GENERAL INFORMATION

Working press and photographer credentials for Baylor's home meets will be handled by Baylor Athletics Communications Student Assistant **Kalie Smith**. All requests should be made as early as possible and be limited to working press only. Requests made within 24 hours of the match may not be considered.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials can be picked up in the Communications Office located on the second floor of the Simpson Center or at media will-call at the media entrance of the Willis Family Equestrian Center the day of the meet. Web-based media from sites affiliated with established, nationally recognized news-gathering organizations are eligible for media credentials. Online media with an emphasis on the recruitment of potential student-athletes that meet the above qualification can request one credential for the purpose of writing a game recap.

Credentials will not be granted to any online agency operating sites that are in any way affiliated with gambling. Nor will credentials be granted to fan-submitted or unedited sites that are not affiliated with an established news-gathering organization and/or sites whose sole entity is fan-generated message boards that allow the posting of anonymous comments.

UNAUTHORIZED USE OF CREDENTIALS

Press credentials will be issued to working press only. Press credentials are not transferable and use by anyone other than members of the working press is unauthorized. Press credentials used in an unauthorized manner will be revoked immediately. News organizations allowing unauthorized individuals to use credentials will have their credentials revoked for the remainder of the year.

All press credentials are the property of the Baylor Athletics Department and must be returned upon request.

ADDITIONAL INTERVIEWS

Baylor players and coaches will be available for in-person or phone interviews before or after practice. Player interviews must be coordinated through Athletics Communications Student Assistant **Kalie Smith at least 24 hours in advance**. If a telephone interview is desired, the player will be provided with the number and will telephone the interviewer at a time that does not interfere with the student-athlete's academic schedule. Student-athlete's personal numbers will not be given out under any circumstances.

POST-MEET INTERVIEWS

Baylor University is committed to a policy of equal access for both male and female reporters and photographers.

The Baylor locker room is closed to the media. Head coach Casie Maxwell and requested players will be made available for interviews after a brief cooling-off period in the lobby of the Willis Family Equestrian Center.

Media are asked to submit player interview requests to **Kalie Smith** prior to the end of the meet.

The visiting SID will select student-athletes to be interviewed postmeet if needed. If no visiting SID is available, media are asked to submit their requests to **Kalie Smith**.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Baylor follows NCEA and Big 12 Conference rules regarding media representatives photographing games.

Only properly credentialed photographers will be allowed in the designated photo areas of the Willis Family Equestrian Center as specified by the NCEA and Big 12 Conference.

Photo credentials are subject to revocation by the Baylor Athletics Communications Office at any time.

- From the southwest, take Hwy. 6 to Bus. 77 exit. Bus 77 become LaSalle. Turn left on University Parks Drive. The arena is on the left side of the road.

DR. LINDA A. LIVINGSTONE

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

OKLAHOMA STATE, 1982

Dr. Linda A. Livingstone is the 15th president of Baylor University. She previously served as dean and professor of management at The George Washington University School of Business, as dean and professor of management at Pepperdine University's Graziadio School of Business and Management, and as a tenured faculty member and associate dean of graduate programs at Baylor's Hankamer School of Business.

As Baylor's president, Dr. Livingstone has overseen the development of Baylor's academic strategic plan, Illuminate, which details Baylor's pursuit of becoming a preeminent Christian research university, and the \$1.1 billion comprehensive campaign that undergirds Illuminate, called Give Light. She has also overseen the University's response to COVID-19 and the robust study of Baylor's full history through the Commission on Historic Campus Representations.

A strong voice for the role of faith-based institutions in American higher education, Dr. Livingstone has established herself as a scholar in organizational behavior, leadership, creativity, and university accreditation. She has been extensively published and cited in academic and professional outlets, including American Business Review, Journal of Organizational Behavior, Journal of High Technology Management Research, and the book Business and Corporate Integrity: Sustaining Organizational Compliance, Ethics and Trust. She serves on a number of boards, councils, and task forces, including the boards of Baylor College of Medicine, Capital Southwest Industrials, Waco Industrial Foundation, and the Independent Colleges and Universities of Texas, Inc., the Taskforce on Higher Education and Opportunity, and the AGB Council of Presidents. In addition, she serves as the Vice Chair of the Big XII Conference Board of Directors, as the Secretary for the Board of Directors of the American Council on Education, on the NCAA Division I Board of Directors, and on the NCAA Board of Governors.

