STORY LINES

- No. 20 Baylor opens its season against a power-conference opponent for the first time since 2013 (Colorado).
- BU is 18-2 in season openers under **Scott Drew** (four-straight wins).
- Tuesday marks BU's eighth all-time meeting with Auburn, with BU holding a 5-2 advantage over the Tigers.
- Auburn is one of six opponents on BU's schedule, that have made a Final Four since 2019.
- BU is playing at the Sanford Pentagon for a second-straight season, after outlasting No. 14 Gonzaga 64-63 in the inaugural Peacock Classic, a rematch of the 2021 national title game.
- The Bears open the season as a ranked team for the fifth-straight season, and 11 of the last 14 seasons since its first preseason ranking in 2010-11.
- The Bears have been ranked in 74 of the last 75 AP Polls.
- BU is 78-20 over the last three seasons, tied for the nation's best record by a Power-6 team in that span.
- Baylor is 104-24 over the last four seasons, the nation's best winning percentage among Power-6 teams in that span.
- BU has won 19 of its last 20 neutral-site games against non-conference opponents (only loss in that span was vs. Virginia 11/18/22).
- The Bears are a nations-best 27-11 vs. AP top-25 teams over the last four years, with 16 of those wins coming away from home.
- Baylor is 77-13 vs. unranked teams over the last four seasons (.855%).
- Baylor is replacing four of its five starters and 68% of its scoring from a season ago.
- BU had a total of 924 games of NCAA experience on the roster last season, and begins this season with just 550.
- The Bears welcome in a top-15 recruiting class, headlined by Preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year, **Ja'Kobe Walter**
- Walter is BU's third-straight preseason freshman of the year (Kendall Brown & Keyonte George)
- Walter is joined by a pair of four-star freshmen in **Yves Missi** and **Miro Little**
- Walter joined his teammates **Jalen Bridges** and **RayJ Dennis** as Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable mention selections
- **Dennis** played two seasons each at Boise State (2019-21) and Toledo (2021-23)
- The Plainfield, Ill. native, is coming off MAC Player of the honors last season with the Rockets after averaging 19.5 points, 4.3 rebounds and 5.8 assists per game.
- Baylor was picked fourth in the 2023-24 Big 12 Preseason Coaches' Poll. This marks the 13th time in the last 16 seasons that BU has been picked to finish in the top half of the league. The Bears were picked in the lower half of the league in each of the conference's first 12 seasons.
- BU is one of just five schools to be ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll in at least two of the last four seasons
- Twelve of Baylor's 13 starting point guards during the **Drew** era have earned All-Big 12 recognition.
- The Bears are 13-3 in the last 16 games against AP Top-10 teams, beating Nos. 5, 9, 6, 6, 10, 6, 1, 6, 8, 5, 8, 9 and 8.
- BU has won 78-straight when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent (last loss March 2, 2019 at K-State).
- BU is playing its 346th game as a ranked team under Scott Drew — Baylor was ranked in just two of 2,197 games over the program's 97 seasons prior to Drew.

