#### Men's Basketball

- No. 13 Baylor MBB hosts No. 23 Texas Tech on Tuesday for an 8pm tip on ESPN.

  The Bears lead the nation in 3-point FG% (40.8), fourth in offensive efficiency (122.6) and second in the Big 12 in points per game (84.0).

  Drew is facing his former assistant coach and
- former Baylor guard, Grant McCasland, for the first time.
- A 1999 graduate of Baylor University, McCasland earned Academic All-Big 12 honorable mention honors in 1999 after playing for four years under head coach Harry Miller.
- Baylor and Tech have played a home-andhome series every year since Tech joined the Southwest Conference in 1958.
- Six of Baylor's 10 remaining games are against teams currently ranked in the top-25.
- BU has scored 80+ points in back-to-back games against Tech for the first time since 2010.

#### Women's Basketball

- No. 18 Baylor WBB travels to face BYU on Wednesday in its only meeting with the Cougars this season before returning to Foster to host No. 22 West Virginia in its first of two outings on Saturday.
  Nationally, the Bears sit in the top 30 in several categories including assists per game, rebounding marrin and scoring marrin.

- Edwards led the Bears in scoring in BU's 23-point win over Houston. The graduate senior has reached double-figure scoring in a team-high 17 of 21 games this season.

#### Softball

- No. 19 SB opens its season this week against No. 2 Tennessee. The Bears host the Lady Vols for a three-game series at Getterman Stadium.
- BU and Tennessee last faced off during the 2023 season when the Bears took down the thenranked No. 4 Lady Vols twice in Knoxville. The Bears are backed by a veteran group,
- including all but one from last season and added three freshmen to the roster.

- No. 1 A&T defeated Texas Lutheran, who is coached by two Baylor alumnae, by 110.035 points to open the season.
- The Bears extended their win streak to 28 meets in a row.

#### Men's Tennis

- No. 24 MT won both ends of its doubleheader on Saturday, defeating Jacksonville State 6-1, and Nebraska 7-0.
- No. 32 Tadeas Paroulek won Big 12 Player of the Week after notching his first ranked win of the spring, taking down Jax State's No. 45 Ivan Marrero Curbelo in three sets. The senior went 2-0 in singles and 1-0 in doubles.

- lead the team in singles wins at five this spring, while Badenhorst/Luc Koenig and Paroulek/ Zsombor Velcz have four doubles wins.

- Sprint squads excelled, as De'montray Callis won the men's 60 and 200 meters, Tiriah Kelley won the women's 200 meters, Demar Francis won the men's 400 meters and Imaobong Uko won the women's 400 meters. Program record holder Alexis Brown also took her first career title in the women's long jump. The Bears ended the meet by improving on the women's 4x400 season-best time, moving to 3:38.73.
- BU heads to Clemson to compete in the Tiger Paw Invitational for the second-straight year, beginning on Friday. It's the final regular-season indoor tuneup before the indoor championship season begins on Feb. 23-24 for the Big 12 Indoor Championships in Lubbock.