Dr. Livingstone was inducted into Oklahoma State University's Hall of Fame in 2020. She also is a member of the Spears School of Business Hall of Fame, was the first recipient of the Outstanding Ph.D. Alumnus Award, and was recognized in 2015 with the OSU Distinguished Alumni Award.

A native of Perkins, Oklahoma, Dr. Livingstone played varsity basketball at Oklahoma State University, where she earned a Bachelor of Science in economics and management, a Master of Business Administration, and a Doctor of Philosophy in management and organizational behavior. Her husband, Brad, a high school history teacher, also played basketball at Oklahoma State. They have one daughter, Shelby, who is an assistant volleyball coach at Liberty University.

Mack B. Rhoades, IV, who has provided outstanding leadership and vision for three NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision athletic programs, was named Baylor University's Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics on July 13, 2016.

Rhoades has organized a team of dynamic administrators and restructured the athletics department to maximize efficiencies across teams. His concept of Preparing Champions for Life has provided the ongoing vision for Baylor Athletics, which aims to bolster the student-athlete experience by focusing on the areas of academic achievement, athletic success, character formation and spiritual growth.

Over his seven years in Waco, Baylor has won 24 Big 12 titles and seven national championships. Since 2011, Baylor leads the nation in combined wins among football, and men's and women's basketball, sporting 58 more wins than the next closest, Notre Dame, and 174 more wins than the next closest in the Big 12, Texas, which ranks No. 22 nationally.

In 2022-23, Baylor saw its Acrobatics & Tumbling team secure an eighth-straight national championship, while running its streak to 27 straight wins. New head coaches Mitch Thompson (baseball) and Michelle Lenard (soccer) debuted, all while the Bears found continued success in competition. Football advanced to a bowl game for the 11th time in 13 years, softball earned a 40-win season, men's and women's golf advanced to the NCAA Championship, men's tennis earned its 25th-straight NCAA Tournament bid and women's tennis advanced to its 24th NCAA tourney appearance. Volleyball earned its seventh-straight NCAA Tournament appearance and advanced to the Sweet 16.

Off the field of competition, the Bears excelled again, earning a 3.28 departmental GPA with 11 teams sporting a combined GPA of over 3.2. The spring marked the 30th-consecutive semester with a departmental-wide GPA of at least 3.0 and over the fall and spring 535 student-athletes earned Academic Champion status, which equates to graduates, student-athletes with a 3.5 GPA or a personal-best GPA. The Bears also boasted over 183 events through its Character Formation program, with 440 student-athletes participating in community volunteer activities, equaling to an economic impact of \$117,217. There were two mission trips, including 30 student-athletes and nine sports, and the Bears saw continued growth in iDisciple, chapel and team ministry programs.

The Baylor Bear Foundation had a banner year in 2022-23 under Rhoades, with the foundation exceeding budgeted goals in raising \$25.1 million in total gifts, the best annual giving campaign in school history, while raising an additional \$56 million beyond its annual fund contributions during the 2022-23 fiscal year.

Rhoades has been instrumental in securing the largest current gift in Baylor history, a \$100-million gift that will help to fund the new Paul and Alejandra Foster Basketball Pavilion. In addition to the state-of-the-art Foster Pavilion, set to open in January of 2024, Rhoades has also spearheaded the Fudge Development Center, a \$75-million facility that will house the daily operations of the football program and will open in the summer of 2024.

During 2021-22, Baylor had one of the best athletic seasons in collegiate history, earning Big 12 Championships in football, and men's and women's basketball, the only school in the 26-year history of the league to accomplish that feat. The Bears boasted a 74-8 record in football and men's and women's basketball, the best in the country. Football won the 2022 Sugar Bowl, while earning a No. 4 national ranking at the end of the season. Acrobatics & Tumbling claimed its

seventh-straight NCAA Championship and men's tennis claimed the Big 12 Tournament title. A total of nine teams earned top-10 national rankings. The Bears were the only school in the nation to have multiple NFL, NBA and WNBA draft picks.

Off the field in 2021-22, the Bears had a 94-percent graduation success rate (GSR), the highest in the Big 12 Conference in the last eight years. BU had a combined 3.32 GPA across all sports and 10 of 17 sports owned at least a 3.3 GPA for the season. There were 163 events sponsored by Character Formation, with Spiritual Growth and the Baylor Built program excelling in its impact on BU student-athletes. BBF raised \$21.9 million in total giving during the fiscal year, a then-school record, while adding an additional \$33 million beyond annual fund contributions.