QUICK HITS

- With back-to-back Big 12 titles in 2020-21 & 2021-22, BU became one of just three Big 12 teams to win back-to-back conference titles
- Selected 16th overall by the Utah Jazz in June's NBA Draft, Keyonte George gave BU three-straight lottery picks for the first time in program history (**Jeremy Sochan** 9th overall to San Antonio in 2022 **Davion Mitchell** 9th overall to Sacramento in 2021).
- The Bears have had 11 picks in the last 11 drafts, which is the most in the state of Texas and second-most in the Big 12 since 2012
- Baylor is one of two schools to have three-straight top-20 picks in the NBA Draft.
- Baylor is on a school-record streak of 11-consecutive postseason appearances, the nation's fifth-longest active streak
- The Bears have gone to nine NCAA Tournaments and two National Invitation Tournaments since 2012.
- BU is 54-6 in home games over the last four seasons.
- Baylor will play its final games at the famed Ferrell Center this season, before opening up brand new Foster Pavilion in January.
- The Ferrell Center has been home to Baylor basketball since 1988-89
- Baylor holds 384-169 record with over 3.2 million men's basketball fans coming through the turnstiles in the building's 35-year history.
- Baylor has reached the 25-win milestone in three of the last four seasons and in 7 of the last 14 years. Prior to that, BU reached 25 wins just once in the program's first 103 years (25-5 in 1945-46).
- Baylor is 27-11 against ranked teams over the last four seasons, including a 16-5 mark away from home.
- Baylor's 54-14 Big 12 record over the last four seasons is the best record of any Power-5 team.
- Head coach **Scott Drew** is in his 21st season at Baylor with a school-record 420 career victories.
- Drew is tied for the eighth longest-tenured head coach in Division I men's college basketball.
- Baylor is playing its 654th game of the 21-year Drew era – more than half (346) have been as a ranked team.
- Over the last 4 seasons, Baylor is 83-10 when leading at the half and 103-13 when taking a 2nd-half lead.
- Baylor spent a school-record 54-straight weeks ranked in the top-10 of the AP Poll, from Dec. 16, 2019-Dec 5, 2022.
- BU set a school-record streak of 65-straight weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 (previous record was 25). The streak lasted from Nov. 5, 2019 to Jan 9, 2023 (1,161 Days).
- Baylor has been ranked in all 25 spots in the AP Top 25 at some point in the last 8 years.
- Baylor has been No. 1 ranked in 4 of the last 7 seasons (Gonzaga, Duke and Kansas are only others).
- Baylor and Kansas are the only Power-5 schools to win 18+ games every year since 2008.
- Baylor has built leads of 10+ points in 51 of 74 games since the start of the 2021 NCAA Tournament (48-3 record).
- BU has built double-digit leads in 97 of 128 games over the last four seasons (92-5).
- Baylor has won 89% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (232-28).
- Entering 2023-24, Baylor is 295-117 over the last 12 seasons, averaging 24.5 wins per season since 2011-12.
- Baylor's 295 wins since 2011-12 are second-most in the Big 12 behind only Kansas (332).
- Baylor is 386-164 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- Twelve of Baylor's 13 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (17 of last 18 seasons).
- Baylor has made at least one 3-point FG made in 1,030 straight games – the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was over 33 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).
- BU got to .500 as a program on 2/15/2020 with a 70-59 win over West Virginia.

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- **Scott Drew** became Baylor's head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew is one of 10 active men's Division I coaches with at least 400 wins at their current school.
- Drew is one of 2 active coaches to have won an NCAA Title and an NIT Title. He is the only active coach to have won both at the same school (John Calipari NCAA: Kentucky, NIT: Memphis).
- Drew was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 21st season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (420).
- Baylor has a .701 winning percentage (386-164) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08 and a .716 winning percentage (295-117) over the last 12 seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (52) is the second-youngest active collegiate head coach to win a National Championship.
- In Drew's first 20 seasons at Baylor, 54 players have gone on to professional careers.
- Was announced as a member of the Texas Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2023.
- He is the 23rd BU player or coach to be inducted into the Texas Sports Hall of Fame

NATION'S-BEST 27-11 VS. RANKED TEAMS OVER LAST FOUR SEASONS

- Baylor is a nation's-best 27-11 against AP Top-25 ranked teams since 2019-2020.
- BU is 11-3 at home vs. ranked teams in the last 3 seasons – wins vs. #12 Arizona (Dec. 2019), #18 Butler (Dec. 2019), #14 West Virginia (Feb. 2020), #9 Kansas (Jan. 2021), #17 Oklahoma State (March 2021), #18 Texas Tech (March 2021), #6 Villanova (Dec. 2021), #20 Texas (Feb. 2022), #5 Kansas (Feb. 2022), #9 Kansas (Feb. 2023) and #8 Texas (Feb. 2023) and losses by 3 points to #3 Kansas (Feb. 2020) and #19 Texas Tech (Jan. 2022).
- The record includes 16-7 away from home, with neutral wins vs. #17 Villanova (Nov. 2019), vs. #5 Illinois (Nov. 2020), vs. #18 Villanova (March 2021), vs. #10 Arkansas (March 2021), vs. #6 Houston (April 2021), #1 Gonzaga (April 2021), #8 UCLA and #14 Gonzaga, with road wins at #22 Texas Tech (Jan. 2020), at #4 Kansas (Jan. 2020), at #15 Texas Tech (Jan. 2021), at #6 Texas (Feb. 2021), at #6 West Virginia (March 2021), at #8 Iowa State (January 2022), at #21 Texas (Feb. 2022) and at #17 TCU (Feb. 2023).

