**Football**

- Baylor wrapped up its 2023 season with a 34-31 loss to eight-win West Virginia on Saturday at McLane Stadium.
- Baylor got consecutive kickoffs returned for a TD from sophomore RB Richard Reese to keep the game close in the first half, then mounted a furious stretch of 17 straight points to take a 31-27 lead. A missed 32-yard field goal with 1:14 left in the game allowed WVU to regain possession and marched 80 yards on six plays for the game-winning score.
- The Bears saw QB Sawyer Robertson throw for 215 yards and a TD on 17 of 19 passing, rushing 15 times for 33 yards. Dominic Richardson had a TD and Ketron Jackson Jr. hauled in a TD as part of his three-catch, 88-yard outing.

**Men's Basketball**

- No. 9 men's basketball continues its home slate on Tuesday night against Nicholls
- This week, BU entered the Top-10 for the fifth-straight season, becoming one of just three programs in the country to accomplish that feat.
- BU won the NIT Season Tip-Off last week, the Bears' sixth regular-season tournament title in its last seven tries.
- RayJ Dennis was named the Big 12 co-Newcomer of the Week on the strength of a 24-point 8-assist outing against Florida and earning MVP honors in the NIT Season Tip-Off championship game.
- Baylor enters Tuesday's game with 397 wins all-time at the Ferrell Center, and could reach 400 wins as soon as next Tuesday against Seton Hall.

**Women's Basketball**

- Baylor improved to 5-0 on the year after a pair of wins over McNeese and Alcorn State over the weekend.
- The No. 13 Bears will have their first road test of the year at SMU on Thursday before coming back home to host Oregon on Sunday. Both games will be nationally televised on ESPNU and FS1, respectively.
- Baylor is averaging 93.4 points per game, shooting 51.6 percent, while holding foes to 58.4 points and a 39.7 percent from the field. Dre'Una Edwards leads the team with 14.4 points and 6.2 rebounds per game, with Sarah Andrews (13.6), Aijha Blackwell (11.8), Yaya Felder (9.6), Bella Fontleroy (9.4) and Jada Walker (9.0) each averaging over nine points per game. The reigning Big 12 Freshman of the Year, Darianna Littlepage-Buggs leads the team with 8.4 rebounds per game, adding 6.0 points per outing.

**Volleyball**

- Baylor rose to No. 23 in the final regular-season poll from the AVCA after upsetting then-No. 22 Houston, 3-1, on Wednesday.
- Bears earned an at-large bid to their eighth-straight NCAA Tournament, 12th overall. Will face seventh-seeded James Madison in the first round at the Lexington Sub-Regional on Thursday at 3:30 p.m. CT at Rupp Arena.
- With a win, BU faces the winner of Wofford and second-seeded Kentucky on Friday in the second round.