For the second-consecutive full term (not including the COVID-shortened 2019-20 campaign), the Bears brought home multiple national championships. After acrobatics & tumbling won its fifth-straight title and women's basketball clinched their third national championship in 2019, A&T extended to six straight in 2020-21 and men's basketball claimed its first in program history.

In June 2021, Rhoades was selected as Sports Business Journal's 2021 Athletics Director of the Year, marking the second Athletics Director of the Year honor earned by Rhoades in as many years. He was chosen as 2019-20 NACDA Under Armour Athletics Director of the Year in March 2020.

The 2020-21 academic year, despite the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, brought success for Baylor Athletics as the department combined to bring 20 trophies home to Waco. Men's basketball won its first Big 12 regular-season title and clinched its first conference title since 1950 en route to winning every NCAA tournament game by an average of 15.3 points to claim its first-ever national championship.

The women's basketball program brought home its 11th-straight and 12th overall Big 12 regular season championship in addition to its 11th Big 12 Championship title, marking the 10th time Baylor swept the regular-season and tournament titles. The women's basketball team advanced to the program's 10th Elite Eight, marking the sixth time in the last seven seasons the Bears have been one of the final eight squads standing.

Baylor had 16 of 19 teams reach the postseason in 2020-21. Acrobatics & Tumbling brought home its sixth-straight national championship, and men's tennis advanced to the program's third national championship match and first since 2005. Equestrian upset top-ranked Auburn in the NCEA Championship and Track & Field had three individual national champions at the same NCAA meet (NCAA Indoor Championships) for the first time in program history.

Overall, Baylor's 11 head-to-head sports compiled a 208-86-3 record (.705 winning percentage) during the 2020-21 academic year as 10 of Baylor's 17 teams finished the term ranked, including six in the top 10. Baylor Athletics also brought home six Big 12 titles.

In the midst of the coronavirus pandemic, thanks in large part to the direction of Baylor's health & wellness staff, the Bears completed 93.3 percent of their scheduled contests.

Academically, Baylor set a school record with an overall score of 94 in Graduation Success Rate (GSR) that led the Big 12 for the seventh-straight year and was tops in the state of Texas in addition to ranking 10th nationally among Power Five schools. The Bears have had a 3.0 GPA or better term GPA for 26-straight semesters.

Rhoades also oversaw the Baylor Bear Foundation as it reported more than \$19.5 million in annual giving to Baylor Athletics in 2020, tied for the second-highest giving total in the foundation's 70-plus year history.

The 2018-19 academic year brought several strategic initiatives to the forefront of athletics, beginning with December's unveiling of the "Baylor Built" character formation program. The holistic program encompasses character and leadership development, personal skills, social responsibility, community engagement and spiritual growth.

Rhoades, in a collective effort with a team assembled by Jovan Overshown, Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs, launched - in association with NIKE - the "Baylor United" brand

and visual identity for the department in April of 2019. The process produced a unified color palette, updated primary and secondary marks, new wordmarks and custom brand font and numerical system.

In May of 2019, as part of the Baylor Athletics Master Plan portion of the university's \$1.1 billion "Give Light" campaign, Rhoades announced the department would build a new \$105 million basketball fieldhouse following the largest current gift in the university's history. An anonymous lead gift will spearhead the Baylor Basketball Pavilion to provide an electric atmosphere for the department's national championship-winning basketball programs.

Rhoades has led national searches for eight head coaching positions during his time at Baylor, ultimately bringing to Waco, Matt Rhule (Football) in 2016, Casie Maxwell (Equestrian) in 2017, Brian Boland (Men's Tennis) in 2018, Dave Aranda (Football) in 2020, Nicki Collen (Women's Basketball) in 2021, Michelle Lenard (Soccer) in 2022 and Mitch Thompson (Baseball) in 2022. He also promoted Michael Woodson to head coach during the men's tennis team's postseason run to a national runner-up finish.

The Bears remain committed to giving back, with student-athletes volunteering more than 5,500 hours throughout the Waco community in the last three academic years. The football, men's and women's basketball teams each adopted local elementary schools during the school term where student-athletes would read to classes either virtually or in person.