TIGERS AND BEARS OH MY

- Tuesday marks the third meeting between Baylor and Auburn in the Scott Drew Era, with BU holding a 2-0 mark.
- The two last met in January of 2021, when Baylor topped the Tigers 84-72 in Waco en route to the program's first-ever NCAA title
- **Adam Flagler** poured in 19 points and **Matthew Mayer** had a pair of highlight-reel dunks to help the second-ranked Bears remain undefeated on their championship run.
- The only other neutral-site meeting between the two was a 59-44 Baylor win in the first round of the All-College Classic on December of 1948, in Oklahoma City.
- Since 2012-13, Scott Drew is 13-7 against SEC foes, including an 8-2 mark in the 10-year run of the Big 12/SEC Challenge.

FAREWELL TO FERRELL

- BU has played in the Ferrell Center since 1988, and holds a 384-169 record all-time.
- **LaceDarius Dunn** holds the individual scoring record at the Ferrell Center when he scored 43 against Morgan State on 1/4/2011.
- The team record is 118 points by BU against Savannah State on 12/17/2017. The Bears got within one point of that in a 117-52 win over MVSU in the season opener last season (11/7/22).
- Three of the top six crowds in Ferrell Center history have come in the last four seasons (10,628 vs. KU 2/26/22, 10,627 vs. Arkansas 1/28/23 and 10,627 vs. Kansas 2/22/20)

BAYLOR PARTNERS WITH CITY OF WACO ON \$700 MILLION RIVERFRONT PROJECT

- Baylor and the City of Waco have partnered on a \$700 million riverfront development project, headlined by the \$212 million Foster Pavilion, the future home for Baylor's national champion basketball programs.
- Foster Pavilion (capacity 7,500) will be located along the Brazos River on the opposite side of I-35 from McLane Stadium.
- BU is set to begin playing games in the new Pavilion beginning on Jan. 2, 2024, as the Bears welcome in Cornell.
- Development Centers for both basketball programs are included in the 245k square foot Foster Pavilion project and is expected to be completed in the summer of 2024.

MILESTONE WATCH

- **RayJ Dennis** will play his 130th game (110th start) on Tuesday, and is just 14 points shy of 1,500 (1,486) and 22 assists shy of 500 (478) for his career.
- **Jalen Bridges** has 450 rebounds in his career and is 208 points away from 1,000 for his career (792).
- With a game played on Tuesday night, **Bridges** will be just four games shy of 100 for his career (95).
- **Caleb Lohner** will play his 97th career game on Tuesday, leaving him three games shy of 100 for his career.
- **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** will play in his 98th career game, leaving him two games shy of 100.
- **Tchatchoua** is 44 points away from 500 in his Baylor career (456).
- **Langston Love** is 10-points shy of 200 for his career (190).

NOTABLE STREAKS

- Baylor has taken a lead in 152-consecutive games (last wire-to-wire loss Dec. 1, 2018 at Wichita State).
- BU has won 78-straight when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent (last loss March 2, 2019 at K-State).
- Baylor has won 44-straight games when shooting 50% or higher (last loss March 18, 2018 vs. Mississippi State).
- Baylor has made 2 or more 3-pointers in 179 consecutive games (last on Jan. 2, 2018 vs. TCU).
- Baylor has made at least one 3-point FG made in 1,030 straight games — the last time Baylor failed to make a 3-pointer was over 33 years ago, on Feb. 21, 1990 vs. Texas Tech (0-8).
- BU has appeared in 12-straight AP Polls, the 12th-longest streak in the nation.

