with Pitt in 2017 and in 2022 after winning it outright in 2015.

Busboom Kelly Makes History

In 2021, Dani Busboom Kelly became the first woman head coach to end the regular season with an undefeated record (28-0) in D1 volleyball history. Louisville became the first undefeated regular season team since 2013 when Missouri finished its regular season at 34-0, only to fall to Purdue in the second round. Other notable undefeated final records came from Long Beach (36-0 in 1998), Nebraska (34-0 in 2000) and USC (35-0 in 2003, 38-0 in 2008 and 2009.) Penn State had back-to-back 38-0 seasons in 2008 and 2009 and won a total of 109-straight games from September 21, 2007 through September 10, 2010.

Balanced Offense Returns

Louisville's offense features four returning players with 200-plus kills, two of whom have more than 250. The Cards are led by Anna DeBeer who tallied 343 kills and hit .257 with 257 digs, 48 blocks and 29 aces. Claire Chaussee had 292 kills on the season with 109

digs and 24 blocks. Aiko Jones recorded 245 kills and has a team high 39 aces with 127 blocks. Amaya Tillman had 213 kills, hitting .368

Servers Should Avoid Scott

Elena Scott was named ACC Freshman of the Week on three occasions in 2021 as the only non-outside hitter to be so honored. She has been aced 15 times this season in 361 attempts. She was aced only 6 times in the 2021 entire season (399 total attempts) and four of her reception errors were against Top 25 opponents. She was aced only twice in ACC play.

Louisville Will Host 2024 NCAA National Volleyball Championship

The NCAA awarded the Volleyball National Championships and an NCAA Regional to the city of Louisville for the 2024 season.

The City of Louisville and the University of Louisville will host the volleyball championship at the KFC Yum! Center. The KFC Yum! Center was the site of the 2012 NCAA Championship that featured the final match with Texas beating Oregon for the crown.

This is the third time for this specific NCAA championship bid process, which created the largest host site announcement ever, spanning 86 championships across a four-year cycle. Previously, selection announcements varied by sport. This process now gives the NCAA and host sites more time to plan each championship experience.

Cards Add Volunteer Coach Parker Mikesch

The University of Louisville volleyball team has added former Ohio State player Parker Mikesch to the coaching staff as a volunteer coach. Mikesch comes to the Ville after an outstanding volleyball career at OSH. As a senior, he led the Buckeyes with 222 digs and 104 sets played. As libero, he played in all 27 matches on the season and set a career high with 19 digs at Lewis. He finished his career with 264 sets and 81 matches played, 357 digs, 372 assists, 10

blocks and three aces. As a junior, he recorded 30 digs over 49 sets on the year. As a sophomore, he split time as the starting libero and averaged 1.64 digs per set, digging a season-high 15 balls vs. Lincoln Memorial. He reached double-digit digs in the season's final match as well with 11 against No. 8 Penn State. He committed just 10 errors on 185 service-receptions (.946) and assisted on 11 kills. As a freshman he played in 28 matches, including eight starts as a fill-in setter and ranked second on the team with 259 assists. He added 51 digs, 10 blocks, seven kills and three service aces to season stat line, while dishing out a season-high 53 assists in a four-set win over Lincoln Memorial (2/2), steering the squad to a .328 hitting percentage.

Cards Add Five to Class of 2023

The No. 5-ranked University of Louisville volleyball team will add five players to its roster this year with three liberos, a right side and an outside hitter joining the Cardinals.

Alanna Bankston is a 6-1 outside hitter from Omaha, Neb., where she played for Millard West for Coach Joe Wessel and played club with Premier Nebraska for Coach Shannon Smolinski. At Millard West, she was a Preseason Super Six and helped her team to the 2021 state runnerup spot. In 2022, she was named AVC All-Region and on the AVCA All-American Watchlist. She was part of the USA NTDP training series and made PrepVolleyball's Top 150 Class of 2023.

Jessica Drapp is a 5-6 libero from Cincinnati, Ohio, where she played for Mercy McAuley High School and Coach Sam Gagnon. She played club ball for Tri-State Elite for Coach Matt Long. She was named to the GGCL First Team in both 2021 and 2022 and was voted First Team All-Region. She earned OHSVCA Division II All-Ohio First Team honors. On the 2021 AVCA Phenom Watchlist, she also was made the Omaha World Herald's All-State HM list.

Reese Robins, a 6-5 middle blocker/opposite is from Mansfield, Texas where she played for Timberview High School for Coach Judith McGill and club volleyball for Drive Nation for coach Jason Nicolson. Reese is a 4-time USAV HP/NTDP training camp participant and a 4-year varsity letter winner. As a freshman, she was the District 5-5A Newcomer of the year, as a sophomore she was 10th district 8-5A co-offensive player of the year, was named Academic All-District and was on the GJNC 16u All-tournament team. As a junior, she was District 8-5A MVP, and led the DFW Metroplex in Kills (711) and Blocks (170). She made the Texas Sports Writers Association 5A First-team All-State, was an USAV North Texas Region All-star and was on All-Star All-Tournament team.