While mission trips were put on hold for the 2020-21 term due to the pandemic, more than 100 student-athletes participated in spiritual growth opportunities on campus. Previously, Baylor's Sports Ministry Team traveled to share the love of Christ internationally for 12 consecutive years.

Rhoades joined the Baylor family from the University of Missouri, where he spent the previous year (2015-16) leading the 20-sport Southeastern Conference intercollegiate athletics department, and he previously served in similar capacities at the University of Houston (2009-15) and the University of Akron (2006-09).

His first year in Columbia saw Mizzou student-athletes register the highest one-semester grade-point in school history at 3.03 for the fall 2015 term; Barry Odom hired as the Tigers' head football coach; wrestler J' den Cox win an NCAA title and earn a berth on the 2016 U.S. Olympic Team; the Tigers' men's swimming and diving team place a program-best eighth at the NCAA Championship; and its women's basketball program return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006. Bolstered by three top-11 NCAA finishes - wrestling (sixth), men's swimming and diving (eighth) and women's swimming and diving (11th) - Missouri finished 43rd in the final 2015-16 Learfield Directors' Cup standings.

Rhoades and his staff developed a student-athlete enrichment program, Mizzou Made: Preparing Champions for Life. This innovative and comprehensive program is part of a campus community partnership focusing on life skills and career development among other core values.

Before moving to Missouri, Rhoades enjoyed 5 ½ rewarding years guiding the athletic fortunes at the University of Houston as Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics. He reignited the Cougars' entire program, hiring 14 new head coaches, including 2015 FWAA First-Year Coach of the Year Tom Herman. Rhoades also oversaw a transformation of the student-athlete experience while directing marked improvements in the areas of academics, facilities, fundraising and athletic success. In nearly every academic measurement, including grade-point average and the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, Houston registered record achievements. He also unveiled the Cougar Pride Leadership Academy to equip student-athletes with life-long leadership and life skills.

Houston's football team appeared in four bowl games during Rhoades' six seasons, and enjoyed a historic 2011 campaign which saw it climb to No. 6 in the BCS standings en route to a 13-1 record and its first season-ending finish in The Associated Press Top 25 since 1990.

Rhoades, known as an outstanding fundraiser, raised nearly \$100M and constructed \$160M in new facilities during his tenure at Houston,

including a new on-campus football stadium, a men's and women's basketball training center, a golf academy and a short-game facility. Rhoades also negotiated one of the nation's top five facility naming rights agreements at the collegiate level and secured a new multi-media rights deal for Houston. Cougar Pride, Houston Athletics' fundraising arm, set an annual donation record for the fifth-consecutive year in 2013-14 as more than 3,100 Cougar Pride members contributed \$4.5M to eclipse the previous mark of \$3.5M set the previous year.

Rhoades and University of Houston President Dr. Renu Khator successfully steered the institution into an exciting new era when it was invited in December 2011 to join The American Athletic Conference beginning with the 2013-14 academic year. Houston's first year in The American was arguably one of the finest in school history, as its 2013-14 teams combined for 157 victories, 17 American individual championships, 10 NCAA postseason berths and a pair of American team titles. That successful surge led to Houston's highest national finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup since 2000-01.

Rhoades served as chair of the American Athletic Conference Athletics Directors Committee, Athletics Directors Executive Committee and Athletics Directors Finance Committee after having served Conference USA as chairperson for its Championship and Site Selection Committees.

Prior to his arrival at Houston, Rhoades helped the University of Akron achieve unprecedented academic and athletic success. During his tenure, Zip student-athletes earned: 765 total Dean's List honors, 213 All-Conference honors, 83 Academic All-Conference awards, 20 team championships, 14 Conference Player of the Year awards and 12 All-America honors.

Rhoades' Akron tenure was also marked by the construction of a \$61.6M on-campus football stadium, the creation of a women's golf program, three-time recognition for the department's diversity strategy and the hiring of 11 head coaches. UA student-athletes also generously gave back to the community during Rhoades' tenure, providing more than 5,000 service hours to the greater Akron area during each of the 2006-07 and 2007-08 academic years.

He served as a member of the NCAA Division I Championships/ Sports Management Cabinet - as well as its Administrative Committee - and led the Mid-American Conference External Affairs Committee. Rhoades also helped then-MAC Commissioner Rick Chryst negotiate an unprecedented TV contract for the league with ESPN.