WALKED THE WALK, NOW TALKING THE TALK

- Former BU Player Pat Nunley (1978-81) is entering his 43rd season as a radio analyst for Baylor men’s basketball.
- Nunley was named to the Baylor Hall of Fame class of 2023, enshrined on Nov. 3, 2023.
- Playing alongside Southwest Conference Hall of Famer Terry Teagle and first-round pick Vinnie Johnson, Nunley averaged a career-best 12.3 points per game as a junior in 1979-80.
- Nunley started for four years with the Bears, and was named the Bill Henderson SWC Sportsman of the year in 1981.
- His fellow 2023 inductees include J.D. Walton (Football), Ken Quesenberry (football), Max Muncy (baseball), Denes Lukacs (tennis), Stan Curry (track and field), Sandy Forsythe Massey (track and field) and Tiffany Townsend (track and field).

ELEVEN CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON BERTHS

- Baylor is on a school-record streak of 11-consecutive postseason berths and has appeared in 14 of the last 15 postseasons. BU made seven postseason appearances in the program’s 97 seasons prior to the **Scott Drew** era.
- Baylor is 1 of 8 teams to appear in every postseason since 2012, joining Gonzaga, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan State, Oregon, Saint Mary’s and Virginia.
- BU earned NCAA bids in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019, 2021, 2022, and 2023 and NIT bids in 2013 and 2018.
- Baylor has appeared in 13 of 14 postseasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor’s only postseason berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).

THREE-STRAIGHT TOP-THREE SEEDS

- Last season, Baylor earned its third-straight top-three seed for a third-straight NCAA Tournament joining Kansas, Gonzaga and Purdue as the only four teams to accomplish that.
- 2023 marked the fourth time BU has earned a No. 3 seed after also doing it in 2010, 2012, 2015 and 2017.
- Baylor has earned a top-3 seed in 7 of the last 13 NCAA Tournaments.
- BU is 17-6 in NCAAT games as the higher seed, but 2021 was the first time as a higher seed after the Sweet 16.
- BU is 3-5 in NCAAT games as the lower/same seed, though four of those five losses were to top-2 seeds.

A TOP-25 STAPLE

- BU has now been ranked in 71 of the last 72 AP Polls.
- BU spent a school-record 54 weeks in the AP Top-10 from Dec. 16, 2019-Dec. 5, 2022.
- Baylor set a school-record streak of 65-straight weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 (previous record was 25). The streak lasted from Nov. 5, 2019 to Jan 9, 2023 (1,161 Days).

THE BIG 12’S MOST WINS ON CONFERENCE CHALLENGES

- Baylor is 13-4 in conference challenges – 8-2 in Big 12/SEC Challenge, 3-1 in Big 12/Pac-12, 2-1 in Big 12/Big East.
- Baylor’s 13-4 record in conference challenges (Big 12-Big East, Big 12/SEC, Big 12/Pac-12) is best in the Big 12, followed by Kansas at 11-7, OSU at 11-7, Texas Tech at 10-8, Iowa State at 9-8, Texas at 8-8, OU at 9-9, TCU at 6-7, K-State at 6-11 and WVU at 5-9.

SUCCESS IN TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor is 40-13 in regular-season tournaments during the Drew era, including titles in 4 of the last 5 tournaments.
- BU is 27-5 in its eight regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, going 3-1, 3-1, 3-1, 4-0, 4-0, 3-1, 3-0, 3-0 and 1-1.
- BU advanced to championship games in the 2007 Paradise Jam (won), 2008 76 Classic (lost), 2011 Las Vegas Classic (won), 2013 Maui Invitational (lost), 2014 Las Vegas Invitational (lost), 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis (won), 2017 Hall of Fame Classic (won), 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational (won) and 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis (won).
- Baylor has won six regular-season tournament titles under Drew – 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational, 2017 Hall of Fame Classic, 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2011 Las Vegas Classic and 2007 Paradise Jam.

RANKED IN EVERY AP TOP 25 SPOT IN LAST 8 YEARS

- Baylor has been ranked in every AP Top 25 spot at some point in the last 8 years (since March 2, 2015).
 - The Bears were ranked in every AP Top 10 spot at some point over the last three seasons (since Dec. 6, 2021).