Rhoades went to Akron after seven years at UTEP, where he worked his way up the department ranks to become the Miners' Executive Senior Associate Athletics Director after starting as Assistant Athletics Director for Development. In his final position at UTEP, Rhoades oversaw all fundraising, the marketing and media relations offices as well as football external operations, men's basketball, men's golf, licensing, Miner Athletic Club and the athletics ticket office.

Rhoades, who holds a bachelor's degree in health sciences from the University of Arizona (1993) and a master's of science degree in athletics administration/sports management from Indiana University (2002), began his intercollegiate athletics career as a marketing assistant in the Yale athletic department (1996) and worked in development at Marquette (1997-98) before joining the UTEP staff in 1998.

Mack and his wife, Amy, have three daughters - Nicolette (husband Christian Santillán), Natalie (husband, Andrew Charbine and children, Gerard and Gianna) and Noelle (husband, Mason Schlotzhauer).

**HEAD COACH • 7TH SEASON AT BAYLOR
TEXAS A&M, 2006**

Casie Maxwell enters her seventh season as head coach at Baylor and her 14th season as a collegiate equestrian head coach.

Maxwell, who was selected to lead the program in July 2017, finished the 2022-23 season with a career record of 86-108, after previously going 51-60 at Kansas State over seven seasons and posting a 35-48 mark in six campaigns at Baylor. In addition to serving as a figurehead for Baylor Equestrian, Maxwell specializes in the Reining event of the Western discipline, while assistant coaches Grace Bridges (Jumping Seat), Lilly Ulrich (Jumping Seat) and Jessie Weisinger (Horsemanship) also serve the program.

During the 2022-23 athletic season, Maxwell guided the Bears to a 6-10 record and ranked as high as No. 7 in the National Collegiate Equestrian Association (NCEA) poll. Baylor finished as national quarterfinalists after a narrow defeat to eventual national champion SMU, 10-8, in postseason play, and placed third at the 2023 Big 12 Championship after going 1-1 with a close loss to Oklahoma State, 12-8, and a dominating 16-4 victory over Fresno State.

Under Maxwell's tutelage, BU collected three wins over ranked opponents, including the second upset over a No. 1-ranked squad during her tenure with a 12-7 victory over TCU on Oct. 21, 2022. The Bears also matched a program-best with 12 combined Rider of the Month honors from the NCEA and Big 12 Conference.

2023 marked the third-consecutive season with a National Rider of the Year for BUEQ, as senior Dominika Silvestri broke the program record for wins in a Flat season with 14 and garnered national recognition in the event from the NCEA. Silvestri was also tabbed the Big 12 Flat Rider of the Year and joined Madaline Callaway (Reining), Jenna Meimerstorf (Reining), Madison Mitchell (Flat), Annie Vorhies (Flat) and Maddie Vorhies (Flat) as all-conference performers. Silvestri (Flat, First Team) and Mitchell (Flat, Honorable Mention) were also named NCEA All-Americans, the 19th and 20th All-America honorees of the Maxwell era.

For the seventh-straight season, Maxwell coached the league's leading squad in academic honors, as 25 student-athletes were named to the 2023 Academic All-Big 12 squad and another 41 Bears were named to the APHA NCEA All-Academic Teams and Academic Honor Roll.

In the 2021-22 season, Maxwell led the Bears to a No. 6 final national ranking and an NCEA quarterfinals appearance. She guided BU to a 7-8 overall record and a third-place finish in the Big 12 after going 1-1 at the 2022 Big 12 Championship. The Bears collected five wins over ranked opponents on the year, including a season-opening 13-6 win at No. 10 UT Martin which included a full sweep of events and a shutout in Horsemanship.

Under Maxwell's oversight, five Bears were named NCEA All-Americans in Jenna Meimerstorf (First Team, Reining), Andie Pratt (First Team, Reining), Shelby Clausen (Second Team, Reining), Marley Mainwaring (Second Team, Horsemanship) and Caroline Fuller (Honorable Mention, Fences). Additionally, Pratt was named the NCEA's Reining Co-Rider of the Year, the program's second all-time national award recipient and first in Reining. Furthermore, Pratt was named the Big 12 Reining Rider of the Year and was joined by Fuller (Fences and Flat), Mainwaring (Horsemanship) and Clausen (Reining) on the All-Big 12 Teams.