SCOTT DREW COACHING TREE

- Four current Division I head coaches took their first DI head coaching jobs after stints on Scott Drew’s BU staff.
- Jerome Tang is in his second year as head coach at Kansas State. He was a member of Drew’s original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 19 years with Drew.
- Grant McCasland is in his first season as head coach at Texas Tech. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.
- Matthew Driscoll is in his 15th season as head coach at North Florida after six seasons as a Baylor assistant.
- Paul Mills is in his first season as head coach at Wichita State. He was a member of Drew’s original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.
- All four former assistants have led their teams to NCAA Tournaments – Driscoll led UNF to the 2015 NCAA Tournament, while McCasland took UNT to the 2021 Second Round and Mills took ORU to the 2021 Sweet 16.
- Drew is 0-2 all time when facing a former assistant as a head coach.

PROTECTING HALFTIME LEADS

- Baylor is 113-12 when leading at halftime since the start of 2017-18.
- Baylor has won 89% of its games (232-29) when leading at the half in the last 10+ seasons ... **19-5** in 2022-23 **20-3** in 2021-22, **24-0** in 2020-21, **21-2** in 2019-20, **15-3** in 2018-19, **15-0** in 2017-18, **18-3** in 2016-17, **18-2** in 2015-16, **21-7** in 2014-15, **18-2** in 2013-14, **17-1** in 2012-13 and **26-1** in 2011-12.
- BU has won 42% of games in which it’s been tied or trailing at the half since 2011-12, going 63-86 in those.

SECOND-MOST WINS AMONG BIG 12 TEAMS IN LAST DECADE

- Baylor’s 295-117 record since 2011-12 trails only Kansas (332-86) among Big 12 teams.
- Houston (184-118) is third, Cincinnati (282-119) is fourth, BYU (276-131) is fifth, West Virginia (244-161) is sixth, Texas (240-164) is seventh, Iowa State (237-162) is eighth, Oklahoma (229-161) is ninth, Kansas State (232-168) is 10th, UCF (210-163) is 11th, Texas Tech (220-174) is 12th, Oklahoma St. (217-176) is 13th and TCU (207-191) is 14th.
- Baylor has averaged 24.6 wins per season over the last 11 seasons since 2011-12.

NON-CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- Baylor is 13-2 against the Big East during the Drew era.
- The Bears are 18-11 against the SEC during the Drew era, including 13-7 since 2012-13 .
- Baylor is 5-0 against Big Ten teams since 2016 with two wins over Michigan State and Wisconsin, along with a win over Illinois.
- The Bears are 11-1 against their last 12 Pac 12 opponents, with wins in each of their last 6 meetings against teams from out west.
- Drew is 6-6 against the ACC since BU’s first year without scholarship restrictions in 2007-08.

POINT GUARDS THRIVE IN DREW’S SYSTEM

- Twelve of Baylor’s 13 starting point guards during the **Scott Drew** era have earned All-Big 12 recognition.
- Baylor’s starting point guard has earned All-Big 12 recognition in 17 of 18 seasons since 2004-05.
- Adam Flagler (2023), James Akinjo (2022), Jared Butler (2019, 2020, 2021), Davion Mitchell (2020, 2021), Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

54 PRO PLAYERS IN DREW ERA

- In Scott Drew’s 20 years at Baylor, 54 of his players have gone on to professional careers.
- Eight Bears are currently on NBA rosters – Kendall Brown (Pacers), Jared Butler (Wizards), Keyonte George (Jazz), Davion Mitchell (Kings), Royce O’Neale (Nets), Taurean Prince (Lakers), Jeremy Sochan (Spurs) and Ishmail Wainright (Trail Blazers).
- In addition to the eight current NBA players, eight more of Drew’s former players have played in the NBA (most recent team) – Quincy Acy (Raptors), Freddie Gillespie (Raptors), Pierre Jackson (Mavs), Cory Jefferson (Suns), Perry Jones III (Thunder), Quincy Miller (Kings), Johnathan Motley (Clippers) and Ekpe Udoh (Jazz).
- With his selection to the rookie team in the Rising Stars Challenge in 2023, **Jeremy Sochan** became the first player in program history to be a participant in the NBA’s All-Star Weekend.

HISTORY OF DEVELOPMENT WITH REDSHIRTS

- Baylor has a track record of success when redshirting players. **Adam Flagler, Davion Mitchell, MaCio Teague, Freddie Gillespie, Mark Vital, Ekpe Udoh, Johnathan Motley, Cory Jefferson, Brady Heslip, Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. and Manu Lecomte** have all gone on to professional careers after redshirting.
- **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** redshirted in 2019-20 while sitting out to satisfy NCAA transfer rules, **Langston Love** redshirted during the 2021-22 season and **Dantwan Grimes** elected to redshirt for 2022-23.

BAYLOR BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

- Baylor basketball is aired live via the Baylor Sports Media Network from Playfly on ESPN Central Texas and Flagship station 1660AM/92.3 FM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco and worldwide on Sirius/XM Radio.
- Games are broadcast by the “Voice of the Bears” John Morris, who was named NSMA 2019 Texas co-Sportscaster of the Year on Jan. 13, 2020, and Baylor Hall of Famer Pat Nunley.
- Morris is in his 40th year doing BU broadcasts (29th full-time), and Nunley is in his 43rd season as analyst.
- All of Baylor’s games can be heard live on the Internet at <https://www.centexsportsfan.com>.

OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING A BAYLOR STAPLE

- BU led the conference (2nd in the nation) in offensive rebound % (34.4%) according to KenPom in 2022-23.
- Baylor has ranked top-13 nationally in offensive rebounding percentage in nine of the last 10 seasons since 2013-14, including six times ranked in the nation’s top-5. The Bears only cracked the top-20 once in Drew’s first 10 years.
- Baylor finished ranked No. 13 nationally in 2021-22, No. 5 nationally in 2020-21, No. 8 in 2019-20, No. 2 in 2018-19, No. 9 in 2017-18, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16, No. 1 in 2014-15 and No. 3 in 2013-14. Prior to that top-10 streak, BU’s best rank was No. 16 in 2011-12.

BREAKTHROUGH IN BIG 12

- BU is 152-92 in Big 12 play in 14 seasons since 2010 after going 59-149 in the league’s first 13 seasons.
- BU is 166-110 in Big 12 play in 16 seasons since 2008 after going 45-131 in the league’s first 11 seasons.
- Baylor is 71-55 in Big 12 road games since 2012, second-best in the league behind only Kansas (81-47).
- BU has won 8+ Big 12 games in 12-straight seasons after winning 8+ just 3 times in the league’s first 15 years.
- BU has double-digit Big 12 wins in five-straight seasons, 8 of the last 9 years and 10 of the last 14 seasons. BU didn’t reach double-digit Big 12 wins in any of its first 13 years in the league before reaching 10+ for the first time in 2010.

DREW IS THIRD BIG 12 COACH TO REACH 150 CONFERENCE WINS

- **Scott Drew** joined Rick Barnes and Bill Self as the only coaches to reach 150 Big 12 wins on March 4, 2021 vs. OSU.
- Drew needed 136 games over 2,940 days for his first 50 Big 12 wins (50-86), 88 games over 1,821 days for his next 50 Big 12 wins (50-38) and only 77 games over 1,493 days for his next 50 Big 12 wins (50-27).

IMPRESSIVE NON-CONFERENCE NUMBERS AT HOME

- Baylor is 81-4 in its last 85 non-conference home games dating back to Dec. 12, 2012.
- Baylor is 145-16 in non-conference home games in the **Drew era**, including 117-8 since 2007-08.
- Baylor is 61-8 in home games against unranked opponents (including Big 12 play) since 2016-17.