For the sixth-consecutive season, Baylor led the Big 12 with 25 Academic All-Conference selections. BU also garnered 33 selections to the NCEA All-Academic teams and Academic Honor Roll under Maxwell's tutelage.

In the abbreviated 2020-21 season, Maxwell led the Bears to an NCEA Semifinals appearance after an upset of No. 1 Auburn, snapping the Tigers' 42-meet win streak. Maxwell guided the Bears through the COVID-19 pandemic, which forced postponements and rescheduling of multiple meets. But, the Bears were able to overcome the adversity and produce their best rides toward the end of the season, finishing with a strong Senior Day performance and 1-1 showing at the Big 12 Championship, including a 13-7 victory over Fresno State.

Maxwell coached three NCEA All-Americans in 2020-21, including National Flat Rider of the Year Rachael Davis, as well as three All-Big 12

selections. Additionally, 48 Bears received NCEA academic honors, while a league-leading 30 BU student-athletes landed on the Academic All-Big 12 Team.

Before the season was cut short, Maxwell and the Bears went 5-8 in the 2019-20 season. Trekking through a difficult schedule that featured 10 ranked opponents in 13 meets, the Bears knocked off two top-five opponents and recorded a 4-1 record at home. The Bears earned three NCEA All-America selections while Rachael Davis repeated as Big 12 Flat Rider of the Year.

The 2018-19 season was the most successful year under Maxwell's watch where the team compiled a 9-5 overall record and clinched the program's fourth Big 12 title. The team also recorded a 6-1 record at home, earned three Big 12 Rider of the Year honors and five NCEA All-America accolades. During the postseason, the horsemanship team advanced to the NCEA event semifinals for the second consecutive year.

In year one at Baylor, the Bears rallied for ranked wins over No. 5 Auburn and No. 7 TCU. The win over the Tigers was the first win over a ranked opponent for the Bears under Maxwell and the victory over the Horned Frogs extended BU's regular-season win streak over TCU to nine.

Maxwell's expertise with the Western side paid off at the NCEA National Championships. While the team suffered a quarterfinals loss to No. 2 Auburn, both the reining and horsemanship advanced out of the opening rounds, with the horsemanship squad falling to Auburn by just 1.5 points on a 2-2 (581.5-580) raw scores tiebreaker.

Maxwell joined the Bears after spending the previous decade at K-State, serving as the head coach from July 2009 until June 2016, when the program was discontinued by the athletic department. Temporarily transitioning from coaching, Maxwell stayed at K-State as a compliance specialist for the following year before joining the Baylor family.

"I am honored and so excited to continue my coaching career at Baylor University," Maxwell said. "Coaching has a special place in my heart and I am so grateful for the opportunity to contribute to a shared mission of turning these great student-athletes into strong, successful women, all within Baylor's faith-based caring community. I cannot wait to get back into the arena and get started coaching the talented student-athletes who have chosen Baylor for their collegiate careers."

Maxwell led the Wildcats as the head coach, taking over the reins in July 2009 after spending the previous two years as co-head coach. She saw great success at the helm of the program, coaching the western team to three reserve titles, posting 17 All-Americans, two national riders of the year, and twice was named the Big 12 Coach of the Year.

"I have greatly missed being a part of the lives of student-athletes over this past year, so I look forward to this opportunity to push Baylor Equestrian to its highest level," Maxwell said. "Coach (Ellen) White and her staff have worked extremely hard to establish a solid program since its start in 2004. I know I am stepping into a program with a great foundation and significant support both inside and outside of the arena."

Maxwell got her start in coaching as the western assistant at Kansas State in August 2006.

Prior to joining the Wildcats, Maxwell enjoyed a stellar career as a student-athlete and member of the four-time Western National Champions squad at Texas A&M, posting top-four finishes in horsemanship and reining in 2005 in her senior campaign. She took a fifth season to stay with the Aggies as a student coach during the 2005-06 season before moving on to K-State the following year.

Maxwell and her husband, Bailey, have a son, Tatum, and four daughters, Brekyn, Rylan, Trystan and Paityn.

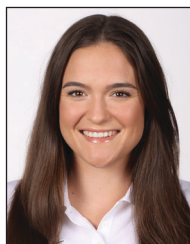

Grace Bridges enters her third season as Baylor equestrian's assistant Jumping Seat coach after being hired in July 2021.