GRADUATING 91 PERCENT OF SENIORS

- Since **Scott Drew** took over the Baylor Basketball program in 2003, 40 of 44 scholarship players who have played their final years of collegiate eligibility under Drew have graduated from Baylor.
- Players recruited by Drew to graduate at Baylor: Tim Bush, Patrick Fields, Aaron Bruce, Mamadou Diene, Delbert Simpson, Curtis Jerrells, Henry Dugat, Kevin Rogers, Tweety Carter, Josh Lomers, Ekpe Udoh, Fred Ellis, Quincy Acy, Anthony Jones, J’mison Morgan, A.J. FERRELL CENTER

The Ferrell Center, home to Baylor's basketball and volleyball programs for more than 30 years, continues to undergo upgrades to maintain its standard as one of the region's finest facilities. The improvements have given the Bears the type of arena necessary to compete in the Big 12 Conference.

The most recent upgrade to the Ferrell Center was a new hardwood floor installed prior to the 2014-15 season. Baylor also added a state-of-the-art, center-hung video board built by Mitsubishi in October 2010. The video board includes four LED screens, each measuring 8.53 feet by 16.01 feet. The lower LED ring is 2.93 feet by 15.96 feet and the upper LED ring is 2.13 feet by 25.82 feet. Weighing in at nearly 22,000 pounds, the total project cost \$3.2 million. In addition to the center-hung video board, Baylor also installed four upper corner boards that have video capability; those boards display in-game individual and team statistics. Four floor-level boards were installed as well as 12 upper arena ribbon boards located at each of the arena entrances.

Another major upgrade was the construction of the Lt. Jack Whetsel Jr. Practice Facility. The 42,990 square-foot addition includes the Hawkins practice courts, the Getterman Office Suites for the coaching staffs, and Gray's Gym, named by R.T. Gray in memory of his son, R.B. Gray. Other improvements include the Hall of Honor entry, the Stone Reception Room VIP area, as well as upgrades to the training room, media room and visiting locker room. The \$8 million Whetsel Practice Facility was dedicated on September 8, 2006. Previous upgrades to the Ferrell Center have included: new state-of-the-art locker rooms in 2004.

Built in 1988 at a cost of \$12.5 million, the gold-domed Ferrell Center is located on a 14-acre tract on the corner of University Parks Drive and Texas Highway 6 (LaSalle Avenue).

Capacity for basketball events is 10,284 and 6,000 for volleyball matches, while conventions, concerts, graduation exercises and convocations can seat 12,000.

The Ferrell Center is named in memory of Charles Robert Ferrell, who

died in 1967 during his sophomore year at Baylor. The arena is named in honor of Paul J. Meyer Sr., of Waco.

A major portion of the construction cost was provided by the estate of the late Mr. and Mrs. Monroe Ferrell of Houston, in memory of their son. Monroe Ferrell, a 1938 graduate of Baylor, operated a concrete pipe business in Houston until his death in December 1981, seven years after the death of his wife.

Other significant contributions came from Paul J. Meyer Sr., Emil H. Meyerhoff and the late J.E. and L.E. Mabee Foundation of Tulsa, Okla. Meyer is founder and chairman of the board of Success Motivation International, Inc., and of the Eureka Corporation. The Meyerhoff estate, through the auspices of executor Bill Patterson of McAllen, provided the University with a large gift.

Groundbreaking for the Ferrell Center was held July 1, 1987, and a women's basketball game between Baylor and Texas State on Nov. 25, 1988, was the first sporting event held. The first men's basketball game was Nov. 29, 1988, a loss to San Diego State.

The height of the facility is 111 feet, and the dome covers three acres and weighs 175 tons. Lighting capacity on the floor is 150-foot candles. The arena is designed with 42-tiered levels of seats, including nine rows of retractable seats at courtside. Banquet accommodations can be arranged for 1,000 people on the main floor.

The lower level of the building houses some of the finest basketball locker rooms in the country. Customized wooden cabinet lockers have been built for both the men's and women's locker rooms. Also, on the lower level are visiting team locker rooms, coaches' and officials dressing rooms, a warming kitchen, media room, interview room and general storage.

The Ferrell Center has been the site of Dallas Mavericks exhibition games, and the facility has also hosted the Mavericks' and Phoenix Suns' training camps. Former President Ronald Reagan spoke to a Republican political rally in the first event held under the golden dome in 1988.