During the 2022-23 athletic season, Bridges assisted in the Bears' 6-10 record and helped BU rank as high as No. 7 in the National Collegiate Equestrian Association (NCEA) poll. Baylor finished as national quarterfinalists after a narrow defeat to eventual national champion SMU, 10-8, in postseason play, and placed third at the 2023 Big 12 Championship after going 1-1 with a close loss to Oklahoma State, 12-8, and a dominating 16-4 victory over Fresno State.

Bridges was instrumental in guiding senior Dominika Silvestri to both National and Big 12 Flat Rider of the Year accolades, as Silvestri set the program record with 14 wins in her Flat season. Silvestri also joined Madison Mitchell (Flat), Annie Vorhies (Flat) and Maddie Vorhies (Flat) as all-conference performers from the Jumping Seat side of the roster. Additionally, Silvestri (Flat, First Team) and Mitchell (Flat, Honorable Mention) were tabbed as NCEA All-Americans, the second and third honorees during Bridges' tenure at Baylor.

Of Baylor's 12 combined national and conference Rider of the Month honors, which tied a program record, nine came on the Jumping Seat side under Bridges' supervision. As part of her stellar season, Silvestri brought home five of those awards alongside A. Vorhies, M. Vorhies and standout freshman Lauren Reid.

In the 2021-22 season, Bridges helped the Bears to a No. 6 final national ranking and an NCEA Quarterfinals appearance. She assisted in BU's 7-8 overall record and third-place finish in the Big 12 after Baylor went 1-1 at the 2022 Big 12 Championship. In her first season, Bridges' Jumping Seat squad posted a combined 16-11-3 record after going 9-4-2 in Fences events and 7-7-1 in Flat contests.

Bridges helped train All-Big 12 and NCEA All-America Honorable Mention selection Caroline Fuller, who boasted one of the program's strongest Jumping Seat seasons of all-time. The senior collected six Rider of the Month awards, which included two national honors from the NCEA and four Big 12 conference accolades, while tallying an 18-12 overall record and going 9-6 in both Fences and Flat, respectively.

A former standout student-athlete at Georgia, Bridges was a two-time All-SEC First Team selection in Flat. She compiled five Most Outstanding Performer rides and was part of two SEC Championship squads during her time in Athens. Additionally, she holds the NCEA record for individual Flat score in a single meet, with a 99.

A four-year letterwinner for the Bulldogs and three-time NCEA All-Academic First Team member, Bridges was a show rider at Beaver River Farm for a year prior to joining the BUEQ staff.

TEXAS A&M, 2002

Jessie Weisinger enters her second season as Baylor equestrian's assistant coach for Horsemanship after being hired in July 2022.

In her first year with the Bears, Weisinger helped BUEQ to a 6-10 record and a No. 7 national ranking. Baylor finished as national quarterfinalists after a narrow defeat to eventual national champion SMU, 10-8, in postseason play, and placed third at the 2023 Big 12 Championship after going 1-1 with a close loss to Oklahoma State, 12-8, and a dominating 16-4 victory over Fresno State.

Under Weisinger's purview, BU's Horsemanship squad went 5-9-2 during the 2022-23 athletic season, but was outscored by just six points total on the year. The sophomore duo of Alexis Rutledge (9-6-1) and Nadalee Vasquez (7-6-2) provided Weisinger with a strong foundation to build around on the Western side, as the pair accounted for four of the Bears' top five scores of the season.

Weisinger came to Baylor after serving as the head coach at UC Davis for the previous four seasons. There, she totaled nine wins with the Aggies as the program's first head coach and secured the team's first-ever win at the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Championships in 2021-22.

Prior to her post at UC Davis, Weisinger coached at her alma mater, Texas A&M, as an assistant for four seasons. She led TAMU's Horsemanship squad and assisted with the Reining team during her tenure from 2014-2018. During that time, the Aggies captured the 2017 NCEA Championship, becoming the first team to win the national title without the benefit of a first-round bye. Weisinger guided three student-athletes to NCEA All-Championship Horsemanship honors in 2017, including the Most Outstanding Horsemanship Rider, Avery Ellis.

Weisinger mentored three first-team All-Americans, one second-team All-American and two All-America honorable mentions in Horsemanship while at Texas A&M. Additionally, she oversaw 20 head of horses for her horsemanship crew, securing the donations and leases for the Aggies. She also handled recruiting, event management and riding camps during her years in College Station.

Prior to returning to her alma mater, Weisinger spent more than three years as an assistant trainer at the Guynn Training Center in Berthoud, Colo. During that stint, she formed the Rocky Mountain Wranglers, a middle/high school team that competed in the Interscholastic Equestrian Association. The RMW placed fifth and sixth at the IEA high school championships in 2013 and 2014, respectively.

Weisinger also worked at the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo (2007-10) and the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo (2005-07) before beginning her tenure at Guynn.

Originally from Corpus Christi, the former Jessie Highfill lettered at Texas A&M from 1999 to 2002. She was one of the original members of the school's equestrian program, as well as a member of its first national championship team in 2002. She continued to ride into her coaching career, earning the Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association Year-End Championship in Open Ranch Horse Pleasure in 2013. That year also saw Weisinger place in the top-15 at the American Paint Horse Association World Show, which in turn was a follow-up to her RMQHA Julie Fabrizio Memorial Rising Star Award in 2012.

Weisinger graduated from Texas A&M in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in animal science. She later pursued her master's degree in equine nutrition from Texas A&M in 2004.

Jessie is married to Jeremy Weisinger.

Lilly Ulrich joined the Baylor equestrian staff as an assistant coach for Jumping Seat in August 2023.

A former standout equestrian student-athlete at UC Davis, Ulrich joined forces with her former head coach, Jessie Weisinger, as members of the BUEQ staff and paired with fellow assistant Grace Bridges to mentor the Jumping Seat side of the roster.

As an Aggie, Ulrich was part of the first two seasons in UC Davis equestrian history. She competed in all six regular-season meets in the inaugural 2018-19 campaign, making her debut in the Aggies' first-ever home meet on Jan. 31, 2019, and earning Most Outstanding Performer honors in Fences that day.

In 2019, Ulrich collected four wins between Fences and Flat and tallied the squad's second-highest Fences score of the year with an 87 against Delaware State. Additionally, Ulrich was named the United Equestrian Conference's Fences Rider of the Week on April 1 after an 80-73 road win at Fresno State.

In addition to her riding days, Ulrich also previously served as an assistant trainer and manager at JH Sporthorses, where she frequently trained both children and adults, as well as exercised over 65 horses daily.

A native of Rochester, N.Y., Ulrich began her collegiate studies at Penn State before attending UC Davis, where she graduated from in 2021 with a degree in plant sciences.

Noel Meadows was hired as Baylor equestrian's director of operations on July 17, 2023.

Meadows, a three-time NCEA All-American during her collegiate career at UT Martin, comes to Waco after serving as a graduate assistant coach for the Skyhawks over the last two seasons.

From 2017-21, Meadows chalked up three All-America accolades in Reining, including first-team honors as a sophomore and a pair of honorable mention distinctions as a freshman and senior. She was also named the 2018-19 United Equestrian Conference Reining Rider of the Year a season after becoming UTM's first UEC Reining Freshman of the Year in program history.

Overall, Meadows accumulated 22 head-to-head victories and six Most Outstanding Performer awards in her career. A two-time all-conference honoree, she notched three conference Rider of the Month accolades, two conference Rider of the Week mentions and a national Rider of the Month honor. Outside of the arena, Meadows tallied a pair of NCEA All-Academic mentions and was an Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll recipient in each of her final two seasons.

In her new role, Meadows' main duties include handling a portion of the program's business responsibilities, planning team travel and recruiting visits, and managing apparel and equipment. She also coordinates communication with parents and boosters, as well as assisting the Baylor staff with scheduling coaching clinics throughout the year.

In addition to her collegiate equestrian career, Meadows also provided routine care for 16 horses and assisted in their training program at Meadows Quarter Horses. There, she also coordinated social media advertising and sponsorship efforts with various brands.

During her tenure at UT Martin, Meadows also served as a teaching assistant, specializing in Horsemanship instruction. While not competing, Meadows helped run gameday operations, assisted in coaching efforts, helped manage social media accounts and cared for over 35 horses.

A native of Staunton, Va., Meadows graduated from UT Martin in 2021 with a Bachelor of Science degree in agriculture and minored in accounting. She is currently pursuing a Master's degree in business administration.
